

SUBJECT: Back to Office Report: Paris Club - October 6-7, 1993

Introduction

1. The principal business during the Paris Club's October meeting was a rather extensive tour d'horizon and a discussion on debt stock reduction for poorest countries. The meeting also marked the debut of the new Chairman Christian Noyer who is taking over from Jean Claude Trichet who has gone to the Bank of France to replace de Larosiere.

Tour d'Horizon

2. The tour d'horizon covered the following countries:

LAC Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Ecuador, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua

MNA Algeria, Egypt, Iran, Syria, Yemen

- EAP Myanmar, Vietnam
- ECA Albania, Bulgaria, Poland, Russia
- AFR Cote d'Ivoire, Equatorial Guinea, Ethiopia, Guinea, Kenya, Sierra Leone, Tanzania, Togo, Uganda, Zambia

Features included discussions on Russia, Iran and Vietnam. For Russia the Fund indicated that their program was off track but many of the creditors indicated that they had recently received significant payments. The situation in Iran was viewed as quite serious as arrears were now approaching US\$4.5 billion with about 80% short term. After some heated exchanges it was decided to draft for approval by the creditors indicating the requirements for a Paris Club rescheduling. Vietnam is now expected to come to the Paris Club soon, probably for the December meeting.

Debt Stock Reduction for the Poorest Countries

3. The discussion was triggered by a paper from the UK: "Trinidad Terms - Earlier Debt Stock Reductions." The UK expressed the hope that the Paris Club would respond to a call from the G7 on July 9 inviting the "Paris Club to continue reviewing the question of relief for the poorest, highly-indebted countries." Some written comments were also provided by the Belgian delegation on "Debt Stock Reduction from the Poorest Countries." The secretariat also provided a note on "Treatment of the Debt

of the Poorest Countries." The discussion provided a number of insights on how each of the Creditor Countries viewed the debt and in particular the debt stock problem. There was a useful summary of their views on technical issues in a table prepared by the secretariat. The draft table is attached to the report. Many of the countries were willing to go beyond the 50% debt stock reduction but the Japanese and US representatives expressed some reservations. The Secretariat also circulated a paper prepared by the Fund "Multilateral Official Debt, Rescheduling Developments and Prospects." However, the Fund and also the World Bank representatives were not invited to participate in the discussion.

Next Steps

4. The next Paris Club meeting will most likely be held in December. At that time Vietnam is expected to be invited for negotiations. A tentative schedule for 1994 was also circulated.
