
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### **Keys Milestone**



- First Detection 27 Jan 2020
- From Jan 2020-Fevruary 2021 successful contain 5 localize Communities transmission
- Widespread community transmission on 20 Feb 2021
- started vaccine on 10 Feb 2021







#### Successes: whole of government, whole of society response

- Strong government leadership and commitment
- Delivery of response plan by inter-ministerial 11 subcommittees ensuring multisectoral coordination and action at the highest levels
- National and global solidarity and cooperation with various ministries and development partners to mobilize and coordinate technical, administrative and financial resources rapidly: *Transparency, Truth and United*



On 13 February, the *Westerdam* cruise ship, carrying more than 2,200 passengers, received authorization from the government to dock







#### Local implementation: local leadership and local solutions

- Empowerment of individuals, families and communities to make the right choices to protect themselves and their loved ones
- 25 provinces developed provincial preparedness and action plans for COVID-19 to respond to transmission at the local level
- National emergency operations centre (EOC) organize daily Zoom calls with provinces to provide updates and technical support













#### **Lessons identified (From Preparedness to Response)**

- Strong government leadership and commitment
- Past investments in health security, pandemic preparedness and public health systems ensured effective surveillance and targeted rapid response: FETP, RRTs, Lab capacities, Vaccine, Quarantine and Isolation facilities
- National and global solidarity and cooperation with various ministries and development partners to mobilize and coordinate technical and financial resources rapidly: Transparency, Truth, United, Emergency Financial Mechanism applied
- Multisectoral collaboration necessary for sustainable PHSM implementation and for future readiness









#### **Lessons identified (From Preparedness to Response)**

- Multisource surveillance to support transmission stage assessment and decision making
- Risk based framework for PHSMs was implemented successfully for guiding PHSM
- Early planning of vaccine deployment strategy and coordination utilizing existing EPI system
- Consistent, effective and persistent multichannel/multi-platform risk communication and community engagement on COVID-19 at the highest to village levels to drive population engagement and behavior change.
