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Inequality studies – A comparative lens


- Dominant approach in inequality studies: comparison of the income/wealth shares of top earners
- Relatively under-explored: cross-national analysis of the economic disparities between social groups
- Significant and persistent group disparities irrespective of the level of development (PCI/HDI) and overall inequalities (Darity and Deshpande 2003)

India-US, Caste-Race

"There is so much similarity between the position of the Untouchables in India and of the position of the Negroes in America that the study of the latter is not only natural but necessary" (Ambedkar 1946)

- Comparison of caste/race fitting for several reasons:
 - Enduring experiences of social exclusion, segregation, and discrimination for certain communities, and privileges for the others
 - Affirmative action policies and backlash against them
 - Despite legal, political, and economic reforms, Black/SC continue to have significantly worse social and economic outcomes






Figure 4: Growth incidence curves calculated from official surveys and corrections




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
Ownership rates in the US





Ownership rates in India







Making sense of the social wealth gap

- Overlapping drivers of the social wealth gap
- Initial condition slavery and untouchability/bondage an offence for Blacks/SCs to own wealth; extraction of free/cheap labour
- Policy (errors of commission and omission) Jim Crow & New Deal; PLAA & GR
- Labour market discrimination hiring and wages
- Segregation and value of assets
- Violence

Main findings - I

- Unambiguous rise in the racial wealth gap during the last thirty years
- The Indian case presents a fractured trend (statistical artefact?)
- The burden of debt is disproportionately borne by the Black community
- Inequality at the top and bottom wealthy among the disadvantaged communities are not nearly as wealthy as the privileged groups
- Over and underrepresentation homogenous elite spaces

Main findings - II

- Composition of assets
 - White wealth: stocks and business assets; Black wealth: houses
 - FC wealth: productive land and financial assets; SC wealth: houses, homestead land
- Ownership rates: slow progress; no convergence in sight
- Social stratification in terms of household wealth
- Within-group wealth concentration
