





TAC - Symposium on Farming Systems

1. Apparently, TAC has in mind to arrange a symposium on farming systems, possibly in Nairobi. Attendance would comprise the consultants who have been working on the Stripe Review, representatives of the Centers, some further invited consultants and representatives of the developing countries.
2. Zane Arlidge called me this morning following a talk he had with Mahler, asking whether we would feel it appropriate to approach USAID for funding of such a symposium.
3. I told Zane that this involved a number of questions. Was this activity not included in the budget put forward by the TAC Secretariat and agreed by the Co-Sponsors? What would be the total cost of the symposium? Was it not agreed, in principle, that the Co-Sponsors would cover the cost of TAC activities, and that we would not pass the hat for contributions from others? If, however, the TAC budget was inadequate to cover all or part of this activity, what was the gap between the amount budgeted for it and the likely total cost? Was USAID necessarily the right or the only donor to approach?
4. Arlidge did not know the answers to these questions. He did, however, refer to the statements made at the CGIAR meeting at the time when the appointment of a chairman of TAC was under discussion to the effect that if the Co-Sponsors were unable to cover the full cost of TAC, members--or at least some members would be willing to provide some funding. I said that I thought that referred to a situation which no longer existed, since all three Co-Sponsors had since that time made it clear that they were willing to put up the funds necessary to cover the TAC operation.
5. It was left that he would produce a tentative budget for the symposium and we could then consider how to proceed.
6. I am reluctant to go to CG members for funding for TAC operations as I think this is the proper responsibility of the Co-Sponsors. On the other hand, one might look on a symposium of this kind as serving a more general purpose and hence to be dealt with outside TAC's budget. The implication would be that if extra-budgetary funds were not forthcoming, the symposium would not be held, though we could always maintain a fall-back position that it be financed under the TAC budget (possibly on a reduced scale) if necessary.
7. Mahler did not raise this subject when I was in Rome, but we were a bit pressed for time and perhaps he overlooked it.
8. Could I please have your views?





This is to confirm our telephone conversation yesterday.

As a result of the resignation of Dr. Hopper after only one year of his two-year term, a vacancy exists on the Technical Advisory Committee of the Consultative Group on International Agricultural Research. The Co-Sponsors of the Group--the FAO, the UNDP and the World Bank--intend to propose to the Group for its approval that you be appointed to fill the unexpired part of Dr. Hopper's term which runs to December 31, 1978. The Co-Sponsors will also be proposing candidates to fill other vacancies arising on the TAC at the end of 1977. They will put forward all the candidates as a single slate in a few days time. Action by the Group should be complete by mid-December. Assuming the action is favorable, you will be officially offered the appointment soon thereafter.

The first meeting of the TAC in 1978 will be February 14-21 in Rome. A second meeting is scheduled for June 6-13 in Nairobi.

I was very glad to hear from you that you would be willing to accept appointment if it is offered and to serve until December 31, 1978.

Members of the TAC serve in their individual capacity. They receive an honorarium for each day spent on TAC business and their travel expenses (transportation plus subsistence per diem) are met from the TAC budget. As soon as your appointment is approved, the TAC Secretariat will send you information on terms of service and the program of work for the upcoming year.

In response to your request for background information I enclose some general information on the CGIAR and a copy of the 1977 "Integrative Report" --a sort of annual report by the Secretariat.

You will, I am sure, find service on TAC interesting and an opportunity to help in solving very difficult problems facing the developing countries.

Revised TAC Budget, 1978/79

1. Attached is a summary of the revised TAC budget (October 21) compared with that (June 21) reviewed at the last Co-Sponsors' meeting in September.

2. For cosmetic reasons, the revised budget as submitted by Mahler excludes \$100,000 from UNDP for a P4/5 post in the TAC Secretariat. This has been added back to the attached table; the total two-year budget is \$1,037,000, compared to the previous estimate of \$1,301,950. Detailed comparisons of the two budgets are not possible since price increases are treated differently in each budget.

3. The assumptions on which the revised budget are based are in line with the discussion at the September Co-Sponsors' meeting. However, we do not recall an explicit agreement to a 20% increase in emoluments as from January 1, 1978.

4. You will recall that the Co-Sponsors agreed to review the TAC budget near the middle of the biennium, and in particular, see whether three meetings might be needed in 1979. Present planning assumes two seven-day meetings each year. Personally, I would think interest would flag after three or four days and there would be a marked decline in effectiveness, so it may be appropriate to review this question after the first marathon in February.

5. The Co-Sponsors may wish to note that the budget revisions continue a shift of available resources from TAC members to TAC services (Chairman and Secretariat).

SUBJ: Revised TAC Budget for 1978/79

Please refer to my memorandum to you on the same subject dated 21 June, 1977, and the report of the last meeting of the co-sponsors held in Washington on 8 and 13 September, 1977.

1. It is my understanding that the co-sponsors agreed to the following changes in the TAC budget for 1978/79:-

- (i) The days spent on TAC business by the Chairman are increased from 80 to 120 per year, and his emoluments have been raised from US\$ 200 to US\$ 240 per day.
- (ii) The emoluments of TAC members, when attending TAC meetings and participating in TAC missions, are raised from US\$ 150 to US\$ 180 per day.
- (iii) The standard rate of per diem is increased from US\$ 50 to US\$ 60 per day.
- (iv) The Chairman and members of TAC agreed to travel economy class, with a provision of 10 kg. excess baggage, and one day's stop-over on lengthy travel (e.g. more than 8 hours of flight).
- (v) There would be only two meetings of TAC per year of seven days' duration instead of three annual meetings of five days' duration. However, the need for an additional meeting in 1978 will be reviewed by the co-sponsors in mid-1978.
- (vi) The provisions for temporary staff, overtime, contractual services and general operating expenses have been reduced, in line with the reduction in the number of TAC meetings.

2. The provision for salaries under "Personal Services" shows the same pattern for staffing in the TAC Secretariat as last year. In fact, as requested by the Chairman of TAC, and agreed by the co-sponsors, an additional P-5 professional will be attached to the TAC Secretariat. This post does not appear in the TAC budget as it is provided through a special arrangement with UNDP.

3. With the above changes and provisions, the TAC budget for the biennium 1978/79 amounts to US\$ 936,640.

4. The expected resources include contributions of US\$ 200,000 each from the co-sponsors and US\$ 254,000 from the Government of Australia. In spite of some unliquidated obligations (estimated at US\$ 47,000) there will be a carry-forward of some US\$ 83,000 from the 1977 budget as a result of reimbursement of the advances made to the Centres for the quinquennial reviews (US\$ 140,000). Total expected resources for 1978/79 would therefore amount to US\$ 937,000, thus covering expected expenditures.

1. Ralph Cummings telephoned me this morning to say that he had been consulting with a member of the faculty at Raleigh (Dr. Coling?) about possible specialists in plant pathology and epidemiology. The following names were suggested to him:

2. Last week, possibly from the same source, Cummings got the name of a Dutchman -- Jon C. Zadoks -- who apparently has a very high reputation in Europe.

3. This morning I also spoke to Bob Cunningham to find out if he knew any of the above candidates and how he would compare them with Posnette.

4. Cunningham said that Posnette was a very wise man, a member of the Royal Society, who enjoyed a high reputation. It is true that while in West Africa he specialised in cocoa. This by no means represents the breadth of his knowledge and understanding of tropical agricultural diseases. He has done a lot of work for ODM over a wide spectrum. It is true, however, that his experience has been essentially with tree crops and perennial crops rather than with annual crops.

5. He knows Last well and would not put him as high as Posnette, particularly since for the last several years he has been exclusively concerned with forestry.

6. Cunningham said that in his opinion Hirst, also a member of the Royal Society, and like Posnetter a man of impeccable reputation, would in his view be the best candidate among those he knows, though he recognizes that Hirst's forthrightness during the course of the CIP review may have caused difficulties.

7. He does not know Bourke, Zadoks or Rotem.

8. In sum, Cunningham would rank the British candidates in the following order:

1. Hirst
2. Posnette
3. Last.

9. I understood Cummings to say that he did not have curricula vitae for Bourke, Rotem or Last, but was sending us one on Zadoks.

Dear Mike,

As we proceed with the quinquennial reviews of the Centres, our experience indicates that larger budgetary provisions may have to be made to cover the costs of these reviews.

As you know, the review costs include those incurred by the TAC Secretariat for the travel, per diem and emoluments of the Review Panel, printing of the report, and the travel of the Panel's Chairman to present the report to TAC and the CGIAR. In addition, the Centre concerned incurs some expenses while under review. These vary with the Centre but usually cover transport for visits to field stations within the host country of the Centre and the typing and photocopying of the first draft of the report.

Review costs have increased for the following reasons:-


- (i) air travel has become more expensive;
- (ii) at the Consultative Group's request, the Centre's outreach activities are covered more extensively by the review;
- (iii) the review teams now set up for Centres dealing with many commodities, such as CIAT and IITA, are necessarily larger than those for the Centres reviewed so far, such as IRRI, CIMMYT and CIP.

...

I attach hereto a list giving the costs directly incurred by TAC for the IRRI and CIMMYT reviews and the estimated costs for the CIAT and IITA reviews. On this basis, you may wish to adjust the budgetary provisions for the CIAT and IITA reviews. As to future reviews, much will depend on the Centre to be reviewed. I shall take advantage of the meeting of Centre Directors in Cali, at the end of the month, to ascertain the future review schedule, and will keep you informed.
