## DOES MICROFINANCE WORK FOR REFUGEES?

MFW started out as a pioneer in financial inclusion in Jordan in 1994, becoming the largest not-for-profit microfinance institution dedicated to empowering the entrepreneurial poor, especially women. Since its inception, it has provided one million loans valued at 500 million JOD. 96% of its clients are women. MFW continues to update its product portfolio to cater to vulnerable groups: it offers a life insurance scheme for low income households and a hospital cash plan. In 2017, MFW launched an e-wallet, Mahfazati, which was extended to Syrian refugees last year. It also piloted a mixed lending scheme for Syrian and Jordanian women. Finally, MFW will share experience with adapting its largest grouploan project, Tadamun, to Syrian refugees, and with offering them individual business startup loans.
