



3. Travel to and from Helsinki

It is expected that participants will make their own travel arrangements to and from the Meetings.

If assistance is required, the Bank/Fund Conferences Office (cable address: INTERFUND WASHINGTONDC) should be so informed as early as practicable.

During the period of the meetings, the International Transportation Office of the Fund and Bank will assist with return reservations, visas and other requirements.

The enclosed luggage tags should be attached to each piece of baggage, including hand baggage and briefcases. These tags will expedite luggage delivery and clearance through Customs and Immigration at the International Airport in Helsinki.

Participants travelling on or connecting to Finnair, enroute or from Helsinki, are requested to indicate to the originating airline or travel agency concerned that they are attending the IMF/IBRD Meetings.

4. Visa Requirements

A visa to enter Helsinki is not required for citizens of the member countries listed below:

ALGERIA, ARGENTINA, AUSTRIA, BAHAMAS, BARBADOS, BELGIUM, BOTSWANA, BRAZIL, CANADA, CHILE, COLOMBIA, COSTA RICA, CYPRUS, DENMARK, DJIBOUTI, DOMINICA, ECUADOR, EL SALVADOR, FIJI, FRANCE, THE GAMBIA, FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY, GREECE, GRENADA, GUATEMALA, GUYANA, HONDURAS, ICELAND, INDIA, IRELAND, ISRAEL, ITALY, IVORY COAST, JAMAICA, JAPAN, REPUBLIC OF KOREA, LESOTHO, LUXEMBOURG, MALAWI, MALDIVES, MALAYSIA, MALTA, MAURITIUS, MOROCCO, NETHERLANDS, NEW ZEALAND, NIGER, NORWAY, PANAMA, PERU, PHILIPPINES, PORTUGAL, ROMANIA, ST. LUCIA, ST. VINCENT AND THE GRENADINES, SEYCHELLES, SINGAPORE, SOLOMON ISLANDS, SPAIN, SRI LANKA, SURINAME, SWAZILAND, SWEDEN, TANZANIA, THAILAND, TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO, TUNISIA, UGANDA, UNITED KINGDOM, UNITED STATES, URUGUAY, WESTERN SAMOA, YUGOSLAVIA, ZIMBABWE.

Citizens of countries not listed require a visa, for which application should be made to the appropriate local Finnish diplomatic or commercial missions abroad or consulates with a visa officer, sufficiently in advance of the date of departure. As a rule such visas will be issued immediately and without charge to participants in the May meetings of the organizations. A special immigration service will be available at the airport on arrival of the participants in Helsinki.

5. Hotel Accommodation

Participants who have not yet made their hotel reservations are requested to make their requirements known as soon as possible to the Bank/Fund Conferences Office (see telex and cable address under paragraph 2.c).

Available rooms and suites will be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. Occupancy of hotel rooms can be guaranteed only for the exact dates reserved. Participants arriving on early morning flights should reserve their accommodation from the previous day to assure occupancy of their room upon arrival. Rooms may not be available otherwise until serviced following the checkout hour on the day of arrival.

Normal checkout time is 12 noon. Later checkout will be charged additionally.

PARTICIPANTS WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ROOM CHARGES FOR THE DAYS RESERVED.

Before departure from Helsinki, participants are expected to make settlement direct with their hotel for all accounts.

6. Local Transportation

The Finnish authorities have requested that they be informed of all participants' flights and arrival times at the International Airport in Helsinki in order to expedite immigration and customs formalities and provide transportation to hotels. This information should be sent to the addresses shown under the section "Communications Regarding Attendance" (paragraph 2.c).

During the period of the meetings transportation will be provided between the Finlandia Hall and the hotels.

Rental of automobiles with or without chauffeurs may be arranged through the Finland Travel Bureau, P.O. Box 319, 00101 Helsinki 10, telex No. 124626.

7. Registration

The Registration-Information Desk at the Finlandia Hall, Helsinki will be open from 3:00 p.m. on Friday, May 7. Participants should register as soon as practicable after arrival in Helsinki.

8. Security

Security arrangements will require that identification badges be worn at all times in the Finlandia Hall, for all social events, and at time of departure from Helsinki International Airport.

Possession of firearms by foreign visitors in Finland must be declared to the Finnish authorities on entry. The national permit to carry firearms issued by the government whose national is carrying the weapon should be in that person's possession at all times.

9. Financial Arrangements

Participants are responsible for and must settle all travel, hotel and subsistence expenses which they incur. Facilities for exchange of foreign currency will be provided at the Airport and at the Finlandia Hall.

10. Simultaneous Interpretation

At the meetings of the G-24, simultaneous interpretation will be provided from and into English, French and Spanish.

At the meetings of the Interim and Development Committees, simultaneous interpretation will be provided from and into Arabic, English, French and Spanish. It will facilitate the conduct of the meetings if participants who have prepared statements will make the text available to the Secretary of the relevant Committee in advance.

11. Documents and Translation

Working documents will be made available in English, French and Spanish at the Documents Desk, located near the Registration Desk. Statements made by participants during the meetings will not appear as documents, but will be reflected in the minutes of the meetings. Policy memoranda submitted by participants for circulation, but which they do not intend to read into the record, will be issued as documents; and they will be translated, to the extent that time and staffing permit.
