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

Dear Mr. Evans,

Thank you for your letter of December 10 and for the steady flow of draft Reports. I will give priority to three received to-day - Costa Rica, Mexico and Paraguay.

All I can say at present about my next visit to Washington is that I expect to spend a good part of February there: precisely how long is rather dependent on a letter from Bernie Bell, promised by cable many days ago but yet to come. From this I hope to learn a bit more about the fate of the Bell Mission to India. However, it rather looks that I will not be able to take part since I cannot be away from here during March. In this case I have in mind a visit to Washington for a large part of February, possibly making a visit to Mexico en route. Would this latter suggestion embarrass you in any way?

I attach some notes on the Malayan Project. I have also read the Report on the Agricultural Development Bank - Pakistan Project. I have decided that this Report does not call for detailed comment other than one. I have become increasingly concerned about East Pakistan and would have liked to have seen more examination of the role of the Bank in East Pakistan. It is clearly not to be expected that it will be so straightforward as in the West. The brief references in Annex 10 were tantalising rather than helpful. My interest is the greater because although much of the Project applying to West Pakistan is applicable to parts of India, East Pakistan is even more relevant to major areas of rice production in India. I would be glad to see any special reports you may have on East Pakistan.

I will try to find in our library the Pakistan studies referred to in paragraph 4 of Annex 10. Could you, however, tell me whether the Table in paragraph 4 referring to "a typical 100-acre holding" refers to two successive years of operating the same property or is a comparison of two 100-acre holdings, the one with and the other without tubewells?

Dear Sir John:

I am arranging to forward to you under separate cover copies of three project appraisal reports. Two of these (Rural Credit in the Philippines and Agricultural Credit in Morocco) were considered by the Board on November 2 and loans were approved. The third report refers to the Muda River Irrigation project in Malaysia which is due for consideration by the Board towards the end of November. In each case, we are sending you copies of the President's report and the loan documents as well as our technical appraisal reports.

You may notice that the two agricultural credit project loans submitted to the Board on the same day were of rather different types. The Philippine loan would be channelled through a number of small rural banks set up with private share capital under the aegis of the Central Bank. In the case of the Moroccan project loan this would be handled by large government institutions.

Earlier this week we sent to you a copy of our Progress of Operations report as at October 31. We produce these Progress Reports twice a month and it may be that you do not want to see them so frequently. Perhaps you would let me know if you would like to receive them, say, only once a month.
