

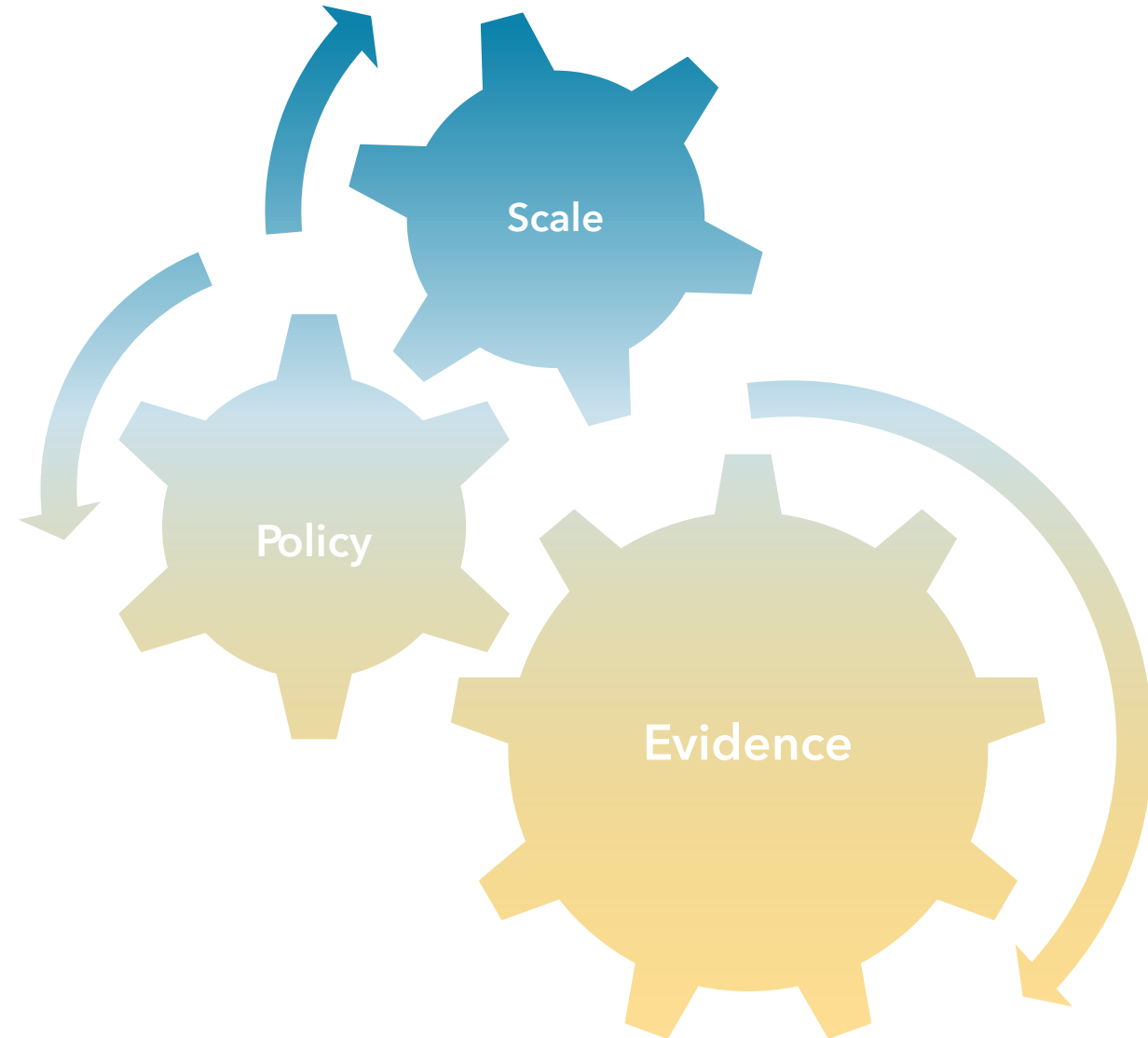

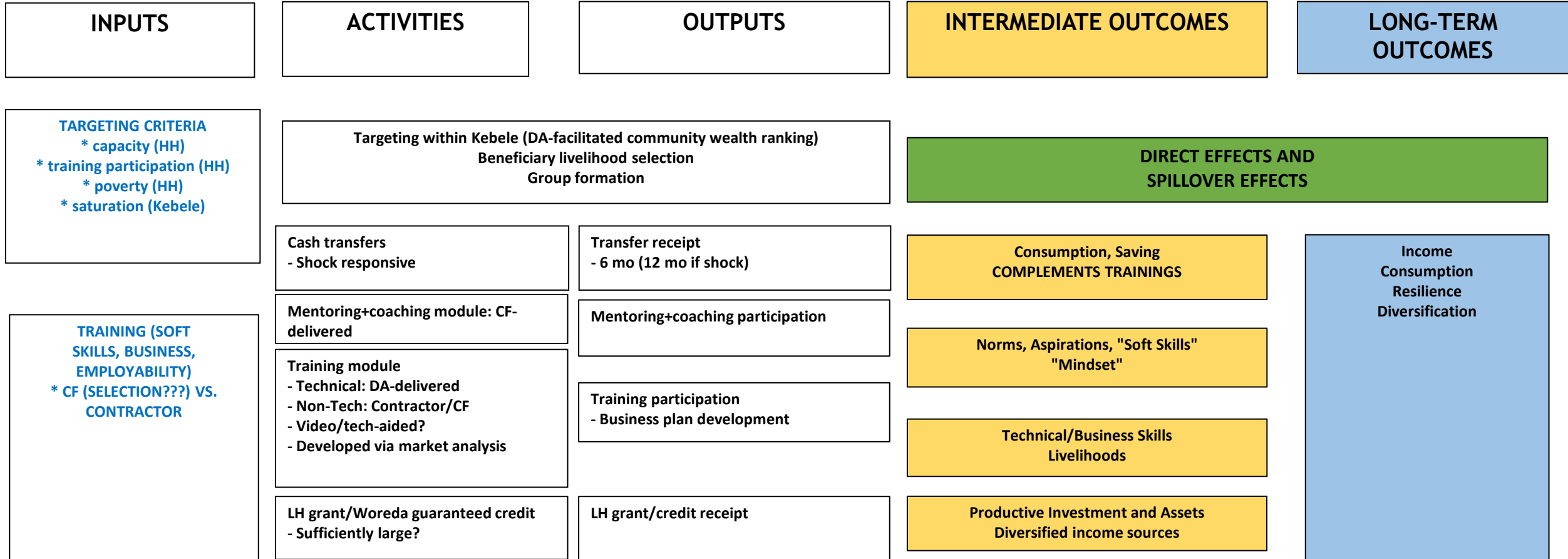
Preliminary Impact Evaluation Design

May 26th, 2022

Livelihood component

- **Objective:** Reduce extreme poverty in rural Ethiopia through enhanced resilience to shocks of extreme poor and vulnerable
- **Scope:** Five components
 1. Public works and cash transfers
 2. Mentoring and coaching
 3. Technical trainings
 4. Non-technical trainings
 - 5a. Credit, 5b. Grant
- **Targeting:** Specify who will receive support
 - 9 Regions, ~180 Woredas (>70% timely payments for public works)
 - **(1.+2.+3.+4.+5a.):** Selected public works beneficiaries (550,000 Households)
 - **(1.+2.+3.+4.+5b.):** 30% poorest of Livelihoods beneficiaries (167,000 Households)

Theory of Change (Livelihoods Component)



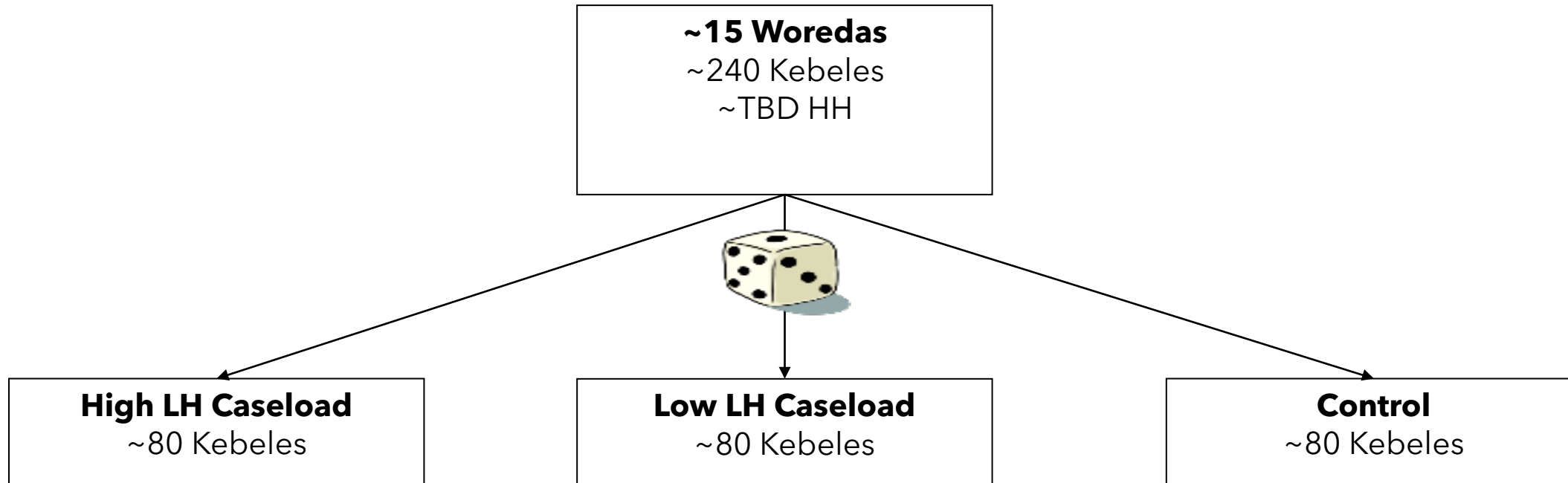
Impact Evaluation Questions

- What is the impact of **RPSNP LH** on ...
- What is the impact of the **number of LH beneficiaries per kebele** on ...
- What is the impact of the **non-technical trainings** on ...
- What is the impact of the selection of community facilitators (**community selection vs. competitive selection**) on ...
 - economic outcomes?
 - economic outcomes of non-targeted households within kebele?

Continuing to explore other impact evaluation questions of interest, e.g.,

- Delivery modality for non-technical trainings
- Approach to targeting within Kebele

Methodology



- **Implement public lottery at Woreda-level to assign caseload, CF-selection modality, and non-technical trainings**
- **Numbers remain under discussion**

Challenges

- **Compliance with "assignment" to livelihoods**
 - Solution 1: (Potentially) Woreda-level lottery to assign caseload to kebele
 - Solution 2: (Potentially) use tablet based tool to assign households to livelihoods
- **Timeline**
 - Livelihoods to be rolled out in IE Woreda in January 2023
 - Details of HH profiling (required for beneficiary selection and baseline sampling) still under discussion
 - Design Workshop in Ethiopia in July 2022 to finalize additional details
 - Baseline survey needs to happen before Livelihoods implementation

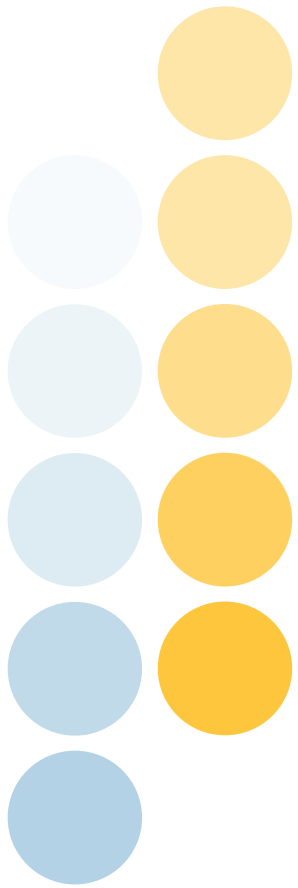
