SECTION 6: SUMMARY OF PROJECT STATUS, TREND, AND MAJOR PROBLEMS:

ENFE and the Minister of Transport.

In the first half of 1976 the railway freight traffic increased by 10% in ton-km but decreased by 34% in tonnage over the same period in 1975 due to exogenous factors such as mining strikes in early part of 1976, Governments' new requirement, from importers of a deposit of 25% of the value of imports prior to importation and, shortage of freight cars. However, the mining strike is over and normal production is resumed since June 1976 and the Government is relaxing the condition of 25% deposit on imports. ENFE is optimistic that the traffic will increase in the second half of 1976. Passenger traffic increased both in numbers (15.7%) and in pass-km (26.9%) for the same period. The working and operating ratios for the first four months of 1976 were 91 and 104 but with the anticipated traffic increase in the remaining period of 1976 the ratios are expected to be close to appraisal targets (80 and 95 against targets of 85 and 95). Therefore the financial position of ENFE will remain satisfactory also for 1976. Procurement performance is satisfactory; by end of September 1976, 96% of the loan was committed and 38% was disbursed. Track rehabilitation is still behind schedule mainly due to management problems in the Eastern Region. Productivity in workshops is normal. Shortage of some parts slowed down the otherwise good progress of the motive power fleet efficiency. The position of ENFE's Chief Mechanical Engineer is still vacant while SOFRERAIL expert has already arrived to organize the mechanical department. The technical assistance has contributed to the better performance of ENFE but good counterparts from ENFE are scarce. Also there is frequent turnover among them

and only middle managers seem to benefit most from technical assistance instead of senior managers. From information collected in La Paz it is clear that the technical assistance for the period January-June 1977 cannot be financed by the Ministry of Transportation as previously expected. ENFE therefore should carefully review the technical assistance program not to overrrun the funds available. On August 31, 1976, ENFE signed a contract with Mitsubishi-Japan for the purchase of 16 line locomotives for the Western Region, and transactions are in progress with Mecano Export-Import from Rumania for five diesel shunters.

7. Action Taken

- (a) A letter has been sent to the General Manager of ENFE summarizing the missions' findings; and
- (b) An appraisal mission to Bolivia, consisting of two Engineers, one Economist and one Financial Analyst is scheduled for October 26 to November 12, 1976.

AIDE MEMOIRE (Track)

ENFE will:

In Western Region:

- 1. Activate work implementation in the two sections of Oruro-Viacha line taking full advantage of new equipment purchased with the loan 1121-BO.
- 2. Extend the instructions and know-how of the use of new equipment to an adequate number of persons in ENFE.
- 3. Study and analyze each week the causes of delay in track rehabilitation program and take corrective actions.
- 4. Recuperate the track rehabilitation backlog so far accumulated, as ballast production increases (42 ballast cars will be available in October) and as the knowledge of how to use the new equipment improves.
- 5. Speed up installation of new steel bridges on the Ollague-Uyuni line.

In Eastern Region:

- 6. Speed up the assignment of a contractor to rehabilitate the permanent way, because although the new mainline locomotives are soon expected the track rehabilitation program is considerably behind schedule.
- 7. Put as soon as possible the new crushing machinery, arrived from France, in operation at Yacuces quarry.
- 8. Proceed as for Western Region in points 2, 3 and 4 above.

AIDE MEMOIRE

Finances

ENFE will:

- 1. Prepare financial forecast for 1976-1981 based on revised traffic forecast and Investment Plan. Forecast should also show revenues and operating expenses separately for Western and Eastern Regions. The operating expenses should also take into consideration the reduction in costs from future benefits to be derived from improved operating efficiency explaining how these benefits are calculated e.g. reduction in fuel cost due to dieselization, reduction in maintenance costs of track and equipment due to investment plan, reduction in transportation costs due to increase in train speed and reduction in turn around time.
- 2. Prepare Cash Flows for 1976-1981 showing clearly the sources and application of funds (fuentes y usos de fondos). If Government has to grant funds to ENFE an agreement reached on such funds should be provided. Show firming up of financing plan for local and foreign loans (other than the Bank loan) indicating interest rate, grace period, commitment charges and amount of loan.
- 3. Prepare Balance Sheets for 1976-1981 including the results of recent revaluation of assets.
- 4. Take action to improve the efficiency and performance of the Finance Department.
- 5. Prepare cost studies of freight services showing by major commodity the marginal costs, tariffs and corresponding highway tariffs where competition exists.
- 6. Prepare plans for reducing passenger train losses and financial justification of purchase of passenger cars in future.
- 7. Obtain Auditor's reports and comments on 1975 accounts and on the results of revaluation of assets for the appraisal mission.
- 8. Finalize the total manpower requirement of the railway indicating by each area the staff required.

AIDE MEMOIRE

Transport Economics

ENFE will:

- 1. Review forecast of freight and passenger traffic, 1977-1981, on the basis of actual (January-September 1976) traffic as discussed with Mr. Saussine.
- Prepare economic evaluation on the basis of methodology explained to ENFE and SOFRERAIL experts Messrs. Balesdens and Saussine by the Mission.

AIDE MEMOIRE (Mechanical)

ENFE will:

- 1. Ask the manufacturers of new locomotives for the Western Region (MTU from Germany) if the Diesel engines have a prelubrication electric pump.
- 2. Prepare Work Plan 1977-78 for Uyuni and Robore Workshops analyzing feasibility, cost-benefit of a partial manufacture and assembly on the spot of new rolling stock to be supplied with the new railway project.
- 3. Appoint ENFE's counterpart of the SOFRERAIL Mechanical Engineer (Mr. Beseme) who, in due course, could assume the position of ENFE's Chief Mechanical Engineer.
- 4. Take disciplinary measures against those responsible for the extended breakdown of level pinions and crown wheels of Ferrobuses in the Western Region due to lack of technical control.
- 5. Implement water treatment to avoid or reduce corrosion and cavitation of the cylinder liners of Diesel engines.
- 6. Define financial conditions for the purchase of used passenger cars from Chilean State Railway so that the reallocation of the funds for the loan 1121-BO can be done.
- 7. Speed up civil works in Guaracachi shop for the installation of the 20 ton mobile crane.
- 8. Prepare a detail list of items under Categories IV and V initially assigned to Category VI of loan 1121-BO.
- 9. Review the inventory data for steam and diesel locomotives, passenger and freight cars that are different in documents presented by the Mechanical Department and the Planning Office.
- 10. Increase the productivity of the new wheel lathe at Uyuni to recuperate the backlog of about 30% of the freight car fleet.
- 11. Carefully select the counterparts of technical experts and limit their turnover to take full advantage of the technical assistance.

FIRST AND SECOND RAILWAY PROJECTS

Draft Paragraph for the President's Reports

All technical targets of the Action Program are met except track rehabilitation in the Eastern network. The freight traffic increased by 10% in ton-km but decreased by 34% in tons due mainly to mining strikes and Government requirement of 25% deposit of total imports prior to importation. But in the second half of 1976 the traffic is anticipated to increase and the working and operating ratios are expected to be 80 and 95 which are close to the appraisal targets of 85 and 95. The financial situation of ENFE, therefore, will continue to be sound. Procurement performance is satisfactory; 96% of the loan is committed and 38% is disbursed. Productivity in workshop is normal. The appraisal of the Third Railway Project is scheduled for October 26-November 12, 1976.

FIRST AND SECOND RAILWAY PROJECTS

Execution of the Project

1. The execution of the Second Railway Project (Loan 1121-B0) is progressing well with minor delays. The drive and initiative of the General Manager, the growing interest of the personnel and the arrival of the items purchased under IDA Credit (346-B0) are the contributory factors for improvement in ENFE's operations.

Procurement

- 2. IDA Credit 346-B0 is entirely committed and about 97% (US\$7.7 million) is already disbursed. The official closing date of the Credit was June 30, 1976 but it has been extended informally until November 30, 1976. Spare parts for D.E. locomotives, arrived with delays, are short for certain items like cylinder liners found highly corroded by cavitation in the first 24,000 hours overhaul. Civil works in Viacha workshop are almost completed.
- Procurement on Loan 1121-B0 is progressing quicker than expected and by the end of September 1976, 96% of the loan was committed amounting to US\$27.5 million. Total disbursements to that date were US\$10.9 million or 38%. However, the amounts contracted under Categories I to VI are higher than the amounts available, therefore an adjustment is required in the amount of unallocated funds (see table 2). ENFE is preparing a request for reallocation of funds. On August 31, 1976, ENFE signed a contract with Mitsubishi-Japan for 16 line diesel locomotives for the Western network and at present is in the process of making transactions with Mecano Export-Import from Rumania for five diesel shunters. These locomotives will have standard mechanical parts so that they are interchangeable with the existing ones. This will complete the dieselization of the western network locomotive fleet. Eastern region, with the arrival of 17 diesel locomotives already ordered to General Electric, Brazil, will also have a fully dieselized fleet.
- On September 3, 1976, Bank agreed with ENFE for purchase of 18 passenger cars from SOCOMETAL of Chile at US\$2.7 million. This was originally ordered, with Bank Agreement, to IMMAR of Chile which declined its offer later. However, ENFE in the meantime, has found out that "SOCOMETAL" has second hand coaches at favorable price. Therefore, ENFE is currently making enquiries with "SOCOMETAL" and will request the Bank for its approval before final order is placed.

Track Rehabioitation and Maintenance

(a) Western Network

5. The way and works equipment has been purchased with Loan 1121-BO but ENFE is slow in making the full utilization of this equipment. The mission has urged that this equipment be immediately used in the two section of Oruro-Viacha line. Also, it emphasized that full training should be given to ENFE staff in handling this equipment. The track rehabilitation program is progressing well. By the end of September 1976 38 km of track has been rehabilitated. However, the mission indicated that the local management should check, daily, the work program and study the causes of delays in order to take remedial action. Also, each week the management should discuss in detail with the General Manager who can take action to replace the inefficient staff. The ballast production is increasing and with the arrival of 42 ballast cars in October 1976 its distribution will also increase and will help in speeding up the rehabilitation work. ENFE has already received steel bridges and there is a need to expedite their installation on the Ollague-Uguni line.

(b) Eastern Network

6. The track rehabilitation program in this network is behind schedule. ENFE was urged to speed up the appointment of a contractor to rehabilitate the permanent way because new diesel locomotives will be arriving soon. A new stone crushing machine has arrived from France. ENFE is installing it at Yacuces quarry and the production is expected to start before December 1976. As in the Western network, there is a need to fully train ENFE staff in handling new equipment and daily checking by management, of the work program and finding causes of delays in rehabilitation work and taking corrective action.

Workshops

7. The workshops at Viacha, Uyuni and Robore are functioning adequately. The availability of locomotives (80%) and freight cars (83%) improved in the first six months of 1976 and surpassed the appraisal targets. 18 out of 20 diesel locomotives are in operation and the remaining two are expected to be in service by early 1977.

FIRST AND SECOND RAILWAY PROJECTS

Operating Results and Forecasts

(a) Traffic

- 1. Freight traffic in the first half of 1976 was 222.1 million ton-km as compared with 201.8 million ton-km for the same period in 1975. However, a total of 481.3 thousand tons were carried in 1976 as against 522.8 thousand tons in 1975 for the same period, a decrease of 34%. The decrease occurred only on the western network, from 452.9 thousand tons in 1975 to 299.9 thousand tons in 1976, but, because of increased long haul traffic, the ton-km were only 7% less than in 1975. The main reasons for the traffic decline were:
 - (i) Minerals There were strikes in the first few months of 1976, which reduced the production and, therefore, the exports.
 - (ii) Iron and Steel and Chemical Products The Government asked for a deposit of a sum equivalent to 25% of the value of imports prior to importation. The importers experienced difficulties in arranging such a sum in advance, which resulted in reduction of imports of iron and steel.
 - (iii) Timber Demand for export decreased in the first quarter of 1976.
 - (iv) Sugar and Flour Short haul traffic was carried by truckers.
 - (v) Cotton Shortage of wagons caused a portion of the export traffic to move by trucks. Also, internal traffic between east and west was hauled by truckers.
- 2. The strike by miners is now over, and mining activities have been returning to normal production since 1976. Also, the Government is relaxing the requirement of 25% deposits on import values. ENFE expects that railway traffic will increase in the remaining months of 1976.
- 3. Passenger traffic increased both in numbers and in pass-km. In the first six months of 1976 a total of 615.6 thousand passengers were transported as against 531.8 in 1975, an increase of 15.7%, while the pass-km were 182.5 million in 1976 as compared with 143.8 in 1975, an increase of 26.9%. The major part of the pass-km increase occurred on the western network (37.5%).

Finances

(b) Operating Results

The increased traffic and tariffs in 1975 had substantially improved the financial position of ENFE. The working and operating ratios of 79 and 88 of that year were better than the appraisal targets of 85 and 96. However, due to exogenous factors the railway traffic declined (para 1) in the first four months of 1976, and the working and operating ratios deteriorated to 91 and 104 as compared with the appraisal targets of 85 and 95 for the full year. The month-by month examination of the freight traffic indicates that, from June, the ton-km have increased, e.g., on the western network, the freight ton-km increased by about 10% over May and on eastern network, by about 65%. Also, ENFE explained that the situation which caused a decrease in traffic of minerals, iron and steel and chemical products during the first five months has improved; therefore, the prospects for the remaining six months of 1976 appear good. The total revenue for 1976 is estimated to be \$b 589 million, a 3.3% increase over 1975. The working and operating ratios are expected to be 80 and 95 against the appraisal target of 85 and 95 (Table 1). ENFE would be able to meet the 1976 interest payments again and would have a net revenue of about \$b 30.0 million after allowing for the staff cost increase from October 1976, of \$b 200 per month per employee earning up to \$b 3,600 per month. In addition, the Government is contributing \$b 80.1 million from the national budget toward local investment for 1976. Therefore, the financial position of ENFE is strong (Table 2). The accounts of the Guaqui-La Paz and Santa Cruz-Puerto Mamore lines are kept separate from those of ENFE, as per Section 3.04(a) of the Guarantee Agreement; however, the losses on the Guaqui-La Paz line decreased from \$b 12.0 million in 1973 to \$b 7.6 in 1975.

(c) Revaluation of Assets and Audit Report

ENFE has taken a complete inventory of all fixed assets and submitted the results to the Government auditors for their comments. As soon as the comments are received by ENFE, which is expected to be by the end of October 1976, they will be handed over to the appraisal mission scheduled to be in the field at that time. This will be in accordance with Section 5.04(b) of the Loan Agreement (1121-B0). Although most of the revalued assets and their related accumulated depreciation are incorporated in the attached balance sheet for 1976 (Table 3), there are still some final adjustments required which will be completed by the end of December 1976. The annual audit report for 1975 is behind schedule, and the mission insisted that this report be submitted to the Bank before the forthcoming appraisal. The current ratios show improvement in 1976 over 1975, and the debt/equity ratio has improved from 52/48 in 1975 to 26/74 in 1976, mainly due to the revaluation of assets. The cash position at the end of 1976 is satisfactory.

(d) Costs and Tariffs

6. The consultants, SOFRERAIL, have completed a cost study based on 1975 financial and statistical data. A tariff and cost analysis office has been

established within the Plannint Unit of ENFE, consisting of a chief and four analysts. The study indicates that the long-run marginal costs are 53% of the total normalized costs. The total freight revenues for carload and less-than-carload traffic cover the marginal and fixed costs, and contribute considerably toward interest and amortization payment, both on the western and the eastern networks, but the passenger revenues cover marginal costs only on the eastern network. On the western network, the revenues on sleeping cars, autocarriles and ferrobuses (special only) are considerably lower than the marginal costs. The cost study indicated that, in 1975, the passenger service operations had incurred 28% of the total costs, but had generated less than 15% of the total costs, revenues. Further, ENFE is planning to buy about 33 passenger cars during 1977/78. The mission has asked ENFE for full financial justification before any purchase is made, and has recommended that ENFE should conduct a detailed study of each passenger service comparing marginal costs, railway fares and bus fares and then take necessary action to reduce passenger losses. A proposal for such action be submitted to the appraisal mission for the proposed Third Railway Project. It is worth mentioning at this stage that the fuel prices have gone up since March 1976. The gasoline price has increased by 122%, fuel oil by 175% and diesel oil by 78%. This will have an impact on the costs of bus operations.

- 7. ENFE's freight rates are, in some cases, quite high in comparison with truck rates. The mission discussed this matter with the railways and suggested that a careful review of rates would be necessary. It suggested further that, if feasible, ENFE should reduce rates on some selected routes in order to attract more traffic.
- 8. SOFRERAIL has studied the tariff structure and prepared comparative statements of costs and tariffs by each commodity with different tonnage per car load, in case of freight, and by class of service (first class, second class, ferrobus, etc.) and by routes, in case of passenger. However, SOFRERAIL has not commented on the adequacy of the present tariff structure. The mission has, therefore, asked ENFE to obtain such comments from SOFRERAIL and forward them to the Bank.

(e) Staff

9. ENFE reported that the total staff strength was reduced from 6,401 in 1973 to 6,336 in 1974 and 6,043 in 1975. The transfer of about two hundred medical employees to the Social Security system helped to improve ENFE's manpower. In the Action Program of the Loan Agreement (1121-B0), a goal was temporarily set for a total of 6,300 employees, pending a detailed study by ENFE. The Railways expect to increase manpower in the Ways and Works Department. It was emphasized that a complete manpower study should be submitted to the forthcoming appraisal mission in October 1976.

FIRST AND SECOND RAILWAY PROJECTS

Organization, Management and Performance of Borrower

- 1. ENFE's performance continues to improve. Rehabilitation of freight cars was satisfactory; for the first half of 1976, 57% of the 1976 target was already met. Rehabilitation of the coaches, diesel locomotives and ferrobuses was as planned. The track rehabilitation program, however, is slow, particularly on the eastern network. It is necessary that ENFE assign a contractor for the rehabilitation of the permanent way.
- 2. While the Mechanical Department is performing satisfactorily, the Management, the Operations Department, and the Permanent Way Department are still lacking effective leadership. The matter has been brought to the attention of the General Manager who was also informed that his satisfactory action will be reviewed during the forthcoming appraisal in October/November 1976.
- 3. The Planning Department is functioning properly. It has produced a five year plan "Plan Quinquenal 1977-1981" for ENFE. Currently, it is in the process of preparing the information still needed for the Bank's appraisal mission.
- 4. ENFE has worked quickly in obtaining offers from suppliers through ICB procedures and, as a result, has saved most of the price contingency that was provided in the Investment Plan.
- 5. In the Finance Department, the mission noticed changes in the middle management; the new entrants lack technical capabilities in performing their tasks. The General Manager was asked to review the situation immediately so that improvements can be seen in this Department at the time of appraisal of the Third Railway Project.

PRE-APPRAISAL OF THE PROPOSED THIRD RAILWAY PROJECT

- 1. ENFE assured the Bank that, when the preappraisal mission arrived in La Paz all information required for appraisal would be ready; this was not the case, however. ENFE and SOFRERAIL did give the mission a five-year plan, 1977-1981, in which a great deal of useful information was available, but some of the important items were still missing. These were:
 - (i) Methodology and preparation of the economic evaluation of the investment plan as a whole and its major components.
 - (ii) Summarized investment plan and its subcomponents.
 - (iii) Financial forecast. Income statement was completed but Cash Flow and Balance sheets were incomplete. On the last day of its stay, the mission was informed that the whole financial forecast would be prepared and kept in readiness for the arrival of the appraisal mission in La Paz. All future benefits arising from improvement in operations would be identified clearly and taken into consideration in the calculation of operating costs for 1977-1981.
- The traffic forecast has been completed and is now under review by the mission. Regarding the economic evaluation, the mission suggested to ENFE a methodology that should be followed. Also, considering the very little time available to complete this task, the mission asked SOFRERAIL to arrange for another economist from Paris to go to Bolivia and speed up the work. This has been done, and Mr. Suassine, the additional economist, visited Washington on October 4, 1976 to discuss the methodology of economic evaluation with the Bank economist. The methodology proposed has been discussed before in the Bank with Messrs. Rafloski and Taborga. ENFE has promised to prepare all missing information for the appraisal mission. It is, therefore, the opinion of the Bank that if all the information is ready on time, the appraisal will be done as scheduled; otherwise, some delay might be encountered.

The 1977-1981 Investment Plan

3. The five-year Investment and Rehabilitation Plan was prepared by SOFRERAIL and ENFE's counterparts. A copy of this Investment Plan has just been received by the mission in Washington; therefore, it has not been thoroughly reviewed yet. Although some modifications are expected during appraisal, the original Plan is estimated to cost about US\$140.0 million, including 5% physical contingencies but excluding any price contingencies.

The foreign exchange component is of the magnitude of US\$94.0 million. The main objectives of the Plan are to continue the program of rehabilitation of track and rolling stock, to replace steam locomotives with more economical diesel locomotives for the western network following the example of the eastern network; to continue modernization of workshops in order to improve railway operating performance, and to provide ENFE with the needed rolling stock. To this Investment Plan, a sum of US\$1.5 million (tentative) should be added to cover the cost of the National Transport Survey for the period 1977-1978.

4. A summary of the Investment Plan is as set out below:

The table indicates that 61% of the Plan is allocated to Way and Works above, 26% to Rolling Stock and 3% to technical assistance, leaving only 10% for telecommunications, spare parts and workshops. The Bank has assigned about US\$35.0 million for external financing of the loan, beyond which ENFE and the Government of Bolivia have to arrange co-financing or bilateral financing.

Preappraisal of the Third Railway Project

Terms of Reference

On or about September 13, 1976, you will arrive La Paz for a limited supervison of Credit 346-BO and Loan 1121-BO, and a preappraisal of the Third Railway Project. The mission should last about five days. Mr. Rasheed will arrive La Paz from Bogota on September 11, 1976 and will lead the mission.

- 2. With regard to the First and Second Railway Projects you will:
 - Obtain information related to the railways' technical. operational, statistical, financial, and managerial matters in order to assess the progress made to date in implementing the Projects and achieving the targets specified in the Action Programs.
 - Review status on (i) final items of the procurement and disbursement, and the closing date for Credit 346-BO and (ii) the procurement and disbursement of Loan 1121-BO particularly the Ferrobuses from Germany and Passenger Cars from IMMAR, Chile.
 - c) Assess further improvements in the rehabilitation program of track, rolling stock and motive power. Also study the 1977-1978 work plan for the Uyuni and Robore workshops.
 - Review and discuss the technical assistance programs.
 - Review ENFE's financial results for the first half of 1976 and prepare a revised financial forecast for the full year. Also discuss with ENFE other financial matters such as auditors report on 1975 accounts and on revaluation of assets, and increases in wages and material prices in 1976.
 - f) Ensure that the newly established Planning Department is functioning satisfactorily and review status of the transport planning department of the Ministry of Transport.
 - Study and discuss the new staff plan prepared by ENFE and SOFRERAIL.

- 3. With regard to the preappraisal of the Third Railway Project you will:
 - a) Examine the overall methodology for the 1977-1981 passenger and freight traffic forecast and Investment Plan, which are being prepared by ENFE and the consultants, SOFRERAIL, in order to define as closely as possible the investments required for rehabilitation of track, equipment and workshop, telecommunication and technical assistance. You will also attempt to establish the technical, economic and financial rationale of the Investment Plan.
 - b) Review ENFE's and the consultants' calculation of economic costs and economic justification of the Investment Plan by principal components of the project.
 - c) Review and discuss the accuracy of the financial forecast (Income Statement, Cash Flow and Balance Sheet) for 1977-1981 based on traffic forecast and Investment Plan.
 - d) You will assess, if possible, the adequacy of the financing plan and the Governments' role in funding ENFE's Investment Plan for 1977-1981.
 - e) Discuss the results of the cost studies of freight and passenger services and tariff policies as specified in items 4 and 5 of page 2 of the Aide-Memoire dated May 3, 1976.
 - f) You will attempt to establish the present and future role of ENFE in the Bolivian economy, and in particular, in transportation.
 - g) Study the present organization, administration and operation of ENFE and indicate if any improvements are necessary including training; and
 - h) Agree with ENFE on all additional work required in preparation for the appraisal of the Third Railway Project scheduled to start in the field on October 27, 1976.

4. Upon your return to headquarter you will submit a combined Back-to-Office and Full Report on limited supervision of Credit 346-BO and Loan 1121-BO and a preappraisal report on the proposed Third Railway Project.
