Distribution of Economic Missions Forecast

Having read the attachments to your memorandum of December III and heard the views of Mr. King and Mr. Owen, we are not in favor of extending distribution of the forecast to division chiefs as requested by Mr. King. It is important to keep the volume of paper produced and distributed within the Bank as low as possible. As the staff commitment seemed to be rather large for missions of this kind we questioned Asia Department on them. It is clear from Mr. King's and Mr. McDiarmid's replies to Mr. Williams of December 5 that both missions are considerably more than routine review missions. Mr. King also commented that, as a result of an error by them, the mission to Singapore shows two industrial specialists instead of one.

As I mentioned on the telephone, the statement shows one agriculturalist and two transportation specialists for the mission to the Congo, whereas the Agriculture and Transportation Division Progress Reports show two agriculturalists (and there will be an FAO man as well) and five transport specialists. Thus the total number on the mission appears to be 12, not seven.

It is important for us, and presumably for those responsible for economic missions, that the statements should be as accurate as possible, both in describing the purpose of the mission and in indicating its composition. Perhaps you could impress this upon those conserned.

I have discussed Mr. Haynes availability for the El Salvador mission and have been informed that it is very unlikely that he will be able to go on this mission if the negotiations for the Malawi Project are undertaken in December. As I understand it, this has not been fully determined as of this date. However, it must be kept in mind that, in the event Mr. Haynes cannot participate in the El Salvador mission, we would have to find another Agriculturist.

After January 1, 1968, we would still have to schedule the following supervision missions:

Malaysia - 434-MA (Muda) 500-MA (Kemubu)

Mexico - 275-ME (Irrigation I) 336-ME (Irrigation II) 450-ME (Irrigation III)

Pakistan - 11-PAK (Dacca) 22-PAK (Khairpur) 39-PAK (Chandpur)

Thailand - 327-TH (Petchburi) 328-TH (Chao Phya) 394-TH (Me Klong) 514-TH (Phasom)

At the present time, I see no problem in meeting the requirements for such missions after the first of the year.

SUBJECT: Monthly Reports on Expected Economic Missions

1. With reference to the Economic Committee's discussion on March 21 of the current forecast of economic missions, and particularly to Mr. Friedman's comments on the comparability of information, I should appreciate if the following details were included in future monthly reports.

Monthly Memorandum

- 2. Part III: All "special" missions (i.e. chiefly missions to discuss draft economic reports and/or economic policies) should be listed with a brief description regarding timing and purpose. Participation in an economic mission organized by another agency, and which would not result in a Bank economic report, should be included in this category. A "joint mission" which resulted in a Bank economic report should be reported in a Timetable for Economic Mission Work.
- 3. Part V: Dates that missions return to the Bank should be given (defined as the date the chief-of-mission returns).

1. A forecast of expected major economic missions (i.e. more than three men) for the whole of FY1968 necessarily becomes increasingly tentative as the perspective lengthens. This is to record our conversations on January 3 and 4, 1967, during which we worked out a tentative timetable for my visits to Bangkok, Saigon and Colombo.

- February 1 Arrive Bangkok for review of Second Five-Year Plan. The mission will consist of Messrs. van der Tak, Foster, Sharif, Afrous, and myself.
- Mid-February Leave Bangkok for Saigon for about three days of discussions with Covernment.
- February 25 Leave Bangkok for Colombo, joining someone from the Department, not yet designated, who would arrive about a week earlier. The purpose would be to discuss aid requirements in 1967 and review prospective aid requirements for the period through 1971.
- March 4 Leave Colombo for Washington.
- March 24 Dispatch to members of Ceylon Aid Group, memorandum outlining aid requirements in 1967 and discussing Ceylon's prospective needs through 1971.

This timetable means that the report of the mission to Thailand will probably not be ready for distribution to the Consultative Group before early May.

SUBJECT: Forecast of Economic Missions

- In order to reduce to the minimum the number of Status of Economic Mission Forms which have to be completed by each Area Department, a new method of reporting will be introduced on a trial basis.
- As already discussed and agreed, beginning with the information due on November 25 for the period December, 1966-May, 1967, a memorandum (four copies) should be completed along the following lines:
- List missions shown in the last Forecast for which there Part I: have been no change in details.
- Part II: List missions for which there have been changes with respect to (a) timing, (b) duration, (c) purpose and (d) cancellation, and give details.
- Part III: List all other "special" missions (including follow-up missions to discuss draft reports) and give brief description regarding timing and purpose. (This was discussed at the Economic Committee meeting on November 15.)
- Part IV: List missions in the field.
- Accordingly, new Mission Forms need only be completed fully for missions reported for the first time.

- 4. In the case of changes in the composition or personnel, only page 3 of the Mission Form need be completed.
- 5. Modification of the existing Status of Economic Mission Form, or the introduction of a new form, is presently under consideration.

Forecasts of Economic Missions

Just a brief comment on para. 1 of your memo of May 19, 1966. As I recall our discussion, we agreed that the area department should indicate in its forecast the degree of flexibility in the timing of the economic missions as well as the degree of commitment, if any, made to the Government involved. I am not sure that we can very usefully indicate "the priorities of economic missions" as you request. Speaking for the Western Hemisphere Department, our mission scheduling reflects the operational requirements of the department; all the missions are therefore a priority in the sense of not being postponed indefinitely. Some, however, are more flexible in their timing than others.

We shall, in our next submission of forms, indicate what flexibility we see in timing. I want to make clear you understand how we read your term "priorities".

Malaysia Mission - Extracts of letters from Threlkeld

February 7 - Kuala Lumpur

"Just a note to let you know we arrived here safely - everyone meary of travelling but in good spirits. There was no one to meet us. The Director of D.I.D. and the Minister are away on tour; the deputy is in Penang until Wednesday; Choshal left 2h hours before we arrived and left no message; Wignaraja I located about 10:30 pm and knows of no arrangements for us; I phoned Singapore at 11:30 pm to get Choshal but he had checked out that morning and they didn't know where he had gone; otherwise things are fine. Fiennes arrives today but the Planning Organization doesn't know we are here, however, I shall straighten things out as soon as the offices open. It will mean a slower start than I expected but with luck we shall catch up."

February 10 - Kota Bharu

"Just a brief report on present activities. Fiences leaves for Sabah tomorrow morning (11th Feb) after a limited briefing. The only details we were able to get were the overall 5 year plan as it affects development plans for Sabah - Sarawak and a confidential preliminary report by U.N. Special Fund on the Labuk Valley, Sabah.

One of the Economic Planning Unit officials returns from Sarawak today, so I hope he will have something concrete for that Territory. It is apparent that the Federal Government were not yet in a position to submit proposals for these Territories, as they are still having their own internal discussions on any proposals there may be. Accordingly, Fiennes will probably spend about four days in each Territory and see what is available from local governments.

With regard to other proposals in Malaya itself - we have had general discussions on Agricultural Education, Agricultural Extension, Livestock, Fisheries, and Agricultural Research. To date, they have given us nothing in writing on which to comment for the Consultative Group. Something might mature next week."
