Maeting with Dr. Boerma, July 11, 1969

I met with Dr. A. H. Boerma, Director-General of FAO, on July 11 and explained to him our program of country missions. I emphasized that we intended to broaden the scope of these missions, to put them on a regularly scheduled basis, and to have them include in their reports a section on pre-investment needs. I said that we would want to cooperate with FAO in this program and hoped that we could count on their assistance.

Dr. Boerma replied that he thought our program was an appropriate and useful one for the Bank to undertake and that it would fill an important gap in the existing international machinery for working out coordinated investment and pre-investment programs country by country. FAO would be prepared to provide us with thatever information was at its disposal about the various countries to be visited and would be pleased to associate a member of its staff with those missions. Dr. Boerma added that, these agriculture was the principal economic sector in almost all developing countries, he believed that PAO's role in our mission program would probably be a substantial one.

Further to our discussions of staffing requirements for economic missions, there have been some additional developments since your return. The first of these concerns Senegal Fisheries. Area Department now agrees that it would be desirable to have an identification mission look into fishery project possibilities sometime between now and the scheduled date of the economic mission to Senegal (early October/early November). ### Minutes

Afghanistan

Stoops

FAO will make proposals for a livestock identification mission for Bank consideration.

Darnell

Kunduz. FAO is planning to prepare the first phase of this project by the end of 1969 and a preparation mission has been scheduled for Oct/Nov. There appears to be less water available than earlier anticipated. The result is likely to be a reduction in the Esentop area from 6,000 to possibly 2,000 ha.

The Bank is interested in financing the project which appears in the Bank's forward plan and believes that Campbell's next visit should take place as soon as possible. The Bank's main concern is that the project is likely to be fairly small. Darnell's opinion is that use of force account in this type of an area is likely to present problems.

Hari-Rud. The latest position on Hari-Rud was discussed at length based on the description provided in the UNDP review note of which the Bank has received a copy.

The main change has been due to the fact that recent studies have revealed large supplies of groundwater and this may change the whole shape of the project.

The Bank was not interested in Hari-Rud as originally planned (partly because of the international water problem and because of possible Yugoslavian bilateral and Asian Bank interest). However, this latest change in emphasis could result in the Bank's taking a different attitude but before being able to judge Bank interest, Darnell has requested further information on the relative economic merits of a surface as opposed to groundwater approach.

He wonders whether Campbell and Webster have sufficient information already to be able to prepare such a paper? (Webster is due in New York in August for a meeting with the consultants. A meeting with Campbell and Darnell would be useful).

Darnell has a number of reservations about the proposal for a groundwater project if sufficient surface water is available. These reservations

Brazil

Darnell

Tubewell Development. The project proposed by SUDENE would comprise the construction of 1,400 tubewells over five years. Credit would be channelled through the Banco del Nordeste. A letter from SUDENE is awaited for confirmation of Government interest in getting financial assistance from the Bank for the project.

Peter Brumby has some reservations about the current proposals for incorporating livestock into the project and would prefer to see a more integrated approach including pasture development than is currently contemplated.

Haynes

Fisheries. The FAO briefing notes raised the question as to the Bank's position on possible financing of the Santos Port project. Apparently the Bank had originally said that it would not envisage financing more than 40% of the total cost of this project. Subsequently, it was stated that the IDB was considering financing the project and that IBRD was not confining its interests to the Santo commercial port. Mike Walden has drafted a letter to FAO on this, which has been sent. Bourgois is expected to comment on this.

The present situation is that Craig-Martin (Area) is scheduled to visit Brazil in approximately two months' time to discuss with the Government the question of the 40%. It was suggested that he could look, at the same time, into the possibility of Bank interest in the project identified by Bourgois for fishing vessels construction. The same problems could be expected here as in the case of Ghana or Tunisia. The main purpose of the Area mission is to examine the whole fishing industry - prices are falling, marketing and distribution are presently a problem, etc.

Further discussion on the Bank's interest in the commercial port will be held between Spears and Carmichael (Transportation).

Rowe

Maranho. Arrangements have been finalized with the ODM for a feasibility study to be carried out by Huntings. Forbes-Watt will visit Brazil in August in order to discuss with the consultants on the ground what is required.

Education Projects FAO will make proposals for an education mission in the Northeast.

Burma

South Asia

Mr. Votaw requested FAO to give Bank latest status of Sittang River Valley - UNDP project.

Burundi

Rowe

Mosso. There was nothing to discuss on Burundi-Mosso at the present time since the UNDP studies are just getting underway. The UNDP studies will be ready towards the end of 1970. The Bank is expecting to appraise the project for fiscal year 1972.

Goffin

Agricultural Credit. The Bank has received Casati's back-to-office report on Burundi which summarizes the main problems to be overcome before credit projects could be prepared.

It was generally agreed that a considerable amount of technical assistance and further work by FAO and PMEA would be necessary before bankable projects could emerge. The most likely areas for early development are in the Ruzizi Valley where preparation of high quality tobacco and rice irrigation projects has been initiated by the Government. A fattening ranch livestock project is also under preparation by the Government. An early follow-up visit to Burundi is being planned by Groenveld (PMEA) in order to assist the Government in preparing these projects.

In the interim it was noticed that IFC which had recently appraised the Burundi Development Bank had not been able to recommend a Bank or IFC loan partly because of the lack of suitable projects for financing.

The view had been expressed in the IFC's back-tooffice report that the agricultural sector would
probably be an important source of projects and
the IFC mission endorsed the attempts which are
now being made to develop an agricultural projects
pipeline.

Note: ADB is also interested in Burundi and coordination should be established.

Cameroon

Rowe

Cocoa. To be left off program until other cocoa projects are done, then this one will appear in the perspective.

Darnell

Semry Rice. No substantive comments were made on this project.

Darnell has asked for clarification from Boumendil of the possible international waters implication of this project. There also seems to be a question as to whether or not this project should be included in the 1970/71 pipeline. Problems of Bank budgeting and appraisal staff availability were mentioned but no definite position could be established. This point needs further discussion with Evans or Wapenhans.

Ceylon

South Asia

Pipeline for Ceylon fairly full in view size Mahaweli. No immediate need for new project ideas. Mr. O'Hagan of FAO will participate in next economic mission and FAO will make proposals for new identification after economic mission.

Bartsch

Mahaweli. This project had been fully discussed at the time of the recent FAO/Bank/UNDP review meeting and no further discussion at this time was considered useful.

Chad

Darnell

Polders. The Projects Department seems to have very substantial reservations about the Chad polder project. Specific problems mentioned were the probable high cost of development (\$3,000 per ha), the fact that the people of this region are traditionally fish eaters and not used to this type of farming. Also, more specifically that a recent publication by the Tropical Agronomy Abstract of Amsterdam reports (a copy of which Darnell gave to Boumendil) that previous polder experiments in the Chad region have broken down because of high salinity problems.

A summary of the relevant technical problems is attached to this note.

We should seek Boumendil's views on this note and Brochu's comments on the overall problem of whether or not this is the right sort of area to be working on.

However, in the interim, the project remains in the Bank's forward project pipeline.

Darnell

Sategui Deressia. This project which would include flood protection of the Sategui Deressia plain, irrigation of 2,000 new hectares and improvement of an area already under cultivation, appears at first sight to be attractive to the Bank.

The main problem at the moment is that the Italians were going to finance technical assistance to prepare this project but apparently no final agreement on this has been reached.

It seems unlikely that the Bank would agree to finance the studies (further discussion with Area required?). The question was not resolved as to who would take the next steps re obtaining the necessary finance for a feasibility study, the cost of which CP has roughly estimated to be \$160,000

Chad

Darnell

As no bilateral agency is interested in financing this study, George Darnell's suggestion was that UNDP should be brought into the picture. Area-Darnell will advise FAO on UNDP role.

Colombia

Hendry

Regular economic mission in the fall. Bank agricultural economist will participate.

Congo Kinshasa Rowe

Rubber. The Bank has received the FAO identification report on this project. Van Gent has reviewed it. In general, the Bank is in favor of this project but it has the following main problems:

- (a) Projects Department doubts whether the use of "clonal" material would be economically possible for this project.
- (b) Has reservations on the method of processing being contemplated and suggests that consideration should be given to the SMR production process. (This method gives lower costs and a higher quality product.)
- (c) The figure of \$400 per ha appears low in the Bank's experience and a figure of \$700-\$800 seems more likely to be the final cost.
- (d) On the preparation side, the Bank doubts very much whether the FAO proposals allow sufficient time for completion of preparation, primarily because van Gent (who has visited the Congo) doubts the ability of the Bamboli technicians to prepare the project. He believes that CP experts will need to spend at least four weeks in the field.
- (e) The Bank will have problems in financing rubber development on the Bamboli's own estate (2,500 ha) on the ground that the Bank could not make a loan to this private company. Either this part of the project should be omitted or, the possibility of altering the financial structure of Bamboli examined. (Area's views on this would be useful.)
- Mr. Ergas raised the issue of Bank interest and willingness to finance project when company owning estates is private firm. Mr. Wapenhans indicated that this was not necessarily an obstacle but that dependent on structure and financial requirements IFC might have to be brought into the picture. (A later cable from FAO to request Bank approval to proceed with preparation needs to be answered.)

Again, the Bank believes that a longer time is necessary to prepare the project than has been allowed for at present. The project would, as currently planned, result in possible over-production of sugar and there may be difficulties in disposing of the additional quantities planned in the absence of definite "quotas".

Apparently, the Bank's Area Department is still trying to resolve this problem and no further progress can be contemplated until this has been done. Ecuador

Stoops

Livestock. Third phase preparation is well in hand with the assistance of the project manager and visits from Bank experts and no FAO assistance is envisaged at this stage.

Haynes

Storage. It was still not known whether the Government had applied to UNDP for the funds to implement a feasibility study of the Ecuador grain storage project and it was agreed that this should be clarified with Area.

It was noted that at the time of the last UNDP/FAO review meeting in Rome the whole question of the procedure of mini-project feasibility studies financed by UNDP had been raised and that the new procedures being evolved should make it possible to carry out studies at fairly short notice.

It was agreed to clarify (a) with Luhman of Area Department and (b) with Taylor of UNDP the question of the Government's position on a request for the feasibility study.

In line with the proposals made in Evans' letter of May 12, 1969, the Cooperative Program would probably provide an economist-marketing specialist to work in conjunction with whichever consulting firm is eventually chosen to carry out the feasibility study.

Rowe

Forestry. The latest report on the proposed forestry project from FAO/UNDP experts in Ecuador indicate that as regards the need for forestry roads investment in Esemeraldas, private concessionaires are agreeable to constructing the roads themselves and external finance for this program is not required. In the field of forest industries financing the FAO/UNDP experts believe that it is still premature to discuss this since firm proposals for setting up of industries in this region have still to be submitted by the various companies to whom concessions have been awarded.

In the Reabamba area, although the government has made some progress in strengthening its forestry service, the FAO/UNDP experts have reported that there is considerable political resistance to acquisition of the land area which would be required to support an economically viable pulp mill.

The Forestry Division of FAO is now investigating the possibility of strengthening technical assistance

Ecuador

Rowe

to the forestry service and investigating the possibilities of alternative planting sites in the coastal region.

In the light of the above problems FAO has recommended that further Bank involvement be post-poned.

FAO will send a letter to the Bank outlining the above and suggests that Area Department discuss the contents of this letter with the Government during their next visit.

El Salvador

Western Hemisphere It was agreed that Livestock and Irrigation would be the responsibility of the IBRD, not of IDB.

Ethiopia

Bartsch

Melka Sedi Amibara. Following the recent Casati/ Crofts mission, a back-to-office report was sent to the Bank outlining the main problem areas on this project. Two of the main problems are spontaneous development of lift irrigation which is proceeding at the moment and may prejudice the eventual type of project, and secondly the problem of locating alternative grazing lands and arranging for compensation of existing graziers should this be necessary. Dumoulin is fully aware of the main FAO suggested problem issues. that the Bank should write to the Government now asking for reassurance that some of these problem areas will be tackled by the Government between now and the time of planned appraisal (the Bank tentatively plans to appraise this project in early 1970).

Bartsch

Meki River Diversion. The recent Steering Committee attended by Casati and Crofts discussed with ITALCONSULT the status of the feasibility studies being carried out on this project. The general conclusion was that the report presented to the Steering Committee is still very deficient, particularly on the economic data side. Various pumping alternatives need to be further investigated and more data will be needed before the project can be appraised.

Dumoulin is also fully conversant with the problems in this project.

The next Steering Committee is scheduled for early November 1969 and the Cooperative Program will try and arrange for Casati and Crofts to attend and to assess the progress which has been made since the time of the last meeting in June. The project is scheduled for appraisal in about mid-1970.

Ethiopia

Bartsch

Bartsch requested a fuller project description. This should be discussed with Dumoulin during the following week. If he cannot provide a full description, we should arrange for one to be sent from Rome.

Ethiopia

Stoops

Beef. If the Bank agrees with the suggestions of Mr. Schaefer-Kehnert in his recent back-to-office report, FAO would be invited to participate in further work. The beef project also depends rather heavily on US AID intentions. On the dairy side, the next step is simply that of compiling additional data and since the expertise is not available in the country it is proposed by Mr. Gordon that PMEA could give some assistance.

Melka Sedi. Though this project is not a livestock project, there is a problem of finding grazing land outside the project area since this will be used for other agricultural purposes under the proposed project. This item is bound to cause serious difficulties and the Area Department should be requested to write to the Government at an early stage indicating that the problem should be solved before an appraisal mission can finalize its work. (See Irrigation I.)

Rowe

Setit Humera. The appraisal mission has just returned from the field and is now drafting its report. Apparently, Forbes' presence during the appraisal was very useful.

The project as it is now being worked on is substantially the same as outlined in Forbes' back-to-office report and it seems probable that Phase One of the project will go ahead.

Forbes' back-to-office report mentioned two particular problems. One is the question of land tenure and the other relates to the appointment of an Ethiopian project manager.

On the former, the question was raised as to whether the Bank would be able to finance the credit project under the proposed system of long-term leases as opposed to freehold tenure. Rowe's opinion was that this should not present a problem since apparently the Bank has already made a loan in the Sudan under similar long-term leasehold arrangements.

Ethiopia

Rowe

A modification of the Ethiopian land is necessary and this will be dealt with by the Government.

Spears raised the question as to whether the Governmentsinsistence on having an Ethiopian project manager might not raise problems when preparing Phase Two. The reply to this was that the Bank would use consultants for the preparation of Phase Two. Spears suggested in a subsequent discussion that Forbes might assist in drafting the terms of reference for Phase Two in the light of his now considerable experience of the project.

Settlement. The Bank has received a copy of Burke's report. Apparently, provision has been made for the Settlement project in the five-year plan and there appears to be no objection to the proposal that further preparation work on this project to be carried out in the latter half of 1969. Gordon has asked FAO to make available an agricultural economist and an agronomist in approximately Sept/Oct. This joint PMEA/FAO operation should be clarified with Projects Department, Area and PMEA in the general context of the proposed FAO pipeline for the coming six months and the general problem of coordinating PMEA/FAO activities. Spears will discuss in Nairobi.

Hendry

FAO might participate in the forthcoming economic mission.

Fiji

Bartsch

Rewa. It was noted that FAO was having discussions with the project manager, Mr. Brown, in Rome and would be planning a preparation mission to finalize the project either in the latter half of 1969 or early 1970.

Gabon

Rowe

Owendo-Belinga. Rowe has asked for FAO's comments on the timber traffic estimates which are included in a recentreport by SEDES.

Apparently, the Government has submitted a proposal for construction of a smaller railway project from Owendo to Booue, the primary economic justification of which would be timber traffic as opposed to iron ore. Spears will deal with this.

General Agriculture. Reference was made to the PMWA proposal for an agricultural identification mission to Gabon. Rowe's reply was that this project does not appear in the five-year plan. The Projects Department has not officially recognized

the existence of the project. (The fact remains that (a) a PMWA mission is scheduled and (b) FAO has done a lot of work on agricultural projects in the Wolem Tem area and FAO believes that it should be associated with any project identification work in Gabon.)

Gambia

Rowe

Rice. The Projects Department has reviewed Helmers' report and was in favor of the preparation of the project. Provision has been made in the forward plan and the Bank would hope to appraise in about 1972.

An FAO/IBRD preparation mission including a rice expert, extension service specialist, irrigation engineer and economist would need about four weeks in the field to prepare the project and a mission to do this has been scheduled for the latter half of 1969.

Forestry. The Projects Department has read Helmers' report on this project but was of the opinion that it was too small to justify Bank's interest. (The total cost is only some \$400,000 of which the foreign exchange component would likely be small.) FAO Investment Centre will discuss project with the African Development Bank.

Ghana

Goffin

Agricultural Credit. The Bank had included a possible Ghana credit project in the 1969 plan of work. However, there appeared to be some considerable doubts at the time of the January FAO/IBRD Washington Review Meeting as to whether the Projects Department did in fact favor such a project. Both Goffin and Rowe have expressed reservations on the grounds that (a) credit for the on-going cocoa and oil palm projects has already been built into the projects themselves, (b) the Bank would prefer to feel its way into a broader credit program through its experience with on-going projects rather than to proceed immediately to an overall credit approach, (c) it was difficult to visualize what sort of a credit project could emerge on a wider program basis at this point in time. At the time of the Washington January Review the Area Department (Mr. Ram), supported the view of the Projects Department.

The only positive comment made by Projects Department was that the experience the Bank had had with the Ghana Development Bank through which the fisheries project credit would be channelled had so far been encouraging and the Bank would like to explore the possibilities of eventually widening the scope of the Bank's operations.

Ghana

Goffin

Further discussion of this project is required with Messrs. Evans and Wapenhans.

Rowe

Oil Palm and Cocoa. PMWA's progress in preparing this project was discussed, particularly with reference to any possible projection by the General Agriculture Division of credit requirements for further cocoa development. The proposed credit project needs to be further discussed with Wapenhans and Goffin

The Bank is planning an appraisal mission of the cocoa project in September and asks whether FAO can provide an economist or a financial analyst. Cable sent to Rome on June 20 suggesting Jaffrezic, or Moesta, or Hyde.

Hendry

There is a possibility of a regular economic mission in the spring 1970. FAO interest in participation was noted.

Guinea

West Africa

No lending activities contemplated but discussions are maintained and channels of communication kept open both through IMF and Bank.

Greece

Bartsch

The Thessaly project (a regional development project involving large scale irrigation and livestock development) was the only project submitted to the economic mission in November 1968. The Bank's preliminary impression of this project was that an early investment project could be identified and the major problem was likely to be devising anappropriate crop pattern for the newly FAO was irrigated areas. the opinion that a substantial irrigation pipeline could be built up in Greece and was proposing an irrigation sector review as part of its 1970 program workload. It was agreed to defer discussion of this possibility until the time of the meeting planned with Evans and Wapenhans to discuss the CP programs forward 1970 pipeline. No sector review in near future.

Stoops

<u>Livestock</u>. This should be further discussed by Messrs. Evans, Ergas and Wapenhans.

General

Mr. Ergas was informed briefly on the results of the recent policy discussions between Bank and Government. (The Ministry of Agriculture had not been represented during these discussions.) Greece

General

Tentative indications were that Government may now follow a priority approach. The Bank will receive annual investment schedules. Mr. Ergas suggested a review by FAO of the irrigation and livestock sectors. An irrigation reconnaissance missior has since been agreed and FAO has been informed by cable. The livestock exercise was not agreed and will be discussed during next review.

Guatemala

Rowe

Coffee Diversification. FAO's report on this project is now being reviewed by the Bank.

Stoops

Livestock. The CP report has just been received and preliminary indications from Mr. Stoops were that this project seemed to be a good one. Final comments will be made by the end of this week. The point was raised that it would do no harm to once again check the intention of IDB in Guatemala's livestock sector.

Western Hemisphere Mr. Ergas was informed of the a priori Bank interest in a fisheries project (port).

Mr. Ergas mentioned the recently FAD identified diversification project and the problem of adequate Government contribution. In this context he enquired if the Government could utilize unused portions of its contribution to I.C.O. Area believes that this might be acceptable to the Bank.

Guyana

Stoops

<u>Livestock</u>. Mr. Fransen has mailed in his back-to-office report which indicated that a small project may be possible. The government is hiring consultants to finalize preparation.

Honduras

General

It has been agreed that livestock would be the prime responsibility of IBRD, not IDB.

India

Darnell

Irrigation

(a) Cauvery Delta and Pochambad. Work on these two projects is proceeding as scheduled. Darnell suggests a short visit of both himself and Don Campbell in November - or early December to coincide with planned appraisal. This would be instead of the October visit suggested by Campbell in his note to FAO file of June 12, 1969. (At this time it might be appropriate to take a forward look at a next possible round of irrigation projects to be brought into the preparation pipeline during 1970).

India

Darnell

- (b) <u>Krishna Godavari</u>. Work proceeding as scheduled, and appraisal planned for about January 1970.
- (c) <u>Tawa</u>. Work proceeding as scheduled and appraisal planned for March/April 1970.
- (d) Godavari Barrage, Jayakwadi and Upper Krishna. The main current problem on all these three projects is whether or not Government of India can guarantee the counterpart funds needed to ensure that the projects can proceed as planned. The Bank is interested in the development of fully integrated projects with appropriate provision for cropping, credit, marketing, extension etc. aspects and not in merely financing structures and engineering works.

In the case of the Upper Krishna project there is an additional problem in that a good redesign job is needed on the engineering side.

The other major general point raised in the CP briefing note was the question of the acceptable rate of interest to be assumed in determining whether the water rate structure should meet both 0 & M costs as well as capital charges. The states have requested advice on this issue.

According to Darnell, the Projects Department have been preparing a paper on this for some time but the Bank's views are not yet finalized and will be communicated to FAO in due course.

Goffin

Credit. No further comment possible pending return of the current FAO mission from the field (Courbois, Forbes-Watt, Egli).

Goffin asked FAO to check whether FAO would be definitely scheduling two missions in 1970 for continued work on credit projects in India. Further work was anticipated in Maharashtra, Mysore, Madras and Andrha Pradesh.

Haynes

Fisheries. A Bank mission is currently in the field looking at general agro-industry possibilities in India including fisheries. It was too early to say what the likely outcome of this mission was going to be but preliminary indications were that the GOI had in fact made little progress in further

India

Haynes

preparing the project compared with the situation 18 months ago when the last FAO mission was involved. Further clarification would be sought after David Haynes' return from the field. A furthere program of action could be defined at that time.

Stoops

<u>Livestock - Dairy</u>. Mr. Stoops mentioned that a project based on dairy alone was not a very good idea and suggested that one should also look at poultry. It was decided that further discussions should take place between Wapenhans and Ergas.

South Asia

Mr. Ergas suggested preparatory activity in both forestry and livestock but the Bank did not agree.

Mr. Wapenhans felt, and Mr. Votaw agreed in principle, that too many different activities could water down the good start that had been made by the Government and the Bank is establishing a pipeline for credit and irrigation.

(a) Forestry. Mr. Mathew of DFC may have some information on Kemla State. If one were to undertake activity in forestry two questions are in need of answer: (1) private or public sector, and (2) hard or softwood.

Mr. Wapenhans feels that the Government's interest in forestry is still little more than a public works program with scattered planting programs in a number of states amounting to about US\$ 30.0 million. He therefore does not believe that the Government has really changed its attitude which sees forestry as part conservation, part public works.

Mr. Wiehen will go to India shortly and he could look at pulp and paper in Kochin and Bombay. Mr. Naylor will also talk to the forestry people in India and may have some recommendations by Oct/Nov.

An FAO forestry mission will be discussed during the next program review.

(b) Livestock. Mr. Ergas proposed a CP follow-up of the Edwards mission, but the Bank was not prepared to agree at present. Mr. Wapenhans explained that Mr. Haynes is at present in India enquiring about slaughterhouses. The Bank will not take any initiative in this. Mr. Ergas will discuss findings with Haynes and subsequently will make a mission proposal.

India

South Asia

Dairy will not get off the ground without reducing the herds. "Operation Flood" sustained largely by grants did not appear a bankable proposition. Mr. Wapenhans did not believe that breeding was an immediate priority.

(c) <u>Credit</u>. Mr. Ergas asked if the Bank intended to investigate plantation crops for future projects. Mr. Ergas wants to send a mission to look at these possibilities within the next 12 months. This will be raised again at the next FAO/Bank review; no agreement meanwhile. Mr. Votaw indicated to Mr. Ergas the Board's increased concern about the Bank's role in alleviating the small farmer's poverty.

Indonesia

E. Asia & Pacific

Mr. Ergas suggested the need to try and establish some coordination of T.A. in Indonesia. Mr. Ergas enquired if this subject had been dealt with during the recent Aid Group Meeting in Holland. Mr. Goodman said that the Government wanted the Bank's help in coordinating technical assistance but the Permanent Mission had probably been too busy on proposing specific project to do much about it. The subject had not been discussed in any detail at the Aid Group Meeting and that no action had been proposed.

Mr. Ergas mentioned that FAO had not received minutes of the Aid Group Meeting. Mr. Goodman answered that the Bank was only an observer in the Meeting and that requests for information should be directed to the Dutch Group.

Mr. Ergas was informed that, as far as the Bank knew, no agricultural sub-group had been installed. There is a small foreign assistance T.A. coordinating committee in existence but this deals only with diplomatic privileges, etc. Mr. Ergas was promised a copy of terms of reference on fertilizer study.

Stoops

Messrs. Gerring's and Milford's reconnaissance mission is scheduled August. The Bank mission will go in August for three weeks and, of course, FAO will receive copies of the report as soon as it is finalized. If CP assistance is required they will be informed later.

Haynes

Fisheries. FAO report received. The Projects Department commented that the back-to-office report gave a very clear picture of the type of project likely to emerge and it appears from the back-to-office report that the project should be of Bank interest. The Bank would like to proceed with appraisal as quickly as possible.

Rowe

Seeds. FAO report on this project is now with the Bank and the Bank will comment in due course. Redrup will discuss the report with Creyke in Djakarta on his way through to Australia.

Iran

S. Asia

Mr. Ergas suggested that FAO initiate a broad identification mission since pipeline for Iran is uncertain. This was not agreed. Before any sector review would be undertaken certain initial steps would be necessary.

Iran

South Asia

Mr. Eschenberg is at present in the field. Mr. Wapenhans would go to Iran later this summer to sound out the Government and make arrangements for further activity if a course of action acceptable to the Bank and Government can be found. FAO might be invited to participate in subsequent activities, but not to take the lead.

Darnell

Talegan. Campbell had requested some information on the Bank's position on Talegan Stage II.

The Projects Department's impression of this project is not very favorable. Construction of a very long canal over difficult country is envisaged. The project is likely to be a high-cost low-return operation, and the Bank's participation is uncertain.

Dez. Work on the Dez project is still proceeding and the Bank would like to see this project working satisfactorily before getting any further involved in this particular sector.

Forward Project Pipeline. The Bank has made a very substantial allocation for the Agricultural sector but future projects are not yet firmly identified. FAO's forward Project planning exercise includes a number of project possibilities which should be discussed with Projects and Area Departments. FAO suggested a fairly broad based agricultural identification mission towards the end of 1969 or early 1970 to study these various project possibilities and to define an appropriate pipeline. This would be discussed further with Wapenhans and Evans.

Hendry

FAO participation in a possible sector review would be clarified after Mr. Wapenhans' August visit.

Iraq

Haynes

The position on the Iraq grain storage project was discussed particularly with reference to FAO's request for information concerning the latest status of the project. Walden indicated that there has been no communication from the Government on this project for some considerable time despite a number of requests from the Bank for clarification of the Government's position.

Iraq

Stoops

FAO. raised the possibility of Iraq livestock mission to follow up the positive proposals in the 1968 Mitchell Back-to-office report. The last Bank letter to the Government was sent on June 4, but there has not yet been any response to this letter.

Bartsch

Lower Diyala. The recent FAO mission had forwarded to the Government the list of information required as a basis for project preparation. A follow-up mission was planned later this year to see what progress was being made. The Bank had reviewed the outlines and data requirements and was in general agreement with them.

Jamaica

Goffin .

Credit. Mr. Wright wanted to read FAO report before indicating to Government whether Bank may be interested in follow-up. (This had also been the view of Agriculture Projects Department in an earlier meeting with members of the FAO mission.) The report by FAO is expected towards end July.

Jordan

Darnell

Neither the Bank nor the FAO have any active projects in the agricultural pipeline at the present time.

FAO has suggested a further look at the Wadi Mujib project (this project would entail the diversion of the base flow of the Wadi Mujib which is now discharged into the sea). Some preliminary design and cost estimates have been done by McDonald and Partners. The present proposal is to transport water southwards to Ghor Safi at the southern end of the Dead Sea. McDonald's feasibility study is apparently now finished.

Other projects which FAO has discussed in the past for Jordan include the sandstone aquifers project, a note on which was prepared for the recent UNDP review meeting.

Jordan

Kenya Rowe

Further discussion with Projects and Area Departments confirmes no Bank operation in near future.

Integrated Rural Development. FAO's briefing note suggests that it should be possible to identify a number of small integrated rural development projects in the East Africa region similar to the Malawi Lilongwe project.

Such projects would normally involve a package approach including financing of e.g. roads, water supplies, tractor and agricultural equipment, seeds, fertilizers, marketing facilities, extension services, etc.

A joint FAO/SIDA mission is currently in the field looking at such project possibilities. FAO have recommended that the mission call on PMEA in Nairobi to discuss their proposed program and we hope that a number of investment possibilities could emerge. Spears will be discussing in Nairobi.

According to Rowe the Bank is definitely interested in principle in this type of project and an amount is being included in the forward plan for such projects.

FAO will make further proposals when the FAO/SIDA mission returns from the field. The question of PMEA/FAO cooperation will need to be clarified.

Forestry. The Bank has deliberately held up presentation of the Kenya forestry project to the Loan Committee pending resolution of the position of the SIDA mission which visited Kenya in March and raised certain criticisms of the Kenya Government forestry program relating in particular to the total planting target and the decision to establish new pulpwood plantations.

SIDA were supposed to be producing a report setting out their views but they seem to be having considerable difficulty in obtaining the necessary information required for such a report.

Kenya

Rowe

It was agreed that in order to expedite progress a letter would be sent to SIDA in Stockholm pointing out that the Bank forestry project has been prepared on the assumption that plantations being established in the Turbo region could be used either for pulpwood or sawlogs, also stressing that the Bank only intends to finance initially a six-year program and that during this period a careful market survey of future prospects would be made. These two facts should be sufficient to dispel any doubts which SIDA may have about the Bank project.

Spcars, therefore, drafted an appropriate letter and this was left with the Bank for onward transmission to Stockholm.

Korea

Bartsch

Drought Areas. The FAO mission's report on this project was still awaited and it was hoped that it would be available during this coming week.

Goffin

Agri. Credit. No comment possible pending receipt of the FAD mission's report, a first draft of which should be available within the coming week.

Lebanon

Bartsch

Litani. The Bank letter of Lebanon had been sent to Rome and it was noted that Mr. Ergas had arranged to send Casati to Washington for further discussion of the next steps on this project.

<u>Livestock</u>. Mr. W. Allan (FAO Consultant) who was recently in Lesotho has apparently suggested in this Stoops Lesotho report that livestock should be made part of the UNDP project which will deal with rainfed cultivation. This point should be further clarified when Mr. Allan's report has been received. In the meantime the position of PMEA needs to be clarified (see Irrigation I). G.Agriculture. The FAO/UNDP project is just getting Rowe Lesotho underway and will apparently concentrate on development of rainfed agriculture in the Leribe region (a report by Allan should be available shortly). In the meanwhile PMEA are apparently proceeding with preparation of an irrigation project in an adjacent area. able to comment on these Rowe was not projects and at the present time they are included in the Bank's forward plan. Irrigation II. There had been some confusion in Bartsch Lesotho FAO 's mind about the exact position of the Bank on the proposed UNDP project which had originally intended to investigate possible irrigation projects in the Leribe area. A recent back-to-office report from Nottidge indicates that PMEA have been asked by the Government to assist in preparing an irrigation project in this region. The UNDP project for which FAO will be the executing agency is now apparently investigating a rainfed project possibility instead. Livestock. The FAO mission which was preparing the Goffin Madagascar credit project had recently returned Malagasy from the field and a report would be available in due course. FAO wrote to the Morondava. Bartsch Malagasy Bank on March 3 giving the latest information on the consultants chosen for execution of this project. The project is included in the Bank's plans for fiscal year 1972-73 - and this fits in with the

FAO suggestion that the project would be ready for

appraisal by the end of calendar year 1971.

Malagasy

Bartsch

The recent FAO preparation mission to Malagasy which looked at the credit and Lake Alaotra projects did not have time to visit the Morondava region. A short mission is planned by Boumendil towards the end of the year to assess the progress which the consultants are making.

Lake Alaotra. The recent FAO mission is now finalizing a report on this project, and this should be available before the end of 1969. The project should be ready for appraisal towards the end of the year.

Bartsch suggested that the Bank might have certain problems on the project, particularly relating to soils. He believes that there is likely to be a technical problem that the soils of this area contain a high proportion of humus that a certain amount of settlement and shrinkage is bound to take place once the area has been adequately drained and that very careful attention will need to be paid to subsequent cropping patterns, etc. Boumendil should be asked to comment on these aspects in particular in preparing his current report on the project.

Agriculturists will participate in forthcoming economic mission.

Malawi

Bartsch

At the time of the January review meetings, the Projects Departmentsview appeared to be that the Lower Shire project was no longer of interest to the Bank. This was duly recorded and subsequently to this the project was discussed with the African Development Bank (Robin Bishop) to see whether they would be interested in financing it. FAO understands that an African Development Bank mission has been scheduled for the latter half of the year.

In the meantime, the Bank's position may have changed as a result of the Mitchell visit which gave a more favorable impression of the project than in the past.

Malawi

Bartsch

Malawi. Lending for livestock in Malawi appears in the Forward Plan for fiscal year 1972. Mr. Grimshaw of PMEA has been in the Karonga area and has concluded that the adjacent area has good potential for livestock and has recommended a PMEA preparation mission to look at this project.

Malawi

Rowe

G. Agriculture. FAO's proposals to work on livestock and seeds development were discussed as well as the PMEA proposal to prepare an integrated development project in the Karonga region.

It was agreed that some coordination of PMEA and FAO acitivities was very desirable. PMEA have requested FAO assistance in preparing a second phase of Lilongne and FAO and PMEA intend to cooperate when preparing a livestock project.

The Karonga project and seeds proposals do not appear in the Bank's forward plan.

Mali

Ergas

Office du Niger. Mr. Ergas discussed this separately with Mr. de Wilde. FAO will receive copies of de Wilde report.

Darnell

Rice. This project was identified by a recent PMEA/FAO mission and it would include a 23,000 ha rice project in the vicinity of Mopti along the Niger and Bani rivers. The project would include extension services for a greater area of 64,000 ha. Project costs have been estimated at \$8 million, supplementary surveys and studies needed for completion of preparation will be carried out jointly by UNDP and FAO. A recent note from Taylor to Sar (FAO) suggests that there are likely to be some serious problems in the UNDP project relating mainly to the recruitment of the necessary counterpart personnel and the lack of a suitable institution for agricultural development in the area.

Mali

At the present time the Bank has insufficient information to be able to comment on the proposed project.

In principle, the Bank would be interested in such a project and provision has been made for this in the Bank's forward plan. The F/O will proceed with preparation and will keep the Bank informed as to progress.

Mauritania

Stoops

Livestock. The most basic issue in the review of this report was the project suggested for health control. No final comment will be given on the FAOreport until Mr. Sutherland has reviewed the report from a veterinary point of view. Mr. Stoops indicated that if the disease control program was limited to a rather small area the FAO project might be feasible. A detailed letter will be sent to the FAOwhen Sutherland has an opportunity to review. (He is now in Nigeria.)

Mauritius

Rowe

G.Agriculture. FAO's report on Mauritius has not yet been received by the Bank. There might be a tea project suitable for Bank financing and Lloyd of PMEA has been preparing this.

Mauritius

General

Credit. Mr. Smeyers of FAO had recently identified a small credit project. Mr. Ergas was informed that there was no allocation for such a project in the Five-Year Plan. However, the idea should not be abandoned since the Tea project was not yet clear to go ahead and credit might be substituted. A further possibility would be that if the Tea project came through it might be smaller in size than the amount allocated and the rest amount could be used for a small credit project. The Bank will keep FAO informed.

Mauritius

Goffin

Credit. The recent identification mission to Mauritius sent by the FAO had come back with a proposal for a small credit project of about \$1 million providing medium and long-term loans for the development of smallholders. (This is separate from the tea project already discussed under General Agriculture).

Mauritius

Goffin

However, Goffin's initial reaction to this credit project was negative primarily on the grounds that (a) the project was not in the Five-Year Plan and (b) that it was very small. The Bank was likely to be faced with the problem in the next 12 months of having the necessary manpower to appraise such projects.

Mexico

Rowe

Forestry. The FAOreport has now been sent to the Government and arrangements are being finalized for obtaining three Canadian bilateral aid experts for further preparation of the forestry aspects of this project.

FAOwill finalize the proposed marketing expert visit (Arnold of FAO under FAO/IBRD CP arrangements). The next CP mission should be planned for Jan/Feb'70 as and when the Canadian consultants complete their forestry studies.

If IFC goes ahead with its project then this one concentrates on plywood lumber.

Lorocco

EMENA

Sebou. Mention was made of recent FAO activity seemingly duplicating Bank T.A. regarding execution of Sebou/Bank project. Mr. Ergas said that FAO would want to maintain interest in the "larger Sebou" project since there may be other financing possibilities. Mr. Ergas indicated the custom of retaining a UNDP project team for about one year after completion of study. Mr. Ergas was informed that the Bank cannot delegate the responsibility of project supervision and that uncoordinated FAO involvement in the Bank project was not acceptable. (Subsequently Mr. Ergas contacted Rome and was informed that FAO will halt all activity in Sebou until the intial project area and plans for further clear to FAO. The "Sebou" lending in Sebou are yellow-cover report, giving such outlines, is now being studied in Rome.) FAO will send terms of reference of SODECA contract to Bank.

In a later meeting, Mr. Ergas proposed a livestock preparation mission. Mr. Wapenhans believed that livestock might well! be absorbed by the ongoing credit scheme but indicated we would check on the idea and inform FAO. The Bank will send FAO a copy of McMeekan's report (1967?) on livestock in Morocco.

Morocco

Mr. Ergas mentioned that during the recent FAO council meeting the CP had been criticized for not having been very active in the Arab countries. The obvious answer was that since the CP only works on projects upon the Bank's authority that the Bank should be subject of such criticism. The posture on Jordan was very pessimistic and the situation vis-a-vis Algeria remained unchanged.

Morocco

Education. Mr. Ergas suggested a reconnaissance mission but no agreement was reached. Reference was made to the "Grontmy" study on manpower in Morocco.

S.Asia

Darnell

Nepal. The Bank has an interest in small groundwater projects. The large UNDP project is not the kind the Bank would be interested in.

The Bank also would be interested in a forestry project. Mr. Ergas will make proposals for Bank consideration. Mr. Ergas mentioned that the Asian Development Bank will be sending an irrigation reconnaissance mission to Nepal in August. That mission will look at other possibilities than those identified by the recent FAO mission.

The Bank has received FAO's report of the identification mission carried out by Messrs. Bhattacharjee and will comment. Provision has been made in the Bank's forward plan for an agricultural development project to be appraised in 1971 or 1972.

The two main projects identified by the Cooperative Program are the Chatra development project and the Central Terai groundwater development project.

FAO will be submitting a report on these to the Bank in the very near future and following receipt of this report, the next steps for project preparation can be jointly worked out.

Nicaragua

Goffin

Credit. The proposal discussed at the time of the January Review Meeting to reshape the livestock and banana projects into a broader-based credit project tied to the Atlantic region development possibilities was discussed. There appears to be general agreement that this is the right approach. Heymans has called in on his way back from Chile to assess the next steps and the FAO was proposing to try and prepare this project in the latter half of '69.

Nicaragua

Haynes

Fisheries. The Bank has not yet received the report by Tecno-Beria which Bourgois had proposed to review in Washington en route to Panama. Depending on Bourgois' Panama visit this review could be carried out when the report is received in Washington. If the Panama mission is cancelled for any reason (see below) then the proposal would be for the Bank to send the Tecno-Beria report to Rome for Bourgois' comments.

Nicaragua

Stoops

<u>Livestock</u>. Mr. Heymans will stop on his way back from Chile to have some further discussions on this project.

Western Hemisphere Micaragua. Further FAO activity only after return of Bank economic mission in August. Mr. Bourgois will pass through headquarters enroute to or from Panama. The question of IDB operations in C.A. was discussed.

The following broad lending areas were to be handled as below:

Niger

General

<u>Livestock Study</u>. Mr. Ergas was informed of the situation reported by the McMeekan mission which is roughly as follows:

- a) FAO/UNDP general study of livestock in Niger has been ongoing for 3-4 years. When a proposal was made by FAO/UNDP to extend this study by another four years the Government was only willing to agree to a one year extension. The Government claims that it has not received any information on the current study.
- b) FAC has financed a pilot ranch with watering points adjacent.
- c) The Bank might consider including \$200,000 (either as IDA credit or T.A. grant) in the credit project now under consideration for a FAC type study on a larger scale.

Niger

The Bank is in contact with UNDP and FAC to ascertain their interests before proposing IDA finance for a study for which alternate sources of finance might be available. In any case, care should be taken that the information available from the general UNDP study (see (a) above) will be utilized and that all efforts should be made to ensure that the ongoing UNDP study will be as successful as possible. Whether UNDP or IDA finances the study it would in our view be essential to hire consultants.

In view of the Government's reported disappointment with FAO's conduct of the ongoing UNDP study, Mr. Ergas suggested the possibility of using the FAO/IBRD Cooperative Program, to oversee within FAO a new UNDP study, as was done in the case of Malawi -- Lilongwe project.

Care should be taken that all parties be kept informed on all future developments.

Nigeria

Haynes

Agric. Industries. A FAO mission to look at Migerian fisheries projects has been on the cards since January of this year but the carrying out of the mission has been delayed because of the present political disturbances. In principle, the Bank remains interested in developing such projects; in particular, attention would probably be focused on Tin Can Island.

The FAO will continue to schedule this mission for the latter half of 1969 but further discussion with McIvor is required in order to clarify the area position.

Pakistan

Goffin

Credit. Following the last credit mission, the Pakistan Government wished to follow up the proposals made by Elkjaer. The Pakistan Government had expressed particular interest in obtaining Danish technical assistance for further development of the credit banks. The Bank was therefore scheduling a mission within the next two weeks and a cable was sent to Elkjer asking him to report directly to Washington not later than 25 June.

Panama

W.Hem.

Fisheries. FAO mission scheduled for July 12. Indication of Government's positive interest received from Wyss.

Panama

Panama fisheries project. Walden reported that Wyss had written to the Government to obtain clarification on this point. It was agreed to contact Wyss during the Washington review discussions and try and obtain clarification of the Government's possible interest so that the FAO mission scheduled for July to August could proceed.

Peru

Rowe

<u>Via Centrale</u>. No further action on this project is contemplated at the present time pending change in the present political situation.

Philippines

Education Projects

Education. Mr. Ergas proposed a review of the sector. Mr. Burt advised that the Ford Foundation may be willing to finance a survey of the education and training sector, provided the Government makes an official request. OECD might be asked by Ford Foundation to undertake the actual study if a survey is agreed but several questions remain to be settled. No agreement was reached that FAO should undertake a review.

Philippines

E. Asia & Pacific

The Bank Economic Report will be completed the second week in July. Election outcome by no means certain. Mr. Goodman said the Bank would not lend to Philippine Development Bank but was considering a loan to Government for the Storage project, which might be placed in a Trust Fund with DBP.

Mr. Ergas enquired if any follow-up was contemplated on the Gaitskell report on Central Luzon. This report advocated the setting up of a large rural rehabilitation scheme. The Bank representatives answered negatively and said that the Government had no enthusiasm for the plan.

Mr. Gibbs was more in favor of the UNDP groundwater resources survey. FAO will keep the Bank informed on progress.

Philippines

Stoops

Livestock. The FAO mission report will be ready early mid July. Mr. Spears indicated that the mission had also briefly looked at the possibilities of pigs and poultry and that the mission had reservations about need for Bank financing in this kind of project. Also, a pig and poultry project could be in competition with human food stuffs. The prospects for a beef project appeared to be good.

Portugal

General

FAO will send Bank available material which may be of help to current sector review mission. Mr. Sonley (leader of sector review) will stopover in Rome for discussions after completion of field work. Mr. Ergas will check possibility of FAO involvement in project preparation in future.

Rwanda

Rowe

Tea. The Bank still has a number of reservations about the Rwanda tea project and these have been spelled out in a letter to FAO dated March 10, 1969.

#### These reservations include:

- (a) The proposal to use a vegetative propagation system (the Bank doubts that VP material is available).
- (b) The rate of return on the project is likely to be lower than originally anticipated primarily because:
  - i. the Projects Department believes that yields are likely to be lower than anticipated; and
- ii. the Bank's latest projection of tea prices is much lower than FAO have assumed (the Bank is now quoting a price of US\$0.28 per pound, fob, which is equivalent to 0.36 pence cif London).

There are also problems on the organization and management side. Belgian technical assistance is helping in this direction but there will need to be considerable strengthening of the organization side if the project is to be made acceptable to the Bank.

FAO preparation of the project is proceeding in cooperation with PMEA.

Rwanda

Bartsch

Marshlands Reclamation. Bartsch has a number of reservations about this project stemming primarily from the fact that the project would involve improvement of a large number of small scattered marshland areas. The project would be difficult to organize and would likely be fairly small.

On the other hand, it is very clear that there are few project possibilities in Rwanda and this project does appear in the forward Bank plan for possible financing in 1972-73. FAO has

Rwanda

planned further preparation of the project during early 1970 and the Government should proceed with project preparation as discussed with FAO at the time of the December identification mission.

FAO 's latest view on cropping patterns is that in the Kigali region a combination of rice and vegetables or rice and forage would be appropriate although cultivation has not yet been carried out on a large scale.

Vegetable marketing is likely to be a major problem. There has been a suggestion from the Government that part of the project output should be sold on the European market as fresh vegetables (by air transport?) but this proposal would need very careful examination. There has been a suggestion for a dehydration plant but again the economics of this need to be carefully studied.

The relationship between the proposed marshlands reclamation and Mutara livestock project have been worked out. The latter would comprise drainage of the whole of the Kakitumba marshland (about 2,800 hectares). It is possible that part (about 500 hectares of this area) could be diverted to forage for the ranch in the dry season.

Senegal Casamance Darnell

Rice. The Bank has recently reviewed a review on this project by SATEC.

The project is being followed up by PMWA and in part by FAO. but the Bank's comments on Casamance may be relevant to other rice projects with which FAO is concerned.

The Bank's reservations about Casamance include the low internal price for rice and the high collection transport and milling costs. At the moment the project benefits are being calculated on the basis of a price at \$195 per ton. The Bank's Commodities Branch suggest that by 1975 this price will have declined to between \$110 and \$120 a ton (this represents a 40% decline). FAO should obtain a copy of the Bank Commodities Division note.

Senegal Delta Dumoulin

Rice. A 4,100 ha project in the Delta region was identified by Boumendil during a visit to Senegal in April 1969. Total project costs estimated at \$2.4 million and a tentative rate of return at 14%.

Senegal

Feasibility studies are already well advanced. About \$85,000 more will be required to complete project preparation. The Government is investigating the possibility of having these studies completed by FAC.

Economic Division. An agriculturist and a fish specialis will participate in the forthcoming economic mission.

Sierra Leone Rowe

Rice. To date FAO has been concentrating on the Rhombe rice project, a first phase of which would cover some 10,000 acres.

Denness (who worked for a number of years in Sierra Leone) has a number of substantial reservations about the proposed Rhombe project. These include:

- (a) The probable difficulty of persuading farmers to take up land in the Rhombe area.
- (b) The fact that the Rhombe project assumes a very high degree of mechanization and a rice farming system running along estate lines. Denness believes that this is the wrong strategy for Sierra Leone, that there will be considerable difficulties over maintenance of the equipment, that the number of farmers affected will be small and that the origin of the project stems from the desire on the part of the Government to make use of a lot of machinery which has already been imported and is not being adequately used?

He believes that a more appropriate type of development would be a low cost rice farming operation in the swamp lands to the south? This would be carried out in more densely populated areas, would affect a large number of farmers, could be easily implemented based on previous experience of the Sierra Leone Agricultural Department and could be combined with smallholder cocoa production.

These comments should be discussed with Boumendil and Claude Brochu. FAO may wish to give consideration to identification of a project of the type now being recommended by Denness.

Sierra Leone

Stoops

Livestock. FAO has planned a mission in October (agreed previously) but the point was raised, (since again this project will involve disease control) that further discussion with the Bank would be useful before the proposed preparation mission proceeds to the field, particularly with reference to those points raised in the recent McMeekan Report of possible relevance to Sierra Leone. In the meantime, PMVA has been working on the slaughterhouse project and FAO will check how far this has proceeded.

Spain

Bartsch

Irrigation I. FAQ was of the view that a substantial irrigation projects program could be built up in Spain, starting with the Guadalquivir project and would recommend that a survey of irrigation possibilities be carried out in early 1970 as part of the CP program of work.

Spain

Education Projects Education. Mr. Ballantine explained the Bank's thinking which was on a two-track basis. A general education project will be appraised in September but agricultural education will need to be handled on a broad basis, as outlined in Mr. Tellex-Molina's (FAO) back-to-office report of March 27, 1969. This would also require a joint operation with the Agriculture Projects Department of the Bank.

A small working group could be set up to look at the following main items:

- 1) Decentralization of research.
- 2) Decentralization of extension.
- 3) Agricultural services.
- 4) Vocational agricultural training.

The present thinking had been influenced by the Beal/Richter (FAO) report. But there was no certainty whether the Government is ready with the rationalization plans preliminary to implementing decentralization policy. When there is evidence that the Government has taken the required policy decisions or when it is clear that it intends to do so, preparation activity can be initiated. The general education project appraisal mission should look into the matter in late September.

Spain

Education and Agriculture Projects Departments will need further discussions on terms of reference and staffing and responsibilities.

The preparation mission, which might go to Spain in December 1969, might include the following specialists:

- 1) A research administrator;
- 2) An extension expert;
- 3) Two educators higher and intermediate; and
- 4) An architect and economist.

Spain

General

Mr. Ergas suggested an irrigation review by FAO This mission was not agreed but FAO will make proposals for a possible mission in early 1970.

Sudan

General

No FAO or Bank activity until political realities after "coup" can be evaluated.

FAO requested to receive copies of recent Bank economic report. Mr. Ergas expressed interest in future FAO activity after situation becomes clearer.

Sudan

Rowe

G.Agriculture. The proposed FAO identification mission has been deferred pending resolution under the present political troubles.

Swaziland

Goffin

<u>Credit</u>. The Bank has received the FAO/PMEA back-to-office report on the project and is now awaiting the full report. The Bank's initial reaction to the project was to express concern at the very high proportion of short-term credit involved and it was suggested that this be discussed between Messrs. Evans and Ergas.

The FAO emphasized that this type of project is probably the only way to initiate development in Swaziland and that despite the fact that the short-term credit element of the project is high, this project could lead to a very much larger investment program for which a higher proportion of medium and long-term credit would be required.

The Agric. Projects Department will comment on the repor in due course. In the meanwhile it was noted that provision had been made in the Bank's forward plan for financing of a possible credit project in 1971/72.

Swaziland

The need for a follow up mission will be decided after obtaining the full report.

Swaziland

Bartsch

Usutu. Bartsch's view on this project remains as already indicated, namely that primary emphasis should be given to the early development possibilities in the Usutu region. The prospects for rapid development in the Usutu basin appear excellent. The project to dam the greater Usutu would be a very expensive operation. The correct strategy should be to proceed with smaller scale irrigation possibilities and a fairly wide range of cropping activities. He feels it is wrong for too much time to be wasted at present on studies for development of the Komati river basin.

Syria

Haynes

Grain Storage. The FAO briefing notes raised the question as to Bank's possible interest in the Syrian grain storage projects which were examined by J.P. Battacharjee at the time of the last economic review mission. It is reported that other financial agencies have been approached; for example the Kuwait Fund. Bids for project construction have apparently been put out and it seems a Russian group has won a contract, although, a Yugoslavian bid was lower.

Tanzania

Stoops

Livestock. The FAO report has been received. A preliminary review shows that there will be a variety of separate projects and Mr. Stoops believes that some of these elements could possibly be joined to create larger projects. Regarding Kitulu, it was felt that a beef/dairy project as now proposed could be possible in view of the existing marketing arrangements. The Bank's full comments will be forwarded to Rome as soon as possible. Messrs Gerring and Knobel will go to Tanzania shortly to check on the ongoing livestock project and also investigate the restructuring of NDC. Mr. Spears requested that the mission visit Rome on its way back to Washington to brief them on the latest situation.

Thailand

General

Chao Phya. Mr. Gaitskell's ad hoc involvement was agreed. It was made clear that terms of reference for each mission by him would have to be agreed in advance and that after each mission discussions would be held on the nature and timing of the next visit, if any.

Thailand

Mr. Ergas was invited to make proposals for identification in the N. East and the Southern region. Mr. Ergas should ascertain nature of US AID activity in N. East.

Thailand

Education. Bank has written to Kasetsart University to reiterate its view that present facilities and size of campus in Bangkok are insufficient and not capable of acceptable expansion and that additional new campus should be developed at Kampaengsaen about 80 miles from the city. Mr. Ergas emphasized that unless faculty was given the incentive of higher salaries there might be a new facility without teaching staff.

Tha: Land

Seeds. The Bank is in favor of the FAO proposal to proceed with further preparation of this project.

Tunisia

Haynes

Fisheries. This project was discussed at some length, primarily in the context of the difficulties which Bank is having in financing vessel construction where such vessels are to be manufactured locally and international competitive bidding problems are involved. The case of Ghana was cited where this proved to be a major stumbling block. opinion, which apparently he has already communicated is that the Tunisian project to Bourgois. as currently proposed by the CP is likely to run into the same difficulties as in Ghana. The basic problem is that under the Bank's requirements which calls for international competitive bidding it is possible that the Tunisian boat construction yards would not be able to compete with foreign suppliers. However, the Tunisian Government may be reluctant to import boats for the project even though overseas purchases might be cheaper. There appears to be no easy answer to this problem but the issue was flagged as being likely to cause problems at the time of appraisal.

Turkey

Eco. Div.

Ashton will come to HQ in September to discuss the revised economic report. There is no sector review contemplated for the near future.

Stoops

<u>livestock.</u> The general volume of the FAO livestock report has been received and the project reports also.

Turkey

Stoops

It became apparent from the general volume that the dairy project has a heavy import element and that the other 3 projects rely heavily on local currency and have a large short-term credit component and these points will need further discussion. Mr. Stoops also indicated that although detailed comments could not be made before the full reports had been received. If the fattening project is not part of an integrated project the Bank may have some difficultuies. An appraisalmission has been scheduled for August/September. Bank's full comments will be sent in due course.

(See Annex II for a more complete report on Turkey Preparation report discussions.)

Education Projects

An Agricultural education mission to Turkey under FAO leadership was agreed. This mission would investigate the whole of the educational structure for higher and intermediate agricultural education with the organization of services. Mr. Ballantine will write to the Government on this mission.

Haynes

Food Processing and Fruit and Vegetable Marketing.

Haynes is due to pay a reconnaissance visit to Turkey between July 2 and July 4 to look at various project possibilities.

Spears had brought to Washington a number of relevant reports on FAO staff on such a project (these included a recent survey by an FAO team of the Turkish production companies which the Bank is being asked to finance). FAO has also been involved in providing technical advice to a number of the on-going food processing industry groups in Turkey.

It was suggested that this information might appropriately be discussed with Haynes on his way back from India and a cable was sent to him suggesting that he should call in Rome.

Uganda

Bartsch

Mubuku. The Bank's interest in the project is very uncertain.

Rowe

Integrated Rural Development. Both FAO and PMEA have expressed reservation about the UNDP integrated rural development project. Too many agencies have become involved. The project contains a complicated refugee problem and at the moment it is not sufficiently production-oriented to be of Bank interest. CP has initiated discussions in FAO to try and resolve the situation. At the

moment, this project does not appear in the Bank's forward plan. Further discussion of this is needed with Evans and Area to clarify fiveyear plan and PMEA/CP coordination aspects.

Goffin

Credit. When Eccles returns, prospects for an agricultural credit might be clearer. However, it looks as if this were a better project for the African Development Bank as it differs considerably from our present credit ventures.

U.A.R.

Goffin

Credit. FAO had proposed that the possibilities of a credit project in the UAR should be further investigated. This was one of the priority areas noted by FAO. following Bhattacharjee's participation in an earlier economic review mission.

Darnell

Irrigation. The FAObriefing note on UAR raises the question as to whether it would be appropriate to start looking at basin irrigation projects. The note states that the problem of conversion of basin irrigation is likely to become acute with the control of Nile floods being achieved through the High Dam. Farm investment will be necessary and it is hoped that this is one of the major items which will be looked at under the proposed bid project for UAR. Since 1966 the World Food Program has had a project for conversion of basin irrigation in upper Egypt and this experience could provide a basis for elaborating the proposed credit project.

Darnell's view was that drainage development should continue to be given first priority in the UAR. The Bank has only made provision for Delta reclamation projects in the 1971/72 pipeline (in addition to credit) and it appears to be the view that it would be advisable to concentrate on the Delta reclamation drainage projects during the next two years rather than starting on a new line of approach. This was confirmed by Area Dept.

Upper Volta

Hendry

An agriculturist and a livestock expert will participate in the forthcoming economic mission.

Tenezuela

Stoops

<u>Livestock</u>. Mr. Brumby of FAO will do the first mission in August and Mr. Stoops requested that he also look at the Zulia Area. A discussion with Zinman and Stoops would be useful enroute to Venezuela or on return from Chile.

Yugoslavia

Haynes

FAO had suggested that during the latter half of 1969 or early 1970, an identificantion mission be sent to Yugoslavia to look at various agro-industry possibilities including food processing, fruit and vegetable marketing, forest industries, etc. The possibility of Bank financing of such projects had been discussed at the time of the appraisal of the Yugoslavia Belgrade had participated. Bar railway project in which FAO The Bank's position at that time had been that it would not be possible to contemplate Bank financing at the present time because the Bank had just made a loan of \$50 million for the railway project and did not want immediately to contemplate further investment in Yugoslavia. However, it was understood that the situation had not evolved and that the Bank was looking for a forward project pipeline. This might be an appropriate time to re-raise the whole question of possible interest by the Bank in agro-industries, particularly since FAO had been approached recently by the FAO/UNDP project manager asking whether or not the Cooperative Program could assist in identifying investment projects.

The Bank has an unidentified amount for agriculture in the forward plan. The missing link is the question of the Government's possible interest in still obtaining Bank finance and this should be clarified both with Area and the Government.

Goffin

A credit project in Yugoslavia would be sensible. Further discussions Spears-Area need to be undertaken.

Zambia

Rowe

Rowe has no views on the proposed regional development project which FAO intend to assist PMEA to prepare.

It is clear that a number of project possibilities are likely to emerge from the economic review mission now in the field and further preparation work in Zambia could be anticipated towards the end of the year. Position on the five-year plan needs clarification.

#### NOTES ON VARIOUS COUNTRIES

### Agro-Industry Projects (Walden)

#### General

There was a short, general discussion on any significant changes which have taken place since the time of the last Washington review in January, particularly with respect to such items as the types of projects which the Agro-industries Division is now working on, the relationships between the Agro-industries Division and the IFC, etc.

The types of project on which the Agro-industries Division is currently working include primarily fisheries projects, grain storage projects, food processing, fruit and vegetable marketing, etc. In principle, the Agro-industries Division is interested in widening the scope of these activities and would be prepared to consider within the definition of agro-industries, for example, agro-aviation projects (of the type which Haynes has been looking at in India), slaughterhouse projects (in conjunction with the Livestock Division), forest industry projects (sawmills, plywood mills, etc.). The staff of the Agro-industries Division remains small. The Division is still feeling its way into project identification and preparation activities but there appears to be no difficulty in principle about making use of the FAO/IBRD Cooperative Program as experience is gained and the program gets under way. Relationships with the IFC have been dis-There is a proposal cussed. for an industrial projects department within the Bank, which has not yet been put into practice and relationships between this and the Agroindustries Department should be clarified at a later stage. No problems are anticipated.

The point was made in the discussions that FAO could provide a source of new project ideas (reference was made to the fact that the investment center has just completed such an exercise in conjunction with the FAO industry Cooperative Program).

# Western Hemisphere (General)

Present: Wright, Mirza, Ergas and Veraart.

Mr. Ergas indicated that FAO was contemplating a further study on C.A. integration and he enquired the Bank's intention regarding regional projects. Mr. Mirza said that no specific such projects were foreseen other than a staged effort in electric power. As a measure of the difficulties in such involvements he mentioned the abortive attempt in telecommunications.

FAO (not the FAO/IBRD team) also wants to do a specific regional exercise in livestock. Grain-storage will be handled by IDB. Mr. Ergas was informed of a regional port study being undertaken by Transportation Projects Department.

## Eastern Africa (General)

Present: El Emary, Williams, Evans, Wapenhans, Ergas, Veraart.

Mr. Ergas indicated that in a number of recent instances there had been failure of coordination between FAO and PMEA (for example, Mauritius Tea).

All parties agreed that coordination was necessary and that an attempt should be made to establish future working programs which would eliminate the chance of duplicating activity.

Mr. El Emary was somewhat surprised at the strength of Mr. Ergas' complaint. Mr. Evans suggested that in balance the situation was not at all critical. In the majority of instances cooperation was good. Mr. Ergas was complaining about the relatively few cases where it was not.

One item of overlap was however identified as particularly serious and that was the PMEA activity regarding ongoing UNDP projects for which FAO was executing agency. These contacts by PMEA with UNDP/FAO personnel without prior or post consultation with FAO, Rome, had confused all parties and made the CP role of coordinating very difficult.

### Western Africa (General)

Present: Chaufournier, Evans, Wapenhans, Ergas, Vertart.

Mr. Ergas mentioned acute competition in West Africa between FAO and PMEA. The need was recognized that bothFAO and PMEA delineate their activities in accordance with agreed working programs.

The African Development Bank has requested FAO to be kept informed of its future activities. There was no objection to do so.

Regarding release of FAO/IBRD reports, this could be done only in agreement with respective Governments. Mr. Chaufournier suggested Mr. Ergas check with Governments on either ad hoc or permanent procedures. Both Mr. Chaufournier and Evans felt that sending all reports would be quite inefficient but held no serious objection if African Development Bank wanted to see all, provided that in each case the Government's agreement was obtained. Mr. Chaufournier added that ADB is always informed, well before reports are published, on project possibilities the Bank has come across.

Mr. Ergas mentioned ADB's interest in N. Nigeria.

IBRD has no current plans for "Consultative Group" for Nigeria.

Current Inputs and Local Currency Financing. Mr. Wapenhans informed Mr. Ergas of the present attitude of the Board of Directors. If current input financing was to give a "first shot in the arm" then that could be acceptable under certain circumstances. In general, however, the attitude was quite cool.

Mr. Wapenhans also indicated that the Bank is trying to work out a formulation on incremental working capital. Local currency financing on project grounds was unacceptable but country reasons could be accepted as justification (institution building for instance).

High Level livestock discussion. Mr. Evans agreed in principle with Mr. Ergas that a one or two day livestock seminar with limited participation would be interesting. The discussions would focus on research policy. FAO will send TOR and details on participants.

Economic Papers. Mr. Ergas would like to receive a list of working papers and other material produced by the Bank's Economic Department. This would allow selectivity in requesting copies of material of interest. Mr. Ergas also requested to receive copies of all commodity papers produced by the Bank. Mr. Wapenhans will check on both requests.

Opex - T.A. Mr. Ergas indicated that FAO will be more and more receptive to Bank requests for providing personnel for project execution.

Mr. Evans did not agree to the principle of first refusal by FAO and wanted to continue on an ad hoc basis.

Mr. Ergas will write a letter on the general subject to the Bank.

I.W.P. Mr. Ergas requested Bank comments on the Latin American section in the summary volume of the FAO published Indicative World Plan.

#### Recruitment FAO/IBRD Cooperative Program

Mr. Ergas said that recruitment was going well and would be kept in line with the schedule agreed during the 1970-1971 Budget Discussions.

The possibility was raised by Mr. Ergas to include some agrobusiness experts in the "Team".

#### TURKEY

#### Livestock Preparation Mission Reports

#### Meeting on Tuesday, July 1, 1969

- 1. A meeting was held on Tuesday, July 1, to discuss the Turkey Livestock Preparation Mission reports dated June 5 (General Report) and 19 (Reports 1-4), received in the Bank on June 19 and 24. The meeting was attended by Messrs. Edwards, Ergas, Fransen, Gerring, P. Nelson, Stoops, Wapenhans and I. Wright.
- 2. The report covered four projects:
  - (a) intensive dairy production;

(b) livestock fattening;

- (c) national dairy breed improvement; and
- (d) beet pulp drying.
- January 1969 had been deliberately concentrated on intensive dairying so as not to delay this particular project, which had seemed reasonably near to being ready for appraisal. In the short time available for study of the reports now submitted, it seemed that intensive dairying was ready for appraisal, and possibly fattening of cattle through beet sugar factory feedlots; but there remained uncertainties over the other projects, and there were policy decisions to be made before appraisal or further preparation.

#### Foreign Exchange Component

The meeting discussed the question of the foreign exchange component of the proposed projects. The dairy cattle projects, estimated to cost US\$26 million, would need about US\$15 million foreign exchange. They seemed unlikely to earn or save foreign exchange, which was so critical to Turkey's economy. The livestock fattening projects, estimated to cost US\$57 million, would need little foreign exchange, and involved mostly short-term current input financing. It was not clear that Turkey would be able to find export markets for meat in order to earn foreign exchange, since Turkey's experience in the meat export trade was not, at the present, very great. The Bank would need to make an early decision on the acceptability of the projects, having regard particularly to the lack of long-term investments to finance in the fattening projects. This would be discussed on return of the Area mission which was recently in Turkey.

#### Supply of Cattle

A fundamental question for the cattle fattening projects was the proposed size of the operation in relation to available cattle. The Ministry Feedlot Scheme would need 300,000 cattle a year (150,000 twice a year) and the Sugarbeet Factory Feedlot Scheme about the same number. In relation to Turkey's estimated (1967) total cattle population of 14.2 million and estimated annual offtake of 2 million, of which 605,000 suitable for fattening, these were large numbers. Even if some of the cattle taken into the project would have been fattened by the same farmers in any case (though less efficiently), there seemed a real danger

of two large new buyers pushing up prices of feeder steers beyond an acceptable level; beyond the 10% contemplated in the reports, at any rate. Report No. 2 stated (para 8) that "Government will, therefore, examine ways of improving the existing marketing system" and these ways would include appointment of a UN Marketing Expert. This improvement would obviously take time and, especially in view of the lack of experience in Turkey of such an ambitious scheme, the alternative of starting with a smaller project in one or more selected areas might be preferred, if a project with investments, rather than current inputs, to finance could be devised.

ó. Another feedlot problem, especially for the Ministry Scheme, which relies on hired labor, might be seasonal labor being needed at the same time that sugarbeet handling needed labor.

#### Beet Pulp Drying

7. It was not too clear from the reports whether (and how much) sugarbeet pulp was actually being wasted or whether it was being inefficiently used. If not actually wasted, present use would need to be taken into account and set off against proposed use when calculating the economic benefits of pulp drying.

#### Rate of Interest

Although the reports said the rate of interest to be charged to farmers by the Agricultural Bank would be subject to negotiation with IBRD, the implication was that the rate would be 7%. This seemed low in relation to 9% interest charged for short-term credit, 10% for commercial loans, and the policy of the Agricultural Bank to earn a 2% margin on all loans. Para 79 of the General Report stated that the rate of interest for medium and long-term loans would be "not less than 7%".

#### Organization

9. The organization proposed for the projects was not very clear and the reports differed from the Decree establishing the Livestock Improvement Project Principles. Neither placed the Intensive Dairy Project Manager with the Milk Industry Organization or the Sugar Factory Feedlot Project Manager with the Sugarbeet Corporation.

#### Conclusion

10. In summary, the Intensive Dairy Production Project appeared ready for appraisal, but the other projects were not. It was agreed that the General Report and Intensive Dairy Project Report could be released to the Turkish Government, but that the other reports needed further consideration. Bank staff would study the reports in more detail and comment as soon as possible. It was suggested that Mr. Ergas and Mr. Allen might return to Turkey shortly to explain the need for further preparation and that Mr. Allen might visit Washington before August 15 for discussion prior to departure of an appraisal mission. If further preparation was agreed by Bank and Government, this might then be arranged to overlap Bank appraisal. As far as the Bank was concerned, decisions on further preparation would be made as soon as the issues had been discussed with Area, following return of the Area mission to Turkey about July 16.

#### FAO/IBRD Cooperative Program

- 1. This is an additional briefing note for your visit next week to FAO, Rome and it refers to some of the things that we have discussed in the Bank during our review with FAO in the past two weeks.
- 2. FAO manpower resources under the Program are being devoted mainly to project preparation. They have done, or are doing, substantive work on 19 projects which are listed in our FY 1970 Lending Program. We have asked them to be responsible for most of the preparation work on 24 projects in the FY 1971 Lending Program and for about 40 projects in the 1972 Lending Program. We are thus looking to FAO for the preparation of about half of the projects that we have in our agricultural lending programs. The other half will be prepared by the Bank's Permanent Missions or by consultants, or by Bank headquarters staff in the case of repeater loans.
- 3. We have requested FAO participation in six economic missions between now and December 31, 1969. At our next review with FAO in September we shall invite their participation in some economic missions to be carried out in the first half of calendar year 1970.
- 4. We have invited FAO participation in at least one agricultural sector review (Brazil), and have tentatively invited it for two more. We are taking the line that these agricultural sector reviews are so closely related to Bank Lending Programs that they should be Bank led missions, even though, in most cases, we may invite FAO participation. Mr. Ergas had been pressing for FAO to be given responsibility for leading such missions, but he did not refer to this during our discussions of the past week.
- 5. We have checked with FAO the progress of their recruiting for the Cooperative Program Team. They had 38 men in their Team at the end of June but commitments to four more which puts their recruiting just about on target. (Reference the agreed recruiting targets which you already have in your briefing). Mr. Ergas expects that recruitment will proceed according to the agreed targets.
- 6. FAO have suggested that there could be an improvement in continuity between project preparation and project appraisal, either by having some of the people who have helped governments to prepare projects in the field at the time of appraisal; or alternatively by having a member of the appraisal team

overlap in the field during the later stages of project preparation. In principle the idea of an overlap is good; it is nothing new and we have been able to achieve it in several cases. I have said that we shall not be able, save in very exceptional cases, to arrange for Bank appraisal staff to overlap in the later stages of project preparation. (We have been able to do it only two or three times during the past 12 months). What we would welcome, and what Mr. Ergas will try to do, is to see that at the time when our appraisal missions are in the field, one or two of the FAO men who have beloed government to prepare the project should be present as advisors to the government, (not as members of the appraisal team). This is the normal procedure where consultants are used.

- Mr. Ergas has spent a total of four days in the Bank during 7. the review which we completed yesterday. Mr. Spears arrived about a week before Mr. Ergas, and much of the routine business was disposed of before Mr. Ergas arrived. It is clear that we do not need to have Mr. Ergas here for more than three or four days for each review. He complained when he arrived that he was "not being allowed to see Area Departments." In fact the arrangements which we made worked quite well. He did see a number of Area Department Directors, but in fairly short meetings on specific items which we had agreed in advance. to put on the Agenda. We had a useful meeting with Mr. Ballantine about agricultural education operations in which FAO can assist.
- One matter that is still not really satisfactory is the arrangements for coordinating the FAO work with the work of the Permanent Missions in Eastern and Western Africa. There have been several cases in Eastern Africa where coordination has been unsatisfactory and there has been duplication. We think the situation may improve with the new setup in PMEA, and we hope to have the Heads of PMEA and PMNA in Washington at the time of our next review with FAO, which will be just before the annual meeting.

## 1. ALGERIA Preparation Mission

No action is planned by the Bank for the time being.

# 2. BOLIVIA Preparation Mission

This has been delayed until the second half of August at Government request. UNESCO is carrying out preparation. FAC participation will probably be required.

# 3. BOTSWANA-LESOTHO-SWAZTLAND Proparation Mission

This project has a low priority and no estion is expected within the next six months.

## A. BRAZIL Preparation Mission

This mission will probably take place in September. Tellez' porticipation has been agreed.

# 5. CHYLON Identification Mission

This will take place probably in October and will be UNESCO responsibility. FAC will suggest participation and insist at least on an adequate briefing of the UNESCO agricultural expert in Rome.

# 6. CHINA (Taiwan) - Preparation

UNESCO Preparation Mission now in the field. FAO participating through Fisheries consultant.

# 7. CONGO (Brazzaville)

This has low priority and no action is expected within the next six months.

# 8. CONGO (Kinshasa)

#### 20. MOROCCO - Preparation

This could possibly take place in December 1969, and Beal's participation would be wolcome.

#### 21. NICARAGUA

Action on a second project is being held in abeyance for the time being.

#### 22. PARAGUAY - Reconnaissance

Area Bank Recommaissance Mission is going out mid-June.

#### 23. PHILIPPINES

The last Supervision Mission (Bank) was of the opinion that a sector review of education would be required. Further discussions will have to be held on the way to carry out this sector review

Appraisal is scheduled for September/October 1969. CP participation possible. The question is to be followed up as soon as the Preparation Mission has completed its work.

#### 31. THAILAND

Discussed at another meeting with Mr. Ergas.

#### 32. TUNISIA

A further education project holds low priority in the Bank programme and no action is expected within the next six months.

#### 33. TURKEY

A UNESCO mission going out in June/July. Mr. Ballantine feels that the possible agricultural component should be prepared separately but the first step is to assist Turkey in defining its basic policy with regard to middle level agricultural schools and to survey requirements for Government agricultural services. An Agricultural Education Mission under FAO responsibility could be mounted in October, with participation of an institutions man to cover the aspect of requirements of Government services. However, Mr. Ballantine will confirm these arrangements after his trip to Turkey.

#### 34. UGANDA - Preparation

The UNESCO report is almost ready. A Preparation Mission is scheduled for November 1969 with possible CP participation.

Back-to-Office and Final Report

The consultation concerned 16 UNDP projects in Afghanistan, Iraq, Jordan, Lebanon, Pakistan, Somalia, Sudan, Syria, Saudi Arabia, UAR and Yemen. Heads of delegations present were, in most cases, directors of the departments of water and land resources. UNDP project managers and national counterparts were also present.

The UNDP/FAO projects considered were discussed in detail and a preliminary list of common problems that could make the subject of regional applied research programmes were identified in the draft report of the Meeting (see Appendix A). These will be reviewed by the Secretariat, who will make specific proposals to the next meeting of the FAO Regional Commission on Land and Water Use in Alexandria in September 1969 as to how and to what extent the meeting's recommendations could be implemented. The intention is to carry out this research within the means made available to present UNDP projects.

The only two projects of stated special Bank interest are the Kunduz Khanabad in Afghanistan and the Shebelli in Somalia, for which Appendix B gives a resume of the statements made at the meeting.

Other projects that may lead to investment follow-up within a couple of years are the "Investigation of the Sandstone Aquifers of East Jordan", and "Hydro-agricultural Development" (Northern Lebanon). Both the project for "Irrigation Development in the Wadi Jezan, in Saudi Arabia, and the "Survey of the Agricultural Potential of Wadi Zabid", in Yemen, have sizeable investment implications, and could be followed up closely by the Programme should there be Bank interest in investment in these two countries.

In its draft report, the Meeting expressed hope that Bank/IDA financing for irrigation development for the Region could be increased, and that the process of project preparation for the World Bank could be speeded up. In this respect the meeting recognised that a great deal of background data was requested by the World Bank before project appraisal and underlined the necessity of early contacts between UNDP/SF projects and the FAO/IBRD Cooperative Programme so that there would always be early awareness of the requirements and appraisal criteria of the World Bank.

The working papers for the Meeting, and the draft report approved at the closing session, are available in the files.

### Possible subjects for a regional applied research programme

Regional applied research programmes could consist of the study of the following subjects, which were all recognized as being, although at various degrees, of regional significance:

- (a) Reclamation, improvement and management of the following soils:
  - (i) heavy clay soils;
  - (ii) calcareous soils;
  - (iii) sandy soils;
    (iv) loss soils;
    - (v) salt affected soils, including, when applicable, the control of waterlogging;
- (b) Fertility, including the study of micro-nutrients, with particular reference to the introduction of high yielding varieties of crops;
- (c) Soil and water conservation in arid and semi-arid areas, including the use of small surface water storages and taking into account the need for a watershed approach;
- (d) Improved water use techniques, including:
  - (i) consumptive use of irrigated crops under the various soil and climatic conditions of the region;
  - (ii) determination of the most economic water duty, taking into account consumptive use, application efficiency, crops and cropping pattern, in order to achieve the highest economic return under local conditions
  - (iii) irrigation by sprinkling, with particular reference to the effect of high temperatures and wind and to the problems of handling, operation and maintenance;
    - (iv) contour irrigation;
    - (v) utilization of brackish water;
- (e) Water development, including:
  - (i) irrigation networks design and canal lining;
  - (ii) groundwater development for agricultural purposes, in marginal areas where the availability of limited quantities of additional water could assure crop yields through supplementary irrigation and open new land to rainfed cultivation and range management, through the provision of watering points;
- (f) Organizational problems, with special reference to groundwater legislation and, more generally, to a better exchange of information among the various countries of the region.

### · AFCHANISTAN

### Kunduz-Khanabad Irrigation Feasibility Study (AFG.20)

This project consisted of a feasibility study for the irrigation of 20,000 hectares of fertile land in the Kunduz-Khanabad valley. This area was also favoured with a comparatively highly developed infrastructure with only agricultural production somewhat lagging behind. Since this project had only been recently started, the discussion of its technical features was limited. It was noted, however, that particular problems might arise in connection with the irrigation of loss and loss type soils.

In answer to a question of the representative of UNDP, it was acknowledged that some adjustments in the Plan of Operation might be needed to cover some additional studies, but it was stated that the necessary additional working means could only be known within a few weeks since the results of basic studies still under way were required to arrive at definite conclusions in this regard.

The representative of Afghanistan confirmed the intention of the Government to submit this project as soon as possible to international financing institutions. He indicated, furthermore, that local conditions might require that the construction work be directly carried out by an appropriate Government body. In this connection, he thanked UNDP and FAO for the assistance received in the past, within the framework of the Technical Assistance Programme, for the organization and strengthening of the Government Irrigation Construction Unit. He expressed the hope, therefore, that this assistance would be continued and strengthened, since this might prove essential for the implementation of the Kunduz-Khanabad project.

### SOMALIA

### Water Control and Management of the Shebelli River (SOM. 10)

This project was considered to be a rather classical example of a feasibility study of an irrigation scheme. Although it was a follow-up to a previous land and water resources survey, its progress had been somewhat hampered by the lack of basic data. It was expected, however, that this obstacle would be overcome before the end of the project. Among technical points of possible regional interest, the comparison which had been made between the economic feasibility of perennial and intermittent irrigation was particularly mentioned. In spite of higher initial capital investment cost, and subject to further studies, the preliminary findings of the project indicated that perennial irrigation, when physically possible, was likely to prove more profitable.

In view of the lack of sufficient data on actual crop yields and water requirements, it was recognized that follow-up action in these fields was still needed in connection with a first phase of pilot development. Answering a question from the UNDP representative, the Government delegate stated that his Government was preparing a request for further assistance in this field, based on the findings incorporated in the interim report which had just been prepared by FAO.

In this respect the meeting recognized that a great deal of background data was requested by the World Bank before project appraisal and underlined the necessity of early contacts between UNDP/SF projects and the FAO/IBRD Cooperative Programme so that there would always be early awareness of the requirements and appraisal criteria of the World Bank.

The working papers for the Meeting, and the draft report approved at the closing session, are available in the files.

### Possible subjects for a regional applied research programme

Regional applied research programmes could consist of the study of the following subjects, which were all recognized as being, although at various degrees, of regional significance:

- (a) Reclamation, improvement and management of the following soils:
  - (i) heavy clay soils;
  - (ii) calcareous soils;
  - (iii) sandy soils;
    - (iv) loess soils;
       (v) salt affected soils, including, when applicable,
       the control of waterlogging;
- (b) Fertility, including the study of micro-nutrients, with particular reference to the introduction of high yielding varieties of crops;
- (c) Soil and water conservation in arid and semi-arid areas, including the use of small surface water storages and taking into account the need for a watershed approach;
- (d) Improved water use techniques, including:
  - (i) consumptive use of irrigated crops under the various soil and climatic conditions of the region;
  - (ii) determination of the most economic water duty, taking into account consumptive use, application efficiency, crops and cropping pattern, in order to achieve the highest economic return under local conditions
  - (iii) irrigation by sprinkling, with particular reference to the effect of high temperatures and wind and to the problems of handling, operation and maintenance;
    - (iv) contour irrigation;
    - (v) utilization of brackish water;
- (e) Water development, including:
  - (i) irrigation networks design and canal lining;
  - (ii) groundwater development for agricultural purposes, in marginal areas where the availability of limited quantities of additional water could assure crop yields through supplementary irrigation and open new land to rainfed cultivation and range management, through the provision of watering points;
- (f) Organizational problems, with special reference to groundwater legislation and, more generally, to a better exchange of information among the various countries of the region.

### AFGHANISTAN

### Kundur-Khanabad Irrigation Feasibility Study (AFG.20)

This project consisted of a feasibility study for the irrigation of 20,000 hectares of fertile land in the Kunduz-Khanabad valley. This area was also favoured with a comparatively highly developed infrastructure with only agricultural production somewhat lagging behind. Since this project had only been recently started, the discussion of its technical features was limited. It was noted, however, that particular problems might arise in connection with the irrigation of losss and losss type soils.

In answer to a question of the representative of UNDP, it was acknowledged that some adjustments in the Plan of Operation might be needed to cover some additional studies, but it was stated that the necessary additional working means could only be known within a few weeks since the results of basic studies still under way were required to arrive at definite conclusions in this regard.

Government to submit this project as soon as possible to international financing institutions. He indicated, furthermore, that local conditions might require that the construction work be directly carried out by an appropriate Government body. In this connection, he thanked UNDP and FAO for the assistance received in the past, within the framework of the Technical Assistance Programme, for the organization and strengthening of the Government Irrigation Construction Unit. He expressed the hope, therefore, that this assistance would be continued and strengthened, since this might prove essential for the implementation of the Kunduz-Khanabad project.

### SOMALIA

### Water Control and Management of the Shebelli River (SOM. 10)

This project was considered to be a rather classical example of a feasibility study of an irrigation scheme. Although it was a follow-up to a previous land and water resources survey, its progress had been somewhat hampered by the lack of basic data. It was expected, however, that this obstacle would be overcome before the end of the project. Among technical points of possible regional interest, the comparison which had been made between the economic feasibility of perennial and intermittent irrigation was particularly mentioned. In spite of higher initial capital investment cost, and subject to further studies, the preliminary findings of the project indicated that perennial irrigation, when physically possible, was likely to prove more profitable.

In view of the lack of sufficient data on actual crop yields and water requirements, it was recognized that follow-up action in these fields was still needed in connection with a first phase of pilot development. Answering a question from the UNDP representative, the Government delegate stated that his Government was preparing a request for further assistance in this field, based on the findings incorporated in the interim report which had just been prepared by FAO.

I am writing to thank you for Mr. Tellez's letters
No. 00115 and 00117 to Hursit Calika concerning forthcoming missions
and mission reports. I am glad to list below information on the specific
points he raises in these letters.

### A. Missions

#### Bolivia

We now plan that the next step would be a project preparation mission by Unesco, which we hope would be arranged in July 1969. We are awaiting Unesco's proposals as to the more precise timing and the mission composition. We note your interest in participating in this mission.

## Congo (K)

Lending in Congo (K) by the Bank or IDA for education is now planned for the 1971/72 fiscal year. We have, therefore, deferred for the time being a reconnaissance mission in May, but hope that it could be undertaken toward the end of the year.

### Dominican Republic

We are planning a project reconnaissance mission about mid-June and have approached Mr. van Vliet about his releasing Mr. Ramos Saco as agricultural education specialist. Mr. Ramos Saco was the leader of an Unesco mission to the Dominican Republic in 1964 and also served on a joint Unesco/IBRD reconnaissance mission in 1965.

### Ethiopia

As you know, the appraisal mission originally scheduled for February 1969 has since been deferred at the request of the Government. Subject to the Government's request, we plan that it would be undertaken next fall.

I am writing to thank you for Mr. Telles's letters
No. 00115 and 00117 to Hursit Calika concerning forthcoming missions
and mission reports. I am glad to list below information on the specific
points he reises in these letters.

### A. Missions

### Bolivia

We now plan that the next step would be a project preparation mission by Unesco, which we hope would be arranged in July 1969. We are awaiting Unesco's proposals as to the more precise timing and the mission composition. We note your interest in participating in this mission.

### Congo (E)

Lending in Congo (K) by the Bank or IDA for education is now planned for the 1971/72 fiscal year. We have, therefore, deferred for the time being a recommandation mission in May, but hope that it could be undertaken toward the end of the year.

### Dominican Republic

We are planning a project reconnaissance mission about mid-June and have approached Mr. van Vliet about his releasing Mr. Hamos Saco as exricultural education specialist. Mr. Hamos Saco was the leader of amunesco mission to the Dominican Republic in 1964 and also served on a joint Unesco/IERD reconnaissance mission in 1965.

## Ethiopia

As you know, the appreisal mission originally scheduled for February 1969 has since been deferred at the 1969 WHATI OF Cherrment. Subject to the Government's request, we plan that it would be undertaken next fall.

#### Iraq

The Bank project reconnaissance mission has just returned from Baghdad. The Government has been advised by the mission that, subject to completion of certain data, a PIM would be arranged. We shall discuss with Unesco the composition of such mission and take note of your willingness to participate.

### Jamaica

Your comments are noted.

#### Morocco

We have not yet received from the Government data recommended by the van Dijk/Beal mission.

#### Pakistan

A reconnaissance mission by Mr. McMahon is now scheduled for the first week of June. His main purpose will be to determine how much project preparation work is required to revitalize a previously proposed engineering education project. Your suggestion for the inclusion of the agricultural education sector among the fields for possible Bank/IDA lending in Pakistan has been noted. However, the engineering education project is planned for presentation to the Executive Directors, hopefully, during the course of 1969/70 fiscal year and, within the time limit, an agricultural component is not likely to be forthcoming.

## Paraguay

Since the earlier PIM visit, no further action has been taken by the Government. A recommaissance visit by our Area Department is planned for later in the year.

### Tunisia

Mr. van Dijk has just completed a visit to Tunisia as a member of an economic mission, and we will know about his findings upon his return to the Bank later this month (now he is in Zambia). So far, the Government has not yet completed the data required for a project preparation visit.

### B. Reports

As to Mr. Tellez's letter No. 00117, regarding the mission reports, the following is an account by countries as listed in his letter:

### Algeria

The Unesco PIM report has been submitted to the Government.

#### Ceylon

A reconnaissance report by Mr. Markgren is being prepared. We shall send you a copy when it is ready.

#### Chile II

The project appraisal mission report will shortly be finalized.

#### Colombia

A copy of Mr. Hultin's reconnaissance mission report is attached.

### Congo (B)

The PIM report is being drafted by Unesco.

#### Indonesia

Copy of Mr. Ballantine's reconnaissance mission report was sent you earlier.

#### Iran

The Unesco PIM report has been submitted to the Government.

#### Israel

Mr. Stewart has not yet visited Israel. The date is uncertain.

### Kenya

Our appraisal report is being drafted.

### Malawi

A reconneissance visit by Mr. Byron has been deferred.

### Meli

The economic review mission has only recently arrived in Mali.

## Nepal

The economic review mission has only recently returned to Washington.

### Nicaregue

Mr. Thint has just visited Nicaragua and we shall send you a copy of his report when it is available.

### Philippines

A copy of Mr. Burt's reconnaissance mission report is attached.

### Papua & New Guinea

We did not have an Education Projects Department specialist on the economic mission.

#### Rwanda

A copy of Mr. van Dijk's reconnaissance mission report is attached.

### Turkey

A copy of Mr. Ballantine's reconnaissance mission report was sent to you earlier.

#### UAR

A copy of Mr. Bahr's contribution to the economic report is attached.

#### Uganda

A Unesco project preparation mission in now in the field.

### C. Review

Hursit Calika will be visiting Paris during the week of May 26 to attend a DAC meeting and will take this occasion to discuss with Unesco a tentative schedule of activities for the remainder of the calendar year 1969. I suggest a one-day stop-over in Rome, say, on Monday, June 2, for him to have similar discussions with you. Gould you please let me know by cable if such a visit would be conveniente for you?

Meeting of Mr. McNamara and Messrs. Oris V. Wells (Deputy Director-General), Pierre Tervier (Director Development Department), Henry Ergas (Director Investment Center), Forbes-Watt and others, at FAO Headquarters, Rome, on Tuesday, April 29, 1969, from 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon.

Mr. Ergas welcomed Mr. McNamara to the Investment Center of FAO. Mr. McNamara in reply said he was delighted to meet with Mr. Ergas and the staff of the Bank/FAO Cooperative Program and to learn more about its work. At Mr. McNamara's request, Mr. Ergas outlined the organization and work of the Investment Center and explained that 99% of the work of the Center was devoted to the Cooperative Program. The Center was divided into four area divisions (Africa, Asia, Latin America and Middle East) and one pool of experts. At present 36 professionals were working for the Program and their number was expected to increase to 42 by June 30. Offers for staff positions had been made to six candidates and negotiations with them were well advanced. Mr. Ergas pointed out that the Cooperative Program was able to absorb new staff quickly since most of its staff were recruited from within FAO and was, therefore, already familiar with developmental work in the field of agriculture.

Mr. Ergas emphasized that the FAO staff liked to feel as part of the World Bank family and wished to be increasingly identified with its work. Jokingly, he added it might be worth considering whether his Center should be located in Washington or whether, alternatively, the Bank's Agricultural Projects Department should be stationed in Rome. Mr. McNamara commented that the present arrangement worked well and that, in fact, the FAO team was increasingly integrated in the Bank's work.

In this connection, Mr. Ergas urged Mr. McNamara to give his team a role in the Bank's policy formulation. The present practice of the Bank was to formulate its policies and agricultural lending programs without consulting FAO and FAO was only allowed to discuss with the Bank the allocation of personnel. He continued to say that FAO had started on its own to prepare policy papers on countries and that the need for more "harmonization" between the policies adopted in Rome and Washington had become more urgent. In reply, Mr. McNamara pointed out that a "harmonization" of policies would generally come through increased participation of FAO staff in Bank missions, especially in general economic review missions. Mr. McNamara explained that the Bank planned to send regular annual review missions to major countries and the FAO team would be increasingly called upon to provide staff for these missions. This would provide even more opportunities for FAO to state its views.

Mr. McNamara then referred back to the policy papers Mr. Ergas had previously mentioned. Mr. Forbes-Watt, who appeared exceedingly competent, explained FAO's approach using Thailand and Brazil as illustrations. In general, FAO reviewed in a given country the agricultural programs carried out in the past five years, the plans for development of agriculture in the future and the type and magnitude of external assistance needed to carry out sound plans. In the northeast of Thailand, for example, there was an obvious need for soil conservation and rice farming and possibly livestock. Thailand, however, had failed so far to develop an integrated plan for the development of the northeast and such a plan was badly needed

Mr. Ergas intervened to say that it was difficult for FAO to make plans for the development of agriculture in Thailand as long as the extent of the contemplated Bank involvement in the Mekong Basin and its effect on Thailand was unknown to FAO. He made this point only to illustrate the need for increased cooperation between IBRD and his team in general and for a joint Bank/FAO task force for Southeast Asia in particular. Mr. McNamara commented that any plans for the development of the Mekong Basin would not influence the northeast of Thailand, at least not for the next 10 years.

Mr. McNamara then enquired about FAO's views on the northeast of Brazil. Mr. Forbes-Watt thought that the San Francisco area was a promising one for Bank investment. Mr. McNamara interjected that the Bank could not invest in lowyielding projects and, during his visit to Petrolina, he was told that the return on agricultural projects there would not be high. The Bank would consider a rate of return of 12% as satisfactory but he, Mr. McNamara, would not recommend to the Board any projects with a rate of return below 8%. Mr. Ergas agreed that the Bank rightly insisted on a satisfactory rate of return and Mr. Forbes-Watt added that, in the case of the San Francisco River, the UNDP study which showed a low rate of return was actually wrong and had to be revised. Moreover, most of the present projects in that area were ill-defined and too small. FAO, Mr. Forbes-Watt explained, felt there was a need to build up a pipeline of large-scale agricultural projects especially in that area and preliminary investigations had shown that high-yielding projects could be found. Mr. McNamara welcomed that approach, especially since the Bank was willing to step up lending to Brazil, assuming her over-all performance was satisfactory, and therefore a pipeline of good projects, especially in the northeast, was needed.

Mr. McNamara then turned to Indonesia. Mr. Ergas emphasized that FAO had a very close and satisfactory relationship with the Bank's resident mission. At present FAO, in consultation with Bernie Bell, was preparing a tunafish project, a seed production project and might start to explore the possibilities for livestock.

Turning to another subject, Mr. McNamara asked about FAO's relationship with UNDP. Mr. Ergas explained that FAO was given an opportunity to comment on all requests submitted to UNDP for financing prior to a decision. In fact, in more than 50% of all cases FAO would have taken a different decision than UNDP on these requests. Mr. Ergas agreed with Mr. McNamara that the most important problem for the future was to influence UNDP to approve sound and project-oriented studies. Mr. Forbes-Watt added that UNDP had a tendency to look at vast areas, such as river basins, instead of concentrating on sound and well defined projects and sometimes UNDP went to the other extreme of working out projects which were too small to have any impact, for instance demonstration farms.

Mr. Ergas then called in the whole staff of the Cooperative Program and Mr. McNamara, at Mr. Ergas' request, outlined the Bank's program in the agricultural sector and the importance of FAO's contribution. He then concluded by saying that he was looking forward to an increased participation of FAO both in project preparation and in the formulation of agricultural development plans for member countries. Mr. McNamara's statement was followed by a very brief question and answer period.

### MALTA: Conference of Vice-Chancellors and Principals, April 8-11

This conference was sponsored by the U.K. Inter-University Council for Higher Education Overseas in association with the Overseas Liaison Committee of the American Council on Education. Almost all the English-speaking African universities were represented as well as the two universities of Hong Kong and the Universities of the West Indies, Guyana and Fiji. Observers included the principal U.S. and U.K. foundations, ODM, AID, the Bank and several other private agencies (see list attached).

These conferences do not generate concrete proposals or actions. They are an exchange of views on issues of common interest and provide an opportunity to assess current thinking of leaders of higher education in these regions. In addition, the conference gave an opportunity to talk with the Vice-Chancellors of Kenya and Zambia about projects currently being processed and the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Fiji about a request he intends to make.

Of the agenda topics, the discussion of the university and rural development, which promised to be most interesting, was abbreviated and disappointing. Very good meetings were held on academic planning and physical planning. Other meetings covered teacher education, middle level training, research and continuing education. A special session explored the new relationship between the I.U.C. and the universities as a result of transferring the responsibility for financial assistance in higher education from the Ministry of Overseas Development directly to the I.U.C. This will affect the Bank in projects which might formerly have been assisted in cooperation with O.D.M. and I was assured that the I.U.C. would welcome such cooperation.

### TURKEY: April 14-15

In Turkey I was accompanied by Mr. van Vliet, Director of the Educational Financing Division of Unesco. Our discussions were with the Ministry of Finance (Messrs. Canturk and Toker) and, more fully, with the State Planning Organization (S.P.O.) - Secretary General Turgut Ozal, Dr. Nevzat Yalcintas, Head of the Social Planning Department, and colleagues. Representatives of the Ministry of Education - Akif Tuncel, Undersecretary for Technical Education, and Nusret Karcioglu, Head of

Educational Planning and Research - attended these meetings. Meetings were also held with Mr. James Curley of the Ford Foundation and the U.N. Resident Representative.

The purposes of the mission were to establish preliminary contact with government authorities, to explain Bank policies and procedures for educational financing, to ascertain the main directions of the government's interest in educational financing and to determine the next steps which might be taken.

There is a substantial amount of planning data at the OECD in Paris which, if analyzed in advance, would obviate the need for a full-fledged project identification mission. This impression was confirmed by our visit. A shorter and more sharply project-pointed mission might be more appropriate although it should be noted that Turkey is at the point where serious imbalances and shortages could materialize quickly and where the resulting financial constraints could limit the needed freedom of action for priority developments.

Turkey's educational planning has two main reference points:
(a) the estimated skill requirements of the planned development by sector and level of occupation, and (b) fuller utilization of the potential labor force. The emphasis is on rapid industrialization and therefore on several levels of technical and vocational training.

Three projects or project ideas were proposed by the S.P.O.:

- 1) Skilled and semi-skilled worker training at 4 centers (Istanbul, Bursa, Adana, Izmir) ranging in enrollment from 500 to 2,000 trainees. Training courses would last about 3 months allowing an annual output of 4 times the enrollment capacity, i.e. about 18,000 trainees per year. This target is very modest when compared with the estimated aggregate shortfall of this category during the Second Plan period, 1969-72. Construction estimates are not provided but average machinery and equipment costs are estimated at about LT 2 million (\$220,000) per center (possibly low).
- Management training. In view of the widely agreed need for better management, the government proposed to establish in an industrial area (probably Istanbul) a school for management training offering a course of 1 to 2 years. It would be independent of any university in order to avoid the rigidity of formal entrance requirements. A preliminary estimate for a school of 500 students is LT 8 million.
- 3) "A fully equipped laboratory project for a technical university". This proposal is the least thought out and defined of those made. Manpower estimates indicate a current shortfall in the supply of engineers of about 10,000, rising to 16,000 in 1972 and to nearly 56,000 in 1982. The basis of these estimates is not indicated and no data is given on the present or projected cutput.

It is probably safe to say in general that Turkey will require an expansion in the supply of engineers but how and where it is to be created is not at all clear. Moreover, although no official statement is made, there is a sharp dichotomy among Turkish universities and the inference is given that this is a source of concern to the government. On one side are the older and classical universities of Ankara and Istanbul together with Istanbul Technical University which, because of their autonomy and unresponsiveness to changing demands, do not appear to have the full confidence of the Planning Office. On the other side are the newer and more dynamic universities - Hacetepe, Ataturk, Middle East Technical University and the smaller universities. How these existing resources would be used or combined with new facilities remains to be seen.

In addition to these three proposals, reference was made to the establishment of a new-style Faculty of Agriculture in Adana, which I urged should be included as a project item for possible Bank financing. In view of the Bank's livestock project and various agricultural developments under way for the Adana Plain as well as an agreement by the Rockefeller Foundation to set up a research station in Adana, this item is of particular importance. A second item I suggested was the extension of the pilot project for the improvement of secondary level science teaching now being supported by the Ford Foundation at the Ankara Science Lise and nine other Lises.

To shake down these various proposals into a well identified project would require one or more missions of reconnaissance in depth, bringing in FAO for the Adama Agricultural Faculty and other agricultural training as it might develop. At the same time it will be necessary for the government to take decisions respecting the development of the universities.

Our discussions revealed that the government is quite unhappy about the situation of middle level agricultural training in which the agricultural high schools do not channel graduates into the agricultural sector. It would welcome advice on this question.

As a next step we discussed the sending of a reconnaissance in depth mission which might be sent in June or July depending on the availability of staff in the Bank, Unesco and FAO. This timing would be agreeable to the government.

### INDIA: April 16-19

In India I was also accompanied by Mr. van Vliet. As in Turkey, the purposes of the mission were to establish a first contact, to advise the government regarding Bank policies and procedures, to learn the directions of the government's interest in educational financing and to determine the next steps which might be taken.

Our three-day program included meetings with the Minister of Education, Mr. Rao; the Permanent Secretary of Education, S. Chakravarty, and staff

(S.N. Saraf - Director of Planning, J.P. Naik - Adviser, G.K. Chamdiramman and Mr. Ramakirshna of the Ministry of Finance); Mr. George Tobias of the Ford Foundation; the Indian Agricultural Research Institute; the Planning Commission (B.D. Nag Chaudhuri, Pitambar Pant and B.C. Pande); the Commission for Scientific and Industrial Research (Dr. Atma Ram); the University Grants Commission (Dr. Kothari and colleagues); Dr. D.G. Boutaev of Unesco; Director M.B. Mathur of the Asian Institute of Educational Planning and Administration and colleagues; Mr. C.S. Swaminathan, Ministry of Finance; Dr. Pal, Director of the Indian Council for Agricultural Research, and colleagues; and Dr. Russell Olson and Mr. Pollack of AID.

While these meetings provided useful background and points of contact, they did not (with some exception) provide any suggestion of a pattern of needs or of priorities. They did leave an impression of vast complexity and a long, unstructured list of needs. In India, although almost all the indices of human resource development are still low, everything appears to have been tried at least once in greater or less degree and with varying success. The sheer numbers challenge the imagination and although our inquiry did not reach the state level, where the real educational responsibility lies, the diversity and complexity of India's system is clear. For these reasons and because Bank financing would be within, and not additional to, the approved plan, the discussions were largely not project or priority oriented. It was clear also that the usual project identification mission by Unesco would be a very time consuming and not very rewarding exercise.

Nevertheless, several lines of further exploration did emerge.

### 1) Agricultural Universities

It is the long-term objective of the government to establish in each of the 17 states at least one new agricultural university based upon the land grant college concept of integrating research, teaching and extension. Thus far seven of these have been established with technical support through American universities and some physical support provided by AID. Of Rs 280 million allocated in the Fourth Plan to agricultural education, Rs 210 million are for further development of these agricultural universities including a new one in Maharastra (because of ethnic rivalries the state government has recently decided to create two). Action by state governments is also under way in Bihar, Kerala and Gujarat but these projects are not in the Fourth Plan.

These university projects are widely accepted as successful although AID feels that at four locations the success has been limited by insufficient state support for physical facilities. It had therefore proposed an accelerated program increasing Fourth Plan expenditure from Rs 210 million to Rs 400 million and had offered to finance the acceleration from U.S. balances of PL 480 rupee funds. The offer had been declined by the government on the ground that the acceleration would be inflationary. AID would welcome IDA participation in the hope that the dollar contribution might induce the government to change its mind. This would mean, of course, the

substitution of a very scarce commodity (IDA dollars) for an abundant commodity (PL 480 local currency) as the source of finance.

It was agreed with Messrs. Gilmartin, Kirk and Picciotto that assistance to the agricultural universities should be one line of further exploration and that particular attention might be paid to the State of Gujarat in view of other Bank agricultural projects there.

### 2) Minister of Education Proposals

The Minister suggested four types of projects, all of which are in the Fourth Plan and would require substantial foreign currency.

Printing and production facilities plus paper for the a) provision of school books on a greatly expanded scale. This appears to be a high priority need. I commented that assistance for the production of textbooks and teaching materials falls within Bank policy but the position with respect to paper is not so clear. The particular virtue of this proposal is that it offers a relatively simple and potentially high impact vehicle for both savings and educational reform on a national basis. Provided a broad market was assured, books incorporating new course syllabuses and teaching approach could make a significant penetration into prevailing teaching practices and attitudes as well as supplying an important lack. It could minimize the resistances arising from the attitudes of state ministries and establishments by avoiding the broad frontal approach in favor of a more sharply focused one.

For some time Unesco has had a large team in India assisting in the preparation of new syllabi and texts especially for the new math and science courses. "Software" development may therefore already be well advanced, making the time right for "hardware" investment. The Minister has promised to send a statement on this proposal and it is intended to follow this up with Unesco on the "software" side and with a consultant such as Franklin Books Program on the "hardware" side. The comparative advantages of the public and private sectors for this type of production would need to be examined.

b) Equipment for engineering colleges. The intention is to provide for a selected group of colleges a minimum of basic teaching equipment which is now lacking with serious effect on the quality of training and perhaps employability of the engineering graduates. There are at present an estimated 40,000 unemployed or misemployed engineering graduates in India. Whether this is due to the recession of the last several years, their unemployability, over-expanded capacity or a combination of all three factors would need to be investigated. In any case, the project would not increase existing capacity but would aim at upgrading the quality of existing instruction.

- c) Production of teaching equipment at selected technical institutions. Although the idea of design and testing of teaching equipment within a teaching institution has some merit, the introduction of production operations is questionable. Moreover, the market is nowhere near as clear as for textbooks. Teaching equipment needs up through the secondary level can now generally be supplied by local production to the extent that budgetary resources are available. Given a wider and more assured market, the private sector could presumably expand to meet it more efficiently than the proposed scheme.
- Equipment for national laboratories and research institutions. There are about 30 such institutions in India, under the guidance of the Council for Scientific and Industrial Research, which are generally lacking in the more sophisticated equipment needed for applied scientific and technological research. Research instrumentation is also not well developed. The general argument for supporting applied research in India was effectively put by Dr. Atma Ram, Director General of the CSIR. Imported technology is essential but may not always be suited to Indian conditions such as the abundant supply of cheap labor. Moreover, in the world today a substantial imbalance of "technological payments", i.e. payment of royalties, exists. Although he gave no figure for India, Dr. Ram's data showed that only the United States has a favorable balance of technological payments (estimated at \$514 million). France (-\$42 million), Germany (the same) and the United Kingdom (-\$69 million) all have deficits. Since India has very little "technological export", its deficit for sometimes unsuitable technology may be very substantial. India therefore needs to develop a "domestic technology" as rapidly as possible.

As a question of Bank financing, the case is not so clear. Returns on technological research, which in the aggregate and on a large scale are very high, might be very uncertain in a situation like India's today. Dr. Ram will submit a statement on this proposal which can then be reviewed.

### NEW YORK: April 21-22

In New York I visited Ford Foundation and Rockefeller Foundation. At Ford, with Mr. Frank Sutton, I discussed a broad range of educational questions in various countries, and with Messrs. Wayne Fredericks (Head of the Division for Middle East and Africa) and his colleagues - Willard Hertz and David Smock - I discussed more specifically questions pertaining to Africa. We considered also the possibility of achieving more effective coordination between the activities of Ford and the Bank in education. We agreed in principle that a meeting to discuss lines of strategy with some reference to particular countries would be useful. Some preparation of agenda would be necessary, for which the Bank would take the initiative. In view of existing commitments and workloads, it did not appear that such a meeting could be held before September.

At the Rockefeller Foundation I talked with Mr. Ralph Richardson about the proposed Rockefeller agricultural research project for Southern Turkey. As presently defined, this project would consist of 4 or 5 experts for a duration of about 5 years (possibly to be extended) which would be concentrated entirely on research for the introduction and adaptation of the new wheat strains. Signature of the agreement has been delayed by the need to resolve certain purely logistic questions for which solutions now appear to be in sight. Rockefeller Foundation is awaiting the invitation of the government to sign the agreement and is prepared to do so and initiate the project promptly. Although limited in scope, this project would nevertheless bear some relation to the proposal for the establishment of a new Agricultural Faculty in Adama referred to above.

### FAO/IBRD Cooperative Program - Additional Briefing

- 1. The following information about the FAO/IBRD Cooperative Program is in addition to that contained in paras 6 9 of my briefing note dated April 17 on FAO.
- 2. A copy is attached of memorandum Evans to Chadenet dated June 13, 1968 on the Cooperative Agreement. Important changes since that time are:
  - (1) We agreed (your letter to Dr. Boerma dated July 30, 1968 attached) that the staff of the FAO/IBRD Cooperative Program Division at FAO should be increased to 42 posts by June 30, 1969 with an expansion to 47 posts by January 1970. The FAO team in Rome should reach the agreed figure of 42 by June 30.
  - (ii) After considerable discussion on the basis of the agricultural workload implied in the Bank's Five-Year Plan, we agreed (your letter to Dr. Boerma dated October 25, 1968 attached) that the workload justified a US\$5 million budget for the biennium 1970-71 (calendar years) that would enable the FAO team in Rome to be expanded to 70 in 1971. Subject to approval by the Bank's Executive Directors, the Bank would approve contributions of 75% of approved expenditures within the US\$5 million ceiling.
  - (iii) FAO's activities under the Cooperative Program are being increasingly oriented towards preparation of projects. FAO has accepted as a target that with a biennial budget of US\$5 million they would expect to assist Governments in the preparation of 35 to 40 projects a year.
  - (iv) The Bank's lending program for FY 1970 includes lending for hh agricultural projects (gross figure). FAO has already done substantive work on project preparation for 17 of these projects. The lending program for FY 1971 at present suggests lending for 88 agricultural projects, but this is a gross figure which is in excess of what can be achieved. Allowing

for slippage and Bank staff constraints that may limit our appraisal capacity the net figure for loans and credits actually made in 1971 may be nearer 50 (this is subject to further review). FAO is already engaged or plans to engage in preparation of 33 projects included in our FY 1971 lending program.

- (v) Between July 1968 and June 1969 approximately 100 missions will have been carried out under the FAO/IBRD Cooperative Program. Of these the Bank took the lead in 26 missions (including country economic missions and appraisal missions in which FAO staff participated). For the remaining 74 missions (mainly for project identification and preparation) FAO took the lead. (In addition to these 100 missions carried out under the Cooperative Program, the Agriculture Projects Department staff, sometimes assisted by consultants, will have carried out some 190 missions during the same period.)
- The new FAO biennium to which an expanded budget for the Cooperative Program of US\$5 million would apply begins January 1, 1970. FAO will be seeking approval for a program of this size and for FAO contributions up to 25% at the FAO Council meeting in June and subsequently at the FAO Conference in November 1969. I would not recommend that at this point we give FAO any commitment that they should expect a still further expanded program after 1970/71. As suggested by Mr. Chadenet in his memorandum to Mr. Aldewereld dated April 3, 1969, a copy of which you have seen, "we should also review whether the size of the (Cooperative) Program should exceed 70 professionals or whether the growing workload could be carried out more effectively by better access to the FAO expertise outside the Program team and/or by consulting firms working directly for the Bank".



I believe that during your most recent visit here you discussed with Duncan Ballantine the exchange of reports with UNESCO. Duncan has shown me a copy of the letter which Mr. McKitterick of UNESCO wrote on February 27 to Mr. Terver (reference RIO/PRG/1/2565).

I am sure that the reservations in Mr. Terver's letter BK2/2 to Mr. McKitterick were correct, namely that the Bank would have to agree to the FAO communicating copies of its reports to UNESCO, and secondly that the reports are of a confidential nature. On our side we would agree to project identification reports prepared by FAO under the FAO/IERD Cooperative Program being made available to UNESCO, as soon as we have received them from you and had an opportunity to comment. With regard to project preparation reports however, I don't think that we could easily agree, as a general rule, that these reports should be communicated to UNESCO. We might do so in particular cases, in consultation with you. However, UNESCO have not, I understand, requested to see preparation reports, which I believe in most cases would concern them much less than would identification reports.

Proportion of IDA Work done by FAO/IBRD Cooperative Program

An analysis of FAO missions carried out under the FAO/IBRD Cooperative Program during calendar year 1968 shows that there were a total of 90 such missions. After analysing the countries to which these missions went I find that 50 were to Bank countries and 48 to IDA countries, after making an adjustment for some which should be classified as "blend" countries. An analysis of the number of manweeks on the same basis as above shows that 183 man-weeks were spent on Bank countries and 176 man-weeks on IDA countries. The figures are not precise enough to enable us to say more than that the proportion is of the order of 50-50.

# I. Paris: IBRD/Unesco Cooperative Program - Periodic Review, January 6-9

Separate minutes of the agenda and discussions are being prepared. The principal subjects discussed were:

# 1) A statement of the objectives of the Cooperative Program

For Unesco it was felt that an up-to-date and comprehensive statement of the Program's objectives and procedures is urgently desired for the benefit of its field staff and other departments of Unesco. For the Bank it was recognized that no up-to-date, single statement of the Bank's policy and criteria for educational financing exists. Operational Memorandum # 5.02 needs revision and a brochure for the use of borrowers is desired. These various uses call for similar but not identical treatment. It was agreed that Unesco would prepare a draft which, when cleared with the Bank, would be used for its staff, and the Bank would revise Operational Memorandum # 5.02 and prepare another statement for general circulation.

# 2) Guidelines for Project Preparation

Pending the completion of the work of Mr. Stewart's committee, it was agreed that the Bank and Unesco architects would work out an agreed range of accommodation standards in the expectation that in most cases this would obviate the need for review and recalculation by the appraisal team of what had already been done by the preparation mission. It was agreed also to eliminate from the project presentation any statement of data already available elsewhere in usable form and particularly long histories or pure descriptions of the education system.

# 3) Project Priorities

Unesco is setting up procedures to generate project suggestions from various departments of Unesco which could be brought to the attention of the Bank through the Cooperative Program.

### 4) Post-Project Evaluation

The Tunisian project evaluation was useful and should be repeated for other projects as they become ready. The purpose of these evaluations is not simply to take corrective action in the particular country but also to provide guidance in general as to what provisions, conditions, etc. are needed in loan agreements and side letters. In this connection, it was suggested and agreed that performance on a country's first project should be considered in appraisal of a second project (e.g. Ethiopia).

## 5) Technical Assistance in Project Implementation

Mr. Rodriguez of RIO indicated that Unesco would be interested in playing a role under an expanded technical assistance indicated by current statements of Bank policy. I stated that we expected to turn to Unesco on occasions, as suggested in the agreement, but also that the Bank would not regard Unesco as the exclusive agent and would reserve the right to turn elsewhere, as also provided in the agreement. We had spent five years developing the procedures which govern the present major functions of project identification and preparation and are still working to improve them. It will be necessary to work out carefully the procedures and guidelines for the quite different work of technical assistance.

### 6) Personnel

I talked with Mr. Forbes, Assistant Director General (Administration), and Mr. Bolla, Director of Personnel, about general policies. For recruiting, I emphasized the Bank's understanding that selections would be made on the basis of qualifications alone and not be influenced by geographical considerations. This was agreed, but Unesco felt it must at least give consideration to nominations by member countries and might even discover good candidates in the process. I said the Bank could not object to this provided that qualifications remained the governing factor in selection and that undue delays did not occur as in the case of Mr. Magnen. (Later Mr. Bolla assured me that a decision on Mr. Magnen would be taken next week, January 13.) I urged also that, given the great difficulties of weeding out suitable personnel other than at the time of renewal of appointments, great care should be taken at that time. This has not been done.

# 7) Country Review and Missions

We reviewed the present schedule of missions for the period January through June and made some adjustments in the schedule. Not allowing for slippage, there would be approximately 60 missions of all kinds, of which 10 would be Identification, 9 Preparation, 14 Reconnaissance, 6 Appraisal, 15 Supervision and 5 Economic. Unesco would be responsible for or participate in just under half of these missions. Allowing a 25% slippage and the use of consultants, this schedule would be just manageable although it would impose a very heavy travel burden on both Unesco and Bank staff and would leave inadequate time (for Bank staff at least) for general headquarters tasks.

#### 8) Budget

Mr. Forbes agreed that when non-program staff of Unesco are made available for program missions, reimbursement will be on a cash basis. With regard to additional staff (up to 29) and fund authorization over and above Unesco's new biennial budget, Mr. Maheu has not yet reacted to the report given him following our December operations review which indicated the need for an additional \$100,000. I warned that for Bank budgeting we should have Unesco's position by February 1. (This has now been received.)

#### II. Spain: January 10-12

I talked with various people in the Ministry of Education including the Minister, the Undersecretary, Ricardo Diez, and all of his department directors, the Education Officer of the Ministry of Agriculture and the Undersecretary of Finance. The objective was to assess the status and probable timetable for the forthcoming project or, as appears probable, projects. Although it was not possible to judge very accurately the position of agricultural education, it appears likely that this will move more slowly, at least, if significant reforms and reorganization are to take place. It is widely felt that the Ministry of Agriculture is much less dynamic than Education and that much less momentum exists. (In Rome Mr. Apodaca of FAO felt that mere preparation of project items would not take long. He agreed that the question of major reorganization is not clear and he will stop in Madrid to check on the intentions of the Finance Ministry.)

Considerable momentum does exist in the Ministry of Education and it appears fairly likely that the schedule of a brief mission in April to complete identification, followed by a preparation mission in June (possibly May) can be met. Appraisal might follow in July or August. I urged upon Ricardo Diez the need for spelling out the location, size and modalities of schools in the 4-Year Plan from which a project could be carved. Diez agreed to initiate this at once and hoped to complete the task in one to two months. In comparing the Plan targets (1968-71) for new upper primary schools (grades 6-8) and comprehensive schools (grades 9-11) with the necessary lead times, it was clear that the targets could not be met, even without Bank financing, without sacrificing the major reforms envisaged. I urged, therefore, a stretch-out of targets to permit a realistic program and assure the accomplishment of the reforms. The basic White Paper on Education has been completed and will be issued in a few days. It should prevent any serious delays later as a result of basic policy indecision. On the other hand, although the auspices appear very favorable, it has still to be subjected to public reaction and there could be some delays in its final adoption. Whether such delays, if they occur, would be on issues affecting a Bank project remains to be seen.

# III. Rome: FAO - January 13

I met for discussion of general questions with Messrs. Terver (Assistant Director General), Ergas, Andersen, Kimmel, Wilson, Sestan (for Fergus Wilson), Tellez Molina and Apodaca. I met also with 15 to 20

division heads (Forestry, Home Economics, etc.) working under Mr. Andersen in order to acquaint them with Bank policies and procedures in educational financing. In the first meeting, the following points were raised:

- 1) As between FAO and Unesco the need for clarification and resolution of differing views as to curriculum. To a large extent these may be the difference between education and training demarcated in the now abandoned FAO/Unesco agreement of 1961.
- 2) The need to give more attention to farmer training in short specialized courses along the lines of INACAP and SENA especially in farm management, mechanics and agricultural business.
- 3) The need for better continuity of data between missions when subsequent missions are by other people. The use of data sheets was suggested. This might also be dealt with by assuring fuller and more regular distribution of existing reports. It was felt that too often the subsequent mission had to repeat the job of data collection done by the preceding mission.
- 4) The small project. We discussed this at length. Ergas put forth the suggestion that for very small countries e.g. Upper Volta, Mali, etc. the country itself should be regarded as the project and even separate sectors be combined into a package or program of projects. As far as existing Bank procedures are concerned, there are two possible ways of dealing with a small agricultural education project:
  - (a) to include it as an item in a package education project as we have most commonly done, or
  - (b) where it is predominantly training of specialized manpower required to implement an agricultural project, to include it in that.
- 5) Mr. Andersen was concerned about public administration training. I saw no reason why the Bank could not assist in appropriate cases, but it should not become too specialized and parcellated. Where institutional development is concerned, the scope should be broad; where very specialized and applied training is needed, it might better be provided within government agencies.
- 6) Mr. Kimmel made the point that in providing for the primary or secondary leaver the first problem is job creation. Training programs generally short and practical should follow from job definitions and employment opportunities. On a broader basis the same principle applies. It is necessary, for example, to consider the size, functions and organization of the agricultural services and of agricultural employment in the private sector as it may determine the needs for training. We considered also the possibility of agricultural training sector studies (and projects) on a comprehensive basis as we are doing in Kenya and Tanzania. There would appear to be cases for this approach. At the same time we should include agricultural educators or manpower specialists more frequently in general agricultural project identification missions.

- 7) FAO felt there should be more systematic coordination of project work between IBRD and UNDP, that it could best be done in FAO where knowledge of the projects exists, and that the cooperation should begin very early in the history of the project. Ergas suggested that the Education Projects Department should be represented in the annual FAO/IBRD review of UNDP projects in Rome (26 May 6 June). I agreed to consider the suggestion.
- 8) Mr. Andersen gave a preliminary invitation to attend the World Conference on Agricultural Education in Copenhagen (July 27 to August 8, 1970) and hoped someone would speak. I indicated our desire to attend and willingness to contribute in some way.
- 9) We should check again and be sure that all yellow cover appraisal reports are sent to FAO at the time they are sent to Unesco. There are various other reports (back-to-office, reconnaissance, etc. as well as Unesco's PIM reports) which should be sent to FAO automatically. A review should be made and standard procedures set up.

# IV. Indonesia: January 16-22

My visit was organized by BAPPENAS (the Planning Ministry) and began and concluded with meetings with the Minister, Mr. Wujojo, and Mr. Suhoto, the Director for Social Institutions and Programs. Subsequently I met with representatives of the Departments of Public Works, Communications, Manpower, Agriculture and Education, the National Institute of Administration, Prof. Sarwono, Director of LIPPI (the National Science Council), Mr. Untasoit, Adviser to the Education Ministry, Messrs. McDivot and Britton of Unesco, Mr. Stokes Tolbert and Dr. Liddle of AID, Messrs. Frank Miller and Paul Booz of Ford Foundation. Mr. Kartomo, Director of Planning in the Department of Education, joined in several of the other meetings and is the best contact with that Ministry.

Mr. Sulaiman of the Bank mission accompanied me in my visits and will follow up our contacts in the future.

The Five-Year Plan (1969-73) has been completed and presented to Parliament. As yet only a rough translation in English is available. During the preceding year several important studies have been made. The Emerson report is a valuable compilation and organization of educational data. It is very thin on economic data and especially manpower data. The report has been useful to the Ministry of Education although many of its conclusions are received with skepticism by the Ministry and even more outside the Ministry insofar as they are known. I share this skepticism, but support one of the recommendations most widely challenged, namely, for early action on educational radio and TV. Also worth study are four papers drafted by Prof. Nathan Keyfitz of Berkeley (?) on Manpower, Education, Statistics and Demography and the report of the Ira Baldwin (US AID) survey team on higher education in agriculture. Several Ministries - notably Education and Agriculture state they have detailed backup data for the Five-Year Plan but it is questionable whether it goes much beyond the current annual budget.

In all cases, there is not yet a good manpower base for educational and training targets and there also remain to be resolved many major questions of organization, structure, curriculum and general policy before detailed planning of a reformed system can proceed very far.

The Plan and the planners state that greater emphasis will be placed on consolidation and quality than on further quantitative expansion and this is borne out by the stated intention to hold university enrollment at the present level of about 230,000, to shift the balance of enrollments within that figure, to restructure university education into three levels (cf. the California system) and to improve facilities for scientific and technical education at secondary and higher levels. On the other hand, the target of increasing secondary technical enrollment from 105,000 to 325,000 together with upgrading of facilities for existing places appears unrealistic, if indeed it could be justified economically. The intentions regarding expansion of primary education are not clear.

During the coming year several important studies are to be undertaken. The Department of Manpower hopes to complete by the end of the year a national manpower survey, covering both public and private sectors, and updating the survey of 1963-64 (annual budget estimates for government departments and enterprises have just been submitted).

With Ford Foundation help the Department of Education hopes to begin in April an "assessment" of the education system which would be completed in about two years. This would be a basic study covering objectives, organization, structure and general policy and not a planning exercise. Clearly this study is essential not only to resolve the many issues of policy and reform but also to gain acceptance for reform proposals when made. It should therefore work at two levels: (a) the prestige level of highly respected citizens and officials supported by (b) professional and technical staff.

Various specialized studies are also under way, such as the employment of graduates of senior agricultural high schools, resources for education in Bandung, etc.

The next 12-24 months could therefore be a very important formative period for further development and especially reform of the education and training system. It should not be a period of intensive investment activity either for the government or the Bank. At the same time, some limited projects in areas of obvious priority would contribute sharpness, reality and discipline to this formative period and should be undertaken as soon as feasible.

Two areas of obvious high priority in which early investment could safely be undertaken are agricultural training (especially of extension workers) and scientific and technical education. An agricultural training project should take account of the U.S. AID project for upgrading the faculties of agriculture in the universities. It might supplement the physical facilities component of the AID project and also provide facilities for strengthening scientific and practical work in the agricultural senior high schools. However, background and project identification study is

needed and this should cover both the organization of the extension and other agricultural services, including numbers, types and job descriptions of the service workers, and also the training requirements and necessary institutional build-up. For this purpose we should attempt to send a two-man mission as early as possible - one man from Agriculture Projects Department and one from Education Projects Department.

From all reports the need for science laboratories and practical workshops is critical at both the secondary and university levels. For the secondary the government is working out a scheme for nuclear facilities centers which could serve from 6 to 12 secondary schools of both junior and senior levels. A pilot group of 5 centers is to be assisted by UNICEF. This scheme should be feasible in the larger cities but some modification would be necessary in regions where secondary schools are more dispersed. At the university level the consensus is to concentrate first on the 5 or 6 larger universities - described as "feeder" universities, which actually means centers of excellence which will support or "feed" the second line of institutions. Laboratory and practical work in agriculture, pre-clinical medicine/dentistry/pharmacy, engineering and in science subjects is reported to be very weak or absent for lack of facilities. The Ministry of Education which controls the budget for the universities is prepared to insist upon the fully integrated use of all facilities for the basic sciences.

In view of the several studies (manpower and assessment) which are to be undertaken this year, a conventional, across the board or sectorwide project identification mission would be premature. Moreover, in view of Emerson's assembly of educational data some factual background already exists. It should be possible to deal separately or in parallel with items for agricultural training and science/technical education, deferring a decision on what to include in a first loan or credit until we see how both items approach readiness for appraisal. For the science/technical item a three-man mission of one science, one technical and one economist would appear appropriate.

As agreed in your discussions with him. I am sending under separate cover a copy of the Unesco PM report on Rumnda. We now plan that, in conformity with your agreement with Duncan, the agricultural education and training mission to Tanzania will be sent in May, instead of in March/April as was earlier suggested in your letter of Jamuary 2, 1969 (ref. BK 3/2.6 TAN) to Duncan.

Duncan's note confirms that FAO CP staff would join Unesco PIM mission to Botswanz, Lesotho and Swaziland. I present that you have been in touch with van Vliet on the timing, etc., of this visit. The mission, I understand, is scheduled to leave Paris on January 23 to stay in the field until March 3.

The addition of an FAO CP staff member to the proposed Unesco PP visit to Bolivia in February has to be taken up with van Vliet. Has enything been done on your side on this matter? The remaining joint missions, as agreed between you and Duncan, will be undertaken in March or April and there will be more time for making the necessary arrangements.

Duncan will return to the Bank on Jamary 27. We look forward to seeing you here next week.

A few notes following my meeting here with FAO.

- 1) Would you please send 2 copies of the Iran PIM report to Ergas at the same time as you send them to the Bank. Incidentally the delay in this report is becoming a matter of serious concern if we are to keep our schedule.
- 2) Apparently FAO has not a copy of the Rwanda PIM report and I have asked Calika to send this from Washington.
- 3) As a general rule I think we should send copies of all PIM reports as well as reconnaissance reports to FAO when issued. I discussed quid pro quo with Ergas but this will also have to be discussed in Washington with Agricultural Projects Dept.
- 4) In several cases not previously noted notably Iraq (R), possibly Jordan (I), Greece (P.P.), Congo K (R), we will also wish to involve FAO.

Many thanks for your hospitable reception in Paris. From Madrid I came away with the impression that we probably should deal with the agric ultural and the general education as separate, but parallel projects at least until the appraisal stage and allowing some architectural help in preparation to FAO either from you or us. This seems to be the view of some Spaniards including Ricardo.
