



James D. Wolfensohn Remarks to the Alumni of the Harvard Business School June 17th 1997

The Challenge of Change Management

Harvard Business School Alumni know better than anyone the need for corporate relevancy.

Company after company has been forced to reform to meet the challenges of the 21st century.

The Bank is no exception to this. Shares a good deal in common with a number of well known Harvard Business School studies - Aravind Eye Hospital, (trying to run a non-profit agency on businesslike lines); Nucor - (American steel corporation with total greenfield approach); ABB ("The Art of Being Local Worldwide"); Mrs. Fields - which like ABB shows the key importance of an information system).

But neither is the Bank a private sector company. (Professors on the Executive Development Program have had some difficulties coming up with appropriate parallels).

The Bank finds itself in a peculiar position.

- 1. Makes no money on its core product.
- 2. Bad product image (in large part brought on by its own definition of success 1/3 projects fail).
- 3. 2 sets of "shareholders" capital markets for IBRD; taxpayers for IDA.
- 4. enormous diversity of clients; and erosion of purity of client base (new importance of civil society, NGOs).
- 5. Changing operating environment and increased number of competitors.
- 6. End goal unrealizable in the short term? effect of population growth on poverty reduction

But set against this enormous strengths:

Intellectual strength and commitment of Bank employees Continued need for Bank services - 3 billion under \$2 a day.

- 130 million kids not in school
- 1.3 no access to clean water
- continued environmental degradation etc.

The Objective of Change:

Central goal is to enhance relevancy by improving development effectiveness.

The Strategy:

1. Change the business - the Compact:

- Shift resources to the front line
- focus on a new development agenda private /financial sector; social development; rural development;
- Leverage knowledge
- Introduce a new product line Just in time loans;
- Approach development on a country by country basis (multiplicity of different needs from East Asia to Sub-Saharan Africa; transition economies etc.)

2. Change the culture

- Executive training
- decentralization moving closer to the client
- Returning ownership to governments
- Participation of affected stakeholders 52 NGO liaison officers
- Partnership MDBs/bilateral, civil society; private sector; foundations
- Technical excellence/management streams
- Changed HR policy

Will we succeed?

Jury still out. (Keeping HBS in business by writing its next case study). One thing is certain, however, and that is that the stakes are very high......for this generation but also for our children.

Why getting it right matters:

Ultimately not talking about fast food, but about global peace and security: *Economics* - 4 million US jobs; 18% of global GDP today, 30% in 2020. *Quality of life* -200 million tons carbon emissions; 2 million deaths from tuberculosis every year; 856,000 from malaria; globally 23 million infected with the AIDS virus. *Peace* - over last 10 years, ½ poorest countries have experienced conflict.
