



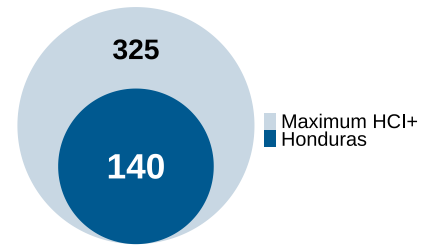

Human capital - people’s knowledge, skills, and health - drives productivity and growth. The Human Capital Index Plus (HCI+) measures the human capital a child born today can expect to accumulate over their working life, extending the original HCI by incorporating tertiary education and work experience. This brief summarizes **Honduras’s** HCI+ score and its performance in building human capital.

What is Honduras’s HCI+ and what does it mean?

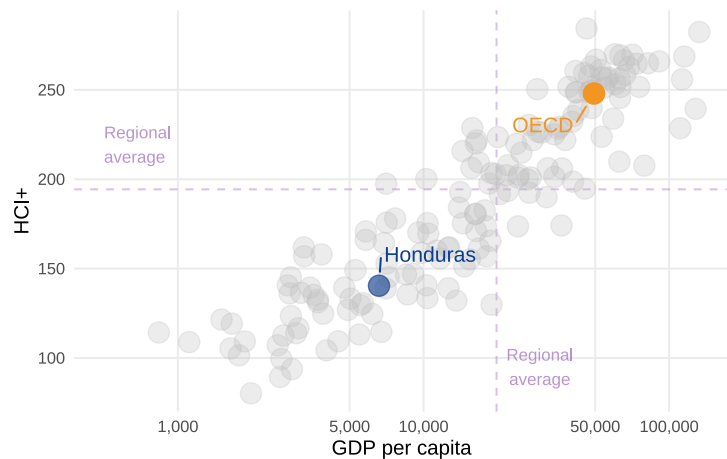
Honduras’s HCI+ score is 140 (out of a maximum of 325), reflecting its investments in health, education, and employment. A 10-point increase in the index would translate into approximately 10 percent higher future income. Closing the current gaps in these areas relative to high-performing countries with similar GDP per capita would boost future income by 62%.



How does Honduras’s HCI+ compare to other countries?

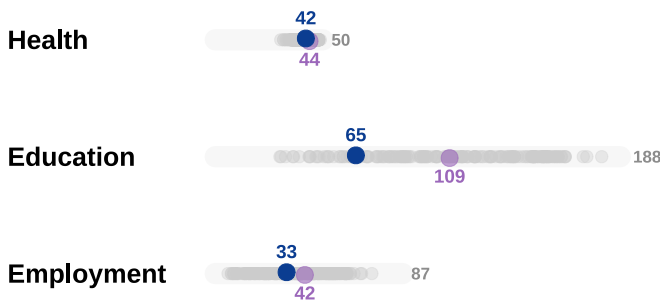
Honduras’s HCI+ is lower than the average for the **Latin America & Caribbean region (194)** and lower than the average for **lower-middle-income countries (153)**.

Honduras’s HCI+ score is also **108 points lower than the OECD average.**



What explains Honduras’s HCI+?

The HCI+ has three components corresponding to health, education, and employment.



The HCI+ score for the **Health pillar is 42**, slightly lower than the **regional average of 44**.

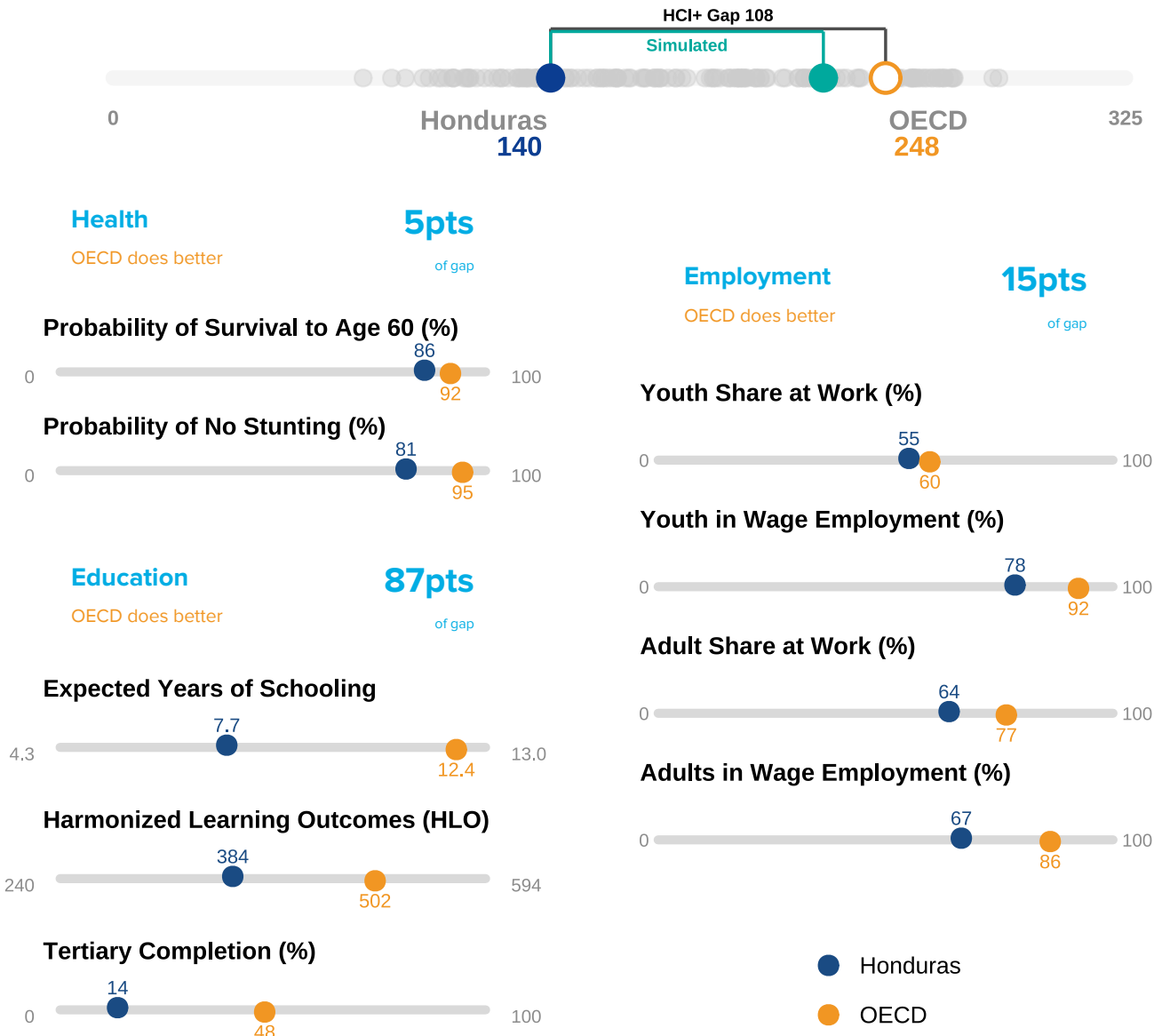
The HCI+ score for the **Education pillar is 65**, lower than the **regional average of 109**.

The HCI+ score for the **Employment pillar is 33**, lower than the **regional average of 42**.



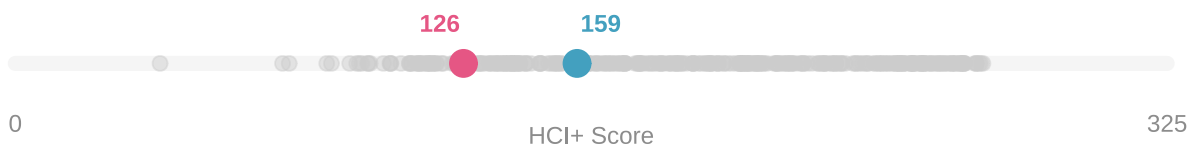
What indicators are responsible for Honduras's HCI+ gap with OECD?

Honduras's HCI+ score (140) is lower than the OECD average (248). The indicators that account for the largest share of the HCI+ gap between Honduras and the OECD are **expected years of schooling, tertiary completion, and Harmonized Learning Outcomes (HLO)**. Raising these indicators to OECD levels would increase Honduras's score to 228, boosting future income by approximately 87.7%.



What is Honduras's HCI+ gender gap?

The HCI+ score for **women in Honduras is 126** compared to **159 for men**. The 33-point gap indicates that women's earning potential will be 33% lower than men's due to differences in the human capital acquired by men and women in Honduras.
