<u>DMV Updates – October 2022</u>

DC Metro Area Department of Motor Vehicle offices have returned their services to pre COVID-19 pandemic emergency at their various locations throughout the region.

<u>Virginia DMV</u> (https://www.dmv.virginia.gov/)

- Expired driver licenses and identification cards must be renewed by original expiration date listed on card
- **DMV offices have opened for walk-in services or by appointment.** Appointments may be scheduled at https://www.dmv.virginia.gov/general/#appointments.asp
- An expired G-4 Visa with a recent I-94 record of entry may be used to renew VA Driver Licenses: https://www.dmv.virginia.gov/webdoc/pdf/accept_doc_status.pdf

<u>District of Columbia DMV (https://dmv.dc.gov/)</u>

- All expired vehicle registration, driver licenses, and identification cards must be renewed
- All service centers have resumed walk-in service on a first-come, first-serve basis. Appointments are no longer available.
- An expired G-4 Visa with a recent I-94 record of entry may be used to renew DC Driver Licenses: https://dmv.dc.gov/node/1414691

Maryland MVA (https://mva.maryland.gov/)

- All expired driver licenses, identification cards, permits and vehicle registrations must be renewed
- Maryland MVA Customer Service Centers are open by <u>appointment only</u> until further notice. Appointments may be scheduled at https://mvascheduling.mva.maryland.gov/
- An expired G-4 Visa with a recent I-94 record of entry may be used to renew MD Driver Licenses: http://license.mva.maryland.gov/checklist/checklist.aspx

Transportation Security Administration (TSA) on airline travel

- Travelers with a driver's license that expired after March 1, 2020, and who are not able to renew, may still use it as acceptable identification at TSA checkpoints
- As of May 3, 2023 Real ID compliant driver licenses will be required for air travel within the United States. WBG HR does not recommend applying for non-compliant driver licenses

Social Security Administration (SSA) for Social Security Numbers or Non-Eligibility Letters

- Generally, only non-US citizens authorized to work in the United States by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) are eligible to receive a Social Security Number (SSN)
- G-4 visa holders do not need an SSN to obtain a driver's license
- To obtain a SSN non-eligibility (denial) letter in-lieu of an SSN, complete and submit <u>SSA</u> Form SS-05 in-person or by mail
