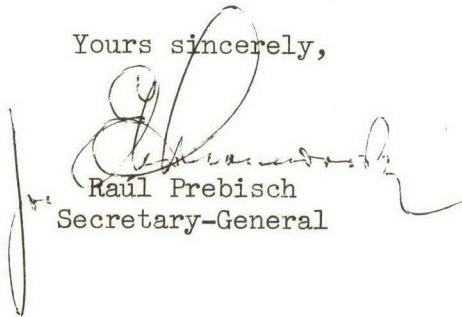

NOTIFICATION

Special Committee on Preferences,
first session, Geneva, 29 November 1968.

The Secretary-General of UNCTAD has the honour to refer to resolution 21 (II) on Preferential or free entry of exports of manufactures and semi-manufactures of developing countries to the developed countries, unanimously adopted by the Conference on 27 March 1968 at its second session, and, in particular, to operative paragraph 2 concerning the establishment of a Special Committee on Preferences as a subsidiary organ of the Trade and Development Board (TD/L.37, Annex I, resolution 21 (II), pages 31-32). Pursuant to operative paragraph 4 of the resolution, the Trade and Development Board in adopting the calendar of UNCTAD meetings for the remainder of 1968 and for 1969 (decisions 41 (VI) and 49 (VII)) made provision for the first session of the Special Committee to be held in Geneva from 29 November to 17 December 1968. Accordingly, the first session of the Special Committee on Preferences will open at the Palais des Nations, Geneva, at 11 a.m. on Friday, 29 November 1968.

The draft provisional agenda for the first session of the Special Committee will be distributed as document TD/B/AC.5/1.

Under the terms of resolution 21 (II) membership of the Special Committee is open to all members of UNCTAD; any member country which is unable to participate in the Special Committee may make its views known to the Secretary-General of UNCTAD who will bring them to the attention of the Special Committee.

Governments wishing to participate are hereby requested, under rule 17 of the Trade and Development Board, to submit to the Secretary-General of UNCTAD, by 4 November 1968 if possible, the credentials of their representatives and the names of alternate representatives and advisers. The request for early intimation of credentials is prompted by the need of the secretariat to know the likely size of the meeting so as to adjust servicing facilities accordingly.
