

# Listening to Kazakhstan

- L2Kaz provides high-frequency panel survey data on wellbeing
- Collaboration between the World Bank and the UK International Development
- Similar initiatives in Tajikistan, the Kyrgyz Republic, and Uzbekistan
- Blends traditional welfare monitoring with polling-type questions, filling a gap in the policy generation process


# **Objectives**

- Promote evidence-based policy and decision making
- Assessing the impact of policies and reform
- Traditional surveys are conducted less frequently, but some decisions must be made urgently
- Approach proven very useful in region, particularly responding to shocks

# **Sample Design: maintaining representativeness**

In the baseline survey, each blue dot represents **20 households** 

In the panel, each blue dot represents 7 or 8 households – every month




#### The Listening to Kazakhstan survey

Timing	<ul> <li>Baseline completed in October 2020</li> <li>Monthly rounds thereafter</li> <li>54,000 interviews completed</li> </ul>
Sample size	• 1,400 households per month (2,000 for 6 months)
Geographic coverage	• Representative of major cities, urban, and rural areas
Survey content	<ul> <li>8 core modules (demographics, shocks, wellbeing, migration, employment activity, opinions, incomes, savings)</li> <li>Several rotating modules (trust on statistics, tax policy, gender, energy subsidy reform, etc.)</li> </ul>
Similar surveys in other countries	<ul> <li>Uzbekistan, Tajikistan, Kyrgyz Republic</li> <li>The survey design is also linked to the World Bank global rapid assessment monitoring framework</li> </ul>


### **Economic Conditions**

Wages are the primary source of income for families and increased their share over time. In contrast, selfemployment shows a slight decrease over time



# Perception of local economic conditions showed noticeable improvement, particularly in the first half of 2023


Local economic conditions "good"



Listening to Kazakhstan: Do you believe that the current economic conditions in the city or area where you live are good, or not?


#### Around three-quarters of respondents expressed optimism regarding the country's long-term economic trends, and this share remained largely stable during 2023


Optimistic about the economic situation of the country

Listening to Kazakhstan: Now is a good time to find a job where I live.


Listening to Kazakhstan: Now it is a good time to start a business where I live.

# However, workers continue to be worried about losing jobs in 2023




# **Household Well-being**

#### Average levels of life satisfaction have consistently remained around 70 percent since the beginning of the survey.


#### Since the first quarter of 2022, less people are reporting a deterioration in their financial well being




Worse financial wellbeing than before


Listening to Kazakhstan: If you compare the financial well-being of your household with that of 30 days ago, has it become better or worse?

#### More households are accumulating savings




#### Majority of households can cover emergencies





Listening to Kazakhstan: In your view, what are the most pressing economic challenges facing Kazakhstan? (up to 3)




# Higher public concern about rising prices

# **Government policies**


#### Significant support for ongoing political, social, and economic reforms but not much change in the past year



Listening to Kazakhstan: The country is generally on the right track on political, social, and economic reforms


#### After falling at the beginning of 2021, public satisfaction with government's dialogue with citizens has not improved
