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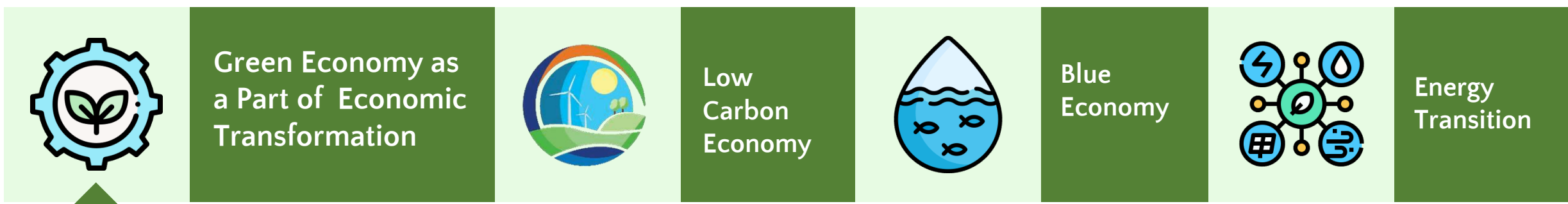
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Green Economy as a 'Game Changer' for Inclusive and Sustainable Development

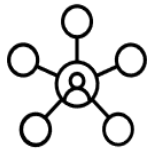
Challenges



Policies and regulations related to Green Jobs in Indonesia are **not yet integrated under one legal framework** and does not regulate related to funding, investment and incentives



Indonesia needs **highly skilled workers** who have **green skills**



The availability and accessibility of **data and information about Green Jobs** in Indonesia is still limited



Awareness and understanding of Green Jobs is still low



Stakeholder involvement is needed to ensure Green Jobs Development

Potentials



Trends show an **increasing awareness** of the importance of green industry, green technology and green infrastructure



In 2025, the National Energy General Plan (RUEN) **targets renewable Energy (RE) to be at least 23% of the primary energy mix**. By 2030, the target is to reach 750,000 four-wheeled electric vehicles and 2,450,000 two-wheeled electric vehicles.



The coastal and marine sector creates 35% of Indonesia's total workforce. The development of the blue economy will increase Green Jobs in this sector



In 2019, the **tourism sector absorbed 11.83% of the total workers in Indonesia**. With the increase in sustainable tourism, Green Jobs in the tourism sector will increase
