I have pleasure in sending you further information, and background papers, for the meeting of population donors to be held in London on December 5-6, 1977, which your agency has indicated it plans to attend. One set of the papers are sent herewith and two sets will be sent separately for use by your representative(s) or other staff (most agencies are expected to send one or two representatives. We hope this will keep the meeting small and focussed in its deliberations.)

As indicated in my letter of August 18, 1977, the general topic of the meeting is "Project Co-financing and Aid Coordination in the Population Sector", with some emphasis on countries and projects that have involved World Bank assistance. However, as you can see from the papers enclosed, this experience reflects some broad and important questions which are of general concern to all of us who work in population assistance.

The preliminary agenda suggest some of the specific topics to be Our intention is to keep the discussion informal and candid, and not to issue any statements or press release at the conclusion. A report will be prepared of the deliberations of the group that may give us useful guidance for the future. The Chairmen and opening speakers will be designated before the meetings begin and will be indicated on the final agenda.

We have, in a number of cases, already received the name and designation of the representative(s) who will attend. If you have not already done so, please confirm to us the name and designation of your representative(s) - if possible before November 25, 1977. We expect to complete the discussions by late afternoon on December 6. The Bank's participants, however, will be available on the morning of December 7 for any individual consultations which other donors may wish to hold. Participation on the 7th is therefore optional.



I want to draw attention to the documentation enclosed. The discussion paper on "Project Co-financing and Aid Coordination in the Population Sector", and on the "World Bank's Lending Policies and Procedures" would merit closer study. The third document on "World Bank Lending for Population 1969-77" is intended as a background paper.

We look forward to a useful and productive meeting that will contribute to still more effective external assistance in the population field.

I have pleasure in sending you further information, and back-ground papers, for the meeting of population donors to be held in London on December 5-6, 1977, in which your agency has expressed interest. One set of the papers are sent herewith and two sets will be sent separately for use by your representative(s) or other staff (most agencies are expected to send one or two representatives. We hope this will keep the meeting small and focussed in its deliberations.)

As indicated in my letter of August 18, 1977, the general topic of the meeting is "Project Co-financing and Aid Coordination in the Population Sector", with some emphasis on countries and projects that have involved World Bank assistance. However, as you can see from the papers enclosed, this experience reflects some broad and important questions which are of general concern to all of us who work in population assistance.

The preliminary agenda suggest some of the specific topics to be covered. Our intention is to keep the discussion informal and candid, and not to issue any statements or press release at the conclusion. A report will be prepared of the deliberations of the group that may give us useful guidance for the future. The Chairmen and opening speakers will be designated before the meetings begin and will be indicated on the final agenda.

If you have not already done so, please confirm to us the name and designation of your representative(s) - if possible before November 25, 1977. We expect to complete the discussions by late afternoon on December 6. The Bank's participants, however, will be available on the morning of December 7 for any individual consultations which other donors may wish to hold. Participation on the 7th is therefore optional.

I want to draw attention to the documentation enclosed. The discussion paper on "Project Co-financing and Aid Coordination in the Population Sector", and on the "World Bank's Lending Policies and Procedures" would merit closer study. The third document on "World Bank Lending for Population 1969-77" is intended as a background paper.

We look forward to a useful and productive meeting that will contribute to still more effective external assistance in the population field.
