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

It might be advisable to consider the question in respect of the changes in the other Programs too, to the extent that there may be a change in orientation, rather than merely a reduction in the number of posts in the CP unit. Perhaps this consultation has already occurred.

## Cooperative Programs

- 1. When we spoke the other day about the possibility that Saouma might say something to you at the ACC about our proposal to cut back on the FAO/Bank Cooperative Program, I said I would give you a note on where these efforts stood.
- 2. Stern sent a note to the CPS Directors, asking them to be in touch with the C/Ps to warn them of our need to retrench because of staff and resource constraints. For some of the C/Ps, a review of the direction or emphasis of the work programs was already under way for quality reasons.
- 3. As far as concerns FAO, the head of the C/P, Cedric Fernando, was in Washington last week, to talk with our agriculture people about what is contemplated. Saouma has been and will be fully informed of the discussions, via Fernando. Our people (including Baum and Yudelman) and Fernando feel that nothing should be said to Saouma formally until there is a clearer idea of just what is in fact going to be proposed, i.e., whether just a freezing of unfilled positions (most likely) or something more, and if only the former, whether that means a shift in some posts to assure that the necessary disciplines remain available. (If, for example, all forestry posts were vacant at the moment, although it is necessary that at least one forester be among the C/P staff.) There is going to be less agricultural financing on the part of the Bank, so some reduction is inevitable. As you know, the work programs are agreed each year, so a conclusion will have to be reached before long.
- As for the WHO program, John Evans and John Kalbermatten were in Geneva the week before last, and met with Dr. Mahler to talk about the C/P. The issue here, while including a need to cut back because of constraints, also extends to de-emphasizing water/sanitation in favor of greater cooperation in the field of health. Since the C/P agreement relates only to water/sanitation, this implies phasing down, and perhaps out, the C/P itself, although there would continue to be Bank/WHO cooperation in the water/sanitation field in any event. All of this is under active discussion and seems likely to have an outcome satisfactory or at least acceptable to WHO. As Dr. Mahler is fully involved in the discussions, there is no need to write him at this stage.
- The new head of the Bank/Unesco C/P, Kobayashi, was in Washington last week for talks with Aklilu and the regional education staff (and with me). Hultin went to Unesco earlier in the month with draft terms of reference for a review of the C/P which would be likely to result in some cut-back as well as a reorientation of the Program. He met with Assistant Director General Najman, who is responsible for

Unesco's external relations, although the C/P is administratively under another D/G. We had expected Kobayashi to come here with Unesco comments on the draft terms of reference but at almost the last moment before he left Paris he was told that he should not, and that we would not have comments until May. Aklilu is concerned that these may be delaying tactics, but would not want anything done at this stage. He thinks a letter from AWC to MBow might prove useful if the process seems to need jogging.

- 6. The UNIDO C/P was some months ago the subject of a meeting here between Khane and Stern (I was present), and a reorientation of that program was agreed. No further review is contemplated just now.
- 7. I spoke with Warren about all this. He suggested that he be asked just before your departure for Rome whether there have been any further developments of which you might usefully be informed. I have asked Peter Chatenay to call him to this end before you leave.

Following your visit to the Bank and in light of our discussions with various CPS departments about a reorientation of the Cooperative Program, we are in the process of formulating some possible alternatives.

I am writing you today to let you know that at the same time we are reviewing possible reductions in Cooperative Program activities. I am sure you are aware that IDA funds are available at a greatly reduced level only. It is likely that the Bank will limit its project preparatory activities. Reductions in project preparatory activities would of course affect our Cooperative Program. You should therefore be aware that Cooperative Program funding might be substantially reduced.

## Discussion on WHO/WB CP with Dr. B. Dieterich, WHO

- 1. The Bank Regional Managers and WHO are not satisfied with the CP. WHO feels that the emphasis on lending program support, particularly the staff budgeting, prevents activities of interest to WHO. Those activities are national planning and programming in the health sector at large (not just water supply and sanitation), information exchange, general support to governments, TCDC promotion, i.e., noninvestment-oriented activities. Bank staff is opposed precisely to nonlending-oriented activities and is concerned (as is WHO to a lesser extent) about the inherent inefficiencies of the CP "joint" management.
- 2. WHO would like to use the CP for a range of activities (such as those described above) without being tied to a budget related to the Bank lending program. I suspect they would like to expand the CP, keeping what they have in Geneva and adding new staff to the regional offices.
- 3. I believe WHO would be interested in the approach described in the SSSP, namely to undertake health impact analysis, design of health-related project components, health education and training of community workers (see attached paras. 3.10 and 3.11 of SSSP).
- 4. I met Dr. Dieterich recently in Pakistan and informed him of our recommendation in the SSSP to either change the CP or eliminate it. He stated that he is of the same opinion and has so informed his management though he made it clear he does not believe the CP can be abandoned.

## GENERAL

## WORKPLAN

A new workplan dated 17 February 1981 was issued covering the three periods January-June 1981, July-December 1981 and January-June 1982, and sent to you with our letter of 23 February 1981. This Quarterly Report reflects changes up to 17 March 1981.

## RECRUITMENT OF MR AJDARI

Mr Ajdari's recruitment has been officially completed and the Government of Mali has cleared his assignment in Bamako. Mr Ajdari visited the World Bank from 19 January to 13 February for general briefing and explanations on the Bank's methods of work, and spent ten days in Geneva for briefing on Cooperative Programme and on other Interregional Projects (UNDP, SIDA, GTZ). As his first mission (Cameroon), scheduled to start on 16 March 1981, has been postponed, he visited AFRO for one week and then joined his duty station.

## RECRUITMENT OF A FINANCIAL ANALYST FOR AMRO

Mr Ringskog, CP Financial Analyst outposted to AMRO, left the Organization end-February. A vacancy notice issued by Personnel for this post was sent to different individuals and institutes which might be in a position to suggest names of potential candidates. The closing date for the applications was 12 March 1981.

## REPLACEMENT OF MR HEYLAND

As Mr Heyland confirmed his decision to leave WHO/SEARO end-June 1980, a vacancy notice has just been issued for his replacement.

## PUBLIC STANDPOST WATER SUPPLY SYSTEMS

It was agreed by the Bank that a CP input of 4 man/weeks (2 weeks of engineer, 1 week of economist and 1 week of financial analyst) would be devoted to review/revision of the Public Standpost Testing Project. As shown in the workplan of 17 February, Mr Jackson, who will act as coordinator for this activity, has been assigned for two weeks (PSWS, 4-15 May), Dr Becher for one week (4-8 May) and Mr Nur for one week (4-8 May). We should be grateful if you would let us know which code it should be shown.

#### FINANCIAL/ECONOMIC WORKSHOP

As you have probably noted in the 17 February workplan, a provision of one week for each staff present in Geneva has been earmarked for the above-mentioned activity (FW, week of 27 April 1981). Mr Laugeri will conduct this workshop, which has two main objectives: (i) to achieve a common understanding of economic

and financial sector problems in the context of the Decade; (ii) to provide all ETS staff with an in-depth knowledge of the Terrania Case Study, so that they can later on conduct similar workshops or participate as facilitators; four inter-country workshops are planned to take place in 1981, and they are expected to be followed by number of national workshops.

## SEMINAR - ENVIRONMENTALLY CAUSED HEALTH CONDITIONS

As you have probably noted, a provision of one week for each staff member present in Geneva has been earmarked in the 17 February workplan for the above activity (S, week of 23 March 1981). The purposes of this meeting are to give a basic indoctrination to ETS staff in epidemiological methods and to enable staff of the Unit to orient the technical advice and other output they are producing so that it will contribute to solving major health problems.

## DJIBOUTI

The mini mission requested by the Bank between 8 and 13 January 1981 was postponed at the Government's request firstly to 1-13 February and then, because of a sectoral review meeting scheduled by UNDP for the period 23 to 26 February, to the first or second week of March. Mr Bishara participated in the above sectoral review meeting on behalf of EMRO. We advised the RR/UNDP that March might be inconvenient for re-scheduling the mission in view of prior commitments and suggested the period of 30 March to 10 April 1981, to which he agreed. Mr Bishara, team leader, will be accompanied by Mr Nur.

## LESOTHO, SWAZILAND, BOTSWANA\*

Provision: FY1981 - 5 man/weeks

Manpower and training subcommittees were established in Swaziland, Lesotho and Botswana as part of the National Steering/Action Groups for Decade Planning. Arrangements are being made to support the work of these subcommittees by training consultants sponsored by the WHO/SIDA Cooperation Project. Brief manpower and training reports in a form of back-to-office reports were prepared and attached to Mr Redekopp's Duty Travel Report dated 19 December 1980; these summarized the information available to the mission at that time.

## RWANDA

Health Education Study - Resp. Off.: AFRO Specialist - Code: SWØ 2RWAW

Provision: FY1981 - 5 man/weeks

The amended version of the terms of reference was translated into French at AFRO's request and sent to the Regional Office on 16 January 1981. The field mission was scheduled to be undertaken immediately after the Burundi one and we are now awaiting the mission report.

During the WHO/IBRD Cooperative Programme Planning Meeting held in Brazzaville from 1 to 10 October, Dr Duncan reported on his negotiations with UNDP for Project Document preparation for water supply and sanitation for the Seychelles. He proposed a mission which would include Mr Laugeri, Mr Vogel and himself working in the country from 11 to 24 May 1981. Up to now, we have not received further details from AFRO or Dr Duncan about this mission. However as it has not been officially cancelled, we maintained it in the current workplan.

After discussions in Geneva with the RR/UNDP Zimbabwe, representatives of AFRO and of HQ, a WHO mission took place in February 1981, to prepare, in association with Government officials, a position paper for consideration at the March Conference as a basis for mobilizing resources for the health sector. The inclusion of a sanitary engineer in the above mission was decided, to prepare a rapid assessment report and also to serve as reconnaissance mission for the full sector study. A provision of 4 man/weeks (+ 1 week for finalization of report) of Mr Vogel's time was earmarked in the 17 February workplan for this activity. The Bank agreed to this mission, which was carried out from 23 February to 6 March.

Because of the late recruitment of Mr Ajdari and his briefing at the World Bank and WHO, the mission was postponed up to 16 March 1981. Terms of reference prepared by the Bank were brought back from Washington by Mr Ajdari. As it seemed that there was a misunderstanding with AFRO concerning the dates and exact purpose of the mission, we cabled them on 19 February proposing that: (i) Messrs Romain and Ajdari carry out a reconnaissance mission in Yaoundé from 9 to 12 March, covering the points alpha, beta and gamma of the Bank's terms of reference; definite terms of reference and composition of full sector study mission would be discussed with Government on 13 March, and (ii) the full mission takes place from 16 March to 3 April, of which two weeks visit inside the country and one week for preparation and presentation of summary and preliminary conclusions of the mission to the Government officials, and two to three weeks in Brazzaville for report writing. The full mission would consist of Messrs Ajdari, Ballance and Romain, plus a rural water supply specialist, either recruited by AFRO on the advice of the Bank, or preferably a national suggested by Mr Ngassam, Director, Génie rural, plus if possible participation of Mr Godart from SNEC. We are awaiting AFRO's reaction to this proposal.

## CAPE VERDE

Due to other commitments of the mission members, we suggested to the Bank to re-schedule the Yemen mission as from 23 March 1981; the Bank informed us that their next mission to Yemen be planned for the period 10 to 25 June and asked us if it would be convenient for the CP mission. On 6 January, we advised the Bank that the dates are convenient to the other mission members, but that Mr Redekopp will not be available at that time; we suggested three options: (i) to drop the training element, (ii) to use a training consultant, or (iii) to re-schedule the mission from 11 to 29 May 1981. In their reply, the Bank requested us to arrange assignment of Mr Neal Carefoot from PAHO for 10-25 June. PAHO indicated by cable that they were unable to make firm commitments for Mr Carefoot. Bank has now agreed to assign Mr Barker for this task. Terms of reference have been received from the Bank and transmitted to EMRO and WPC Sana'a; no comments have been made and no amendments requested up to now.

The Bank's concurrence was sought and they indicated that they did not have any objection to this visit to Nepal and would be very interested in receiving Mr Redekopp's mission report. Draft terms of reference were sent to the Bank who indicated that they had no specific comments; they were slightly modified after discussion in SEARO and Nepal. A Training Project Document (for UNDP funding) was prepared which will be finalized by SEARO. The full report will be available end-April.

The first draft report was sent to WPRO, WPC Seoul and the World Bank on 31 October 1980 for comments. The Bank's comments were sent by cable on 20 November and by letter on 24 November 1980. These comments resulted from a review of the draft made by some 15 Bank staff who had met principally to review the Bank's issues paper on the current Korea Project. The Bank indicated that the report was too long and the manpower section required to be considerably shortened. They also mentioned that a number of items were not included (e.g. geography and climate, public health, water resources). We suggested that the re-drafting should result in a two volumes report - the first one a short issue type of paper with all appendices and background information to the second one. Philippines sector study was suggested as a good model. On the delicate question of institutional proposals we suggested a review of options available without any firm recommendations. WPC Seoul comments were received on 17 December through WPRO who supported these comments. A provision has now been earmarked in the current workplan (about 12 man/weeks) for a complete re-writing of the Korea report.
