The Executive Director undertook a working visit to the Central African Republic (CAR) from January 24 to 27, 2024. Upon his arrival, he was received by the President of the Republic, Head of State, H.E. Mr. Faustin Archange Touadéra, who gave him sound advice. The Executive Director reiterated his resolve and that of his Office to continue supporting the country's cooperation with the World Bank Group (WBG), whose portfolio of operations has grown from around a hundred million dollars in 2017 to a little over a million dollars today. He assured the Head of State of our commitment to continuing our efforts in favor of inclusive growth and prosperity in CAR.

The following day, Mr. Bello travelled with the Prime Minister to Bouar (West of the capital, Bangui), during a high-level joint mission with international partners which H.E. Mr. Moloua led

as part of the implementation of the Priority Stabilization Program in CAR. An excellent example of the synergies between humanitarian, development and peace actions.

On January 26, the Executive Director was honored to take part in an information session with members of the Government on the process of drafting the National Development Plan 2024-2028, under the Prime Minister's leadership.
