The Country Partnership Framework (CPF) is a strategic document that outlines the World Bank Group's engagement with a client country. It is designed to align the WBG's support with the country's own development goals and priorities.

Key elements of the CPF include:

- **Country Diagnostics:** An analysis of the country's development challenges and opportunities.
- **Outcomes:** The main goals that the WBG aims to support in the country.
- **Results Framework:** A set of indicators and targets to measure progress towards the strategic objectives.
- **Partnerships and Coordination:** Collaboration with other development partners and stakeholders.
- **Duration:** Up to 10 years
- **Focus:** Bringing public and private solutions to development problems
- **Flexibility:** The CPF is designed to be flexible and adaptive, allowing for adjustments based on changing circumstances and new information.
