

# Indonesia Sustainable Landscapes Management Multi-Donor Trust Fund

Implemented by the World Bank, the Indonesia **Sustainable Landscapes Management Multi-Donor Trust Fund (SLM-MDTF)** works to improve the integration and coordination of landscape management across multi-sector stakeholders and demonstrate sustainable landscape management approaches in selected areas of Indonesia with the ultimate goal of reducing deforestation and forest degradation, and improving livelihoods.

The SLM-MDTF was established in December 2016 with contributions from the Government of Norway and Government of Australia to provide technical assistance, policy advisory, capacity building and pilot investments. The SLM-MDTF plays a catalytic role through agile knowledge products and technical assistance to improve the effectiveness of Government of Indonesia and donor investments.

The SLM-MDTF addresses the key drivers of unsustainable landscape management:

- 1 Insecure land rights that contribute to land conflicts and reduce livelihood opportunities
- 2 Limited financing for reduced deforestation, landscape management and sustainable livelihood development
- 3 Degradation of land from conversion to unsustainable agricultural crops and forestry production
- 4 Limited livelihood opportunities from sustainable agriculture and from participation in natural resource management
- 5 Use of fire in land clearing, drainage-based agriculture and ineffective water management

# LANDSCAPE MANAGEMENT INTERVENTIONS

## 6

The SLM-MDTF plays a strategic role in supporting Indonesia's climate agenda, including improving livelihood opportunities, secure land rights, financial support and incentives and the continued flow of ecosystem services from forests and natural areas.

The program combines work at the national, provincial and district/village levels.



### Improved Land Administration and Governance

Supporting Government of Indonesia to achieve a unified land register and map of all rights on land in Indonesia by providing technical assistance to support the development and implementation of joint standard operating procedures and participatory mapping across forest boundaries.



### Sustainable Development of Indonesia's Priority Landscapes

Contributing to improving rural livelihoods by addressing key barriers to the production of environmentally sustainable and commercially viable agricultural commodities and value chain development.



### Improved Management of Forest Resources

Informing the design and adoption of economic incentive schemes at the national and provincial levels to promote sustainable landscape management by public and private stakeholders. Supporting Gol to implement an integrated fire management strategy.



### Equitable and Inclusive Growth within Rural Landscapes

Identifying and developing key information and incentive schemes, instruments for participatory planning, and institutional arrangements to promote natural resource management, alternative sustainable agricultural products, and value chain development within districts and villages.



### Sustainable Financing for Landscape Management

Supporting the operationalisation of the Indonesia Environment Fund (IEF/BPDLH) to establish a credible and internationally recognized mechanism to blend and channel climate and environmental funds.



### Improved Coordination, Communication and Stakeholder Engagement

Strengthening communications, stakeholder engagement and cross-sectoral coordination at the national and sub-national levels to achieve integrated solutions.
