Amendment to Loan Agreement and Agreement Amending the Loan Agreement

We seek your approval of the proposed amendment to the Loan Agreement, dated March 8, 1993, and the subsequent Agreement Amending the Loan Agreement, dated July 15, 1996, for the above referenced project.

- 2 The proposed amendment includes a change in the scope of the project by canceling one activity (development of curricula) and adding another (training in key trades). This change in the scope remains within the objectives of the project. An additional minor change would be to allow the use of Statement of Expenditures for Consultant Services contracts and training according to Bank Guidelines.
- 3. The Minister of State for Financial Affairs in Lebanon sent us a formal request, dated June 23, 1997, to amend the Loan Agreement for the said project to allow for financing of training activities not included within the original project description.
- 4. Discussions with the Government on the proposed changes were held with a Bank mission in July 1996. It was then agreed that the proposed training activities would focus on providing urgently needed training to key persons in various trades related to the ongoing reconstruction initiative. These activities would comprise:
 - consumables and tools for about \$1.42 million (contracts already awarded) (i) (to be funded under the existing Category 2(d) of Schedule 1); and
 - (ii) direct training costs for about \$1.03 million consisting of trainers fees, stipends for trainees and other related incidental costs (to be funded under the existing Category 3 of Schedule 1).
- 5. The financing of these activities would be covered by the amount originally allocated for the curricula development activities, which are no longer part of this project.

The Government has decided to do the work for all the curricula development activities in-house and fund it from its budget.

We refer to the Loan Agreement between the Lebanese Republic (the Borrower) and the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (the Bank), dated March 8, 1993, as amended (the Loan Agreement), and the Agreement Amending Loan Agreement, dated July 15, 1996 (the Amendment). We also refer to your request, dated June 23, 1997, that the Loan Agreement and the Amendment be amended to allow for the financing of training activities of persons in several trades through the use of amounts originally allocated for the current Part D (2) of the Project.

We are pleased to inform you that the Bank accedes to your request and that the Loan Agreement and the Amendment are hereby amended as follows:

- 1. In Section 1.02 (n) of the Loan Agreement the letters "MOTEVT" are deleted and replaced with the letters "MVTE". The words "Technical Education and Vocational Training" are deleted and replaced with the words "Vocational and Technical Education".
- 2. The table in paragraph 1 of Schedule 1 to the Amendment is amended to read as set forth in the Attachment to this Letter.
- 3. In paragraph 4 of Schedule 1, the comma in the third line is deleted and replaced with a colon and the letter (a). The full stop in the last line is deleted and replaced with a semi-colon, the word "and" and the letter (b), followed by a new sub-paragraph that reads: " under contracts costing less than \$100,000 equivalent for services with

consulting firms, \$50,000 equivalent for services with individual consultants, and all contracts for training."

- 4. In Schedule 2 to the Loan Agreement, paragraph D (2) is deleted, D (3) is relettered as D (2), and the new D (2) is amended as follows:
 - (a) the word "MOTEVT" is deleted and replaced with "MVTE"; and
- (b) a coma and the following additional words are added at the end of the paragraph: "and the training of persons in key trades."

Amendment of Project Desciption

Tufan/Suhail,

In the Vocational Education component of ERRP, we are deleting one activity <u>development of curricula</u> and adding <u>training in key trades</u>. The actual wording in the documents may be different but this is the general idea. The amendment letter has the correct terminology as they appear in the formal documents.

The deletion of curriculum activities is a good idea since after several years of inactivity or proposals that did not comply with Bank procedures, the Ministry finally decided to do the work in-house and with consultants of its choice (it's a complicated story) amd fund it from its budget.

The addition of training will enable MVTE to undertake accelerated training in key trades, which is needed urgently. Equipment is being procured under the equipment category and fees for trainers are covered under the consultant category. The only issue with training was that MOF wanted assurances that the trainers are not public servants (and they are not).

We also need to address another issue, the use of SOEs for consultants. Now that we have six persons (the TSU) on the payroll, it would be a good idea to pay their salaries from the Special Account and avoid the need for contract records here etc. Lama, told me that she would be happy to incorporate this change as well.

We need to inform our RVP of these changes (OD 13.05 see page 2 relevant paras 34 & 35). I would be happy to help Suhail prepare a short memo from Inder to Kamal.

- 34. Except for routine modifications (para. 23), amendments to the legal agreements, including the waiver of conditions, require the approval of the CD director. If a proposed amendment is substantial, particularly if it involves a significant change in project scope and concept, or if the waiver of a condition is of major significance, it must be endorsed by the RVP and approved by the executive directors. The RVP in consultation with LEG, is responsible for deciding whether a proposed amendment to a Loan/Credit Agreement or a waiver is major and therefore needs to be submitted to the Board for approval on a no-objection basis. For amendment and waivers requiring Board approval, and for supplemental loans, the RVP may seek the guidance of the MD concerned.
- 35. The monthly Report to the Executive Directors on Bank and IDA Operations, prepared by the Secretary's Department in consultation with the Regions, informs the executive directors of minor changes in the project description and loan covenants. Substantial changes and supplemental loans are submitted by the appropriate RVP to the executive directors in the form of a Memorandum and Recommendation of the President (MOP). Board approval is normally sought on a "no-objection" basis, but in special circumstances, for example, where the proposed change substantially alters the project concept or design, or where the supplemental loan is large, the MOP is considered at a Board meeting. The MOP focuses on the cause of the change or additional financing needs, the measures taken to deal with the situation, and any new arrangements for project execution. It is brief and provides the executive directors with background information and justification for continuing the project and, in the case of a supplemental loan, the need and justification for additional Bank financing. The MOP includes a newly estimated economic rate of return or other appropriate justifications, supported by reference to changes in benefits and costs. The MOP concisely describes any changes required in the loan documents.

A meeting, chaired by Ms. Tufan Kolan, Acting Director, was held on June 25, 1997 at 10:00 a.m. in Mr. Sud's office to discuss the issues note for the subject project Mid-Term Review Mission I will undertake from June 26 to July 12, 1997. In attendance were Messrs./Mesdames: Sarshar Khan, Acting MN2PI Chief; Lama Abu-Odeh, LEGMN; Vasilios Demetriou, MNSHD; Laurens Hoppenbrouwer, MN2CO; ar myself. A summary of the discussions and decisions taken are given below.

Regarding Issue 1- Procurement of pending works.

(a) Regarding CDR's implementation capacity, the meeting agreed that CDR is swamped with work and the mission should explore the possibility of CDR assigning senior staff full-time to the ERRP to ensure the project is completed before loan closing; and (b) Regarding pending procurement by the Electricite du Liban (EdL), the mission will arrange a joint meeting between EdL and CDR to reach agreement of how they will cooperate to proceed expeditiously to complete implementation of pending project components prior to Loan closing on December 31, 1998;

Regarding Issue 2- Completion of the Vocational Education Component. The meeting advised the mission to review jointly with CDR and MVTE the pending works reported by Mr. Vas Demetriou in his BOT of May 1997, and evaluate what could be completed before Loan closing. Any sub-components which could not be completed before Loan closing should be considered under the proposed loan for tional and Technical Education (Mr. Demetriou agreed to do that). It was agreed, in principle, based on Mr. Demetriou's BTO that only the following sub-components may be completed prior to Loan closing: (i) the accelerated training sub-component (about US\$2.45 million equivalent), (ii) the design (excluding supervision) services (less than \$0.4 million equivalent), (iii) the Technical Support Unit til Loan closing (about \$0.35 million equivalent), and (iv) the design and preparation of tender documents for Civil Works (amount to be determined out of the \$4.16 million Bank share of civil works). In principle, only those works which could be completed prior to Loan closing should be considered and the balance may be considered for re-allocation to other ERRP components which could be completed before Loan closing. Also, the mission will hold a joint meeting with CDR and the Ministry of Vocational and Technical Education and reach agreement on how both organizations should cooperate to expedite implementation of those sub-components which could be completed before Loan closing. These agreements will be included in the time-based action plan.

Regarding Issue 3-Extending the Loan Closing date. The meeting advised the mission to review those contracts already approved by the Bank and determine to the best of its judgement the time needed for completion. According to a recent

report from Mr. Lars Rasmusson who visited Lebanon in May 1997, completion of some contracts approved by the Bank may extend up to six or more months beyond loan closing. The Mission will recommend to Management on the best course of action upon return to Headquarters. In principle, any extension to the closing date should be only to complete those contracts already approved by the Bank.

Regarding Issue 4- Re-allocation of uncommitted funds to existing contracts. The meeting agreed that such an option may be feasible provided: (i) it is legal to extend the contracts, particularly as it regards the extent of increase to the original contract amount; (ii) the extension of the contract will not require extending the Loan closing date; and (iii) the additional works are within the project scope and objectives. The mission should examine the possibility of extending existing satisfactory contracts under the VTE component for the rehabilitation of schools, as such facilities were not fully rehabilitated due to the lack of sufficient funds.

Finally, the mission will record all its findings and agreements in the Memorandum of Understandings.

Minutes of Review Meeting

- 1. A meeting, chaired by Ms. Tufan Kolan, Acting Director, was held on June 25, 1997, at 10:00 a.m. in Mr. Sud's office to discuss the issues note for the subject project Mid-Term Review Mission I will undertake from June 26 to July 12, 1997. In attendance were Messrs./Mesdames: Sarshar Khan, Acting MN2PI Chief; Lama Abu-Odeh, LEGMN; Vasilios Demetriou, MNSHD; Laurens Hoppenbrouwer, MN2CO; and myself. A summary of the discussions and decisions taken are given below.
- 2. Regarding Issue 1- Procurement of pending works. (a) Regarding CDR's implementation capacity, the meeting agreed that CDR is swamped with work and the mission should explore the possibility of CDR assigning senior staff full-time to the ERRP to ensure the project is completed before loan closing; and (b) regarding pending procurement by the Electricite du Liban (EdL), the mission will arrange a joint meeting between EdL and CDR to reach agreement of how they will cooperate to proceed expeditiously to complete implementation of pending project components prior to Loan closing on December 31, 1998.
- 3. Regarding Issue 2- Completion of the Vocational Education Component. The meeting advised the mission to review jointly with CDR and MVTE, the pending works reported by Mr. Vas Demetriou in his BOT of May 1997, and evaluate what could be completed before Loan closing. Any sub-components which could not be completed before Loan closing should be considered under the proposed loan for Vocational and Technical Education (Mr. Demetriou agreed to do that). It was agreed that of the \$7.4 million for vocational education component, about \$2.45 million equivalent had been firmly committed for the accelerated training component. Another \$0.35 million was committed for the Technical Support Unit. For the remaining sum, it was agreed in principle that activities which can be completed by the project closing date could be considered. These activities could include (i) variation orders to complete the rehabilitation works at vocational schools which were not carried out due to lack of funds or omitted from the original contracts due to inadequate field surveys; (ii) design works and preparation of tender documents for civil works (the contracts would be awarded

under the proposed Vocational Education Project); and (iii) other activities that are of small scope and can be completed within the closing date. It was also agreed that any "unallocated" amount from the remaining fund for the vocational education component, should be reallocated, in agreement with the MVTE, to other project components. If necessary, to ensure that the vocational education program does not get "shortchanged", the mission is authorized to inform the MVTE Minister that the Bank could increase the proposed loan amount for the vocational education component by the amount reallocated to other components. Also, the mission will hold a joint meeting with CDR and the MVTE and reach agreement on how both organizations should cooperate to expedite implementation of those sub-components which could be completed before Loan closing. These agreements will be included in the time-based action plan.

- 4. Regarding Issue 3-Extending the Loan Closing date. The meeting advised the mission to review those contracts already approved by the Bank and determine to the best of its judgment the time needed for completion. According to a recent report from Mr. Lars Rasmusson who visited Lebanon in May 1997, completion of some contracts approved by the Bank may extend up to six or more months beyond loan closing. The Mission will recommend to Management on the best course of action upon return to Headquarters. In principle, any extension to the closing date should be only to complete those contracts already approved by the Bank.
- 5. Regarding Issue 4- Re-allocation of uncommitted funds to existing contracts. I am planning to arrive in Lebanon on June 28, 1997 for a stay of about two weeks. The main purpose of my mission will be to conduct a mid-term review to follow up on the issues discussed and agreed during the pre-mission issues review meeting chaired by Ms. Tufan Kolan, Acting Director, on June 25, 1997 (see rate minutes of meeting). I will also spend about three days to assist MNSHD in the identification of the proposed Community Development Fund for Lebanon as agreed in the meeting with Mr. Sud dated May 30, 1997.

Regarding the ERRP, in addition to the normal supervision, I will follow-up on the findings and recommendations of recent supervision missions of Messrs. Skelton in April/May 1997; Mr. Demetriou and Ms. El-Rashidi in May 1997; Mr. Rasmusson in May 1997; and Mr. Saghir in May/June 1997. I will specifically follow-up on the recommedations of the pre-mission issues review meeting as recorded in the minutes of the meeting (separate EMail).

Regarding the proposed Community Development Fund, I will work closely with Mr. Basam Ramadan (task manager) in the identification of the project. In this regard, I will meet with concerned officials primarily of the Ministry Of Municipal Affairs who would be the main beneficiary of the proposed loan. In spite of recent events in South Lebanon, which are outside the control of the Govt., Project Development Objectives (DO) is rated Satisfactory (S) on the grounds that: (i) rehabilitation of damaged infrastructure is progressing satisfactorily; and (ii) substantial progress has been achieved in strengthening government institutions.

Implementation Progress (IP) is rated "S" because about 90% of loan proceeds of original ERRP (US\$175 million) are committed, and about 77% have been disbursed in spite of events outside the control of the Borrower. It is expected that the one additional year extension to the loan closing date (extended to 12/31/99) will be required to complete the disbursements of the original ERRP and the supplement (US\$50 million). The power supply for Greater Beirut has been substantially restored; and rehabilitation of water supply and solid waste services are on schedule. Institutional capacity is progressing satisfactorily as CDR has been effectively managing implementation of the reconstruction and rehabilitation program, assisting sectoral ministries in building institutional capacity, and promoting private sector management of public services (telecom and solid waste sectors).

Other ratings: These ratings were better than satisfactory except for procurement and training which, though progressing satisfactorily, are behind schedule. It should be noted that procurement delays have been in part caused by events outside the control of the Borrower, which have diverted its attention to attend to emergencies.

BLOCK A. SUMMARY OF CURRENT PROJECT STATUS, ISSUES AND PROBLEMS

(i) Overall project implementation continues to progress satisfactorily in the power, telecom and water and wastewater sectors. The education sector, due to changes in minister and some rules, has progressed with difficulty. Also, the VTE is facing some difficulties with consultants and contractors for the civil works sub-component and is considering rebidding such service and contracts. An amendment to the Loan Agreement will be requested soon to include a training component. Regarding the original housing loans component, US\$25 million was reallocated to the power component. With respect of the water and wastewater component, about US\$53 million has been committed leaving a balance of about US\$7 million, which could be used for additional works in Laboue, Aanjar and Majdel Aanjar in the Beka'a Valley. CDR will submit soon for Bank review a request to reallocate uncommitted funds. Concerning the solid waste management component, about US\$8 million of uncommitted funds will be reallocated to the water and telecom components, as works initially included in the ERRP, except for the equipment for the Tripoli landfill and the Qarantina compost plants in Beirut, will be undertaken within the scope of the proposed Solid waste and Environmental Management Project. US\$27.5 million has been allocated to expenditures related to the April 1996 hostilities in South Lebanon, of which US\$18.5 million equivalent) for which reimbursements will be requested soon.

- (ii) The Consultancy contract for the supervision of the second and third years of the ERRP has been terminated on account of having reached the ceiling of the contract amount; however, the Borrower will notify the Bank of other arrangements it is now considering to cover such needs.
- (iii) Regarding the ERRP supplemental loan, about US\$28.5 million out of the US\$50 million or about 57% have been allocated to the water supply and wastewater component. Two water and wastewater contracts will extend well beyond the current loan closing date (12/31/98). Therefore, a one-year extension of the loan closing date will be required.

Problems that are likely to/may delay project implementation over the next six to twelve months

The weak institutional capacity of the Ministry of Vocational Training & Education may delay implementation of the VTE component. Substantial implementation delays may require reallocation of resources to other components. This issue will be discussed at the mid-term review.



- 1. A World Bank mission, Mr. Lars Rasmusson visited Lebanon from May 21 to June 11, 1997 and Mr. Jamal Saghir from June 2 to 19, 1997, to:
 - a) carry out a mid-term review of the ERRP and ERRP Supplementary;
 - review the ongoing Coastal Pollution Control and Water Supply Project (CPCWSP);
 - assist in the preparation of proposed Awali-Beirut Water Conveyor Project (A-BWCP) and to review present status on preparatory works for Bisri dam;
 and
 - d) initiate the preparation of proposed Greater Beirut Water Supply and Wastewater Project (GBWSWP).

The mission was assisted by Mr. Etienne Linard, Regional Procurement Advisor, in the review of draft Request for Proposals (RfPs) for proposed Operation, Maintenance and Training Services (OM&TS) contract under the CPCWSP. The mission worked and met with representatives from the CDR, the Ministry of Hydraulic and Electric Resources (MHER), the Ministry of Environment (MOE), the Ministry for Administrative Reforms (MAR), the Litani River Authority (LRA), the Arab Fund, the EU, the EIB, Italien Aid, the SIU and consultants working on different projects. The mission made field visits to the Beka'a Valley to review works under an ongoing contract and sites for proposed contracts and to proposed sites for A-BWCP. The ERRP Supplementary has been declared effective and the CPCWSP is expected to be signed in June 1997. This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) covers projects under a) and b), while a separate MOU has been prepared for projects under c) and d).

- The mission addressed regarding the ERRP/ERRP Supplementary:
 - a) status on preparation and implementation of remaining contracts;
 - b) status on cost estimates and disbursements; and
 - c) use of remaining funds.

- The mission addressed regarding the CPCWSP:
 - a) preparation of detailed engineering for works in different sub-project areas including oceanographic surveys;
 - b) progress made under land acquisition and resettlements;
 - c) processing of Nabatiye water supply and wastewater contract;
 - d) preparation of RfPs for an OM&TS contract and of a short list of firms to be invited to submit proposals;
 - e) preparation of TORs for supervision of the OM&TS contract and of a short list of consulting firms to be invited to submit proposals;
 - f) identification of pre-treatment requirements for industrial effluents and preparation and implementation of pre-treatment works;
 - g) preparation of an Environmental Monitoring Plan (EMP) with appointment of consulting firm;
 - h) under sector reforms establishment of a Steering Committee (SC) and Technical Secretariat (TS) and appointment of an Institutional Specialist (IS);
 - i) status on finalization of the draft law for sector reforms;
 - j) continuation of project management; and
 - k) establishment of a project monitoring system.

SUMMARY

- 4. The following summarizes major conclusions and actions taken or to be taken:
 - a) regarding the ERRP/ERRP Supplementary:
 - the closing date for ERRP/ERRP Supplementary is December 31, 1998, while completion date for a major contract is scheduled for the first half of 1999. All efforts should be made to enable completion of the bulk of the works before closing date. An extension of the closing date might be considered by the Bank management in late 1998, which would then be made in view of actual performance under project implementation;
 - under the ERRP about US\$7 million remain uncommitted, which could be used under an extension of ongoing Ba'albeck Nabi Chit contract and/or for an extension of wastewate collection and treatment facilities in the Beka'a Valley for Laboue, Aanjar, and Majdel Anjar. CDR will before July 1, 1997, submit a proposal on additional works to be included to the Bank for review and approval; and

to keep the Bank informed on the implementation of remaining contracts the CDR will submit to the Bank before July 1, 1997, a detailed and updated implementation schedule. This should form the basis for the preparation of quarterly progress report with the first one, covering the second quarter of 1997, to be submitted to the Bank by July 15, 1997;

b) regarding the CPCWSP:

- only minor progress has been made, since previous mission, on land acquisition and resettlement for the Sour treatment site, when a revised action plan was agreed. This activity is now becoming critical and if further delays will occur, it could effect the start of the construction works as presently planned;
- an updated cost estimate for the Sour outfall main indicates a significant cost increase. Although an updating of previous cost estimate for the Kesrouan outfall main has still to be carried out, there are indications of a possible cost increase. However, because of the nature of the works the estimated costs will remain uncertain until bids have been received. In order the guard against potential cost increases for the outfall mains, the ultimate size of the Nabatiye contract could be considered to be kept flexible and adjustable to actual availability of funds;
- revisions were made to the draft RfPs for the OM&TS contract for which invitation of proposals is scheduled for August 1997. The MHER will ensure the availability of adequate counterpart funds;
- the preparation of a study on the provision of pre-treatment facilities as required for industrial effluents should start before October 1, 1997;
- the SC with its TS is scheduled to be established soon and announcement for the recruitment of an IS would take place in June 1997. The IS is scheduled to be in place by October 1997;
- the amended draft law will be submitted to the Bank for review in July 1997;
- arrangements have been made for the continuation of the SIU contract to October/November 1997 with a second extension expected to follow to mid-1998, when a permanent arrangement should put in place; and
- CDR should submit to the Bank for review the first progress report for the quarter ending September 30, 1997 within 30 days.

The above matters are further elaborated upon in below paragraphs.

5. The appointment by CDR of a **Project Manager** for the CPCWSP remains to be done. This matter, that was agreed during previous mission, was again discussed by this mission in view of the critical need for this position. The CPCWSP includes a number of components involving different financing and implementing agencies, which need to be closely coordinated and managed. The CDR will appoint a Project Manager before mid-July 1997 and inform the Bank on its choice.

ERRP AND ERRP SUPPLEMENTARY

6. Present status is:

- a) under the ERRP only one contract, the Ba'albeck Nabi Chit, is ongoing. Completion of this contract is currently scheduled for mid-1998. Present issues refer to: land acquisition has still to be finalized; an underestimation of length of pipes that will require a correction of the contract amount; and proposed change of AC pipes within distribution networks to ductile iron or PVC. The CDR/SIU will address these matters and inform the Bank on conclusions reached:
- b) of the water supply and wastewater component of the ERRP loan, amounting to US\$60 million, about US\$53 million has been committed including the Ba'albeck Nabi Chit contract taking into account expected variation orders. This leaves a remaining amount of about US\$7 million, which could be used for additional works referred to under c) and d) below. The mission did not have any specific objections to proposed additions neither to proposed prioritizations. It was agreed that CDR will, before July 1, 1997, submit to the Bank for review/approval a proposal, including technical justifications and implementation schedules, for use of remaining funds;
- c) MHER has proposed to extend the Ba'albeck Nabi Chit contract to additionally include some adjacent areas/villages. In this context and in view of larger quantities of groundwater -- than originally foreseen -- available from boreholes already drilled, the supervisory consultant has prepared an outline proposal on extension and design changes of the water supply systems, which might imply additional costs of about US\$3 million. This could be included as an addendum to existing contract amounting to about US\$18 million;
- d) other works identified for potential inclusion under the ERRP are the extension of wastewater collection and disposal facilities for Laboue, Aanjar and Majdel Aanjar in the Beka'a Valley in this order of priority. The mission reviewed a technical note prepared for Laboue and had no comments. CDR will submit a request to the Bank for the inclusion of proposed works for Laboue as a variation order under the Ba'albeck Nabi Chit contract;
- e) out of US\$50 million under the ERRP Supplementary, US\$28.5 million has been allocated for water supply and wastewater. Two contracts are being processed with one for Ba'albeck wastewater treatment works, including trunk main, and one for Metn and Barouk water supply. Although bids have still to

be received for Metn and Barouk water supply, it is estimated that available amount will be sufficient for these contracts;

f) for the Ba'albeck wastewater treatment works the evaluation report has been prepared and will be submitted to the Bank for review during June 1997. The CDR Board has approved the evaluation report as well as a proposal to change the site for the treatment works to a place further away from the urban area. The mission did not object to proposed change, since it does provide a better technical and long-term solution. This could also be negotiated with the contracter, recommended for award of contract, and covered in an addendum.

Consultant proposals for construction supervision had been proposed to be invited, but during the mission CDR proposed, because of time constraints, to negotiate a contract with the consulting firm that has carried out the engineering design and is presently supervising the Ba'albeck Nabi Chit contract. This has been submitted to the CDR Board for approval. A contract under such an arrangement would be expected to be signed before July 15, 1997.

Land aquisition for previously proposed site for the treatment works has been processed by CDR to the stage for submission to the Council of Ministers. It has still to be initiated for the new site with relevant documentation proposed to be prepared by the supervisory consultant when appointed. Although no specific problems are envisaged, land acquisition could be expected to take up to 6 months from submission of documentation to CDR.

This contract is also linked to and should be coordinated with the extension of the wastewater collection network included under the Ba'albeck Nabi Chit contract. In view of proposed changes CDR will submit to the Bank for review, together with the evaluation report, a detailed implementation schedule showing steps to be taken and time requirements for land acquisition and appointment of supervisory consultant.

- g) for the Metn and Barouk water supply contract, announcement for tender invitation took place during the mission, which would enable contract award by late 1997. Contract duration is planned to 17 months, which would imply contract completion by mid-1999. Consultant proposals for construction supervision were invited during the mission with award of contract expected within a 3-4 months period or ahead of expected date for award of the construction contract;
- h) the utilization of works to be constructed for Metn water supply will be subject to implementation of proposed contract for Fouar Antelias including water intake, treatment works and transmission main with financing expected to be provided under Italian Aid. The mission was informed that a financial agreement is being processed for approval and expected to be signed in June/July 1997 and met with Italian experts, who were preparing an environmental assessment. The engineering design with preparation of tender documents would be completed within 2-3 months. The earliest completion

- date for the Fouar Antelias contract would be in the latter half of 1999 or about 6 months later than expected completion date for the Metn and Barouk water supply contract;
- i) the above would indicate that completion of part of remaining works will be beyond the loan closing date, December 31, 1998, and that a 6 to 12 months extension would be required. It could be assumed that the Bank management will decide on eventual extension of the closing date by end 1998 in view of progress made under contracts implementation. This would imply that, in case no extension will be approved, local financing will have to cover all expenditures to be incurred after December 31, 1998. Bank no-objection to award of remaining contracts will be given on this premise;
- j) to ensure full utilization of remaining funds, these could move between the ERRP and ERRP Supplementary and also, if justified, finance a portion of the Nabatiye contract under the CPCWSP. A complete picture of funding requirements will first be available at the time for award of the Metn and Barouk water supply contract and of potential additional contracts/variation orders discussed above; and
- k) the mission received from CDR an updated table, which is enclosed, on status on fund commitments and disbursements. Under the ERRP 86 % has been committed with 57 % disbursed. Under the ERRP Supplementary regarding the water supply and wastewater component the first commitment will be the award of contract for Ba'albeck wastewater treatment works. In order to closely supervise the implementation of remaining contracts the CDR will submit to the Bank for review before July 1, 1997, a detailed and updated implementation schedule (also to include the contract for Fouar Antelias) with projected expenditures to be incurred and disbursements to be effected on a monthly basis. This should then form the basis for the preparation of quarterly progress reports, which should include an analysis of specific issues and how they are proposed to be resolved. The first quarterly progress report, to cover the second quarter of 1997, should be submitted to the Bank for review by July 15, 1997. These quarterly reports will then show progress made and provide a basis for a decision to be made by the Bank on eventual extension of the closing date.

CPCWSP

- 7. Present status on engineering design (wastewater collection and disposal), oceanographic surveys and contracts implementation is:
 - a) the engineering design is progressing well with contract for collection and treatment works scheduled to be awarded by April 1998 for Saida, by January 1998 for Sour, and by March 1998 for Kesrouan;
 - b) the oceanographic surveys will be completed by September/October 1997 after inclusion of the summar season. Progress made so far has been satisfactory;

- c) based on an analysis of the oceanographic surveys the detail design for the outfall mains can be prepared with contracts scheduled to awarded by December 1998 for Saida, by August 1998 for Sour, and by July 1998 for Kesrouan. It should be considered to tender for the three outfall mains at the same time and through the possible award of one contract to achieve the advantages of economy of scale. Such a contract could then, in practice, be executed as three sub-contracts. This is a matter to be decided at a later date:
- d) for Saida the trunk main is presently included and financed under the southern highway project, for which contract has been awarded, but works have yet to start. In case this will not materialize, another arrangement has to be made for the execution of the trunk main;
- e) for Sour the wastewater is proposed to be treated for unrestricted use for irrigation and to be pumped to an adjacent irrigation canal operated under the Litani River Authority (LRA). The treated wastewater will be delivered free of charge, but an agreement has still to be reached with the LRA on its acceptance. Such an agreement should be reached at an early stage, since this will be subject to the construction of pertinant pumping station and delivery main; and
- f) an updated cost estimate for the Sour outfall main shows US\$9 million as compared to the appraisal estimate of US\$3.2 million. A similar update for the Kesrouan outfall main is expected by September 1997. However, because of the nature of works any reliable cost estimate will only be available at the time for submission of bids. In order to ensure the availability of Bank funds for the outfall mains it is proposed to consider the possibility to maintain a flexibility under the Nabatiye water supply and wastewater contract and adjust the contract size to the funding situation;

The status on land acquistion and resettlements are:

- a) the following Action Plan on land acquisition and resettlement for the site for Sour wastewater treatment works has been submitted by CDR to the Bank:
 - STEP 1: preparation of documentation to be annexed to the decree for expropriation and submission to CDR; this was done in December 1996;
 - ◆ STEP 2: this step has been added since previous MOU and refers to approval to be given by MHER before the documentation can be sent to the CDR Board for approval; the MHER approval has been given and the documentation was during the mission submitted to the Board, which has yet to give its approval; this corresponds to about 5 months for CDR's internal processing of the documentation to the Board;

- STEP 3: submission of the decree by CDR to the Council of Ministers for approval; this was previously scheduled to end February 1997 and has now been rescheduled to June 15, 1997;
- STEP 4: expropriation will be declared by decree from the Council of Ministers; rescheduled to July 15, 1997;
- STEP 5: CDR will convey the decree and the completed file to the competent expropriation commission; rescheduled to August 15, 1997. Procedures to be followed include summoning owners and persons holding legal rights to full hearings. Procedures to be completed have been rescheduled to September 15, 1997;
- STEP 6: CDR will deposit the compensation, as determined, notify those entitled to be paid, and serve an order of occupation of expropriated land and property; rescheduled to October 15, 1997;
- STEP 7: CDR will issue a decree of possession of the expropriated land; rescheduled to November 15, 1997.

The above process has been delayed, and any further delays could effect the commencement of construction works, since STEP 7 should be completed before contract can be awarded for wastewater collection and treatment works, which is scheduled for January, 1998. The CDR will inform the Bank in case any slippages will occur in the above dates.

- b) status on land acquisition in other sub-project areas is:
 - SAIDA: the land for the wastewater treatment works has already been expropriated in connection with proposed extension of the southern highway;
 - ♦ KESROUAN: documentation required under step 1 for land acquisition for sites for wastewater treatment works and pumping stations has been submitted by the consultant to CDR; this should then be processed as for Sour;
 - NABATIYE: no land acquisition required.
- 9. Status on processing the contract for Nabatiye water supply and wastewater is:
 - a) during previous mission it was agreed that tender documents should be submitted to the Bank for review in April with bid invitation to take place in May 1997. The tender documents were during the mission submitted by the consultant to SIU for review, whereafter they will be forwarded to the CDR for its review. Barring further delays the documents could be expected to be sent to the Bank in July for its review; and
 - b) specific procurement notice has been announced in Development Business.

10. Status on preparation of RfPs for OM&TS is:

- a) draft RfPs were submitted, as agreed, by the SIU to the CDR and MHER by end April, but no copies were forwarded to the Bank. No review of the documents had been carried out by CDR and MHER before arrival of the mission. The RfPs covers the whole of Lebanon except Mount Lebanon, which is proposed to be covered by Lyonnaise des Eaux, but for which a contract has still to be signed;
- b) the RfPs was reviewed by the mission together with the SIU, and inputs were also provided by CDR and MHER. Conclusions were reached on revisions to be made and a revised draft was agreed to be submitted to the Bank for review by mid-June 1997. Bank comments would be expected by early July, which would enable finalization of the documents by July/August with invitation of proposals by August 1997;
- c) the CDR/MHER should submit a short list of firms -- with wide geographical spread and no more than 2 firms from any country -- to be invited to submit proposals to the Bank for review by end-June 1997; and
- d) for the supervisory consultancy it was agreed that its coverage should be limited to the coverage of the RfPs and not, as previously proposed, include the whole of Lebanon. Documents for invitation of proposals should be submitted to the Bank for review by mid-June 1997 also to include a short list of consulting firms. This should enable invitation to take place by August 1997. It is essential that this consultancy is appointed in time to enable its participation in the review of proposals for the OM&TS contract;

11. Status on arrangements to be made to ensure pre-treatment of industrial effluents, where required, is:

- a) an inventory of industrial effluents, prepared by Dar Al Handasah, will be finalized shortly. Rules and regulations have been established on industrial effluents and the legal structure for enforcement of pre-treatment requirements, where needed, is in place;
- b) as a continuation of the above inventory and with specific focus on the subproject areas under this project, a study should be prepared to cover: a detailed inventory of industries relevant to this project; assessment of present and projected effluents; assessment of effluent compositions and treatment requirements; and arrangement and time schedule for implementation of proposals. Outline TORs were prepared by the mission and discussed with the MOE;
- c) the study could be implemented as a continuation of the Dar Al Handasah contract and financed under the same agreement or under a separate contract, which could be financed under the Bank loan. The implementation of the study will be managed by CDR/MOE with the assistance of SIU1;

- d) the finalization of the TORs for the study will be carried out by MOE and SIU1 and submitted to CDR and the Bank for review/approval before July 1, 1997. The Bank should then also be informed on approach to contracting, and in case of Bank financing a short list of consulting firms to be invited to submit proposals should be submitted to the Bank for approval; and
- e) the study should commence before October 1, 1997, for completion within a 6 months period.
- 12. Status on the preparation of an Environmental Monitoring Plan (EMP) with appointment of consulting firm is:
 - a) draft TORs for the preparation of an EMP was submitted by previous mission for review by CDR, SIU, and MOE. This did not take place but was done during this mission. Finalization of the TORs incorporating comments made will be done by SIU with copy to be sent to the Bank for review before July 1, 1997; and
 - b) CDR will be responsible for the preparation of the EMP and coordinate with MOE as needed. CDR should submit to the Bank for review before July 1, 1997, a short list of consulting firms to be invited to submit proposals. Invitation of proposals should be scheduled for August 1997.

13. Status under sector reforms is:

- a) the advertisement for an Institutional Specialist (IS) and related TORs were during the mission approved by the MHER. Next step is its submission to the CDR Board for approval, which is expected to take place by mid-June 1997. The Bank, when informed on the Board's approval, will publish the advertisement in the Development Business, and CDR should do the same in the local press. Applications should be submitted before August 20, 1997, and reviewed by CDR and the Steering Committee (SC) (see b) below). An evaluation report with recommendation to appointment and including the applications for the 5 highest rated candidates should be sent to the Bank for review before September 15, 1997. The CDR/SC could, as needed, be assisted by the SIU (Binnie and Partners) homeoffice in the interview of potential candidates in UK and France. The final decision on the appointment of candidate should be made by the SC;
- b) the establishment of the Steering Committee (SC) through an administrative order by the Minister of MHER was agreed by the Minister to take place soon. The SC, to be chaired by the Minister for MHER, will be composed of representatives from the MHER, CDR, Ministry of Finance, Ministry of Administrative Reforms, Ministry of Agriculture, and Ministry of Environment. The Bank will be informed on appointed members;
- c) the draft law as amended will be submitted to the Bank for review by early July 1997. If further amendments will be needed to properly reflect the objectives

- under sector reforms, these should be incorporated in the draft law before mid-August 1997. The draft law will then be submitted to the Council of Ministers for approval before being introduced to the Parliament;
- d) for implementation of phase 2 under sector reforms ECU 2.53 million, which constitutes a component of proposed EU grant to the Ministry of Administrative Reforms (MAR), should be made available. This component has been earmarked for use in the water supply and wastewater sector. The EU agreement is expected to be signed in September 1997, and an organizational structure for the implementation of proposed technical assistance has to be put in place. The structure to be established for implementation of water supply and wastewater sector reforms -- a SC with a Technical Secretariat to be headed by the IS -- will manage the ECU 2.53 million but under overall monitoring and coordination from the MAR. Once the EU agreement has been signed, an agreement should be reached between the SC and the MAR on the modality for the use of the ECU 2.53 million. The funds are urgently required, and all efforts should be made, to include the assistance of EIB, to make the funds available. Other potential sources of funds should also be explored; and
- e) the MHER should prepare an action program for steps to be taken under sector reforms -- to enable early initiation -- and submit it before July 1, 1997, to the Bank and the EIB for review. The implementation of the action program should then be followed-up and coordinated by Bank and EIB missions.

14. Status on continuation of project management is:

- a) during the mission an agreement was approved by CDR to extend the SIU contract to October/November 1997 with the retaining of about 10 staff members. This would basically enable the SIU, for the time being, to continue with present assignments;
- b) the SIU extension will be financed by the EU to an amount of ECU 750,000 under a new contract that is expected to be signed shortly. Funding of SIU under the old agreement expired on May 26, 1997, and in case under EU procedures no retroactive financing can take place, the CDR will fund the SIU until a new EU contract has been concluded;
- c) under the EU Investment Planning Program (IPP), proposed committments under two budget lines include ECU 21.0 million and ECU 4.0 million. The EU will, based on past experience, evaluate arrangements to be made for continuation of project management taking into account the need for increased local participation. The EU will appoint a consultant for evaluation and preparation of TORs for invitation of proposals. This activity has still to be initiated, and a new project management team would not be expected to be in place before the second quarter of 1998. This would necessitate a second extension of the SIU contract to bridge the gap with funding to be provided

- from the ECU 4.0 million. The new project management team would then be funded under the budget line of ECU 21 million; and
- d) CDR has under the CPCWSP agreed to maintain a project management unit, which has been referred to as "SIU or its successor". In this context the Bank will review arrangements to be made on project management to ensure satisfactory execution of Bank financed projects.
- For the development of a progress reporting system including performance 15. indicators it was agreed:
 - a) the reporting system should be simple and should not only serve the Bank or other financing agencies but provide a useful tool under project management;
 - b) the reporting system should monitor projected data, at the time for project appraisal, with actual data and provide early indications on eventual slippages in project execution. This should then trigger actions to be taken to adjust to such delays. The reporting system should include from the appraisal report: Annex 2, table 3; Annex 5, tables 1,2 and 3; implementation schedule as a barchart; and under Annex 7 tables prepared for monitoring indicators. Tables should be prepared to show projected as well as actual data;
 - c) information should be prepared on a quarterly basis except for the monitoring indicators which should be prepared on an annual basis; and
 - d) the first progress report, which should be submitted within 30 days after the end of the reporting period, should be prepared for the quarter ending September 30, 1997.





Hope you had a good flight back and managed to get some rest. I received some feedback on the donor assistance section of the Aide-Memoire of the pre-appraisal mission of the Vocational and Technical Education Project based on a discussion with Jihan Haidar. The additional information and revisions are listed below.

Islamic Bank

The Islamic Development Bank (IDB) is providing a soft loan in the amount of US7.8 million for civil works for the construction of 16 schools. This amount finances 39% percent of civil works for 16 new schools, the balance is to be financed by GOL. The location of schools to be financed by IDB has not been finalized, in fact the loan has not been signed for the civil works component. The grant agreement we received was for the equipment list to be financed by IDB.

Apparently, both the Arab Fund, IDB and OPEC are providing penallel financing for the 31 new VTE schools. There is an inter-change of who pays for what, depending on available funds. See below for elaboration.

OPEC

The US\$4 million provided by OPEC to finance three schools in North Lebanon are part of the agreed upon locations from the original list of schools to be financed by the Arab Fund and/or the IDB. Tentatively, the locations are Halba, Amyoun and Baghoun. We were advised not to list the locations, as this might change, depending upon which schools IDH will agree to finance. IDB will provide financing for the equipment for the 3 selected schools.

The Arab Fund will only finance 78% of civil works, design, construction, equipment and supervision of the 15 new schools. We have the list of schools. At least this activity is clear, unlike the IDB.

French Protocol

We need to change the heading French Cooperation to French Protocol. It was suggested that we phrase the paragraph to say: "French protocol of 1995 allocated US\$2 million..... the rest stays, and then we need to say that "in 1996 a grant of 2 million francs for TA was provided to complement activities to be financed under the 19965/96 loans."

VTE Component of the ERRP (I.n. 3562)

Equipment. I was informed by Nada that the amount required to finance the equipment component of the accelerated training component amounted to US1.9 million, and therefore, exceeded our expectations (US1.42 million). It was tentatively decided, that MVTE should finance the balance required, because as we know all funds were allocated towards well defined activities, all in need of financing. They will inform us of their final decision.

Technical Support Unit (TSU). The TSU staff met with Nada to discuss revised salary scales. She seems amenable towards increasing the salaries of the Architect, Procurement, Accountant and TA Specialist (Deputy), but not that of the Project Director or the Executive Secretary. This is an internal matter, they will sort it out.

I had the opportunity to provide feedback to H.E. Barbir on the importance of the appropriate location of the TSU staff, and the implications involved. He stated that he would handle it in a manner which would ensure that TSU staff would be able to perform their work in an efficient and expeditious manner.

VTE PHRD. I faxed Nada a copy of the activities to be financed under the Government executed portion of the PHRD. She will follow up with Mr. Haddad.

I plan to visit Lebanon from May 20 to June 10, 1997, to cover:

- (a) a review (or project launch) of the Coastal Pollution Control and Water Supply Project (CPCWSP);
- (b) a mid-term review of the ERRP including ERRP Supplementary;
- (c) preparation of the proposed Awali-Beirut Water Conveyor Project (A-BWCP); and
- (d) initiation of a proposed Beirut Water Supply and Wastewater Project (BWSWP).

Regarding A-BWCP and BWSWP I will overlap with a mission by Jamal Saghir and for ERRP with a mission by Mario Zelaya. Jamal Saghir will also assist in the review of the CPCWSP particularly on the components on sector reforms. Etienne Linard, who will be in Lebanon during May 18 to 24, will assist, as time permits, on procurement matters for the CPCWSP.

Sracific activities to be covered under the above projects are o. lined below.

- arrangements made or to be made for continuation of ongoing contract for project management;
- progress made under the consultant contracts on detail engineering and oceanographic surveys;

 - progress made in land aquisition and resettlement;
- draft Request for Proposals (RfPs) for a Operation, Maintenance and Training Services (OMTS) contract and a short list of firms to be invited to submit proposals;
- TORs for supervision of the OMTS contract and a short list of firms to be invited to submit proposals;
- for sector reforms the establishment of a Steering Committee and Technical Secretariat with the appointment of an Institutional

Specialist;

revised draft law on sector reforms; and

progress made on identification of pre-treatment requirements for industrial effluents and on appointment of consultants for preparation of an environmental monitoring program.

FOR A-BWCP I will assist in:

a review of the Gibb's study on water demand and supply and on water costs; and

discussions with Montgomery Watson on progress made in the preparation of Request for Proposals for a BOT contract and of an environmental assessment.

FOR BWSWP I will discuss:

the request for PHRD funding of consultant services for p ject preparation;

potential scope of project and scope of works to be covered under a consultant contract and preparation of relevant TORs; and project preparation plan for next steps to be taken.

For the mid-term review of the ERRP including ERRP Supplementary and for the preparation of the A-BWCP separate Statement of Objectives will be issued.

The mission outputs will be:

a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the CPCWSP; and contributions to MOUs to be prepared for the other projects.

On return of mission to headquarters a BTO report will be prepared and a Technical Note on the A-BWCP will be finalized.

Lars,

As per your request, I reviewed the draft contract sent to the Bank by CDR for the supply of circuit breakers and disconnectors needed for the rehabilitation of the Markabi Hydoelectric Power Plant. I have the following comments:

- 1. This is a relatively large contract containing equipment manufactured by a large number of firms. I do not know the nature of the agreement between the Bank and GOL regarding the procurement of supplies needed for emergency assistance, but I think single-sourcing in this case can be justified only if the original equipment were supplied by the same firm (AEG). You should ascertain that this is the case.
- 2. The contract is not clear about delivery terms (delivered at the power plant, but is it duty-paid or duty-unpaid?). However SCC Clause 11 (Prices) suggests that the contract prices contain customs and import duties. If the Bank is to finance this contract, these duties must be shown separately.
- 3. GCC Clause 26.1 (Termination for Insolvency) has the wrong text (Termination for Convenience). It should be replaced with the co ect text appearing on page 49 of the Standard Bidding Documents for Procurement of Goods (January 1995).
- 4. I shall return your documents under separate cover.

Our specific comments on Instructions to Tenderers (IT) and Conditions of Particular Application (CPA) are shown in below paragraphs.
- 2. On Instructions to Tenderers (IT):
 - a) para 1.2: It states that the successful tenderer will be expected to complete the contract within 24 months from the date of commencement of works. We want to draw to your attention that this is beyond the closing date, which is December 31, 1998, and that the Bank cannot at this stage approve any extension of the closing date;
 - b) para 5.3 (f): This should correspond to about 4 months' cashflow, which would be in the order of US\$3.5 - 4.0 million. The stated figure US\$2.5 million would be on the low side;
 - c) para 5.4: The 30 percent, regarding minimum criteria to be met, is proposed to be changed to 40 percent;

- d) para 8.1: In line 1 "the tenderer is required" is proposed to be changed to "the tenderer is advised";

- g) para 16.2: In case of price adjustments this clause will not be needed;
- h) para 25.2: The following corrections are proposed ""WITHDRAWAL" and "SUBSTITUTION" shall be opened and the name of the bidder shall be read out first";
- para 25.5: This is a new para to read "Bids not opened and read out at bid opening shall not be considered further for evaluation, irrespective of the circumstances";
- j) paras 31.2 and 31.3: We propose the use of the exact wording of corresponding paras in the SBD;
- k) paras 36.2 and 36.3: We propose the use of the exact wording of corresponding paras in the SBD;
- 1) the SBD para 38.1 on "Disputes Review Board" should be inserted; and
- m) a separate para should be inserted on Fraud and Corruption as stated in the latest version of the Bank's Procurement Guidelines (revised January and August 1996).
- 3. On Conditions of Particular Application (CPA):
 - a) add from the SBD sub-clause 10.2, Validity of the Performance Security, and sub-clause 10.4, Cost of Performance Security;
 - b) replace sub-clause 21.2 with what is stated under sub-clause 21.2 and 21.2(c) in the SBD;

- c) the wording in the SBD for sub-clause 52.2 should be used;
- d) add from the SBD a sub-clause 55.2 on Omissions of Quantities; and
- e) sub-clause 78.1, Restrictions on Eligibility, is not acceptable, and should be replaced with sub-clause 76.1 in the SBD.
- 4. We propose that you proceed with tender invitation as early as possible at the same time as you submit the revised IT and CPA to the Bank for review.

Reference is to our fax dated 12/9/96 enclosing the Implementation Plan for the Housing Grants Component. Please be informed that the verification referred to in the first paragraph of the plan and in our fax dated 14/6/96, has now been completed.

A summary of the original estimates, as per the plan, and the final estimates are provided in the attached.

As you may see, the total of eligible damages is now around \$ 15.6 million as compared to around \$ 12.9 million originally. Most of the increase relates to houses with damages of less than \$ 3,000, the total number of which has increased from 6,288 to 13,057 (92% of total eligible houses), with an average damage of houses in this category of \$ 379. The verification established that a large number of houses with very small damages were not captured in the original damage assessment.

We will use \$ 13.271.838 (85% of eligible damages) of the \$ 18.2 million allocated for housing grants in the amending agreements, and will, upon effectiveness of the ERRP supplement, make proposals on the reallocation of the balance of about \$ 4.9 million to other priority components of the NERP in sectors covered by the ERRP. In the meantime, we are proceeding to disburse the \$ 8 million allocated in the original ERRP
