SUBJECT:

Proposal for a Working Party on the financing of Seed Production Projects

- Aside from disagreeing with the conclusion in Para. 1 of Mr. Ergas's memorandum that the components usually lacking in seed production projects are the facilities for bulk handling, credit and quality control, I support the action that the FAO/IBRD Cooperative Program is initiating.
- I suppose the fact that disagreement does occur is itself indicative of the need for a working party. At the same time I doubt whether a working party will achieve much if it is not involved with whether a working party will achieve much if it is not involved with specific case-studies. One is already extant, this is Mr. Jones' proposal re financing a seed program in Korea. This section is reviewing this at the moment. Possibly it is in this type of activity that we can best participate. I do not think that we should become deeply involved in the technical aspects of seed production and handling, FAO is equipped to handle this. Also, there is the physical problem of attending working party meetings.
- 3. I suggest that a member of the Division should be nominated as a correspondent for the working party. He would receive relevant reports etc. and obtain comments from within the Bank where appropriate and when required.
- Financing seed programs should present no greater difficulties than many other projects with which we are concerned. I doubt whether a standard pattern could be evolved which would be applicable to all countries. The organization of projects would vary considerably from country to country and each case would have to be decided on its merits.
- A Bank position on the economic justification of seed projects would be of considerable value. In many countries an element of subsidy will be unavoidable, at least for the early years of a program or until seed production is commercialized. Again, until we have the opportunity to study a project, the practical feasibility of which is established and supported by estimates of costs and benefits, it will be difficult to proceed meaningfully towards this.
- * INDIA The proposed Korean project could be a starting point for these developments. A review of Mr. Jones! proposals is under preparation.

PROPOSAL FOR A

WORKING PARTY ON THE FINANCING OF SEED PRODUCTION PROJECTS

- 1. It is, of course, widely known and accepted that availability of good seed is a key element in agricultural development, but it is depressing to note how few developing countries have managed to achieve really good seed production programs. It would seem to us that there are five essential components to any seed production projects: (1) research and experimentation; (2) the maintenance of standards of quality laboratory seed testing, field certification; (3) the availability of a sound credit program; (4) the availability of a sound business organization responsible for organising the growing collection, processing, storage and redistribution of seeds together with the necessary financial backing; (5) a sound extension organization. The components usually lacking are the facilities for bulk handling, the credit program and quality control. In consequence, the work of the plant breeder is nullified and the extension agent frustrated because the advice he gives cannot be followed by the provision of this input to the farmer.
- 2. Emphasis is given here to local production of seed, but the possibilities of international trade in this commodity, particularly at the initial production when nucleus stocks are required have not been forgotten. The proposed program on Agricultural Production Requisites would, of course, play a major role in this context; the hope is that any eventual Bank interest in this field would strongly complement action under that Program when it comes into being.
- 3. In fact, with the desire of the World Bank to increase and develop the range of its activities in agriculture, it should be possible for us to do something more positive in fostering seed production financing. Already the World Bank has indicated its potential interest in seed projects and we are considering developing a project of this type in India. We would, however, like to have a more comprehensive approach and to enjoy the benefit of cooperation of all concerned.
- 4. To develop an approach, we have already set up within this Programme a small working party including Mr. D.K. Jones (Chairman), Mr. Bhattacharjee, Mr. Peperzak and Mr. Anania. We would also hope for representatives from your Program/Division the types of expertise primarily involved are agronomy, credit, seed handling and processing and extension. In addition, it is proposed that the World Bank should be represented and an approach has been made to them to this effect.

In response to your memorandum of June 24 to Mr. Hoffman about the Bank's agreement with FAO on Agricultural Review Missions, the following is an excerpt from a minute of discussions which Mr. Aldewereld and I had with FAO which covers this subject.

"Agricultural Review Missions

- "27. As an experimental measure it is agreed that operational responsibility for agricultural review missions organized under the Programme will be vested in a two-man Steering Committee with one member from each organization. The mission chief will report regularly to this Steering Committee.
- "28. All official advice and instructions to mission members, except the provision of technical data, will be channelled through the Steering Committee and the mission chief."

You also enclosed a questionnaire of points on which you would like the Bank's views. We have the following remarks in reply to the questions which you asked.

Questions 1 and 2 - Growth Rates in the Non-Agricultural Sector

The growth rate assumed for the non-agricultural sector in Afghanistan appears optimistic, especially for the ten-year period ending in 1975. Industrial production has good prospects for expansion in existing and a few new fields and the discovery of large reserves of natural gas is providing a new source of cheap energy. But potential large scale industries are subject to the constraints of a small domestic market, little comparative advantage with neighboring countries and high cost of access to the sea. Construction activity expanded rapidly in recent years, largely thanks to foreign aid, and may slow down gradually in the future as more emphasis will be put on quick maturing projects in the commodity producing sectors. Services, chiefly government, contributed little in the past to GNP growth and should not be expected to expand much faster in the future since there are already problems of over staffing in government services. Although statistics are scarce and uncertain, a very tentative guesstimate of the growth rate in the non-agricultural sector from 1965 to 1975 would be 4% rather than 6%. Beyond 1975, the choice of rate is entirely speculative. There seems little likelihood of a rapid increase though, of course, with such a low base, it is possible.

Jordan. The growth rate in the non-agricultural sector in 1965-75 may be rather less than the 7% suggested. Mineral resources could contribute to the country's economic development but at present only phosphates are commercially exploited, and they account for over 1/3 of Jordan's exports. In this sector, the large scale industry is confined to a petroleum refinery, a cement mill and a tannery. The lack of raw materials, the scarcity of managerial and technical skill and the small internal market will limit the country's industrial development. In your memorandum of May 3 you asked for a number of Bank documents for the World Indicative Plan. I am sending copies of most of those mentioned in your list: the remainder are, I am afraid, not at present available.

You also enclosed a questionnaire of points on which you would like the Bank's views. We have the following remarks in reply to the questions which you asked.

Questions 1 and 2 - Growth Rates in the Non-Agricultural Sector

The growth rate assumed for the non-agricultural sector in Afghanistan appears optimistic, especially for the ten-year period ending in 1975. Industrial production has good prospects for expansion in existing and a few new fields and the discovery of large reserves of natural gas is providing a new source of cheap energy. But potential large scale industries are subject to the constraints of a small demestic market, little comparative advantage with neighboring countries and high cost of access to the sea. Construction activity expanded rapidly in recent years, largely thanks to foreign sid, and may slow down gradually in the future as more emphasis will be put on quick maturing projects in the commodity producing sectors. Services, chiefly government, contributed little in the past to GNP growth and should not be expected to expand much faster in the future since there are already problems of over staffing in government services. Although statistics are scarce and uncertain, a very tentative guesstimate of the Ed ed bluce 1975 of 1965 mora reteat terest lucky non eds it eser diweres rather than 65. Beyond 1975, the choice of rate is entirely speculative. There seems little likelihood of a rapid increase though, of course, with such a low base, it is possible.

Jordan. The growth rate in the non-agricultural sector in 1965-75 may be rather less than the 7% suggested. Mineral resources could contribute to the country's economic development but at present only phosphates are commercially exploited, and they account for over 1/3 of Jordan's exports. In this sector, the large scale industry is confined to a petroleum refinery, a cement mill and a tennery. The large for rais internal market will limit the country's industrial development. Moreover, the largest contribution to the

GDP in the non-agricultural sector is made by wholesale and retail trade and public administration which accounted for 37-40% of the GDP in 1959-1961, and are unlikely to grow fast. Thus the growth rate for the non-agricultural sector in 1965-75 may be nearer 6.5%.

The assumed growth rate of 7% for the non-agricultural sector in 1975-85 we have no reason to disagree with.

Sudan. The growth rates assumed for the non-agricultural sector appear to be reasonable.

Syria. The suggested growth rates for 1965-75 seem optimistic. National income data indicate that while the non-agricultural sector grew at 5% during the years 1953-62, the annual rate of growth had fallen back to 3.7% in the last five years of that period. On the assumption that the ratio of capital depreciation and net factor income payments to the GDP will not be subject to wide fluctuations, and in view of the low rates obtained in the recent past, it appears that during 1965-75 the growth rate for the non-agricultural sector may be nearer 4.5% than 6.5%.

We would also venture to suggest that the growth rate in the agricultural sector may be rather lower than the 4% included in the table, say around 2.5%.

The Syrian Government has accepted the recommendations of the Bank mission's review of 1962 and planning is now again being given a central place since the 1960-61 to 1965-66 plan introduced under the UAR regime was abandoned as over ambitious. It will however take time before the growth rates can rise markedly. Further, the present government is limited in its freedom of choice. Commitments were made by its predecessors for carrying out large projects (like the Euphrates Dam project and the Latakia-Kamechlie Rail link). These large projects, if finally implemented, will lead to increased production but the full benefits will accrue over a long period of time. In the ten years 1975-85 the growth rate for the non-agricultural sector may, therefore, be closer to 6.5% than 6.8%.

On the assumptions we have suggested, including that for the agricultural sector, the overall growth in GDP in 1965-75 may be at a rate of about 3.7%; and in 1975-85 at a rate of about 5.5%.

United Arab Republic. The rate of 7% anticipated for the non-agricultural sector in 1965-75 seems realistic. But industrial growth in the UAR is, to a large extent, dependent on the performance of the agricultural sector. It is estimated that about 80% of the industry works on agricultural raw materials. Accordingly, the estimated growth of 7% depends on the satisfactory performance of agriculture, for which the 1% growth rate seems reasonable in the context of the completion of the Aswan High Dam and the switch from basic to perennial irrigation.

The growth rate of about 7.5% in 1975-85 could be realistic in spite of the possibility of some decline in the rate of growth of the agricultural sector. This is on the assumption that in the intervening ten-year period, the UAR will attempt to diversify industrially and develop its industrial potential. It is already receiving considerable assistance from the USSR, and it is not unlikely that some oil may be found in the UAR. In that event, the growth rates will no doubt significantly increase.

For both the ten-year periods the rate of growth in GNP is estimated slightly more than that in the GDP. Though the UAR's outstanding debt is substantial (estimated at about US\$880 million) and they are likely to continue to need assistance from abroad, this seems to be on the assumption that the rate of inflow of net capital from abroad may somewhat decline and this may lead to some fall in the rate of growth of net investment income payments.

Iran. The growth rate in the non-agricultural sector will continue to be influenced by that of the oil industry for some time to come. Variant I in the table might be achieved during the period 1965-75, whereas, in view of a possible drop in the growth of oil revenues, a slightly lower rate may be more likely in the period 1975-85.

For the next five years, the Bank believes that the increase in oil revenues in Iran is likely to continue at a steady rate of at least 10% a year. A drop in the rate, possibly to around 8%, may be expected in 1970-75 because of the impact of gas from Algeria, Libya and the Netherlands on the markets of Western Europe. Beyond 1975, a further drop might occur, the extent of which will depend upon the use of gas and nuclear energy.

Iraq. The variants in the table for 1965-75 are growth rates of GDP of 7.8, 6.5 or 5.3%. In the past (from 1953-55 to 1961-63) the GDP showed a growth rate of 6.1%. Though Iraq will no doubt attempt to improve upon its past performance, it is likely that during 1965-75, the overall growth rate may be about 6.5%.

In the non-agricultural sector oil is the most important. Production of oil is approaching the present capacity (of 70 million tons) because no major investments have been made in the oil industry in the last three years. The growth rate in the oil industry could be maintained at about 9% during 1965-75 because no serious threat to world oil prices is foreseen and the world crude oil requirements are expected to grow fast. This would, however, be feasible only if necessary investments are made in the oil sector. With the 9% growth rate in the oil sector, the rate for the non-agricultural sector as a whole, may be approximately 6% in 1965-75.

During 1975-85, the rate of growth in the GDP may decline since it is unlikely that large investments in oil will continue to be made. Further the European oil market may also be affected by gas supplies from Libya, the Nether-

lands and Algeria. The growth in the oil sector during this period may therefore be approximately 5%. Other industries may, however, make progress. Accordingly, for the non-agricultural sector as a whole, the growth rate may be maintained at around 6%.

Question 3 - Resources for Agriculture

More resources should be devoted to the development of agriculture in Iran. But the relevant question is how to get them used productively. In recent years, large amounts of public funds have been spent on the implementation of the Land Reform Program, but a good deal of this has been used for consumption. This program has put a heavy demand on the administrative capacity of the government, and has thus caused delays in other programs that might have increased productivity. It may take some time before Iranian agriculture expands its capacity to absorb funds productively at a substantially higher rate than at present.

The questionnaire asked about the oil producing countries, but in addition to these Afghanistan is one clear case where resources for agricultural development should be increased in absolute as well as in relative terms. We are supporting the plans for upgrading and expanding the transactions of the Agricultural Bank; and we shall probably support the government's intention for the third plan to put strong emphasis on the development of commodity producing sectors, of which agriculture is by far the most important.

Question 4 - Fertilizer Industries

The development of fertilizer industries in the near East will depend primarily on the size of the markets which they can hope to supply, and, as you know, this is highly problematical. However, we gather that some privately financed ammonia projects are being considered (and one is under way) in Iran, Kuwait, and Saudi Arabia.

As for the Bank's attitude towards the development of fertilizer industries, I do not think I can do better than refer you to Mr. Woods' speech of February 25, 1966 to ECOSOC, in which he said:

"In the World Bank Group we are actively exploring a wide range of specific projects in the fertilizer field right now. We stand ready to give prompt and sympathetic consideration to further requests for assistance, employing whatever financial techniques seem most appropriate to a given situation. It is my hope that we can serve as honest broker for organizations in the public sector or the private sector or both wherever collaboration is necessary or desirable. It is my hope, too, that we can serve as honest broker between governments in the various regions of the underdeveloped world where international cooperation is necessary or desirable."

We shall be able to give you a more considered reply to these questions when Mr. Varon has returned from the Conference which he is presently attending. I am, therefore, asking Tony Macone to write to you separately about these two questions in the course of the next fortnight.

I hope the above material will prove helpful. The documents are being air freighted to you under separate cover.

COOPERATION WITH FAO ON COMMODITY STUDIES

- Mr. Kamarck reported that the previous week he had visited Rome to discuss the coordination of the Bank's commodity studies with those of FAO. The latter had a staff of 40 working on commodity and food and agricultural product studies, while the Bank had seven only, with a prospect of two additions in the next year, to work on all commodity aspects of country export forecasts and international trade problems. Mr. Ojala, head of the FAO Commodities Division, had proved cooperative, and it had been agreed that FAO would make basic studies on food and agricultural products to meet the Bank's needs, and would also make price forecasts. In cases where the Bank had urgent needs which could not be promptly met by FAO, the Bank would go ahead, but in consultation with FAO, especially with regard to its price forecasts, which had in the past tended to diverge from FAO's. This arrangement with FAO would enable the Bank to concentrate more on non-agricultural commodities: as regards the latter, the possibility of cooperation with UNCTAD was being explored.
- Mr. Rist said that the Bank should not accept the conclusions of others without submitting them to its own critical judgment. Mr. Kamarck, agreeing, said that the studies prepared by FAO would provide such basic material as the supply and demand schedules for the commodities in question, and the Bank would have sufficient staff to judge what conclusions should be drawn from the basic material.
- Mr. Friedman said that it would be useful if in due course a report could be prepared on the usability of outside material for Bank purposes. While it was desirable to try to economize on staff, in some fields the Bank might not be able to avoid making its own studies. The Chairman suggested that the Bank should not forget to keep a check on the accuracy of its own judgments.

Comments on "Outline For Projects To Be Presented For Financing"

- 1. The attached outline accompanying Mr. Ergas' memo dated November 10, 1965 is very similar to the outline prepared by Ken Jones and Phil Kirpich for Korea dated May 3, 1966 (copy also attached).
- The main topics of the outline are very similar to those used in many of the Bank's Appraisal Reports. The details set forth under the various topics, however, are such that there needs to be a word of caution to the effect that the details must necessarily vary with the type of project. For irrigation projects it would seem necessary to have a fuller discussion of water requirements as well as sources of supply (stream flows, storage in reservoirs, etc). The Jones-Kirpich outline for Korea does some of this, but more adjustment would seem desirable.
- 3. In item 21 "gross and net value of present production" there is a footnote stating that "usually farmer's family labor is not costed". This should have a word of explanation to the effect that in labor short areas a charge for family labor would be appropriate.
- 4. Section C. "Cost Estimates" of the FAO outline seems quite inadequate and the revision of this section in the Jones-Kirpich version seems
 more complete and generally appropriate, particularly for irrigation projects. The addition of a section on "Construction Schedule" as in the Korea
 eutline (para 32) would be appropriate for all projects involving construction works.
- 5. Section G "Debt Repayment and Financial Results" should be revised so as to give the sources and application of funds as proposed in Annex1-B of the Korea outline.
- 6. In paragraph 50, the reference to incremental indirect benefits and costs of the project needs explanation. This is a subject on which there has been much written and there are many who think that a deficit of direct benefits can be made up with indirect benefits (usually without consideration of the many indirect costs.
- 7. My general reaction to the FAO outline is that it is quite good, but could be improved by the suggestions made above. Even then I believe that it had best be used by experienced persons who would recognize that it must be adapted to the widely varying requirements of different projects.

 We would suggest that the Bank should reserve
 judgment pending the receipt of FAO's terms of
 reference;
 - (b) We assume that the proposed visit to Tunisia in September (Item No. 2 for the "June Review") would be combined with the Bank economic mission;
 - (c) During the recent meetings with FAO, we have proposed that the Bank (Mr. McMeekan, plus the Abidjan staff) would visit Nigeria for a possible livestock project, after we have received from the Nigerians the report proposed by a German group. You might wish to pursue this matter during the "June Review";
 - (d) The economic review mission to Guinea (ref. item No.4 of the "June Review") is expected to take place in September; this timing is subject to confirmation;
 - (e) It was agreed with FAO that, in the case of Somalia, FAO would not come in until the results of Mr. Groenveld's visit are known. It might be useful to confirm this understanding with FAO.

Comments on FAO/Bank Meetings

The following comments are made on your draft memo of May 16 on this subject.

- 1. Burundi. We have no Burundi Mission in our approved list of missions, but we did understand from Mr. Gordon that Mr. Anderson would be going down to Burundi as suggested earlier by Nairobi.
- 2. Central Africa Republic. The proposal is for the FAO mission to go about July for 2-3 weeks, this is to be rediscussed in June in Rome.
- 3. Congo-Brazz. The name of the forest expert with the FAO Team is Spears.
- h. Gabon. FAO has proposed an identification mission consisting of Spears (forestry) and a transportation expert. We are not clear what is the object of this mission in view of the extensive studies already in hand over the past 2 years. We shall try and clarify in Rome in June.
- 5. Malagasy. The Malagasy mission (Gordon/Bishop) is scheduled for 1-14 July.
- 6. Morocco (Derro). Tentatively this is scheduled for August.
- 7. Morocco (Sebou). Will be rediscussed in Rome in June and is not yet on the Agreed Missions List.

- Zambia. This mission is proposed for July consisting of Bishop, Spears and Groenveld, if the latter is available. (Gordon thought this would be possible).

I suggest we might have a word on this when you have a moment.

BOLIVIA, PERU and URUGUAY - Per Capita GDP, Rates of Growth of Population and of GDP used by FAO

A. Per Capita GDP, 1965

1. The FAO per capita GDP figures compare with our recent estimates:

	FAO	IBRD
Bolivia	US\$128	135
Peru	US\$261	365
Uruguay	US\$420	520

Obviously our figures are arrived at on a straight exchange rate conversion without any attempt to allow for purchasing power differences among these countries or between them and other - more developed - areas.

- As to Bolivia I should like to reserve comments until returning from the forthcoming economic mission. Regarding Peru our 1965 estimate is based on the revised national income series (in current prices) prepared by the staff of the Central Reserve Bank with assistance from IMF. The FAO estimate is expressed at 1961-63 prices. As between 1962 (mid point of 1961-63) and 1965 prices rose by 38 percent, while the exchange rate was not changed, the difference between the FAO and our estimates is insignificant (\$360 vs. \$365). It could be argued that the 1965 current price GDP overstates the "real" GDP as measured in US\$ by converting the sol at the official rate. However, a possible adjustment of the sol to bring the country's expenditure in balance with its resources would certainly not have to amount to 38 percent, but perhaps to 10 or 15 percent, thus reducing per capita GDP to \$315-\$330.
- 3. With respect to <u>Uruguay</u>, GDP estimates expressed in dollars are particularly hazardous because of differences in the movement of domestic prices vs. exchange rate adjustments. The per capita GDP estimate made by the last economic mission has been checked for various years when the exchange rate appeared to be in balance; thus the estimate seems supported quite well. On the other hand, FAO's estimate would be too low.

B. Projected Rates of Growth of Population and GDP

4. On population growth rates no comment seems needed except perhaps for Peru where recent estimates given to us (by the staff of the Central Reserve Bank) point toward an upward shift in population growth from past estimates of 2.6 percent p.a. to an annual 3.2 percent (FA) uses the 2.6 rate as the "high" figure for future population expansion).

5. As to GDP growth, the FAO projections compare as follows with our most recent estimates:

(No estimate was spelled out in the last economic report on Bolivia).

With respect to <u>Feru</u>, the two projections are as close as could be expected. In the <u>Uruguayan</u> case, the caution reflected in the FAO figures appears well founded - the higher growth figure implicit in our present draft report clearly hinges on the success of <u>Uruguay's vital livestock</u> program in the context of improved economic policies.

Following the discussion which Messrs. Aldewereld and Demuth had with you in Rome during March, detailed talks took place with Mr. Ergas last week about the budget which you propose for the FAO/IERD Program for the biennium 1966-67.

We agree that the prospective workload warrants an increase above the presently agreed \$1.8 million budget and, subject to the approval of the Executive Directors, which I expect to obtain in June, we are prepared to approve a budget of \$2.2 million for the 1966-67 biennium.

Our agreement to this increase is based on the understanding that it implies no commitment by the Bank to approve a further increase for the 1963-69 biennium, except such as might be necessary to cover mandatory increases. We have as yet given no consideration whatever to the size of the program which might be appropriate for the next biennium and we wish to be able to consider whether or not the program should be increased for that period, and if so to what extent, without any constraint resulting from continuing staff commitments which would involve (apart from mandatory increases) a level of total expenditures above that agreed to for the present biennium. I should add that we hope to consider our position with respect to the 1963-69 biennium within the next few months and to be in a position to discuss it with you next fall.

We agree that the prospective workload warrants an increase above the presently agreed \$1.8 million budget and subject to the approval of the Executive Directors, which we still have to obtain, we would be prepared to approve a budget of \$2.2 million for the 1966-67 biennium.

In agreeing to this increase we wish to avoid giving any implied commitment to approval of a further increase for the 1968-69 biennium (except such as might be appropriate to cover mandatory increases), even if the workload continues to expand. We would wish to review the situation when the time comes.

FAO/IBRD Badget - Biemnium 1966-67

Dear Mr. Wells:

We had discussions with Henry Ergas this week on the proposed FAO/IBRD Program Budget for the Biennium 1966-67.

Subject to approval by the Directors we agreed that the present and envisaged workload would warrant our support of a \$2.2 million joint budget. We would, however, like to caution against a too rapid increase in the number of permanent FAO team members which might lead to an establishment later in 1967 which would appear to commit the Bank to a continuing budget beyond the present biennium, on a level above \$2.2 million.

Present professional staff in the FAO team, we understand, consists of 23 officers. We suggested to Mr. Ergas that a target of something like 32 permanent team members should be aimed at, with the balance of manpower being provided by consultants. We also pointed out that there seemed to be no flexibility in the proposed budget for mandatory salary increases or other contingencies.

SUBJECT: IBRD/FAO Cooperative Program - Budget

You asked to be informed of the position regarding our discussions with FAO on the budget for 1966-67 biennium for the Cooperative Program.

Two questions have been of primary concern to us in discussions during the past ten days with FAO.

- Does the amount of work to be done under the Program justify an increase in the budget from \$1.8 million, which is the presently agreed level, to \$2.2 million for the current biennium 1966-67 (calendar years)?
- If the answer to 1) above is 'yes' would we, by approving a program of work which can be done within a \$2.2 million budget for the current biennium, be accepting any commitment expressed or implied to a further increase in level of expenditure under the Program for the biennium 1968-69?

We are in no doubt that the answer to question 1) above is 'yes'. FAO have pointed out, and we have agreed, that an increase in workload must be expected for reasons which include a) follow up of work already under way; b) increasing attention being given by the Program team in FAO to work on UNDP projects with a view to preparing them for Bank appraisal; c) some reduction in missions and overseas travel per man in order to avoid breakdown of some of the team members who have been travelling far too much in the past two years.

The answer to question 2) is related to the proposals of FAO in relation to the work program and the hiring of permanent staff to carry it out. The most significant item in FAO's proposed budget is the number of members in the Program team. May 3

I attach a memorandum received from the Treasurers' Department. am in no doubt that if FAO increased its team from 23 to 36 professional staff this will imply a level of expenditure in excess of \$2.2 million per biennium after 1968. The level of expenditure might be about \$2.6 million per biennium and it is relevant to note that this was one of the conclusions in the first budget paper which was handed to us by FAO when they arrived in the Bank last week. (When we pointed this out Mr. Ergas asked that the paper be withdrawn and they have since reworked their figures.) There are two reasons for this opinion:

While expenditure during the current biennium could be held within \$2.2 million on account of the time required for the permanent team to reach 36 members, there is no doubt that to maintain a team at that level and to provide related services and travel costs would involve a continuing level of expenditure in excess of \$2.2 million.

2) We believe that some of the estimates presented by the FAO representatives are not realistic (c.f. Mr. Reamy's memo of May 3). For instance, the cost per man and the travel cost per month are underevaluated. There is no provision for contingencies, estimated staff costs do not include any provision for promotions or mandatory increases, etc.

If our position is that once we have agreed to an increased budget of \$2.2 million we need not be too much concerned with FAO decisions as to the size of the permanent team which FAO will have on the job, I would suggest that our views ought to be on record in the files and we should be aware that a position could arise in, say, early 1968 when it would be apparent that a team of 36 permanent staff members could not be maintained during the 1968-69 biennium without an increase in the budget beyond \$2.2 million. If the Bank were unwilling for the budget to be increased this might then mean that there would have to be some reduction in permanent team members.

We have discussed with Mr. Ergas the advantages of not increasing the team beyond 32 members but to increase the dependence on temporary consultants beyond the level proposed in the FAO budget. This he has been unwilling to do.

Cooperative Program with FAO

Miss Powell met with Messrs. de Lusignan and Bhattacharjee yesterday morning to receive FAO's revised budget for a full biennium with an estimated team strength of 36 professionals. The following estimates were provided:

We have the following comments:

Staff Costs

Professional

FAO's figure of \$1,386,000 appears to be under-estimated by approximately \$50,000 as follows:

Staff on payroll at February 28, 1966:

Monthly cost for 20 personnel per FAO's invoices

FAO's invoices \$ 31,975

Cost for biennium

(24 x \$31,975) \$767,400

Education grants and

travel (FAO's estimate) 36,000

Home leave travel

(FAO's estimate) 18,000 \$ 821,400

Total for 36 professional staff \$1,435,800

*The monthly cost of \$1,600 is FAO's estimate. It is presumably based on their "Standard Costs" for P.5 level. This standard cost includes an allowance for repatriation costs, education grants and travel and home leave costs. It should be noted that the average cost for P.5 level on the payroll at February 28, 1966 was \$1,673 exclusive of repatriation costs, education grants and travel and home leave costs.

General Service

We are not sure how the estimate of \$230,000 is calculated but the following appears to be a reasonable assumption:

Staff on payroll at February 28, 1966: Monthly cost for 19 personnel per FAO's invoices	\$ 7,231
Cost for biennium - $24 \times \$7,231$	\$173,544
Additional staff to be recruited - 5 at (say) \$380 per month * - Cost for biennium - 24 x 5 x \$380	45,600

*Average for personnel on February payroll.

Notes

- (1) The above estimates provide for 24 general service staff and 36 professional staff. We understand that in April 1966, there were 20 general service staff and 23 professional staff on the Team. Therefore, we must assume only 4 more general service staff are to be employed for 13 additional professional staff. It should also be noted that the above estimate of \$230,000 for general service staff includes an allowance of \$6,000 for overtime whereas costs in the last quarter of 1965 were already at the level of \$4,000 per annum with 18 general service staff working for only 19 professional staff.
- (2) The estimated staff costs (particularly for professional staff) do not include provision for annual or mandatory increases, promotions, additional allowances, etc.

Consultants

FAO has provided the following details:

FAO staff drawn from other divisions: 3 x 12 man-months p.a. @ \$20,000 p.a.

\$120,000

Outside consultants: 40 man-months p.a. @ \$1,200 per month

96,000

\$216,000

Travel

FAO has provided an estimate of \$15,000 per month for 24 months. It includes transportation and per diem costs for FAO missions, administrative travel to Washington and attendance at conferences. Costs for Bank missions are not charged to the Program. We understand that the figure of \$15,000 is based on 1965 costs and "the present trend". We doubt that this is a realistic approach; if the 1965 staff is to be almost doubled, we would assume a consequent increase in travel costs. We would also prefer to see an estimate based on the anticipated number of missions during a biennium with a separate calculation for administrative travel.

Contractual Services

These include costs for translation, printing (rental of a Xerox machine), hospitality, Compensation Plan Reserve Fund.

Conclusions

It is reasonable to assume that costs will not exceed the budget of \$2,200,000 for the current biennium 1966/67 as the full complement of 36 professional staff will not be attained until 1967.

Costs will almost certainly exceed the figure of \$2,200,000 in a biennium with a full team of 36 professional staff.

Bank/FAO Review Meeting

A meeting was held this morning between Messrs. Ergas, Bishop and Tellez of FAO and Messrs. Evans, Ballantine, Macris, Ramirez and Burt of the Bank.

Mr. Ergas referred to the draft minutes of the recent meeting held in Rome between representatives of FAO and the Bank and said that the new agreements contained therein will point the way for more effective cooperation between the two organizations. Full exchange of information on both sides is agreed and FAO would like to know the full program of the Bank and its policies in agricultural education.

Mr. Ergas then read out an extract from the minutes referred to above as they concerned agricultural education and also some of the opening paragraphs dealing with cooperation in general. (It was noted that he referred only to "agricultural education" and never to "agricultural training". It was also noted that FAO participation in appraisal missions was considered "desirable wherever possible".)

Mr. Ballantine, referring to the Bank program, said that some projects may come from foundations and it is this type of factor which may affect the Education Division pattern of operations. Bank interpretation of the wording of the draft minutes may therefore be affected.

Mr. Evans added that Bank obligations to Unesco may also affect interpretation of the draft minutes.

Mr. Ergas recapitulated part of the draft minutes as follows: complete exchange of information on both sides; consultation to be continuous at all stages of the work; FAO to participate in as many appraisal missions as possible.

Mr. Evans said that FAO participation in missions referred to the use of FAO staff members. It is not necessarily useful for FAO to supply a consultant. Further, the Bank is only required to consult FAO and it is the Bank which will take decisions.

Mr. Ballantine then discussed the Sierra Leone situation, explaining that the revised project had to include items which could be appraised in about six months.

Mr. Tellez said that the inclusion of agricultural education in the second project might cause a delay of two years and FAO should have been informed before such a decision was made.

Mr. Ballantine repeated that the division was necessary to avoid

long delays. Also, the second part of the project had been put aside to avoid pressures by the Sierra Leone government to include the item in the first part.

Mr. Ergas requested information on the new Bank policy for higher education and Mr. Ballantine then gave full details of this development.

Mr. Ergas suggested that Mr. Ballantine should meet Mr. Kimmel, possibly in Nicaragua, to which Mr. Ballantine agreed if it were practicable.

Mr. Ballantine and Mr. Ergas then discussed universities in general and those of Erzerum and Patras in particular.

Mr. Ergas said that his next general question referred to the policies for different countries. Different policies should apply in different areas, e.g., there should be different emphases at different levels of education and training according to the country. FAO would place greater emphasis on countries in Africa and Latin America.

Mr. Ballantine said that each country's needs are viewed against its existing background. In general, the Bank supports as much as can be used by the country. Mr. Evans said that high priority is always given to agriculture but cases occur where the Area Department is unable to find the IDA funds needed.

Mr. Ergas argued that FAO is not simply the technical arm of the Bank but is involved in both the technical assistance and the financing and Mr. Aldewereld will shortly inform the Division accordingly. Referring to reconnaissance missions, he said that Mr. Bishop is going to West Africa and will look out for possible projects. Later Mr. Tellez will go to a number of countries to see what is in progress and to inform the local FAO experts about Bank procedures. He then suggested a country review with Area Departments represented.

Mr. Bishop said that reconnaissance mission members informed FAO experts on UNSF and other projects regarding possible Bank aid but they never indicate that aid will definitely be available.

Mr. Ballantine said that it would be better to have a preliminary review before a full country review with Area is arranged.

A country review between FAO representatives and the Education Division was arranged for 9 a.m. on Friday, April 29, after which the meeting was adjourned.

I. Points of General Importance

- 1. The meeting re-stated three basic premises underlining the approach to the discussions:
 - (a) the objective of the Programme is the common task of promoting the agricultural development of member countries;
 - (b) the Programme has proved worthwhile and the intention is to increase its scope and effectiveness;
 - (c) the partnership between FAO and the Bank is a full and equal partnership; this implies consultation at all stages of the work, as is recognized in the Agreement.
- 2. Responsibilities of the two agencies have been set forth in the Agreement. FAO normally has responsibility for identification and preparation of projects and the Bank for their appraisal and supervision. However, it is recognized that there is no intention of creating watertight compartments. The objective is for the two institutions to work together in all phases of the task and it is desirable for members of each institution to participate fully in missions which are the responsibility of the other. FAO will continue to be kept fully informed of all the Bank's activities in the field of agriculture.

Relations with Governments

- 3. FAO has been presented with an increasing volume of requests from member Gover ments for missions to assist in project identification and preparation. Where FAO and the Bank both feel that promising projects are likely to emerge as a result of these missions, the Bank will normally agree to these missions although it is recognized that for reasons of general policy exceptions may occur.
- 4. The Bank will consult with FAO before communicating with Governments on matters in which the Programme has been involved or in which Programme involvement is specifically contemplated.

II. Fields of Cooperation and Functions of the FAO/IBRD Cooperative Programme

Identification Missions

General

- 5. FAO will organize with Bank agreement, as part of its routine activities under the Programme, short reconnaissance visits to countries where it has field programmes.
- 6. Brief stopovers of FAO personnel en route to or from agreed missions will not require prior agreement from the Bank.

Specific

- 7. Since identification missions fall under several categories, the nature of the work and the size and composition of such missions will vary from case to case.
- 8. There may be cases where large identification missions are necessary, but the Bank feels that in most cases such missions should be small.
- 9. Except for stopovers, as mentioned in paragraph 6, the Bank and FAO will agree in all identification missions on the general objectives of the mission, the general nature of the work, the approximate duration and the approximate size and composition. Detailed arrangements for implementation will be left to FAO's discretion.

Preparation Missions

10. This most important activity of the programme, and one for which FAO normally has responsibility, requires a flexible case by case approach.

11. It is agreed that:

- (a) the government of the country concerned shall be associated as fully as possible with the missions, and for this purpose full consultation is required with all agencies interested in the project;
- (b) one of the objectives of assistance in project preparation is the training of government officials in this work;
- (c) in many cases there may have to be more than one visit to a country to help the government prepare a particular project;
- (d) in order to enable adequate formulation and review of the proposed project, a short but integrated report is necessary.
- 12. Both organizations agree to consult, at whatever level may be necessary, to keep to a minimum disagreements on the nature, scope and arrangements required for assistance in project preparation. This will also apply to work undertaken by or with regional offices in so far as identification and preparation are concerned.

- 13. It will be the concern of both organizations to minimize the risk of disagreement between an FAO Preparation Mission under the Programme, and a Bank Appraisal Mission.
- 14. The provisions referred to in paragraph 9 concerning arrangements for identification missions, apply also to preparation missions.

Appraisal Missions

- 15. FAO will continue to be informed of all appraisal missions planned by the Bank, and it is desirable that it participates in such missions as often as possible.
- 16. FAO has been encouraged by the Bank to make its views known fully and promptly on any project presented to the Bank for appraisal in which it has special interest.
- 17. In those cases where FAO is invited to participate in appraisal missions, FAO will continue to have all the background information on such missions in good time before the appraisal.
- 18. When the Bank appraises projects identified by FAO, or projects in whose preparation FAO has been involved, the Bank will take full account of FAO's views at all stages of the appraisal and care will be taken not to give any contrary impression to governments.
- 19. Where certain aspects of a project in the categories covered by paragraph 18 run counter to Bank policy either for specific or general reasons, an exchange of views will take place between the FAO and the Bank. It is understood that such an exchange would be most useful at the identification or preparation stage.

End-Use Lissions

20. It is desirable that FAO participation in end-use missions be increased.

Technical Assistance

21. The Agreement covers the granting by the Bank only of technical assistance for implementation of projects. It is recognized that it will often also be desirable for FAC to be associated with the Bank in technical assistance related to the preparation of agricultural projects. In these cases appropriate provision will be made for overhead expenditures incurred by FAC.

Economic Review Missions

.22. FAO's interest in economic review missions is recognized and FAO's participation in these missions will generally be invited.

- 23. FAC will be kept informed of all relevant facts and background information regarding the reviews and will, wherever possible, be consulted on the terms of reference and composition insofar as these affect the agricultural sector.
- 24. With the exception of missions to Latin American countries, the Bank will make every effort to arrange for the chief of mission or the chief economist to stop over in Rome. For missions to Latin America, visits to FAO's Santiago Regional Office are recognized as desirable.
- 25. The first draft of the agricultural sector report will as often as possible be prepared in Rome.

Agricultural Review Missions

- 26. Agricultural review missions which are jointly sponsored by both organizations come under the Cooperative Programme. The Bank will normally request joint sponsorship with FAO of any agricultural review missions which it is asked to undertake. The two organizations will agree on the composition and membership of the mission, including the leader.
- 27. As an experimental measure it is agreed that operational responsibility for agricultural review missions organized under the Programme will be vested in a two-man Steering Committee with one member from each organization. The mission chief will report regularly to this Steering Committee.
- 28. All official advice and instructions to mission members, except the provision of technical data, will be channelled through the Steering Committee and the mission chief.

Education Wasions

- 29. The Bank will keep FAO and UNESCO fully and simultaneously informed of its current and planned activities of interest to agricultural education, and consult with FAO on agricultural education matters.
- 30. The PAO will bring to the Bank's attention agricultural education projects which it considers of potential interest to the Bank.
- 31. In cases where UNESCO and FAO do not agree as to whether a mission in agricultural education is to be an FAO or a UNESCO responsibility, the Bank will have to make the decision, normally after calling a tripartite meeting. In making its decision the Bank will bear in mind that projects in agricultural education need to be seen against the background both of the overall education system of the country and of the requirements of the agricultural sector for trained manpower for development.
- 32. Regular reviews of potential activities in agricultural education will be undertaken.

III. The Means of Cooperation

33. All efforts will be made to secure a common approach for the evaluation of the agricultural sector and the appraisal of agricultural development projects. To achieve this, discussions on economic aspects of agricultural sector appraisal, which have been initiated with a Sub-Committee of the Benk's Economic Committee, will continue. Technical checklists to be used as points of reference in project work will be jointly elaborated.

Consultation on Specific Points of Importance to FAO Participation

Planning of Missions

34. Ad hoc planning of missions should be reduced to a minimum and it is hoped that the procedure which has recently been initiated by the Bank, to draw up schedules of economic review missions six months in advance, will contribute to this.

Contacts with Governments prior to Missions

35. FAO will inform the governments concerned in due time of missions for which it has responsibility under the Programme and make fullest use of its Country Representatives in the process. The Bank will also notify the Government of such missions.

Access to Information

36. All relevant information on missions in which FAO participates will be made available to FAO in due time.

Briefing and Debriefing of Missions

37. Care will be taken to ensure that sufficient time is given to briefing and debriefing in Rome of all missions of FAO concern, with the exception of those concerned with Latin America. In the latter case, visits to the FAO!
Santiago office will be arranged whenever practicable.

Visits from Bank Staff

38. The desirability of visits to FAO by Bank staff from all Departments is recognised and vice versa.

Access to Reports of Bank Missions and opportunity to commont at an early stage

39. The Bank sends to FAO reports of concern to it at the same time as they are sent to working parties in the Bank or to the Economic Committee. FAO will comment promptly on these reports, if necessary by cable. Where substantive issues arise, the organizations will arrange for immediate discussions to resolve these.

Accordance of FAO and IBRD Staff on Missions of Common Interest

- 40. Although the Agreement does not cover any reference to the need for consultations between FAO and the Bank on the appointment of FAO staff on Bank missions, the FAO is willing to supply general information and consult with the Bank on the staff it appoints to such missions.
- 41. It is agreed that every effort will be made to keep queries on FAO regular staff to a minimum.
- 42. The Bank will consult FAO on the appointment of agricultural consultants on economic review missions in which FAO is participating and on appraisal missions of projects identified or prepared with FAO assistance.
- 43. It is desirable that FAO participate in appraisal of projects in the preparation of which it has been involved.

Use of Panel of Consultants

44. It is desirable that the use of ad hoc outside consultants should be kept to a minimum. For this purpose FAO has established a panel of consultants.

Use and Consultation of FAO Field Personnel

- 45. It is desirable that Bank Missions consult with FAO field personnel.
- 46. FAO Regional Office staff, to the extent possible, will be made available to work on missions in the areas of their concern.

Cooperation with the Bank's regional offices in Africa

- 47. It is recognized that very close contact and liaison shall be maintained between FAO and the Bank's regional offices in Africa. In order to ensure effective cooperation, it is agreed that:
 - (i) the programme of these offices will be fully discussed periodically with FAO insofar as identification and preparation of agricultural projects are concerned;
 - (ii) FAO will have access at the same time as the Bank, to the reports from these offices dealing with matters which are FAO's concern;
 - (iii) regular visits from staff of these offices will be made to FAO Headquarters, and FAO's staff on the Programme will visit the Regional Offices whenever possible.
 - (iv) FAO Personnel attached to these offices will report to FAO fully and regularly (once a month) on their activities, through the Director of the Office, who will promptly forward such reports with any comments he may have. Similarly, FAO's views or advice on policy or operational natters relating to the Programme will be addressed to the FAO Personnel through the Director of the Office.

IV. FAO/IBRD Cooperative Programme Budget

48. In view of the mandatory increases, and the increasing work in the Programme, FAO has proposed that the Budget for the 1966-67 biennium be raised from US\$1.8 million to US\$2.2 million. The Bank is receptive to this proposal subject to an examination of the trends of expenditures and to approval by the Board of Directors.

V. Fields of Interest Because of Current Developments

Closer Bank Association with Special Fund Projects

49. The Bank expressed an interest in being more closely associated, in cooperation with the Programme team, with Special Fund projects being carried out by FAO as executing agency, with a view to orienting either part or the whole of such projects towards investment. To the extent possible, Bank staff will be associated with Programme staff in consultations on such projects either at FAO Headquarters or in the field. FAO takes note that the Bank will in specific cases be asked by the Special Fund to comment on projects for which the FAO is the executing agency at various stages of implementation. Where feasible, such comments will be formulated in consultation with the Programme.

General (Items V, VII and VIII of Agenda)

50. Discussions were also held on matters of mutual concern, including fertilizers, commodities work, East Pakistan master plan and a proposed study on agricultural financing for the Second World Food Congress.

Dear Henry,

Robin Bishop is leaving this afternoon for Rome and I therefore thought I would take advantage of his return to Rome and write you setting out a number of outstanding points we have on the program:

1. BURUNDI - Identification (Re: your cable April 7)

We have a suggested change to your proposed Terms of reference for the Heymans, Coccioli and Kluit mission in paragraph 1:

"Have general discussions with the Government in light initial contacts of Nairobi office, particularly on programs related to agricultural development on Lakeside area and eventually on Mosso Plains. Crops to be considered seem prima facie oil palm, cotton and tobacco. Possibilities for the improvement of cattle raising should also be considered".

The Bank has not received a formal request from the Government for this mission. Would you confirm by cable that you have received word from the Government that they are ready to receive this particular mission and that the proposed timing is convenient to them.

2. FIJI (Re: your cable April 7)

We have considered your draft letter to Mr. Major and have only one comment to make. In the third paragraph, you say that FAO does not propose to "finalize the report" at this stage. I think this is a little misleading, since the report which you have sent to Fiji is, in fact, a final report not subject to change. Perhaps you would want to reword this to indicate that your report is not a draft and that the next stage is the preparation of Strong's report.

3. BROCHU (Re: your cable April 7)

We are pleased to learn that you propose to extend Brochu's contract until September 30. We would like to suggest, and think it important, that his replacement should have arrived in Abijan so as to overlap with Brochu by about two months. This would mean that the replacement should be available to go to Abijan at the end of July or early August.

4. MAURITANIA - Economic (Re: your cable April 6)

I understand from Time that Aubray will be available for this mission for more than three weeks and could in fact spend four weeks in the field and two weeks report writing. Our main concern was that, if Aubray was to go to Las Palmas for two weeks, he would then only be available for two weeks in Mauritania, and this would obviously be inadequate. His participation on the basis of being available for four weeks in the field is welcomed by us. I am not entirely clear as to whether you are proposing that Meschkat, who I understand will only be available to the mission for a very short period, should be a member of the mission or merely be available to Aubray for consultation. It would obviously be advantageous for Aubray to tap Meschkat's knowledge of the area and local conditions.

5. YUGOSLAVIA - Eonomic (Re: your cable April 6)

We agree with your suggestion that Mouton should spend four to five days in Rome for discussions with FAO before coming to Washington for report writing with the rest of the mission.

6. GREECE - Edonomic (Re: your cable April 6)

Tommy Thompson is most anxious that Hancock be in Rome for briefing of the mission not later than Monday, April 18. We therefore suggest that Hancock return to Rome directly from Perulduring the preceding weekend. I think it more important that Hancock be in Rome for the Greek briefing than that he come to Washington for a couple of days' discussions on his other work.

7. MALAYSIA - Fisheries (Re: your cable April 6)

We would, of course, have no objection to Beever taking advantage of his presence in India to make a short visit to Kuala Lumpur. However, I should point out that it will probably be difficult for him to have successful discussions with the Government, since we understand that practically all of the people in the Economic Planning Unit will be away from Kuala Lumpur from mid-April to Mid-May. The Economic Planning Unit

will be making a tour of the Consultative Group countries before the meeting in London on May 17-18.

Peter Reid, who is in the Bank today, has asked me to tell you that they both hope to leave early next week and would like their mail forwarded to their Sydney address.

One administrative point we would appreciate your completing for us. Tim has already written to Guy de Lusignan asking for an upto-date list of the program team and staff. Would you also please let us have the dates on which the new members of the team actually joined the program. The last list which we have received from you is dated December 1, and I think we should receive more regular lists of the team so that we can keep our Treasurers Department properly informed.

- (iii) We both agree that it is desirable that Program staff participate more frequently in appraisal and end-use supervision missions;
- (iv) There are a good number of project ideas which emerge from economic reviews and identification missions, which need a systematic follow-through.

Even with an establishment of 31, it would be impossible to carry this workload, particularly in view of the fact that our staff has been heavily overstrained, and that our team members are already travelling for more than six months a year.

I attach a further copy of our budget proposals, and in doing so, I should like to refer to Mr. Reamy's memorandum dated 11 March. You will have noticed that our statement on expenditures for the biennium 1964/65 more or less agreed with Statement A of this memorandum.

A question arises on the estimated expenditure for the first two months of 1966 which, according to Mr. Reamy's statement amounts to \$60,309. We consider this an underestimate. We are not in a position to give you actual figures of expenditures for the simple reason that FAO's accounting system does not give a breakdown of expenses for the first three months of the fiscal year, but a total statement at 31 March and a monthly statement thereafter. We have nevertheless obtained the payroll figures for January and February, covering salaries of staff members and consultants, medical and pension costs (but excluding other staff costs such as education grant and travel, home leave travel, installation allowance, etc.) and these figures already total \$88,748.59. This sum covers only filled posts to date, that is 20 professionals and general service, and of course expenditure for the other staff costs, travel and contractual services (mainly consulting firms such as BDPA) should be added. So far, we have committed for travel and contractual services \$53,472.

Furthermore, I should underline that, as you are undoubtedly aware, January is usually a slack month, particularly where travel is concerned. We believe, in fact, that if one were to gross up the figures to a threemonth total we would come to an amount close to our estimated cost of \$226,500. Thereafter our expenditure is likely to increase substantially.

For the discussions on the Bank's regional offices, Mr. El Emary and Mr. Matter of the Bank were also present.

(The agenda for the discussions is shown in Annex)

I. Points of General Importance

- 1. The meeting re-stated three basic premises underlining the approach to the discussions:
 - (a) the objective of the Programme is the common task of promoting the agricultural development of member countries;
 - (b) the Programme has proved worthwhile and the intention is to increase its scope and effectiveness;
 - (c) the partnership between FAO and the Bank is a full and equal partnership; this implies consultation at all stages of the work, as is recognized in the Agreement.
- 2. Responsibilities of the two agencies have been set forth in the Agreement. FAO normally has responsibility for identification and preparation of projects and the Bank for their appraisal and supervision. However, it is recognized that there is no intention of creating watertight compartments. The objective is for the two institutions to work together in all phases of the task and it is desirable for members of each institution to participate fully in missions which are the responsibility of the other. FAO will continue to be kept fully informed of all the Bank's activities in the field of agriculture.

Relations with Governments

- 3. FAO has been presented with an increasing volume of requests from member Governments for missions to assist in project identification and preparation. Where FAO and the Bank both feel that promising projects are likely to emerge as a result of these missions, the Bank will normally agree to these missions although it is recognized that for reasons of general policy exceptions may occur.
- 4. The Bank will consult with FAO before communicating with Governments on matters in which the Programme has been involved or in which Programme involvement is specifically contemplated.

II. Fields of Cooperation and Functions of the FAO/IBRD Cooperative Programme

Identification Missions

General

- 5. FAO will organize with Bank agreement, as part of its routine activities under the Programme, short reconnaissance visits to countries where it has field programmes.
- 6. Brief stopovers of FAO personnel en route to or from agreed missions will not require prior agreement from the Bank.

Specific

- 7. Since identification missions fall under several categories, the nature of the work and the size and composition of such missions will vary from case to case.
- 8. There may be cases where large identification missions are necessary, but the Bank feels that in most cases such missions should be small.
- 9. Except for stopovers, as mentioned in paragraph 6, the Bank and FAO will agree in all identification missions on the general objectives of the mission, the general nature of the work, the approximate duration and the approximate size and composition. Detailed arrangements for implementation will be left to FAO's discretion.

Preparation Missions

- 10. This most important activity of the programme, and one for which FAO normally has responsibility, requires a flexible case by case approach.
- 11. It is agreed that:
 - (a) the government of the country concerned shall be associated as fully as possible with the missions, and for this purpose full consultation is required with all agencies interested in the project;
 - (b) one of the objectives of assistance in project preparation is the training of government officials in this work;
 - (c) in many cases there may have to be more than one visit to a country to help the government prepare a particular project;
 - (d) in order to enable adequate formulation and review of the proposed project, a short but integrated report is necessary.
- 12. Both organizations agree to consult, at whatever level may be necessary, to keep to a minimum disagreements on the nature, scope and arrangements required for assistance in project preparation. This will also apply to work undertaken by or with regional offices in so far as identification and preparation are concerned.

- 13. It will be the concern of both organizations to minimize the risk of disagreement between an FAO Preparation Mission under the Programme, and a Bank Appraisal Mission.
- 14. The provisions referred to in paragraph 9 concerning arrangements for identification missions, apply also to preparation missions.

Appraisal Missions

- 15. FAO will continue to be informed of all appraisal missions planned by the Bank, and it is desirable that it participates in such missions as often as possible.
- 16. FAO has been encouraged by the Bank to make its views known fully and promptly on any project presented to the Bank for appraisal in which it has special interest.
- 17. In those cases where FAO is invited to participate in appraisal missions, FAO will continue to have all the background information on such missions in good time before the appraisal.
- 18. When the Bank appraises projects identified by FAO, or projects in whose preparation FAO has been involved, the Bank will take full account of FAO's views at all stages of the appraisal and care will be taken not to give any contrary impression to governments.
- 19. Where certain aspects of a project in the categories covered by paragraph 18 run counter to Bank policy either for specific or general reasons, an exchange of views will take place between the FAO and the Bank. It is understood that such an exchange would be most useful at the identification or preparation stage.

End-Use Missions

20. It is desirable that FAO participation in end-use missions be increased.

Technical Assistance

21. The Agreement covers the granting by the Bank only of technical assistance for implementation of projects. It is recognized that it will often also be desirable for FAO to be associated with the Bank in technical assistance related to the preparation of agricultural projects. In these cases appropriate provision will be made for overhead expenditures incurred by FAO.

Economic Review Missions

22. FAO's interest in economic review missions is recognized and FAO's participation in these missions will generally be invited.

- 23. FAO will be kept informed of all relevant facts and background information regarding the reviews and will, wherever possible, be consulted on the terms of reference and composition insofar as these affect the agricultural sector.
- 24. With the exception of missions to Latin American countries, the Bank will make every effort to arrange for the chief of mission or the chief economist to stop over in Rome. For missions to Latin America, visits to FAO's Santiago Regional Office are recognized as desirable.
- 25. The first draft of the agricultural sector report will as often as possible be prepared in Rome.

Agricultural Review Missions

- 26. Agricultural review missions which are jointly sponsored by both organizations come under the Cooperative Programme. The Bank will normally request joint sponsorship with FAO of any agricultural review missions which it is asked to undertake. The two organizations will agree on the composition and membership of the mission, including the leader.
- 27. As an experimental measure it is agreed that operational responsibility for agricultural review missions organized under the Programme will be vested in a two-man Steering Committee with one member from each organization. The mission chief will report regularly to this Steering Committee.
- 28. All official advice and instructions to mission members, except the provision of technical data, will be channelled through the Steering Committee and the mission chief.

Education Missions

- 29. The Bank will keep FAO and UNESCO fully and simultaneously informed of its current and planned activities of interest to agricultural education, and consult with FAO on agricultural education matters.
- 30. The FAC will bring to the Bank's attention agricultural education projects which it considers of potential interest to the Bank.
- 31. In cases where UNESCO and FAO do not agree as to whether a mission in agricultural education is to be an FAO or a UNESCO responsibility, the Bank will have to make the decision; normally after calling a tripartite meeting. In making its decision the Bank will bear in mind that projects in agricultural education need to be seen against the background both of the overall education system of the country and of the requirements of the agricultural sector for trained manpower for development.
- 32. Regular reviews of potential activities in agricultural education will be undertaken.

III. The Means of Cooperation

33. All efforts will be made to secure a common approach for the evaluation of the agricultural sector and the appraisal of agricultural development projects. To achieve this, discussions on economic aspects of agricultural sector appraisal, which have been initiated with a Sub-Committee of the Bank's Economic Committee, will continue. Technical checklists to be used as points of reference in project work will be jointly elaborated.

Consultation on Specific Points of Importance to FAO Participation

Planning of Missions

34. Ad hoc planning of missions should be reduced to a minimum and it is hoped that the procedure which has recently been initiated by the Bank, to draw up schedules of economic review missions six months in advance, will contribute to this.

Contacts with Governments prior to Missions

35. FAO will inform the governments concerned in due time of missions for which it has responsibility under the Programme and make fullest use of its Country Representatives in the process. The Bank will also notify the Government of such missions.

Access to Information

36. All relevant information on missions in which FAO participates will be made available to FAO in due time.

Briefing and Debriefing of Missions

37. Care will be taken to ensure that sufficient time is given to briefing and debriefing in Rome of all missions of FAO concern, with the exception of those concerned with Latin America. In the latter case, visits to the FAO's
Santiago office will be arranged whenever practicable.

Visits from Bank Staff

38. The desirability of visits to FAO by Bank staff from all Departments is recognised and vice versa.

Access to Reports of Bank Missions and opportunity to comment at an early stage

39. The Bank sends to FAO reports of concern to it at the same time as they are sent to working parties in the Bank or to the Economic Committee. FAO will comment promptly on these reports, if necessary by cable. Where substantive issues arise, the organizations will arrange for immediate discussions to resolve these.

Acceptance of FAO and IBRD Staff on Missions of Common Interest

- 40. Although the Agreement does not cover any reference to the need for consultations between FAO and the Bank on the appointment of FAO staff on Bank missions, the FAO is willing to supply general information and consult with the Bank on the staff it appoints to such missions.
- 41. It is agreed that every effort will be made to keep queries on FAO regular staff to a minimum.
- 42. The Bank will consult FAO on the appointment of agricultural consultants on economic review missions in which FAO is participating and on appraisal missions of projects identified or prepared with FAO assistance.
- 43. It is desirable that FAO participate in appraisal of projects in the preparation of which it has been involved.

Use of Panel of Consultants

44. It is desirable that the use of ad hoc outside consultants should be kept to a minimum. For this purpose FAO has established a panel of consultants.

Use and Consultation of FAO Field Personnel

- 45. It is desirable that Bank Missions consult with FAO field personnel.
- 46. FAO Regional Office staff, to the extent possible, will be made available to work on missions in the areas of their concern.

Cooperation with the Bank's regional offices in Africa

- 47. It is recognized that very close contact and liaison shall be maintained between FAO and the Bank's regional offices in Africa. In order to ensure effective cooperation, it is agreed that:
 - (i) the programme of these offices will be fully discussed periodically with FAO insofar as identification and preparation of agricultural projects are concerned;
 - (ii) FAO will have access at the same time as the Bank, to the reports from these offices dealing with matters which are FAO's concern:
 - (iii) regular visits from staff of these offices will be made to FAO Headquarters, and FAO's staff on the Programme will visit the Regional Offices whenever possible.
 - (iv) FAO Personnel attached to these offices will report to FAO fully and regularly (once a month) on their activities, through the Director of the Office, who will promptly forward such reports with any comments he may have. Similarly, FAO's views or advice on policy or operational matters relating to the Programme will be addressed to the FAO Personnel through the Director of the Office.

IV. FAO/IBRD Cooperative Programme Budget

48. In view of the mandatory increases, and the increasing work in the Programme, FAO has proposed that the Budget for the 1966-67 biennium be raised from US\$1.8 million to US\$2.2 million. The Bank is receptive to this proposal subject to an examination of the trends of expenditures and to approval by the Board of Directors.

V. Fields of Interest Because of Current Developments

Closer Bank Association with Special Fund Projects

49. The Bank expressed an interest in being more closely associated, in cooperation with the Programme team, with Special Fund projects being carried out by FAO as executing agency, with a view to orienting either part or the whole of such projects towards investment. To the extent possible, Bank staff will be associated with Programme staff in consultations on such projects either at FAO Headquarters or in the field. FAO takes note that the Bank will in specific cases be asked by the Special Fund to comment on projects for which the FAO is the executing agency at various stages of implementation. Where feasible, such comments will be formulated in consultation with the Programme.

General (Items V, VII and VIII of Agenda)

50. Discussions were also held on matters of mutual concern, including fertilizers, commodities work, East Pakistan master plan and a proposed study on agricultural financing for the Second World Food Congress.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH RESPECT TO WORKING ARRANGEMENTS

BETWEEN THE FOOD AND AGRICULTURE ORGANIZATION OF THE

UNITED NATIONS AND THE INTERNATIONAL BANK FOR

RECONSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT AND THE

INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT ASSOCIATION

FAO and the Bank* have for many years been cooperating on an ad hoc basis on matters of common concern. Now that the Bank intends to put more emphasis than hitherto on schemes for improvement of agricultural production, which are of equal concern to FAO, this cooperation will have to be intensified. It accordingly appears desirable both to FAO and the Bank that working arrangements be agreed upon setting forth the principles to govern such cooperation.

These working arrangements, as agreed upon by the Director-General of FAO and the President of the Bank subject to the approvals specified in paragraph 7 hereof, are as follows:

1. The Cooperative Program

FAO and the Bank will cooperate together in the following fields:

- (a) Assisting countries of common membership in the identification and preparation of agricultural projects of types which fall within the framework of the economic development objectives and general policies of the Bank and FAO and which the Bank is willing to consider for financing (including projects for agricultural education falling within FAO's field of responsibility).
- (b) Appraising projects of the foregoing types.
- (c) Providing end-use supervision of the execution and operation of Bank-financed projects.
- (d) Arranging for technical assistance required for the implementation of Bank-financed projects.

Assistance to member governments in agricultural planning is recognized as an important foundation for investment programs in the long term. Insofar as this type of activity is carried out by FAO as part of its Regular or other programs, it is the sole responsibility of FAO. However, in cases agreed with the Bank where FAO carries out this type of activity at the request of the Bank or in cooperation with the Bank, the activity will be part of the cooperative program.

2. Allocation of Functions within the Cooperative Program

(a) Assistance to Governments in Identification and Preparation of Projects

(i) At FAO initiative

FAO will bring to the notice of the Bank projects which appear suitable for Bank financing arising from FAO's activities, whether under its Regular or other programs.

All references in this memorandum to the Bank shall be taken to include both the Bank and the International Development Association.

The Bank will advise FAO whether such projects are prima facie suitable for consideration for financing, and if so, what further action, if any, needs to be taken in order to prepare such projects for appraisal. Moreover, where, in the course of its own activities, FAO wishes the assistance of the Bank in determining whether a project is likely to qualify for Bank or other external financing, or what further steps are necessary to prepare it for appraisal, the Bank will provide such assistance, assuming staff resources permit, either by way of review of the project at Bank headquarters or by participating in the field work.

(ii) At Bank initiative

The general survey missions organized by the Bank may include among their functions the identification of promising projects in various sectors. The Bank will normally look to FAO to provide, as part of the cooperative program, staff members or consultants to serve as advisers to such missions. These advisers will participate in defining priority fields and major projects for investment in agriculture in the framework of over-all development objectives. Missions of this type will be briefed by both the Bank and FAO and both organizations will review and comment upon the draft reports of such missions.

In addition to these general survey missions, the Bank periodically sends smaller missions to a member country to review the country's economic situation and to assess the possibilities for Bank financing. Such economic missions usually make a preliminary selection among projects submitted by the government, and may sometimes suggest that the government work up a specific project for Bank consideration. The Bank will advise FAO of all such missions on which it is proposed to include an agricultural member, and will normally arrange for such missions to consult with FAO with regard to agricultural investment priorities and possible projects. In agreed cases, FAO will provide, as part of the cooperative program, a staff member or consultant to serve as agricultural adviser to such a mission.

Where, in the opinion of the Bank, a project not yet ready for appraisal is sufficiently promising to warrant further preparation, and the government in question has requested assistance in such preparation, FAO will normally provide such assistance as part of the cooperative program.

(iii) General

In all work connected with the identification and preparation of projects falling under the cooperative program, FAO and the Bank will maintain continuing consultation in order that they may agree on a work program and on the priorities to be assigned to different projects, and in

order to minimize the possibilities of substantive disagreement. The support of headquarters facilities will at all times be given to Bank and FAO staff and consultants engaged in work under the cooperative program.

(b) Appraisal of Projects

The Bank will be responsible for the appraisal of projects, upon the basis of which its financing decisions are made. However, at the request of the Bank, FAO will provide, as part of the cooperative program, staff members or consultants to serve as agricultural advisers on Bank appraisal missions.

(c) End-Use Supervision of Bank-Financed Projects

The Bank will be responsible for disbursement of funds and the end-use supervision of the construction and maintenance of physical facilities, and to this end will be responsible for such review as may be appropriate of the specifications, bids, and awards of contracts, and for whatever inspections of the project are necessary in this connection. FAO will, in cases agreed with the Bank, assume responsibility as part of the cooperative program, to ascertain, both through field inspections and through review of periodic reports, and to advise the Bank whether the agricultural objectives of the project are being achieved, and in particular whether the obligations undertaken by the borrower in this regard are being fulfilled. The results of FAO's end-use work on the agricultural aspects of Bank-financed projects will be made available to the Bank and, in the event that representations to the borrower should be necessary on agricultural matters, FAO and the Bank will consult together on how they might best be made.

(d) Technical Assistance in Project Implementation

In cases agreed with the Bank, FAO will provide or arrange for and will exercise appropriate supervision over technical assistance required for the direct implementation of a Bankfinanced project.

3. Personnel

It is agreed that the cooperative program requires a team of specialized personnel of high caliber within the FAO secretariat which can devote
itself continuously to this work (hereafter referred to for purposes of this
Memorandum as "FAO team"). The Director-General of FAO will therefore make
provision for such a team to be established as an identifiable group within
the FAO secretariat. FAO and the Bank will agree from time to time on the
appropriate size of the FAO team and on the types and classifications of
positions to be included within the team, and the Director-General of FAO will
consult with the Bank on the appointment of professional staff to the team.

The FAO team, although it will be devoted full time to work in connection with the cooperative program, will be an integral part of the FAO secretariat and will operate under the exclusive authority of the Director-

General of FAO. Both FAO and the Bank agree that it is desirable that the hard core of the team should to the greatest possible extent be composed of existing FAO staff members. However, it is recognized that for a variety of reasons new staff and ad hoc consultants will be necessary, both in the initial phases of cooperation and as the program expands, although generally maximum care will be taken to secure continuity in employment. It is also recognized that it will be necessary and desirable from time to time to use FAO staff members outside the team for purposes of the cooperative program.

In cases where FAO intends to appoint an outside consultant to serve as agricultural adviser to a Bank mission, or to provide technical assistance in the implementation of a Bank-financed project, it will consult with the Bank as to the person to be appointed.

4. Financial Arrangements

- (a) Subject to the qualifications set forth below, the direct costs of FAO in connection with agreed work under the program, including salaries, allowances and other benefits and travel costs of the FAO team, of outside consultants and of other FAO staff members assigned to such work, will be shared equally by FAO and the Bank up to a ceiling figure to be fixed from time to time by agreement between the two organizations.
- (b) The travel and subsistence expenses of FAO staff members and consultants while serving as members of Bank appraisal, general survey or other missions, will be borne or provided for by the Bank.
- (c) FAO will pay for invisible overhead costs, including space, and for identifiable indirect costs (except as provided in sub-paragraphs (d) and (e)) involved in its participation in the cooperative program.
- (d) The Bank will bear the cost of document reproduction and translation undertaken by FAO in agreement with the Bank.
- (e) The cost of technical assistance directly required for the implementation of Bank-financed projects, including an amount for FAO's estimated administrative costs in arranging for such technical assistance in cases agreed with the Bank, will be paid for out of the proceeds of the financing or will be otherwise met by the Bank. The amount for estimated administrative costs will be 12 percent of the direct cost of such technical assistance except where technical assistance is provided under contract between FAO and some outside entity, in which event the amount will be fixed by agreement between FAO and the Bank.
- (f) It is recognized that the calendar years 1964 and 1965, which comprise FAO's present budgetary biennium, are a transitional period during which FAO's contribution is limited by its existing budget. For those years, the agreed ceiling figure for purposes of sub-paragraph (a) above, to be shared equally by the two organizations, will be \$400,000 for the biennium. FAO's costs in excess of this amount will be met by the Bank, provided that FAO will not incur or commit itself to incur costs in excess of \$800,000 (the presently estimated cost of the cooperative program) during the biennium without the prior approval of the Bank.

- (g) Continuation of the program beyond December 31, 1965, will be subject to mutual agreement in the light of experience and to the decision of FAO's 1965 Conference. It is intended, however, that if the program is continued, the ceiling figure to be agreed upon for purposes of sub-paragraph (a) above for periods after December 31, 1965, will be an amount reflecting the principle of cost-sharing set forth in said sub-paragraph (a).
- (h) The Bank and FAO will agree on the procedures for payment of funds from the Bank to FAO, and for accounting to the Bank by FAO, in connection with the cooperative program, including, if possible, provision for a working fund out of which the expenses of the program can be met.

5. Relations with other Agencies

Where the Bank looks to any outside agency for assistance in connection with agricultural projects, that agency will normally be FAO. However, there may be cases where, because of the type of project involved or because of special circumstances, it would be appropriate and desirable for the Bank to look to some other agency, public or private, to perform some or all of the functions which FAO would ordinarily perform under these Working Arrangements. It is agreed that in all such cases the Bank will consult FAO on the action it proposes to take. It is also agreed that the Bank will not subject FAO's advice on agricultural matters within its competence and covered by the cooperative program to review by any outside agency.

6. Modification and Termination

These Working Arrangements may be modified or supplemented at any time by mutual agreement between the two organizations. Each organization may, after reasonable notice, terminate the arrangements, provided that, if they are terminated by the Bank, the Bank will reimburse FAO for the financial consequences of cancelling personnel commitments entered into for purposes of the cooperative program.

7. Effectuation of the Arrangements

The Working Arrangements will become operative on an interim basis when this Memorandum of Understanding is signed by the Director-General of FAO and the President of the Bank, but the continuation thereof will be subject to the approval of the Boards of Governors in the case of the Bank and IDA and of the Council in the case of FAO. It is contemplated that the necessary approvals will authorize payment by the Bank to FAO retroactively to 1 March 1964 of expenses incurred for purposes of the cooperative program which would have been eligible for payment if these Working Arrangements had been effective on that date.

FAC/IBRD Cooperative Program - Budget

On Saturday morning, March 19, in Rome I discussed with Mr. Ergas the Cooperative Program budgets. He prepared some figures (attached) showing estimated expenditures for 1966 and 1967. These figures were supposed to indicate a trend in expenditure up to a total of \$ 2.2 million for the bi-ennium 1966-67. The figures in fact do not do much more than suggest that if you assume a team having a certain number of people you will incur a certain level of expenditure. You can equally well start from the other end and say that if you assume a certain level of expenditure you will need a certain number of people.

Figures of actual expenditure during 1964 and 1965 prepared by FAO do not quite agree with the ones prepared here by the Treasurer's Department but I will try to see where the differences lie. There is no doubt that the level of expenditure under the Program is currently a good deal less than the money available. The Special Team engaged on Program work in FAO now numbers twenty. It has been difficult for FAO to recruit staff for the team but they say they think that recruitment will go faster in future. They propose to increase it to thirty-one by the fourth quarter of calendar year 1966 and they aim for a team of 35/36 men through 1967.

I suggested that they should prepare a memorandum to support their projections, giving the reasons why the increase of staff is likely to be necessary. Their memorandum will probably include some of the following arguments:

> The increasing interest in the Cooperative Program by FAO member countries is likely to be reflected in more requests to FAO to arrange for work under the Program;

FAO team members are at present overburdened, having to travel to much!

The Cooperative Program team are becoming increasingly engaged in follow-up of Special Fund projects and in advising the other departments of FAO who are supervising these projects;

It is desirable that FAO participate more than hitherto in Bank appreisal and supervision missions;

A larger team is needed to reduce dependence on outside consultants.

Many of these arguments I believe we would accept but I think that before agreeing to an increase in the level of expenditure to \$ 2.2 million we should make a more detailed analysis of the future workload than we have yet had time to make.

Travel Costs for FAO Staff Members and Consultants on Joint Bank/FAO
Agricultural Survey Missions

The Bank/FAO Agreement contains the following provision in paragraph 1:

Assistance to member governments in agricultural planning is recognized as an important foundation for investment programs in the long term. Insofar as this type of activity is carried out by FAO as part of its Regular or other programs, it is the sole responsibility of FAO. However, in cases agreed with the Bank where FAO carries out this type of activity at the request of the Bank or in cooperation with the Bank, the activity will be part of the cooperative program. (Emphasis supplied.)

Under this paragraph, it seems quite clear that where the Bank agrees with FAO, as in the case of Iran, to mount a joint agricultural survey mission, this activity becomes part of the cooperative program.

The cost-sharing provisions of the Agreement cover the costs of FAO staff and consultants assigned to such a mission. Subsistence and travel costs within the country, under normal Bank policy relating to technical assistance, would be borne by the country visited and so present no problem. There is a problem, however, as to who bears the cost of travel expenses of FAO staff and consultants outside the country in connection with missions of this type; on this point the Agreement is silent.

FAO has requested that the Bank agree to pay such travel costs and, if it is permissible under the Agreement, I would be willing to accede to this request as a matter of policy. Would you see any legal difficulty in our doing so?

Bank/FAO Discussions Regarding Agricultural Education

The FAO cable of December 30 which will presumably be the basis for your discussion of agricultural education in Rome reads as follows:

- "...ONE The Bank will keep FAO fully informed of all its activities in agricultural education:
 - TWO that it will also decide as to whether a particular project or activity is of FAO or UNESCO interest;
 - THREE that in cases of doubt, tripartite meeting will be called;
 - FOUR that to the extent possible, FAO will participate in programming of activities in education;
 - FIVE that the Bank will look at agricultural education not only from the angle of educational planning, but also from the angle of planning for agricultural development as is so clearly illustrated by Philippine project with whose approach we are in full agreement."
- Item 1: This request is justified. We have already indicated our willingness and have begun sending information.
- Item 2: It is not within the Bank's competence or responsibility to decide the division of responsibility between FAO and Unesco. We have previously indicated that if FAO and Unesco will jointly agree on a clearly-defined formula we are willing to follow it. If that is not feasible, we would hope that on the basis of information supplied under Item 1 Unesco would be able to determine the responsibility for particular cases. If even that is not feasible, the only alternative would probably be to handle the matter ourselves.
- Item 3: In cases of doubt, tripartite meetings would be timeconsuming and would also necessitate the Bank's arbitrating between FAO and Unesco, which is not desirable.
- Item h: The meaning of this suggestion is not clear but it may refer to a suggestion made verbally by Ergas that FAO should be represented at the periodic program review meetings between the Bank and Unesco. This would be seriously questionable and in any case we should not agree without the prior consent of Unesco.

Item 5: As a statement of general principle, we agree.

This is to acknowledge with thanks your letter of February 23 containing your comments on the "Notes of the Meeting at the Bank" of January 20. I would like to make the following observations on your respective comments:

(a)(c) Paragraphs 4 and 6

We are happy to advise you that the first "Requests for Personnel Action" have been received from Mr. Ergas' Office. We look forward to receiving the payroll status forms, revised as of January 1, 1966, for all team members, with your January invoice.

(b) Paragraph 5

We note your comment that further study on the implications of this subject are needed and look forward to hearing further from you on this point.

(d)(e)(f) Noted.

(g) Expenses Paid by the Bank for the Joint Account

All charges outstanding as of December 31, 1965 were detailed in Mr. Reamy's letter of January 26, 1966. These were mainly personal expenses for FAO personnel and are unlikely to affect the Joint Account. We will keep you informed on a monthly basis of any further charges in this category.

(h) Information Provided by the Program Unit in FAO

We note the agreement as far as consultants are concerned and accept, for the present, the decision that the procedure will not include all professional staff working for the Program.

"Non-Program" Costs

You will recall that during your stay in Washington brief discussions were held in respect to billing the Bank with separate invoices for certain costs which are not part of the financial provisions of the Cooperative Program. The costs we have in mind are as follows:

- (a) All costs for FAO personnel seconded to the Bank such as Messrs. Brochu and Groenveld.
- (b) Pension contributions for seconded staff members such as Mr. Macris.
- (c) Salary costs for Miss P. Sutton, secretary to Mr. Peter Reid.

It will be of great assistance to us if you would arrange to invoice the Bank separately for these costs and for any other costs which are not applicable to the FAO team or FAO and Bank missions undertaken within the Program.

Dear Henry:

This is in reply to your memorandum of February 8 based on our discussions during your recent visit to the Bank. I note that the memorandum is in two parts, the first dealing with general policy questions and the second with certain project possibilities which you suggest.

Concerning the five points of policy and procedure made in your cable of December 30 to Messrs. Aldewereld and Demuth, I do not think there should be any difficulty regarding points 1 and 5, namely that the Bank will keep FAO informed of its activities in agricultural education and that it will look at agricultural education not only from the angle of educational planning but also from the point of view of agricultural development. Points 2, 3, and h, I believe, would more properly be dealt with in your forthcoming meeting in Rome with Messrs. Aldewereld and Demuth. That being so, I agree with you that we should not follow through with the proposal of a meeting on March 10 between yourself, Ricardo Diez and myself.

Regarding your suggestions of project possibilities:

- 1. Nicaragua: As you know, following your suggestion, we cabled Mr. Tuqan, who was then in Nicaragua, to explore the situation of the School of Agriculture at La Calera. He has not yet completed his mission report but the preliminary indication is favorable and as soon as we have the fuller picture we will communicate with you and discuss what steps ought to be taken next.
- 2. Ecuador: Unfortunately, assistance to the faculty of agriculture at Guayaquil University and the experimental farm would not fall within the current policy of the Bank with respect to higher education. The secondary school in itself would probably not justify action at this time.
- 3. Brazil: Consideration of the Universidade Rural, KM. h7 will require some clarification of the Bank's position respecting possible assistance to Brazilian education as a whole. Even within the field of agricultural education we have no comprehensive picture of needs,

existing facilities, and development plans for the country as a whole against which the priority of KM. h? could be evaluated. If you could develop a fuller picture along these lines from the information available in Rome we would be pleased to have it, or if you felt that such a study would require and justify a separate mission I would be happy to take this up with the appropriate Departments in the Bank and get their reaction.

h. Zambia: As you know, a Unesco project identification mission which has been briefed in Rome by FAO is en route to Zambia. Mr. Burt, of this Division, expects also to be in Zambia for about one week during the visit of the Unesco mission. We have also in hand the report of the FAO mission of 1965, including its recommendations for projects in agricultural education. Out of all these findings we anticipate that a mixed project of various items will be put together for consideration by the Bank. You may be sure that FAO's recommendations will be fully considered and that we will be in touch with you as soon as possible regarding possible follow-up action.

I believe that our discussions during your visit were very useful and I am encouraged to think that we may be able to move ahead and activate the Bank/FAO agreement with respect to agricultural education.

I want, also, to express our satisfaction with Mr. Tellez-Molina's contribution to the Sierra Leone appraisal mission. His professional contributions to the appraisal were highly satisfactory and we appreciated also his friendly and cooperative spirit.

Sen's tenure of office. The time for action, they feel, is at the change of D.G. and, hopefully, in the reorganization of FAO. The members (of donor countries, anyway), have become increasingly restless over the sharply rising expenditures, the large number of new senior posts and the expanding global activities. They believe, perhaps in a too conservative way, that the core of FAO's really important task is the field programmes and the work in FAO related to them. Many are disturbed by what they consider Sen's folie de grandeur, and his obsession with global schemes, about many of which they are sceptical - Freedom from Hunger Campaign, World Food Programme, World Fishery Programme, World Food Congress, International Years for rice, wheat, chewing gum, etc. - and now the Indicative World Food Plan. They believe there are many competent technicians in FAO (in this I am sure they are right), and if more interest and money were devoted to their work, greatly increased practical results could be achieved in the field.

Of these matters I am not competent to judge. It may be that the organization is too top heavy, that there should be more concentration on field programmes, that Sen and his senior advisers are giving too much time to these global schemes and going ahead too fast with them. But this is perhaps inevitably the way the world is going. From Unctad and elsewhere come a hail of demands for World Food Plans, World Food Banks, commodity arrangements, preferences, etc. We are in an age of agricultural development and planning. Perhaps FAO must attempt to take a lead - even if its field work suffers.

Finally, I would like to mention our contacts with FAO. Jim Evans is certainly to be congratulated on the part he has played in making the Joint Programme work, and I have been very glad to see that he is now finding it possible to visit Rome fairly often. I believe you are considering not continuing our Rome office, and I would think this a right decision. There is not really a whole time job there, apart from the other possible difficulties which have become evident. At the same time I believe that we need something in addition to Jim's visits or those occasional ones of senior officers of the Bank. So much is happening in agriculture of interest to the Bank as well as to FAO. The World Food Programme and food surplus policies in general, Unctad demands, compensatory financing, commodity arrangements. Much of this is discussed in Europe, and although the Bank will at times send experts to meetings, I would urge that the European Office could and should play a valuable part. Perhaps Johnnie can now spare a little more time for Rome and keep in fairly close touch with the key people in FAO and the World Food Programme. Perhaps Arthur or an assistant can keep an eye on agricultural issues in Geneva. And Johnnie again in his visits to the capitals of the major donors can keep in touch with their thinking. We can thus know what's cooking and not merely wait to be served a dish we may not like.

- Subparagraph (a) of paragraph 4 of the Memorandum of Understanding between FAO and the Bank/IDA is amended to read as follows:
 - "(a) Subject to the qualifications set forth below, the direct costs of FAO in connection with agreed work under the program, including salaries, allowances and other benefits and travel costs of the FAO team, of outside consultants and of other FAO staff members assigned to such work, will, until December 31, 1965, be shared equally by FAO and the Bank up to a ceiling figure to be fixed from time to time by agreement between the two organizations."
- 2. Subparagraph (g) of paragraph 4 of the Memorandum of Understanding is amended to read as follows:
 - "(g) Continuation of the program beyond December 31, 1965, will be subject to mutual agreement in the light of experience and to the decision of FAO's 1965 Conference. If the program is continued, the direct costs of FAO for agreed work under the program as defined in subparagraph (a) shall be shared in the proportion of 25 percent by FAO and 75 percent by the Bank, subject to the qualifications set forth in subparagraphs (b), (c), (d) and (e)."
