Subject: Follow up on today's meeting with Mohamed Muhsin on Information Technology

This note if for your files, as some follow up would be needed in the medium term (names highlighted in red are rough suggestions).

Mr. Wolfensohn met this morning with Mohamed Muhsin and Shengman Zhang, to get progress report on Information Technology at the Bank. Follow up actions:


- Meeting with Intelsat: There will be a meeting next week between Mr. Wolfensohn and Mr. Goldstein from Intelsat. Mohamed Muhsin asked JDW to convey certain messages (mainly around welcoming a strengthened partnership). This should be included in the briefing material to be provided by Mr. Muhsin in the next few days. (Mohamed Muhsin to provide briefing note).
- JDW's Teleconferencing at Headquarters: JDW agreed to have all his video conference events at the EDI/ISG training facility in level C2 of the Main Complex building. (FYI: Cathy Lamb, Lai Foong and Ali)
- 3. LIL Packages for Distance Education Facilities: Muhsin to follow up with Jean-Louis Sarbib on whether the teleconferencing infrastructure planned for Ethiopia (I presume, following JDW's visit there) can be upgraded to a full-fledge facility. Mohamed said that there is a budgetary constraint. Mr. Wolfensohn emphasized that this does not need to be a grant from our budget, but it can be offered as a loan package, in the form of a "LIL." He asked Mohamed for a proposal on a LIL package that countries can use for purposes of enhancing their distance education and teleconferencing facilities (JDW has been asking for this for a long time--- I think that EDI and AFRVP may have given some thought to this---Mohamed may wish to ask John Middleton). (Follow up: Operational MDs, Mohamed with AFRVP, EDI and John Middleton, Joanne Salop.)
- 4. Technology Component in CASs: As concrete follow up to the recommendations in the 1998 WDR on information and technology (coordinated by Carl Dahlman, as most of you know), JDW asked Mohamed to help put together a team with clear responsibilities who can come up with a standard program or model for country assistance on information technology issues, including the idea of LILs for facilities/software/training mentioned in the previous paragraph. JDW would like to see a proposal within the next 2-3 weeks. (FYI/Follow up: Operational MDs, Carl Dahlman, Joanne Salop, Mohamed Muhsin, (FPSI?)).
- 5. Implementation of SAP: There will be a briefing session on the status of SAP implementation this Friday. Mohamed suggested that JDW conveys a strong message about the need to move on and thanks the SAP team. JDW agreed to do so, but also commented that work with SAP has to be careful ("not a cookie-cutter approach"). (Mohamed Muhsin to provide briefing material for Friday meeting).
- 6. ISG Budget issue: ISG is facing an \$8m budget cut this year, because expected savings due to technology enhancement have not materialized yet. At the same time, ISG is facing the greatest costs, among all Bank units, for NRS conversions. JDW said that Systems Renewal is crucial for the progress of the Bank, and asked Shengman and Mohamed to discuss with Mark Bair on how to mitigate the budget problems. In his words: "we should take a head-on look at

the budget situation, without opening the door to excessive expenditure." (Follow up: Mohamed Muhsin, Mark Baird, Achim von Heinitz).

- 7. **Board presentation**: JDW would like to make a presentation to the EDs on progress in Systems Renewal; he sees a need for "keeping the Board interested and excited on this topic." (Follow up: Shengman Zhang, Mohamed Muhsin, SEC)
- 8. Reception for Systems Renewal people: JDW said that he would like to have a reception for all the people who have worked hard on the systems renewal process. Shengman and Mohamed suggested that this would be more appropriate a few months from now. (Follow up: Shengman Zhang, Mohamed Muhsin, Allison Tsatsakis/Lai Foong Goh.)








#### The World Bank Videoconferencing Number of Sessions per Month in FY98



- e. sharing development knowledge globally


#### II. Highlighting progress and next steps:

- Standardization of the desktop (on the planned trajectory)
- New user support model (implications for reporting relationships among VPUs)
- Global communications (ahead of schedule)
- Systems Renewal (separate briefing on May 29th)
- Global knowledge sharing (approach to rationalize the broad scope)
- II. Discussion of our approach to the twin challenges of bringing all these elements together into an integrated deliverable and at the same time implementing it worldwide in 80 Bank offices. We have set as our destination to deliver a **World Development**Network (WDNet) in the year 2000 a network of people sharing development knowledge enabled by technology and available to all Bank offices and partners.
