Two tracks of support & workshops



Given strong interest (24 projects), two support tracks were established.

EARLY ENGAGEMENT TRACK

10 teams at early stages needed support to design IEs and engage with policy makers

7 teams have proceeded with additional country engagement to finalize IE designs

-> 5 in-country workshops (2 pending)

-> [June 2023 Technical workshop](#) to discuss updated designs before finalization.

Common Measurement Framework

Key Elements	Progress
<u>Essential elements</u>	
Standardized household survey modules	Drafted, programming under way
Standardized cost data tools	To be discussed during workshop
<u>Encouraged elements</u>	
Rapid/nimble experimentation/testing	For consideration by teams as they finalize their design
Mixed methods	To be discussed during workshop
Community and market survey for GE/spillovers	Q3 2023
High-frequency measures and resilience	Q3 2023
Administrative data on implementation	Q4 2023
Measures of quality of implementation	Q4 2023

Standardized instruments (least common denominator)

❑ Core surveys modules

- ❑ Consumption and Food Security
- ❑ Income and Time use within household by livelihood (wage, off-farm business, ag, livestock)
- ❑ Assets and Investments
- ❑ Household financial inclusion (Savings, Credit)
- ❑ Women's empowerment (resources, agency)
- ❑ Psychological measures and social well-being
- ❑ Human capital (skills, children's education), migration

❑ Consistent cost data

- ❑ Provide data that can be disaggregated by EI program component
- ❑ Support comparable cost-benefit analysis
- ❑ Guidance on what costs to consider aside from direct delivery
- Adapt PEI/Sahel cost data collection templates
