The following information which Mr. Franco just telephoned to me will update Mr. Demuth's March 10 memorandum.

## IACB

No change. Meets at 10:00 a.m. Friday at IMCO headquarters, 101-104 Piccadilly. Mr. Demuth says no real issues have come up yet at the Program Working Group. There are indications that there will be opposition to the UNDP's proposal for consultation by the agencies on the selection of project managers and consultants. We are on UNDP's side on this. The other issue likely to come up is delays in project implementation, but this does not relate to Bank executed projects.

The World Food Program wants to discuss the agricultural policies of the European Community, especially the feeding of powdered milk to animals instead of making it available for LDCs. The High Commissioner for Refugees wants to discuss pending projects for refugees in Dacca and the resettlement of refugees now returning to Southern Sudan. UNICEF will offer the facilities of their purchasing arm (UNIPAC) for use by all the agencies. UNDP may report on the phasing out of its projects in Taiwan. The Secretariat is trying to cut out some of these items.

## IACB

The IACB will meet at 10:00 a.m., Friday, April 7, at the headquarters of the Inter-Governmental Maritime Consultative Organization (IMCO), 101-104 Piccadilly. We have not yet received either an agenda or papers for the meeting but I understand that the morning is expected to be taken up by a statement by Mr. Peterson, emphasizing his intention to tighten the management and upgrade the personnel of UNDP and to involve the UNDP somewhat more closely in supervising the implementation of projects. This statement, together with responses from the members of IACB, is expected to take the full morning. In the afternoon, there will be an oral report by Myer Cohen concerning the deliberations of the Programme Working Group (PWG) which will be meeting the preceding three days as a committee of deputies. Both Mr. Riley and I will be attending these PWG meetings. Presumably the rest of Friday afternoon will be devoted to discussing any issues which may have come up at PWG and which PWG has been unable to resolve. At the conclusion of the meeting on Friday, Mr. Peterson is giving a reception at IMCO headquarters for the members of the IACB.

Under the circumstances, it will probably not be possible to give you a written brief for the IACB meeting. I will be glad to meet with you before the meeting, however, and go over whatever points seem likely to be raised in the light of the PWG discussion.

## ACC

The ACC meeting will also be held at IMCO, on April 10-11. It will be chaired by Secretary-General Waldheim. Following are the tentative arrangements for the meeting.

### Monday, April 10

Morning (probably 10:00 or 10:30 a.m.) Closed meeting under the Chairmanship of Mr. Waldheim.

Lunch A lunch for the ACC members, hosted by Prime Minister Heath.

Afternoon (probably 3:00 p.m.) ACC regular meeting to consider items referred to it by the Preparatory Committee.

Evening A reception for the ACC members, hosted by the Foreign Secretary, Sir Alec Douglas-Home.



March 10, 1972

Tuesday, April 11

<u>Morning</u> (probably 10:00 or 10:30 a.m.)	ACC regular meeting to consider administrative and financial questions and to hold discussions with the Joint Inspection Unit.
<u>Lunch</u>	Luncheon hosted by Mr. Colin Goad, Secretary-General of IMCO.
<u>Afternoon</u> (probably 3:00 p.m.)	First meeting of the Functional Group on Employment Policy. If necessary, the ACC will take up any unfinished business and give final approval to its annual report.
<u>Evening</u>	Open.

It is not yet known what items will be taken up at the closed meeting on Monday morning. It has been suggested, however, that, among others, the following questions may be discussed: the U.N. mission to Bangladesh; UNRWA's finances; the effects of the numerous General Assembly resolutions, particularly on decolonization, on the work of the smaller agencies.

Ernesto Franco will be attending the meeting of the ACC Preparatory Committee, also to be held at IMCO, from March 20-30. This Preparatory Committee meeting will throw more light on the items that are likely to come up at the ACC. Franco will have a written briefing for the ACC ready for you by the time you arrive in London.

We are not involved in the administrative and financial questions to be discussed Tuesday morning, nor are we affected by the activities of the Joint Inspection Unit. The discussion on employment Tuesday afternoon will be based on a paper still being prepared by the ILO. It is expected to spell out the terms of reference of the Functional Group on Employment Policy that was set up, on a tentative basis, at the ACC meeting last October. A decision is to be taken, based on those terms of reference, as to whether the Functional Group should be continued.

In the circumstances, if you want to skip the meetings on April 11, I see no reason for you not to do so.
