Dear George:

I understand from George Wishart that you will be returning to New York on Wednesday evening of next week and there really is not much that I need to bother you with until you get back. Our regular operational business is proceeding but the only loan which will be ready for action next week (Tuesday) is a \$33 million loan to Peru for highway construction. This completes the \$50 million package of loans which we have been working on in Peru.

The other business for the Executive Directors next Tuesday includes a proposed \$493,000 Technical Assistance grant to Guinea for highway feasibility studies, and a number of formal actions to approve various documents.

Among the latter are reports to the Executive Directors from the Secretary advising them that we have now received affirmative votes from the required number of countries to approve the \$2 billion increase in the capital stock of the Bank and the amendments to the Bank and IFC Charters providing for Bank loans to the IFC. As I think you know, in the case of the Bank a Charter amendment requires a two-step procedure and we are now proceeding to the second step, namely, asking each member country to inform us formally whether it approves the proposed amendment. The amendment becomes effective when we receive such notifications from three-fifths of the members having four-fifths of the total voting power. We hope to get these notifications in without too much delay. This should not be too much of a problem - the only country that voted against the resolution on this subject was Burma.

I attended a signing ceremony in Joe Fowler's office this morning in which the U.S. affixed its signature, subject of course to Senate ratification, to the S.I.D. Convention. I attach a copy of the Treasury press release on this subject which was issued today. We have also received signatures from Niger and the Central African Republic, and Nigeria has become the first country to send in its formal ratification.

I understand that there have been a number of switches and changes in the Indian plans for visits to Washington prior to T.T.K.'s arrival. We first heard that L.K. Jha might come and return to Delhi before T.T.K.

left there. We have heard no more about this but as of yesterday we were definitely notified that I.G. Patel would arrive in Washington on September 1st "for discussions with the Fund". In the meantime we have been trying to learn more about the new import duties which have been introduced in India in a supplementary budget. I enclose a note from Bernie Bell on the subject which I am sure you will find of interest.

Finally, I am happy to report that our 2-year bond issue seems to be going well. As of tonight we have subscriptions of \$81 million, plus a cable from the Bank of Thailand entering a subscription of \$20 million. This cable didn't have the usual "test numbers" on the figures in the cable and we are double checking to make sure that the \$20 million figure is accurate. We are also still waiting to hear from two major holders, namely, Spain and Argentina (\$8 million each), so it may be that we will go well over the top.

Dear Mr. Woods:

I duly received your telegram today regarding the interviews as proposed by Burke Knapp for you to hold during the Governors' Meetings period. I passed the information on to Burke by telephone and, on his instructions, also advised Hilken who is coordinating these arrangements.

There are some other matters on which I should like to report to you:

(a) There will be a Bank Board Meeting on August 31 to consider a road loan for Peru, an item on technical assistance for Guinea (paper enclosed for your information), the "Joint Coffee Study" paper which I sent you previously and also final reports on the Charter Amendments and the \$2 billion capital increase. As regards the Charter Amendments, you will be glad to know that favorable votes from the United States and German Governments have now been received.

It then looks as if we will not have another Board Meeting until Thursday, September 9. The Agendas for that date will include a loan to Japan (Kobe Expressway Project), a Mexican agricultural credit (Bank loan), the loan to the Israeli Development Finance Company and an IFC investment in a textile concern in Ecuador.

(b) Mr. Rajan has been on the phone to fix up a meeting between yourself and Mr. T.T. Krishnamachari. Rajan is particularly anxious for a date as early as possible and asked for the morning of Tuesday, September 14. I understand that T.T.K. arrives on Sunday, September 12, and the plan is that he should meet with Mr. P.P. Schweitzer on Monday, September 13. As you know, you have accepted an invitation to lunch with Rajan on September 14. I have tentatively given Rajan 11 a.m. on September 14 for the meeting with you subject to your concurrence and subject to there not being a Board Meeting that day. Mendels tells me that he has no Agenda items, as yet, for that week although he certainly expects that there will be matters requiring Board attention during that week. If you wish to confirm that date with T.T.K. on Tuesday morning, Mendels would then go for a Board Meeting on Thursday, September 16, and

keep all items for that date; alternatively, of course, we would have to rearrange the T.T.K. meeting, say, for the afternoon of Tuesday, September 14. (Incidentally, de Lattre is due to travel back to Washington on September 8.)

(c) Irving Friedman is back in Washington although he does not intend to come into the Bank for another week. I spoke to him on the telephone and he told me that he had had an interesting, and he thought useful, trip. He asked me to tell you that Mrs. Elizalde is coming to the Governors' Meetings.

(d) Mort Mendels visited Dick Demuth yesterday and I understand Burke Knapp also did so. Mendels tells me that he was pleasantly surprised at Dick's condition, although Dick tired very soon. Dick cannot sit but can stand up for a few minutes at a time, otherwise must lie flat. He is being allowed visitors but only a limited number each day and each for just a few minutes.

(e) I enclose some further papers you may care to have:

(i) Projects Under Consideration by IFC Divisions. You asked that we should try and get these from the three Divisions "coincidentally" and the attached three reports were made available for yesterday's IFC Staff Meeting. However, Marty Rosen deferred consideration of the reports until next week. I have spare copies here, so these can be destroyed when you have finished with them.

(ii) A note from Mendels regarding "International Country Club" which he asked me to send on.



Dear Mr. Woods:

This will be my fourth letter to you and I am numbering it accordingly. The first letter was sent on Friday, August 13, via Mr. Harlan Southerland, with a copy of it addressed to your house; then on Friday, August 20, I sent you a further letter to your house (No. 2) and another letter via Mr. Southerland (No. 3). The main purpose of this one is to acknowledge your letter of August 19. I have copied on to Raymond Cope your note on your talk with the Portuguese Finance Minister. I have also sent to Mr. Edgar Kaiser the clipping you enclosed, with your buck slip.

As regards the speech by Mr. Walter Reuther made in Copenhagen, Harold Graves undertook to obtain a copy for you. He telephoned the Auto Workers Union at both its Washington office and its Detroit office. They have told him that Mr. Reuther made the speech, presumably from notes, but not from a prepared text. Accordingly, there is no copy of the speech available. Harold is making some further enquiries but it does not look as if he can get you the copy you want.

I spoke with Bernie Bell today. He said that his report is not yet ready and will take "several days more."


I telephoned the Demuth household this morning but could only speak to the maid. She told me that Dick is making good progress and had his first walk along the corridor yesterday.

I am enclosing one or two further things which you may like to read through. One of these is a paper to the Board on the "Joint Coffee Study." I asked Mort Mendels when this would come up to the Board. He is not quite sure but thinks at a fairly early meeting, probably August 31 or September 2, provided that the appropriate people are here to deal with any questions.

In my letter of August 20 (No. 2) I sent you the first report on the Special Guest acceptances for the Governors' Meetings. Mendels asks, if you have the time, that you might start considering which of these guests should be invited to one or other of the two Governors' dinners.

We had what I suppose is our last--for some time at least--President's Council meeting this morning, as Siem left mid-day on the first stage of his journey to Brazil. Burke is now the only member of the President's Council left in Washington and I see that he himself is to be away in Wisconsin and Chicago on August 25 and 26. All well here. A certain amount of paper but it is all in hand.

Dear George:

Things have been pretty quiet here and I don't have much to report. I understand that George Wishart has been sending you a certain amount of the flow of papers and answering your queries on a few matters. Also, I presume you are keeping up with the New York Times and other current news sources.

I presume you have heard that Indonesia formally resigned from the Bank on August 17. Under the terms of our Charter we have to pay back their subscription money at the end of six months. Some nice questions may arise as to how much we owe them, but there is plenty of time to consider this.

We are still sorting out the consequences of Singapore's separation from Malaysia; we are continuing to make disbursements on all our Malaysian loans, including those in Singapore (one of our Singapore loans is guaranteed by the U.K. and the Government of Malaysia has reconfirmed its guarantee responsibility on the other loan). Of course the new Port loan which had passed the Board but which was not yet signed will have to be reconsidered as a possible loan to the Government of Singapore after it becomes an independent member of the Bank.

Today's New York Times reports that T.T.K. has called for a substantial increase of import duties on a selective basis to "help cover" a threatening budgetary deficit of \$200 million equivalent. This is not an across-the-board increase and Bernie Bell points out that even if the total yield was \$200 million this would provide a levy of less than 10% on Indian merchandise imports, including food grains. Incidentally, he also tells me that the latest news is that Boothalingam, Bhattacharya and Patel will arrive in Washington the day after Labor Day to start discussions with the Fund.

We made the 2-year bond offering on Wednesday at an interest rate of $4 - 3/8$ %. Responses are beginning to come in. Holders of \$25 million (including the Bundesbank for \$15 million) have rolled over their holdings; two holders have so far declined - Finland for \$2 $\frac{1}{2}$ million and the B.I.S. for \$3 $\frac{1}{2}$ million. I will report further on this next week.

I have been reviewing with Mr. Aldewereld and the Area Departments his memorandum of August 6, which I think you have seen, proposing some cancellations and warnings of cancellations on Bank loans and IDA credits. We are taking action pretty much along the lines of that memorandum. You will remember that a number of the cases relate to East Pakistan and Bernard Chadenet will follow up on these cases when he visits East Pakistan early in September.

We are beginning to get replies in on our invitations to Part I countries to attend the various Consultative Group meetings during and after the Annual Meetings. The returns are still quite incomplete but there are no refusals or other surprises.

I am sure you will have seen that the conference finally approved a one year extension of the foreign aid authorization and that this has now been approved by the House. The Senate is expected to act early next week. The conference bill retains the Senate provision for a 15% transfer to the Bank, IDA or IFC. As you know, however, the real problem here will be to get corresponding action on the Appropriation Bill.

That's all for now, except to tell you that Dick Demuth seems to be making normal progress and is beginning to perk up a little from the aftermath of his operation.

Dear Mr. Woods:

Thank you for your two notes, dated August 16 and 17, which were received here yesterday and today. We were all glad to hear that you are enjoying your holiday and hope you really do have a good and relaxing time. The Wishart family enjoyed their stay at The Homestead so much that they persuaded me to let them stay there an extra night! Accordingly, we returned to Washington on Thursday morning instead of Wednesday evening. I had kept in touch with the office and I knew that everything was being well looked after, so I did not think you would mind if I took an extra morning off.

I note how the delivery of mail to you is working out. This package will come addressed to your house, since it contains mainly routine matters. I am also sending another package c/o Mr. Harlan Southerland, with the note on Portugal from Raymond Cope and copies of letters from Mr. C.C. Desai and Ambassador Amjad Ali; Burke Knapp says he will also have two letters ready for you this afternoon and I shall include these in the Southerland package.

To turn now to the points you have raised in your letters, the answers are as follows:

(a) Mendels has already given Rosen the data on Executive Directors' discussions on "Bank Loans to IFC." Mendels says he has not yet received the official vote in favor from the United States but expects it today or early next week. He also expects a favorable vote from the German Government before August 31.

(b) Central American Telecommunications Project: As a result of a recent meeting, it now appears that only two of the Central American countries (Costa Rica and Nicaragua) are willing to go ahead with this project. Although continuing efforts will be made to persuade the other countries, the project is at a standstill for the time being. Alter is obtaining for me a note on this matter which I shall enclose herewith. Alter does not understand why no reference was made to the status in the last Monthly Operational Summary and he is looking into the position.

(c) Harold Graves says that a "pull" of the Bank/IDA Annual Report should be ready for posting to you tomorrow. I have given him the

American Embassy address which he will use. I also understand from Harold that he has already sent you a Xeroxed copy of the IFC Annual Report.

(d) No sign yet of Bernie Bell's report. I shall get in touch with him on Monday.

(e) Dick Demuth seems to be getting on pretty well. I spoke with his young daughter this morning who said that, although he had been in a good deal of pain up to yesterday, and under sedatives, the news was that he was much better today. I shall talk with Eunice Demuth myself over the weekend and hope that by next week I can send you pretty good news regarding his progress.

(f) The Turkish report is being stencilled at the moment and will be considered in the Bank next week. One of the papers I am enclosing is a note from Dick to Burke Knapp suggesting a procedure for future discussions in Turkey.

(g) Booz left today with the draft Moroccan report, first for discussions with FAO in Rome and then on to Morocco for discussions with the Government. He is expected back here around September 20 and distribution of the report will not take place until after that.

(h) Mike Hoffman has already been sent copies of all the material on consultative groups.

(i) In Schmitt's absence, I will pass on your message regarding a meeting with Mr. G.D. Birla to Lloyd Cutler.

Among the other papers I am sending to you are the following:

(a) A note from Siem Aldewereld, dated August 18, regarding "Bank Proposal on Supplementary Financial Measures." Siem was most anxious you should have this.


(b) A copy of a letter from a Mr. Kuljian. Siem who is here today has already started investigating this matter.

(c) I also think you would like the first reports on members of the delegations attending the Governors' Meetings and the special guest acceptances received so far, so I enclose these.

I trust I am not sending you too much stuff but you said you would like a few things while you are in Lisbon.

Trip to Brazil and Argentina - May 4 to May 26

The purpose of this trip was to assist in the arrangements for coverage of Mr. Woods's visit to Brazil and Argentina. Thanks to preparations made by the host Governments and organizations and the response from friends in newspapers and specialized publications in both countries, this task was made easier. I could not visit more papers than those mentioned below because I had to spend most of my time with Mr. Woods's party, assisting in drafting inserts to his speeches as in the case of Brazil, or drafting a statement for the press in Buenos Aires, or attending official functions.

The President's Trip

Brazil - Rio de Janeiro: Shortly after my arrival on May 5, I visited Mr. John Cotrim, President of FURNAS and Mr. Woods's host at the Estreito and Furnas projects. In talks with him and his Director of Public Relations, Dr. Emerson Coelho, arrangements were made to translate into Portuguese Mr. Woods's biography and a draft press release prepared in advance in Washington. Furnas also undertook the translation of the draft speech Mr. Woods would deliver at Estreito. Mr. Coelho arranged the distribution of all this material to the several news media.

On May 5 I also visited Mr. Arturo Amorin, Assistant to Minister of Planning Roberto Campos. Mr. Amorin was in charge of coordinating Mr. Woods's activities in Rio, including his visits to President Castelo Branco and Cabinet members. He was also in charge of arrangements with USELPA for Mr. Woods's visit to Sao Paulo. In our talks it was arranged to have Mr. Woods's speech in Sao Paulo translated and mimeographed at the Ministry of Planning. Minister Campos sent word that he would like to discuss Mr. Woods's program and a meeting was set for Friday, May 7 with Messrs. Schmidt, Wiese and Perez.

The change of host for the Sao Paulo dinner, with Governor Barros substituting for Minister Campos, prompted my cable of May 6 requesting some changes in the text. (Incidentally, Minister Campos had informed that he would not attend the Sao Paulo dinner claiming some pressing business in Rio. For political reasons he apparently did not want to go as Mr. Barros's guest. However he changed his mind after Barros, in a widely commented political about-face, went to Rio to appear on TV and radio to express his public support of the Federal Government's economic program and of Minister Campos, personally.)

After Messrs. Schmidt and Wiese arrived on May 6, Mr. Perez's suggestion that Mr. Woods should make more specific remarks in one of his speeches about possible Bank assistance to Brazil was discussed. It was agreed that it would be desirable to do so and accordingly and on the basis of information provided by Messrs. Wiese and Perez, several new paragraphs were drafted to be submitted to Mr. Woods as insert to the original text he would bring with him from Washington.

Mr. Woods agreed, suggested some changes and they were incorporated in his text for the Sao Paulo speech. Once in Sao Paulo, on May 14, and after his talks with President Castelo Branco and members of his Government, Mr. Woods decided on some changes. Work on these changes, typing the English text for Mr. Woods and the translation and stenciling of the Portuguese text went on until 7:15 p.m. of May 14, some 45 minutes before he was to deliver his speech.

Sao Paulo: USELPA's President, Dr. Otto C. Lehman was as helpful as Mr. Cotrim, of Furnas, had been in Rio. Met with Dr. Lehman shortly after arrival in Sao Paulo on May 13 to discuss arrangements for Mr. Woods's brief visit to the city the following day. When the Sao Paulo speech had to be retyped in English and Portuguese after Mr. Woods's arrival, Dr. Lehman provided typists and translators who moved into the hotel to work. Dr. Lehman also ordered personnel in his office to stay after hours to print and distribute the speech to the local press, radio and TV and to correspondents of the Rio papers. (It was Dr. Lehman who pointed out that no mention of the recent Xavantes loan had been made in Mr. Woods's speech and a new insertion was added to the draft.)

ARGENTINA

Mr. Woods visited only Buenos Aires. He made no formal speeches. He decided however to issue a sort of farewell statement for the press which he asked Mr. Murray Ross and I to draft.

Arriving in the evening of May 15, I was met at the hotel by the Argentine Central Bank's Chief of Ceremonial (Public Relations to us), Sr. Rodolfo Giudice who informed me that, firstly he had nothing in readiness for the press as the program for Mr. Woods's visit would become definite after discussions with him; and secondly, that he had invited newsmen to a press conference in the hotel later that same evening at which I might give them information on Mr. Woods and the Bank.

In view of the lack of a firmed-up program, a new press release was drafted to substitute for the one taken from Washington.

In the next few days, Mr. Giudice and his assistants were most helpful to all members of Mr. Woods's party. Mr. Giudice's office typed, printed and distributed to all news media Mr. Woods's statement on his visit to Argentina.

The Press

Mr. Woods did not hold press conferences during his visit, mainly because of the political situations in both Brazil and Argentina. In Brazil there is a very strong although minority opposition to Minister Campos's economic plan and the President and Mr. Campos have been under attack in the press and radio and TV for quite a time, particularly by Governor Carlos Lacerda of the State of Guanabara, who is campaigning for President. In Argentina, the Government had suffered recently a political defeat at the hands of the Peronistas and the Government Development Plan is under attack practically from all sides, especially from the private sector.

But generally, the press of both countries was very friendly towards Mr. Woods and the Bank. Old friends in Rio and Sao Paulo as well as in Buenos Aires were of great help. In Buenos Aires I met again with journalists who had been guests of the Bank in Washington; in Brazil I renewed old acquaintances -- this was my first trip to the country as Bank staff -- and met with newspapermen who had visited the Bank as members of groups invited to the U.S. by the IDB and the American Press Institute.

Brazil - Rio de Janeiro: I visited the main morning and afternoon dailies, of which four at least have a well-established financial section: Jornal do Commercio, Jornal do Brazil, Correio da Manhã and O Globo.

The editor of Jornal do Brazil, Mr. Moacyr Padilha, visited the Bank last February as member of a group brought to Washington by the IDB. He has become since a personal friend and follows closely Bank activities in his country. He personally wrote some comments on Mr. Woods's visit and the trip was covered in detail by his paper.

At the Jornal do Brazil I met with editor and publisher Francisco de Nascimento Brito, executive editor Alberto Dines who visited the Bank in 1963 as member of an API group, and its new chief financial editor Nahum Sirotsky, one of the best known Brazilian journalists. This paper has the best financial section among the Rio papers. It has now national circulation and it is one of the most respected in the country. Jornal do Brazil supports the Government's economic policies.

In other papers I met reporters and staff writers who had been assigned to cover Mr. Woods's visit. All of them showed interest in the Bank group activities in Brazil and several devoted editorial or comments to Mr. Woods's visit in connection with the Furnas and Estreito functions.

At this time I did not have an opportunity to get in touch with radio or TV which are very active in the news side of broadcasting. Their news programs are devoted mainly to domestic events. Radio and TV gave full coverage to the Estreito and Furnas ceremonies due to the presence of President Castelo Branco.

Sao Paulo: I was in Sao Paulo only one full day. In the evening of my arrival, May 13, I visited the three main local papers: O Estado, A Gazeta and Folha de Sao Paulo. Did not have time to visit radio or TV.

O Estado is a Bank friend of long standing. I met assistant editor Julio Mesquita Neto, a personal friend of several years, and managing editor F. Carvalho Mesquita who visited the Bank last October with the API group then in Washington. I had dinner with O Estado's chief financial editor Frederico Heller, who often writes about the Bank and has attended some annual meetings in Washington. He is highly considered in Brazil and recently was appointed member of a Committee to prepare a report on the National Development Plan. Mr. Heller had Mr. Woods's speeches at Estreito and Sao Paulo published in full -- I think O Estado was the only paper in Brazil to do so in both instances -- and wrote an editorial on Brazil and the Bank. One of his assistants, Oscar Tamer, visited the Bank two years ago with an API group.

Chief city editor of A Gazeta, Helcio Carvalho de Castro, whom I had not seen for about 15 years, showed a great interest in Bank activities and gave Mr. Woods's visit quite a play.

Dr. Paulo Frias, editor and publisher of Folha de Sao Paulo, also became interested in Bank operations and as Mr. de Castro had done at A Gazeta, he requested that his name be added to our mailing list.

Porto Alegre: On the trip back from Buenos Aires, I stopped for one evening and part of the next morning in Porto Alegre. Visited Correio do Povo and met with assistant editor F. Kessler Caldas, who had visited the Bank last October with an API group. His paper published an editorial on the Bank and covered extensively Mr. Woods's visit to Rio and Sao Paulo.

Paid brief morning visits to Diario de Noticias and Jornal do Dia where I talked with reporters on duty at that time of the day.

ARGENTINA

The press conference arranged by the Central Bank the evening of my arrival was attended by newsmen from all the main dailies, including La Nacion, La Prensa, Clarin, El Mundo, La Razon, and Cronica, as well as from El Economista, Analisis, Veritas and El Cronista Comercial, which are financial and business publications, and Primera Plana, a news magazine.

During my stay I visited most of these publications, all of which covered Mr. Woods's visit very thoroughly.

In La Prensa I was with editor and publisher Dr. Alberto Gainza Paz, and chief financial writer Alfredo Duran. The latter was a guest of the Bank in 1963.

In La Nacion I had a long talk with executive editor Dr. Juan S. Valmaggia and his assistant Dr. Octavio Hornos Paz, who visited the Bank last October with an API group. I also met with Juan Bosio Lavalle, a Bank guest in Washington in 1963, La Nacion's chief financial editor.

In Clarin there is a new chief of their financial section, Reynaldo Bandini, who visited the Bank as member of a group brought to Washington by the IDB last February. He has become a very good friend of the Bank.

Arranged a dinner with Duran, Bosio and Bandini, this being the first time the three financial editors of the main Buenos Aires dailies had gotten together socially.

The specialized publications are quite influential in Argentina. El Economista is recognized as the most objective and apolitical of all of them. Had a long visit with Jorge E. Pengis, a young economist who is co-editor of this weekly. He wrote an editorial on Mr. Woods's visit.

Analisis, established four years ago, is published by economists and journalists and is becoming one of the best financial publications in the country. Because of a death in the family I did not meet Dr. Fernando Morduchowitz, the editor and a well-known journalist. Had a long talk with Dr. Julio C. Cueto Rua, economist, lawyer and former Minister of Commerce and Industry, and co-editor of Analisis. This publication has political undertones; is backed financially by members of the Conservative party and large business firms which oppose the Government's development program.

Veritas' editor, Francisco Rizzuto, again asked about his request for a sort of statement from Mr. Woods. Told him that we would try to have something for him before the annual meeting. Veritas has the smallest circulation of the three specialized publications mentioned but it is widely read in the business circles in the so-called Buenos Aires "city".

Talks

On May 21 gave a talk on Bank group operations to the Argentine Central Bank Training Course for senior officers. Some 20 people attended.

On my way back, during a four-hour stopover in Sao Paulo, I talked to about 15 students of the Catholic University School of Business Administration.

Statement for the Press

By Mr. George D. Woods, President, World Bank

My visit to Argentina has been a very pleasant experience and I have not been disappointed in my expectations. Argentina is a vigorous and strong country and we, in the World Bank, are looking forward to new opportunities to cooperate in this nation's development program. It has been a particular pleasure to have met with President Illia and members of his Government and to have had an opportunity to discuss with them problems of mutual interest.

I have been encouraged by the continued growth in the gross national product which has taken place in the first quarter of this year. This continued growth has benefited agriculture, industry, labor and the Government which are partners in the development efforts of the country. The steps taken by the Government to improve the fiscal system by means of more efficient administration and the imposition of new taxes have led in the first four months of this year to an increase in revenues by more than 50%. I find equally impressive the measures taken to raise rates of public services to more realistic levels in order to strengthen their financial position and provide the basis for the financing needed to improve and enlarge their facilities.

These measures are encouraging and I was pleased to find general agreement among senior officials on the types of policies to be followed if the objectives of the National Development Plan for sustained economic growth are to be achieved under conditions of relative price stability. More effective efforts must be made to reduce the deficits of state enterprises if the large amounts needed to finance the public investment program are to be raised

on a satisfactory basis. Continued reduction in the rate of inflation will require strict adherence to the Government's credit ceilings for the public and private sectors, and that increases in wages be related to increases in productivity. Furthermore, it will necessitate the channeling of scarce financial resources into well prepared high priority projects. The export sector must be stimulated by investments in agriculture. Industry must become more efficient. The infrastructure must be greatly improved to reduce costs and make Argentine products competitive in the world markets. These are called for in the National Development Plan.

Implementation of these policies will not be easy. Self-discipline on the part of all segments of society will be required. But, in my judgment, they are essential for the achievement of a healthy growing economy from which everybody stands to benefit. If these policies are resolutely followed they should bring about high and sustained rates of economic growth and assure Argentina the continued and increasing support of the World Bank and of investors throughout the world.

DECLARACION PARA LA PRENSA

DEL SENOR GEORGE D. WOODS, PRESIDENTE DEL BANCO MUNDIAL

Mi visita a la Argentina ha sido muy agradable y no me he sentido defraudado en cuanto a lo que esperaba de ella. Argentina es un país vigoroso y fuerte y nosotros, en el Banco Mundial, abrigamos la esperanza de poder cooperar con el programa de desarrollo de esta nación. Ha sido particularmente grato para mí haber tenido la oportunidad de conversar con el Presidente Illia y con miembros de su Gobierno, para tratar problemas de mutuo interés.

Me he impuesto, con satisfacción, del sostenido aumento del producto bruto nacional que se ha registrado en el primer trimestre de este año. Este aumento ha beneficiado a la agricultura, la industria, los trabajadores y al Gobierno, que están asociados en la tarea de llevar al país al más grande desarrollo posible. Las normas adoptadas por el Gobierno para hacer más eficiente el sistema fiscal y la aplicación de nuevos impuestos han dado como resultado -en los primeros cuatro meses de 1965-, un incremento de los ingresos de más del 50%. Me han impresionado, igualmente, las medidas para colocar las tarifas de las empresas públicas en niveles más realistas a fin de robustecer su posición financiera y proporcionarles la base del financiamiento requerido para mejorar y ampliar sus servicios.

Estas medidas son alentadoras y fue satisfactorio comprobar que existe acuerdo entre los altos funcionarios respecto de la política que debe seguirse para alcanzar los objetivos del Plan Nacional de Desarrollo, de constante crecimiento económico en condiciones de relativa estabilidad de precios. Serán necesarios esfuerzos más efectivos para reducir los deficits de las empresas

estatales con miras a que puedan obtener, en condiciones satisfactorias, las elevadas sumas requeridas por el programa de inversiones públicas. La reducción del ritmo de inflación exigirá el firme cumplimiento de las limitaciones crediticias impuestas por el Gobierno a los sectores público y privado, así como también exigirá que los aumentos de salarios mantengan relación con los aumentos de la productividad. Además, requerirá la canalización de recursos fiscales -siempre escasos- hacia proyectos bien preparados y de alta prioridad. El sector exportador debe ser estimulado por medio de inversiones en la agricultura. La industria debe hacerse más eficiente. La infraestructura debe mejorarse considerablemente, para reducir costos y hacer que los productos argentinos sean más competitivos en los mercados mundiales. Estos son puntos que contempla el Plan Nacional de Desarrollo.

La realización de esta política no será fácil. Demandará firme disciplina de parte de todos los sectores de la sociedad. Pero, a mi juicio, es esencial para llegar a un crecimiento económico fuerte y de beneficio para todos. Si se sigue esta política de manera resuelta, debe conducir a un elevado y sostenido ritmo de crecimiento económico que asegurará a la Argentina el apoyo constante y creciente del Banco Mundial y de inversionistas de todo el mundo.



Speech by Mr. George D. Woods
at dinner given in his honor
by the Governor of the State of Sao Paulo,
Adhemar de Barros
May 15, 1965

Mr. Governor, Minister Campos, Distinguished Guests, Ladies and Gentlemen:

I very greatly appreciate the honor you do me, Mr. Governor, in being my host here tonight in the city of Sao Paulo and in affording me the opportunity to meet and talk with this distinguished gathering.

Back in the late 1920s, as a youngster, I came to Brazil on a scouting trip for an investment company in New York. No business came out of that venture, but for me, the experience was unforgettable. I got a lasting impression of your country -- its size, its almost unlimited potential for development, the vigor and variety of its people. I learned that there is something very special about Brazilians -- each highly individualistic, with a particular quality of independence that distinguishes him from his fellows and this nation from all others in the hemisphere.

I expected that coming back now, in the mid-1960s, would be a fascinating experience. I haven't been disappointed. The towns I remember have now grown into splendid, modern cities. The signs of advanced industrialization are widely visible. Even the casual visitor can observe in some parts of your cities a standard of living which is hardly second to any in the world. I am most especially impressed with the vigor and the progress evident in this great industrial and cultural center Sao Paulo, capital city of the richest state in Brazil. The State of Sao Paulo has been described as the locomotive that pulls the rest of the nation along. The program of sustained economic growth for the whole Brazilian nation that is now under way will inevitably produce rivals for that pre-eminent position, but it can never diminish the sense of thrill that one feels as one enters this State's dynamic capital that has for so long been an unsurpassed example of what not only Brazil but all Latin America and indeed the whole developing world now strives to achieve.

We all know, nevertheless, that much remains to be done to improve the lot of Brazil's people, and that the progress already made has been accompanied by growing pains of the most intense kind. Throughout, preoccupation with social and partisan political issues has often frustrated attempts to make a decisive attack on Brazil's economic problems. To all friends of Brazil, of whom I count myself one, it is a matter of great encouragement that the administration of President Castelo Branco has formulated realistic economic policies which can provide a strong foundation for Brazil's further economic growth. The measures necessary to carry out such policies are certain to cause -- and in fact already are causing -- discomfort which is by no means trivial. They are not likely to be popular in the short run. But

if they are carried through, I think they can lead the Brazilian economy to a high rate of economic growth on a stable and sustained basis. I applaud the foresight and the courage of the President and his dedicated associates in driving these measures forward, especially Minister of Finance Bulhoes, who represents Brazil on the Board of Governors of the World Bank, and Minister of Planning Roberto Campos, a good friend of mine who is here tonight.

Brazil, I keep reminding myself, occupies half of the entire Continent of South America. If its policies continue in the right direction, it must again become, as it once was, one of the leading clients of the World Bank group of institutions which I represent here today. Perhaps I should remind you briefly of what these three institutions are.

The parent organization is the World Bank itself. It makes long-term loans, chiefly for projects in such basic fields as transportation and electric power development. Lately, it has begun to intensify its efforts in the fields of agriculture, industry and education.

A Bank affiliate, the International Development Association, lends for the same purposes as the Bank. It caters, however, to the member countries which are on the lowest rungs of the development ladder; and it offers them loans free of interest and half a century long. The Association's funds are presently almost entirely reserved for the poorest countries; and it is not likely that Brazil, because of the fundamental strength of its economy, will become a borrower from the Association.

The remaining Bank affiliate, the International Finance Corporation, or IFC, works entirely in the private sector. The very first investment made anywhere in the world was made in 1957, I believe, for the expansion of an electrical equipment manufacturer here in Brazil. It recruits capital and managerial skill from abroad for productive enterprises in the underdeveloped countries, particularly in the field of industry. It helps to raise capital by underwriting stock or debenture issues of new or expanding enterprises. And it puts its own funds into these undertakings, either in share subscriptions or in mixed loan-and-share investments.

IFC is the responsible member of the World Bank group in the industrial field. It evaluates all proposals made to any member of the group for industrial financing. Likewise, it evaluates all proposals made to us for financial or technical assistance in establishing or expanding privately owned development finance companies or banks operating in the industrial field. We expect that the work of IFC soon will expand significantly, as the result of Charter amendments which will permit the Corporation to greatly enlarge its resources by borrowing from the World Bank.

Brazil and the World Bank group have been engaged in various collaborative efforts after the Bank was organized in 1946, although no loan agreements between us were executed after 1958 until February of this year. Brazil is a founding member of all three institutions of the group. It is, along with Argentina, the Bank's largest shareholder among the Latin American countries, and occupies a corresponding position in the two affiliates. Brazil's contributions to the group's financial resources, on the other hand, have been quite modest, amounting to less than \$7 million of convertible funds.

This has proved to be quite a productive investment, since over the course of time, the World Bank and the IFC commitments in Brazil have amounted to nearly \$360 million. By far the greater part of this lending has been directed to developing the electric power potential here in the south central region. Of all our lending for power development in Brazil, nearly \$300 million, has been here in this region, and small wonder. After all, the rivers of this area must satisfy the demands of one of the fastest growing industrial and agricultural areas of the world. This area represents 70% of Brazil's total requirements for power.

Brazil's need for electric power and still more electric power presents the country with a challenge of truly striking dimensions. The market is expanding at a rate of 10% or 11% a year, and Brazil will continue to need increasing amounts of electricity for years to come. The Bank therefore has been glad to organize a study, financed by the United Nations Special Fund, to determine the power needs of the entire south central region. This study is expected to provide the basis for a 15-year construction program for power generation and transmission. I would be happy if in the course of time the Bank became one of the principal sources of finance required for this program and in fact we have already started on this path. One of our recent loans is helping to finance Estreito the construction of which began just two days ago. The other was made to USELPA -- whose President Dr. Otto Lehmann is here with us tonight -- and will help finance the Xavantes hydro-electric project.

Our hope and intention in the Bank is to continue and intensify our collaboration in the economic development of Brazil. Our power study and these loans are among the steps we are taking on the path to the future.

Others of interest are the following:

We have completed a survey of the Brazilian economy as a whole to widen our knowledge and deepen our understanding and that of our Directors of the problems of your country.

Several specialized missions have been coming and still others will come to Brazil in the next few months to assist in the formulation of projects suitable for World Bank financing. Concurrently we are moving ahead towards further lending in the power sector. We are actively considering at this moment the second phase of the important Estreito project to which I have just referred. A second loan would help to build the Estreito transmission network to link the plant with the main consuming centers.

Also in the power sector we are studying two other equally important projects: the Jaguará hydroelectric plant to add up to half a million kilowatts to CEMIG's generating capacity, and the expansion of the distribution system, operated by Eletrobras.

In the field of transportation, we are working with the Government to organize a broad study which would look into ways and means of improving the transport sector. This study will cover highways, ports, coastal shipping and railroads. It will focus on needs for new investment and methods of substantially improving management. We have also begun a review of a number of road construction and improvement projects, with a view to assisting in their financing.

[The Bank also hopes to be able to assist the country's agricultural development. Our work in this field would help to provide new facilities for storing, processing and marketing agricultural products and to improve the efficiency of livestock production through technical assistance and through a well-managed credit non-political program.]

We attach special importance to the future of your steel industry. We expect to organize and sponsor a comprehensive study of the expansion in the steel sector needed over the next seven years. It is my hope that this study will guide Brazil towards a pattern of capacity growth, with experienced and apolitical management, and facilitate the participation of foreign lenders and investors -- including the Bank and IFC -- in the development of this industry.

We have not as yet had any serious discussions with the Brazilian Government about the field of telecommunications. I am sure that everyone here tonight would agree that a smoothly functioning telecommunication system is a must for an expanding economy. This sector certainly needs new investment, modern management and realistic rate structures. We are prepared to provide advice and assistance in this task.

We have been impressed by the accumulating evidence of confidence in the direction of the Brazilian economy. Our own feeling has been confirmed by the interest being shown in establishing new industries as well as expanding those already in existence. The International Finance Corporation is at present examining several industrial projects, with a view to selecting those most suitable for financing by the World Bank or IFC.

Sustained industrial growth requires dynamic financial institutions and a strong capital market, increasingly able to provide a broad range of banking facilities, investment capital and other services. I have been pleased therefore to learn of the measures being taken by your Government to strengthen, and to add to, the institutions, essential to a healthy capital market.

I note with particular pleasure that the Government has drafted a bill authorizing the creation of private investment banks, and that the banking and industrial communities are showing some interest. I attribute special importance to investment banks when they are dynamic and flexible institutions, lending at medium and long term, investing in equities, underwriting, pioneering new types of securities designed to attract domestic savings, bringing in foreign capital, providing technical and managerial services, and promoting new enterprises capable, in short, of all aspects of the "financial engineering" necessary to conceive, promote and finance an industrial project.

It takes time to develop such institutions, but their contribution to industrial growth can be enormous. The World Bank group would like, at the right time and in an appropriate way, to participate in that contribution -- by helping investment banks get started and by working with them later on in joint financing of industrial projects.

The basis for all this World Bank activity is the encouragement afforded by the economic policies adopted by the Government of President Castelo Branco. In my judgment they provide a strong foundation for the future growth of your country. If implemented, they provide a basis on which not only the World Bank but many other investors, both Brazilian and foreign, can contribute a flow of funds into projects which will raise production and standards of living.

The World Bank would take the greatest pride in helping to undertake this task; and we in the Bank, like you, await the future with the keenest expectation.





BRAZIL

Schedule for Visit

1. After discussions with John Cotrim in Washington and Rio, the proposed schedule was discussed with Roberto Campos, Minister of Planning, in Washington on the week-end of April 10. The schedule incorporating changes made by Campos was sent to Minister Thibau by Mr. Woods by letter of April 21 (copy of both attached to the original of this memorandum). Copies of this schedule were sent by me to Cotrim by my letter of April 23 and were given to Neves of the Brazilian Embassy.

Travel Arrangements

2. Flight to Rio. Hauenstein has made 3 first-class reservations for Mr. and Mrs. Woods and Mr. Wishart on Pan Am flight 201, leaving New York Sunday, May 9, at 9:00 ^{PM} and arriving Rio Monday, May 10, 9:40 am.

3. Reservations in Rio. Arrangements were made for Mr. and Mrs. Woods to use Grant Glassco's special suite at the Copacabana Palace Hotel as the guest of the Brazilian Government. However, since the Shah of Iran will be using that suite during his visit just before Mr. Woods' arrival and may not have left before May 9, the Presidential Suite of the Copacabana Palace Apartamentos is also being held for Mr. and Mrs. Woods as a guest of the Government. Cotrim of Furnas has also reserved 6 front apartments at the Copacabana Palace Apartamentos for the week beginning Sunday, May 9.

4. Trip to Furnas. Cotrim has informed me that the Government has made arrangements for a large plane to fly Mr. and Mrs. Woods' party, several ministers and their wives, to Furnas Tuesday afternoon, May 11. The party will spend the night in the Guest House at Furnas and return to Rio in the same plane on Wednesday afternoon, May 12. The Government has said it probably would invite Lincoln Gordon (American Ambassador) and his wife to be with the group flying to Furnas Tuesday afternoon since the U.S. Government helped finance some of the local currency costs of Furnas.

Mr. Bravo of the Office of Information will be there to assist on relations with the press, etc.
9. Bank Personnel in Rio. Attached is a list of people from the World Bank family who will be in Brazil during at least some of the time Mr. Woods is in Brazil and their times of arrival. ARGENTINASchedule for Visit.

1. Both enthusiastically expressed their strong hope that Mr. Woods would be able to come. A tentative program was discussed with Mr. San Miguel and Minister Pugliese. I have just received your letter of April 12. Hotel arrangements have been made for you to stay with the group at the Copacabana Palace Apartments beginning Sunday, May 9. 

Dear John:

Many thanks for your letter of March 29, which must have gotten hung up somewhere (possibly because of the Pan American strike) because it did not reach the Bank until April 9. In fact, Alter was able to tell me that the letter was on its way several days before it arrived.

While Roberto was in Washington we had a chance to discuss the schedule for Mr. Woods' visit to Brazil, and I am enclosing two copies as it emerged from these discussions. Roberto took one copy with him and I gave one to Neves of the Brazilian Embassy last Monday (which was the day Roberto met with Mr. Woods).

The idea of a boat ride and dinner Monday, May 10, was suggested by Roberto and sounded like a good idea to everyone. Mr. Woods will be pleased to attend the ceremony at Estreito and make a short statement if asked. The departure for Sao Paulo has been changed to Friday morning in order to leave more time in Rio. Mrs. Woods is planning to have a tea Thursday afternoon for a group of Brazilian students. The idea of flying to Santos and then driving liesurely to Sao Paulo, passing by Cubatao power plant and COSIPA steel mill, was also suggested by Roberto and readily accepted.

I was sorry to hear about the Shah of Iran and hope that the apartment in the Copacabana Palace Hotel will be available. When Glassco wrote a second letter saying that after writing his first (copy of which I sent you) he had learned that the Government was arranging for Mr. and Mrs. Woods to use his apartment, I assumed it was all fixed; so I told Mr. Woods' secretary they would be staying at the Copacabana Hotel and I believe Mrs. Woods has invited students to a tea there on Thursday afternoon.

I am leaving Washington Friday, April 23, for Asuncion to attend the meeting of the Board of Governors of the Inter-American Bank. I will be arriving in Brazil on the night of Thursday, May 6, on Panagra 518 arriving at 10:00 pm from Buenos Aires. This will give me three days in Rio before Mr. Woods arrives in order to discuss any points which remain outstanding. Wiese is planning to arrive in Rio on Saturday, May 8, coming from Washington on Varig 811, arriving 5:00 pm. Enrique Lopez-Herrarte will be coming directly from Paris and will also arrive prior to May 10. He has not yet made his definite arrangements, but as soon as we hear from him we will tell you on what day and flight he will arrive.

Will you please arrange space for me at the Apartamentos beginning Thursday night and for Wiese beginning Saturday night.

Since there will be a number of other Bank and IFC people in Brazil -- some not connected with Mr. Woods' visit -- I am preparing a list of all people from the World Bank family planning to be in Brazil at that time and will send it to you later just for your information. As I recall, you have reservations at the Zaragua in Sao Paulo for Mr. and Mrs. Woods (a large suite) and for six others. This looks as if it would be about right but I will be planning to write you again before I leave.

After I leave I suggest you address Chaufournier about any aspects of the arrangements which cannot wait until I arrive. Should you want to reach me while I am in Asuncion, I will be staying at the Guarani Hotel. I will be at the Plaza Hotel in Buenos Aires on the night of Wednesday, May 5.

Dear Enrique:

Upon his return from Europe, Mr. Woods informed me that you would be accompanying us on the trip to Brazil etc. and suggested I keep you informed as to the plans as they materialize. While they are not yet worked out in final detail, I feel the outlines are now sufficiently clear that it would be useful for me to tell you about them.

Mr. and Mrs. Woods will be arriving in Rio on the morning of Monday, May 10, coming from New York on Pan American Flight No. 201, scheduled to arrive in Rio about 9:40 a.m. Attached is a tentative schedule for the week in Brazil. The schedule is now being discussed with top members of the Brazilian Government by Alter and Wiese, who are now in Brazil. Next week Roberto Campos will be in Washington to attend the meeting of CIAP and I hope then to have an opportunity to firm up the arrangements. I will let you know of any significant changes.

I am planning to attend the meeting of the Board of Governors of the Inter-American Development Bank, which will take place in Asuncion during the week beginning April 26. I will leave Washington on the afternoon of Friday, April 24. I plan to go from Asuncion to Rio either Wednesday, May 5 or Thursday, May 6. We have, already, reservations for six people at the Copacabana Palace Apartments from Sunday, May 9 and in Sao Paulo from Thursday, May 13. I suggest you make your own arrangements to fly from Europe to Rio. It would probably be best for you, also, to arrive a day or so ahead of Mr. Woods so that we can work together on cleaning up any last-minute details and be there to meet him. If you will inform me when you plan to arrive in Rio, I shall tell our contact in Brazil and have him look after your hotel reservation if needed before Sunday.

Jorge Mejia Palacios informs me that he plans to attend the inauguration of Furnas and will be in Brazil part of the time in his capacity of Executive Director representing Brazil. He plans to go first to Colombia and then on to Brazil.

After the Brazilian visit Mr. Woods plans to go to Argentina, flying directly from Sao Paulo to Buenos Aires on Sunday, May 16. A tentative program is now being discussed in Buenos Aires by David Knox. The general plan, however, is for Mr. Woods to have meetings with the Minister of Economy, the President and top Government officials -- as well as with officials of SEGBA -- on Monday afternoon, Tuesday, and Wednesday morning. He may go to some appropriate place in Argentina Wednesday afternoon to rest until he leaves

Argentina. He plans to fly back to Washington leaving Buenos Aires Friday night. We are making hotel reservations for about six people in Buenos Aires at the Plaza Hotel and will have reservations for you on the flight from Brazil to Argentina. We will expect you to make your own reservations from Europe to Rio and from Buenos Aires back.

If any of the foregoing is not clear or if you have questions, do not hesitate to let me know.

Dear Orvis:

1. Thank you for your letter of March 25. In fact, we had already made arrangements with Mr. Glassco to use Brazilian Traction's apartment in the Copacabana Palace Hotel during Mr. and Mrs. Woods stay here. However, shortly afterwards, we discovered that the same apartment had also been contemplated by our Foreign Office for the Shah of Iran who will be in Brazil during the first week of May and probably will stay around until the 10th or 11th, which upset all our previous plans. Nevertheless, we have succeeded in making arrangements for Mr. and Mrs. Woods stay as a guest of the Government in the presidential suite of the Copacabana Palace Apartamentos which is a very nice place on the top floor, overlooking the ocean and the pool. We have also booked reservations in the same Apartamentos for yourself and the rest of the Bank's Mission during the week starting May 9th.
2. Following our conversation in Washington, I discussed with Ministers Thibau and Campos the attached tentative schedule for Mr. Woods visit to Brazil and in principle it has been agreed upon by everybody. The details of the São Paulo visit are still to be worked out but Minister Campos will take care of that in due time. Perhaps you might discuss it with him during his visit to Washington this week for the CIAP meeting.
3. There is only one new point that was brought up since I saw you last and about which I would appreciate your comments. The ceremonies for the inauguration of Furnas will comprise also a previous short ceremony at the Estreito dam site, 150 kilometers downstream of Furnas, where the President will inaugurate a plate commemorating the official starting of the Estreito Project. Minister Thibau is of the opinion that it would be very nice if Mr. Woods cared to make, on this occasion, a short speech (or, may be, just deliver a statement to the press) expressing his appreciation in the participation of the Bank on this new Project and, perhaps, a comment on what the Bank would



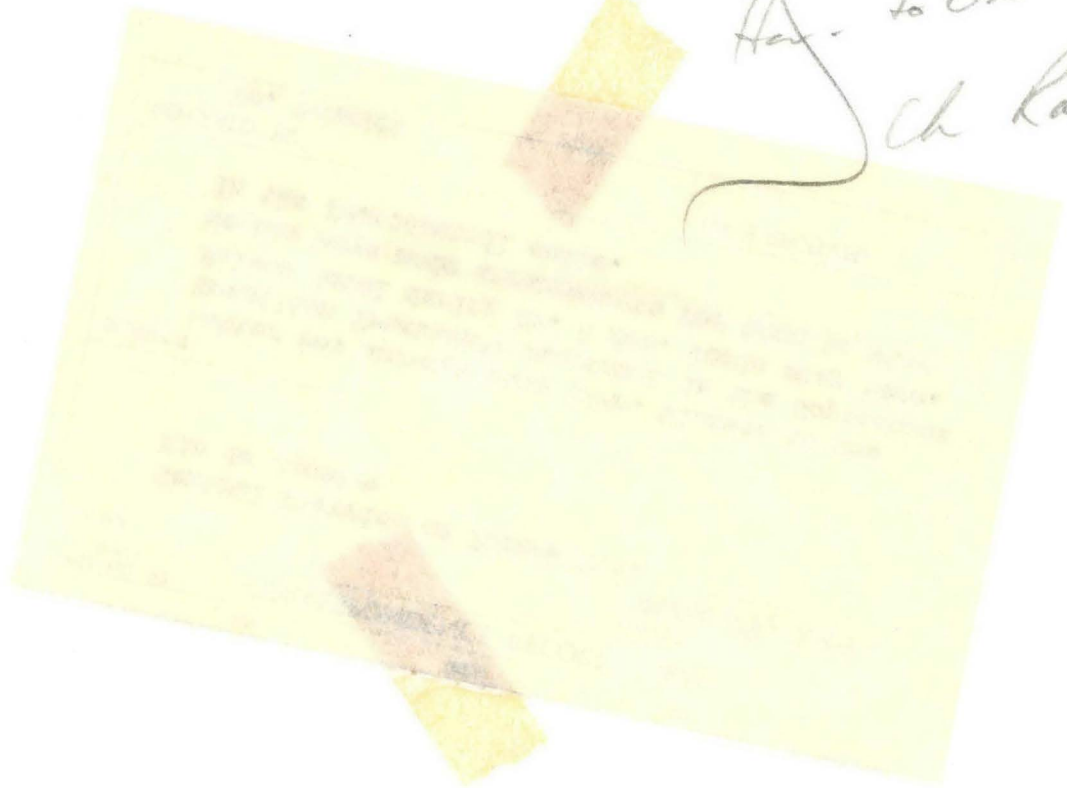

Dear John:

Just this week Mr. Woods received a letter from Grant Glassco of Brazilian Traction inviting Mr. and Mrs. Woods to make use of their apartment in the Copacabana Palace Hotel in Rio during Mr. and Mrs. Woods' stay there (copy of key paragraph attached). Mr. Glassco says that he learned of Mr. Woods' prospective visit through a conversation you had with Mr. Gallotti.

During our last conversation here in Washington we both agreed that the apartment which Henry Borden used to have (and which I remember as a sort of penthouse) was the best place for Mr. and Mrs. Woods to stay and that you would arrange to see that it was available for them. When Mr. Glassco's letter arrived, I was not sure whether this was your way of arranging it or whether you intended to handle it in some other manner. I am not entirely sure that the apartment to which Mr. Glassco refers is, in fact, the one we talked about but have assumed that it is. Accordingly, Mr. Woods has replied to Mr. Glassco in the form of the attached draft.

If the apartment to which Mr. Glassco is referring is the one we talked about, I assume it would be appropriate for Mr. Woods to write Mr. Glassco accepting the invitation to stay there and thanking him for collaborating with the Brazilian Government in this manner by making it available. Mr. Woods met at 10 a.m. on March 15 with Mr. Henckel and Mr. Koinzer of the Ministry of Economics; Messrs. Miller and Wishart were also present. Mr. Henckel referred to his recent visit to India: he had formed the impression that reports of the unrest following on the famine situation had been exaggerated - the agricultural problems could be overcome. He felt basically optimistic about the Indian situation and believed that the U.S. Authorities felt the same way: the British experts were more reserved. He was somewhat worried, however, by what he had heard about the contents of the next Five Year Plan; he understood Prime Minister Shastri was very proud of the volume of the new plan, but it seemed a very ambitious one. Private enterprise circles in India were certainly critical of it. He hoped that the World Bank, and Mr. Woods personally, would have an opportunity of conveying their objective opinions on the Plan to the GOI before the details of the Plan were finally settled.

2. In this connection, he wondered if the procedure followed on the occasion of the previous Plan could not again be followed and a high level group of three or four "wise men" should not be asked to visit India to review the Plan proposals. Mr. Henckel also informed Mr. Woods that a German mission of six to eight persons will leave for India in the near future to review the situation and prepare its own report.

3. Mr. Woods explained the steps the Bank is taking to apprise itself fully of the situation in India and the background against which the Plan is being prepared: he repeated the arrangements for the Bell Mission and that its report will be made, in the first instance, to the President of the Bank who will then consult with the GOI. He hoped that, after that, he would be in a position to supply the Consortium members with a reliable and objective appraisal of the situation. As to timing, an IMF group is visiting India in April and both the Bank and the Fund ought to be in a position to have an informed judgment on the new Plan by May or June. After the Bank has assessed its own information and after he, Mr. Woods, had consulted with GOI, then if the Consortium members so agreed, the Bank would be prepared to act as spokesman for the Consortium and put forward the combined views to the GOI. He saw a danger in too many spokesmen and did not consider that a rather hasty review, say, by a group of "wise men" would serve as useful a purpose as the procedure the Bank is now following. Without prejudging the issues, Mr. Woods thought that as a practical matter all

members of the Consortium would wish to continue assisting India, but this time it should be very clear that the progress made in each of the Years covered by the new Plan must be reviewed and examined by the donors of aid; if possible, these yearly reviews should be made by the same experts to ensure continuity of consideration.

4. Mr. Henckel said he agreed with the above approach - he withdrew his suggestion of a visit by a group of "wise men". He wanted to point out, however, that the mission composed of German experts, which is now going to India, is necessary for internal political reasons in Germany: the German Cabinet requires more satisfaction regarding the results of aid to India, especially as India is also Germany's largest debtor. The German mission did not intend to duplicate the work of the Bell Mission, but the German Government needed its own channel of reporting as to what are the facts of the Indian situation. Mr. Woods said this was entirely understood: he had asked Mr. Bell to give the German experts every possible assistance, although Mr. Bell must keep his conclusions for Mr. Woods's personal consideration in the first instance. Mr. Woods summed up by saying that he was certainly not pessimistic regarding the future of India in the long run, although he did believe that the creditor countries would have to watch the position very carefully over the next few years. The Bell Mission was going to serve a very useful purpose, as would subsequent checks up, if performed by the same people who had acquired deep knowledge of the problems of the economy.

5. Mr. Henckel then mentioned Tarbela and the report of the first stage of the investigations carried out by Dr. Lieftinck and his team. Mr. Henckel understood that WAPDA intended to invite tenders soon for the Tarbela Dam; in his opinion, it would be a mistake to go to tender at such an early date and much better to wait until the second stage of the report had been completed, and also until financing is assured for the Tarbela Project. Mr. Woods said that, on timing, WAPDA is anxious to go ahead, but he himself considered it would be a mistake to do so and he proposed to tell President Ayub this. This was a policy question which President Ayub must decide. Mr. Woods added that he considered that any financing for the Tarbela Project should be considered in the context of the overall aid given to Pakistan and as part of the total commitments reached by the Consortium. He agreed that the Consortium should not be asked to consider this matter this year, but should wait until we have the overall picture.

6. Mr. Henckel then referred to the proposed increase in capital subscription to the World Bank by Germany. He wanted Mr. Woods to know that the Ministry of Economics favored parallel increases. The Ministry of Finance, however, had budgetary difficulties. Mr. Woods responded that he shared the Ministry's view regarding parallel increases. As to payment of an increased German subscription, legally the World Bank must have one percent (amounting to approximately \$2.3 million) paid when the increased subscription is granted. The balance of nine percent could be arranged to suit the German budgetary position.

7. Mr. Woods then went on to a meeting with Minister Scheel of the Ministry for Economic Co-operation; the Minister was accompanied by Mr. Koinzer and Mr. Schultz. Mr. Woods explained the main purposes of his visit to Germany at this time. Minister Scheel referred to the proposed increase of Germany's capital subscription to the Bank and assured Mr. Woods that his Ministry was in favor of this increase, although Cabinet consideration of this matter would be necessary. He also referred to the large stake which Germany has now in the World Bank, both in respect of capital subscription and also of Bank bonds floated in Germany, and said that he hoped that Germany would have a corresponding influence in the operations of the Bank. Mr. Woods said that he was very conscious of this point: the World Bank now had 29 Germans in professional positions on its staff and he would like to have more Germans in important roles. He had endeavoured to secure some outstanding Germans, but these could not be released. Minister Scheel referred to policy matters in which Germany is particularly interested and instanced the financing of the Euphrates Dam and the proposed Keban Project. Mr. Woods said that if there is any matter on which Germany has a particular interest and on which Minister Scheel would like to invoke Mr. Woods's personal attention, he hoped Minister Scheel would not hesitate to telephone him direct and give him his views.

8. At 1 p.m. Mr. Woods was entertained to lunch by Minister R. Dahlgruen, Minister of Finance. During the conversation after lunch, Mr. Woods repeated to Minister Dahlgruen his views as to the flexible arrangements which could be come to in regard to payment of any increase in the German capital subscription to the Bank.

9. FRANKFURT

At 7 p.m. on March 15, Mr. Woods signed the contract for the forthcoming German Bond Issue with Mr. Abs of the Deutsche Bank and Mr. Mattiensen of the Dresdener Bank.

10. At 10 a.m. on March 16, Mr. Woods called on Dr. Karl Blessing of the Bundesbank who was accompanied by Mr. Tüngeler, a member of the Bundesbank Board. The conversation was general and the only particular matter considered was the roll-over of the two maturities of August 1, 1965, and February 1, 1966, of the Bank's debt to the Bundesbank. Arrangements were come to regarding these which are set out in a separate note sent by Mr. Woods to Mr. Cavanaugh on March 18.

11. PARIS

Mr. Woods called on Mr. Valery Giscard d'Estaing, Minister of Finance, at 4 p.m. on March 16. Mr. Andre de Lattre was also present. Minister Giscard d'Estaing referred to a recent meeting he had had with the Finance Ministers from the French/African nations. These Ministers were disappointed that their countries had not received a larger share to date of Bank loans and IDA credits. The Minister referred to the memorandum from the African Caucus which had been presented to Mr. Woods and Mr. Pierre-Paul Schweitzer after the Tokyo meeting and to the helpful reply which had been sent back by Mr. Woods and Mr. Schweitzer. Mr. Woods outlined the steps that the Bank is taking to assist developing countries, particularly the African countries, in identifying and

preparing projects. In particular, he referred to the opening of the new West African office under Mr. Matter. Although sympathetic with the impatience of these countries, he thought that it would be a number of years before they were in a position to put forward an increased number of projects ready for financing and thus secure a much larger share of Bank and IDA assistance.

12. The Minister then referred to the French attitude to monetary affairs which he wished to clarify. He emphasized that French proposals had been inspired by technical considerations and hoped that the French proposals would be given careful and serious consideration. Mr. Woods suggested that it might be of interest to the French Authorities to consider lending some of their reserves to the Bank as had been done by the Bundesbank in Germany.

Dear Robert:

I have just received your teletype message regarding Mr. Woods's visit to Germany. The position is as follows:

- (a) Mr. Woods and I are booked to fly to Frankfurt on Saturday, March 13, by TWA Flight 702 which arrives in Frankfurt at 12:45 a.m. on Sunday, March 14. I teletyped the Paris Office and it arranged hotel accommodation for us at the Frankfurterhof--see teletype messages Nos. 117 and 130.
- (b) On Sunday, March 14, Mr. Woods will drive over to Bonn and we shall stay the night at the Königshof Hotel. Again the Paris Office has arranged the accommodation.
- (c) Mr. Donner is arranging for Mr. Woods to meet with Minister Schmuecker at 12:30 p.m., Monday, March 15, and we understand the Minister will be giving Mr. Woods lunch. Before the meeting with the Minister, it is expected that Mr. Woods will meet with Mr. Henkel and, possibly, Mr. Scheer. We have not yet had definite confirmation from Donner but I think this will work out all right as it was Bonn which first suggested 12:30 on Monday.
- (d) We shall leave Bonn as soon as possible after lunch to drive back to Frankfurt. As you know, the ceremony Mr. Abs is arranging is timed for 7 p.m. on Monday, March 15.
- (e) On Tuesday, March 16, Mr. Woods hopes to meet with Dr. Blessing. I am holding return bookings for Mr. Woods and myself from Frankfurt to New York on both Tuesday, March 16, and Wednesday, March 17.

Mr. Woods intends to speak on the telephone with Johnnie Miller as soon as Johnnie gets back to Paris on March 9, and will be telling Johnnie fully about his plans, subjects for discussion, etc., at that time.


