How to get started - Questions for reflection

- ➤ What research questions you need answers to that will help strengthen your program (and your evaluation!)?
- ➤ When would it make sense to integrate mixed methods within the context of your program and your impact evaluation?
- > What tools could be used to explore the desired questions?

Before

Example of questions:

- What are key constraints and enablers of change in targeted communities?
- How do target beneficiaries define/frame key concepts, e.g., WEE, social relations?
- How could the context (social, economic, cultural..) affect how beneficiaries engage?

Example of tools:

- Focus group discussions
- Participant observation

During

Example of questions:

- How is the program being implemented?
- How are beneficiaries engaging in the program?
- What explains early results of the program?

Example of tools:

- Key informant interviews
- Participant observation
- In-depth interviews
- Quantitative survey on use and satisfaction with program

After

Example of questions:


- What are the main drivers (pathways) of change?
- Why are some beneficiaries benefiting more than others?
- Are there unintended effects of the program and how has that affected program impact?
