

Attached Letter from Mr. Mashler

- 1. This question of circulating the terms of reference for a quinquennial review mission for comment while still in draft form is an old problem which Mashler has, quite rightly, complained about before.
- 2. Originally, Peter Oram and Sir John Crawford took the position that the terms of reference were drafted by the TAC Secretariat, cleared with the center concerned, but were not shown in advance to anyone else. This was the case with the terms of reference of the first quinquennial review mission, the one to IRRI. As soon as Mashler drew this to my attention, I discussed it with Oram and Crawford, and reached agreement with them that in the future draft terms of reference would be circulated to the donors to the center in question as well as the Co-Sponsors and the CG Secretariat for comment in time for these comments to be taken into account. The terms of reference for the second guinguennial review mission -- the one to CDMYT -- had by that time already been agreed with CIMMYT and given to the team members, so it was too late to apply the arrangements on that occasion, but Oram promised it would be done in the future. It would appear that in the course of the hand-over from Oram to Mahler, the agreement got lost in the shuffle. This became apparent with respect to the CIF mission. I thereupon took the matter up with Mahler and it was as a result of this intervention that he then circulated the CIAT terms of reference. But once again it was late in the day. I have now discussed this all over again with Webster and Cummings. There is no disagreement in principle, but the implementation of the agreement has not been properly carried out. I am hoping for improvement in the future and have so told Mashler.

Dear Warren,

About two weeks ago we received from IDRC an invitation to attend a meeting in Amsterdam on April 5 and 6 to discuss the establishment of an agro-forestry institute and to inquire whether UNDP would be prepared to contribute to it. This issue was discussed at the initiative of IDRC by the most recent meeting of the TAC in Rome, which endorsed the idea but did not commit itself to recommending it for consideration by the Consultative Group itself. While I do not propose to discuss the substance of the proposal, I am merely referring to it as one of a number of issues that have come over quite a period of time, and continue to be, under consideration by TAC without having the slightest chance of being considered by the CGIAR for financing in the near and distant future. I have in mind such items as the water buffalo, aquaculture, vegetable research, to mention a few. Taking into account the recommendations concerning the scope of activities sponsored by the Consultative Group which emerged out of the deliberations of the Review Group, the question that comes to mind is, to what extent TAC should continue to concern itself with matters which seem to have less and less relevance to the CGIAR and to its ability and willingness to finance. I am concerned with the fact that the priorities of the TAC and, for that matter, of the CGIAR, are being diluted with what I consider more and more extraneous issues which are burdening the TAC's work as well as its budget. The question therefore arises whether the time has come for TAC to divest itself of such issues and to focus on matters of immediate concern to the CGIAR.

Since it is obvious that the present budget of TAC as well as future requirements will soon come under review again, it might be useful at this time for us to discuss with Ralph Cummings the whole issue to which I have referred above, and to attempt to resolve some of the main problems that TAC is now facing. As I see it, the real issue which we need to consider is whether TAC can continue to receive for consideration

We are currently reviewing the CGIAR Secretariat's administrative budget as we get close to the end of the fistal year. One of the items in our budget is the contribution made by the World Bank to cover the annual budget of TAC.

In October last year, it was agreed among the three co-sponsors that each of them would contribute \$85,000 to finance the TAC budget for 1977. Historically, the World Bank's contribution has been made in two tranches —one in the spring and one in the autumn. Accordingly, we would expect to make a payment of \$42,500 for the TAC budget before June 30, which is the end of the World Bank's fiscal year.

As far as I know, we have not yet received from the TAC Secretariat a request for the Bank's contribution for 1977. If you could send me a request for the first tranche of \$42,500, I will arrange for payment to be made before the end of June. It is important for us to make this payment during the fiscal year as otherwise we would have an unusually large amount to meet out of the budget for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1978.

Dear Mike,

As we come closer to our deadlines for the preparation of the joint commentaries, I feel it necessary to elaborate further on the details of the cooperative arrangements set out in your letter of 23 December, 1976, and my reply of 14 January, 1977.

With regard to the programme of joint visits, I am pleased to see that our plans have been implemented. I very much appreciated receiving copy of Dan Ritchie's report on ICRISAT and on the Executive Committee Meeting of ICARDA as well as the preliminary notes by John Coulter on ICIPE and WARDA. These will be very helpful in the preparation of the draft programme sections of the commentaries. You should by now have received copy of my report on the ICARDA Programme Committee. Preliminary notes by Brian Webster on IITA and by myself on IBPGR should follow next week, so that you may have advance information on the points we shall raise in the draft programme sections.

Regarding the preparation of the commentaries, I wish to confirm my intention of meeting the end-of-April deadline, in as far as the receipt of the Programme and Budget documents from the centres permits. Earlier in the year, I had planned that Zane Arlidge visit Washington, about mid-April, to attempt an initial harmonization of our draft programme sections with the budget sections of the commentaries prepared by the CG Secretariat. I reasoned that this would prove mutually useful, and would also fit in best with our agreed schedule for the preparation of the commentaries.

Although Dr Coulter has indicated that in his opinion the week beginning 4 April would be the most convenient for Zane Arlidge's visit as far as his own programme or work for April is concerned, I consider that this is too early. Firstly, although we hope to have the Programme and Budget papers from the centres by 1 April, our experience is that we can expect delays of a week or more. This is partly a consequence of the Italian postal service. Secondly, I should like us to have drafted as many as possible of our respective commentary sections before Zane Arlidge goes to Washington.

These will include the draft report of the CIAT Quinquennial Review and the draft programme sections expected to be completed at that time.

Following discussions at the Fourteenth TAC Meeting, the terms of reference, timing and composition of the team to visit CIAT have been finalized in consultation with the Chairman of TAC, the Director General of CIAT, and the Team Leader of the mission, Sir Herbert Pereira, taking into account suggestions received from TAC members and from CIAT.

The Executive Secretary of TAC, who will act as Secretary to the review team, met with Sir Herbert Pereira in London on 24 January, 1977. A list of questions for consideration by the review team, and a provisional programme were discussed and agreed upon. These were then submitted to the Director General of CIAT for comment, and, once agreement has been reached on the content, will be communicated to the team members.

- '10. Outreach activities, their present scope, their impact and future plans: relations with the host country, ICA and other national programmes: regional representation and impact on extension activities.
- 11. Training: needs, levels and effectiveness: relative importance of training in production agronomy as compared with research work.
- 12. Quarantine problems and needs, especially for the movement of tissue cultures.

TERMS OF REFERENCE

The major objective of such missions has been defined by TAC in agreement with the Directors of the International Centres as follows:

"on behalf of the Consultative Group, to assess the quality and value of the scientific programmes of the Centres in order to assure the Consultative Group members that the operations being funded are being carried out in line with declared policies and to the full international standard expected."

It is hoped that the review will <u>inter</u> <u>alia</u> assist the International Centres themselves in planning their programmes and ensuring the validity of the research priorities recognized by the Boards of the Centres.

In pursuance of the main objective, defined above, the Mission is requested to give particular attention to the following aspects of the Work of the Centre:

- (i) the results of past research and training programmes at the Centre and the use to which the results have been (or are planned to be) put;
- (ii) the relevance, scope, content and objectives of the present and planned programmes of research at the Centre in relation to (a) the broad mandate of the Centre, and (b) the immediate and long-term needs for increased food supplies globally, and to advise on the future composition and balance of the programme of research;
- (iii) the current conference and training programmes being undertaken or planned by the Centre and the factors affecting the use of trainees by the recipient countries once their training has been completed;
- (iv) the effectiveness of the work conducted under the information service and outreach programmes of the Centre, and its impact on recipient countries;
- (v) the expenditures of the Centre in relation to the quantity, nature and quality of its research and training programmes;
- (vi) the adequacy of the resources available to implement the programmes of research and training recommended above;
- (vii) the constraints which may be hindering the achievement of the Centre's objectives, and possible means of reducing or eliminating such constraints;
- (viii) the effectiveness of coordination of activities at the Centre, both in respect of internal consistency and balance of programme elements, and in particular with reference to its linkages with other national and international organizations.

On the basis of its review, the Mission will report to the Chairman of TAC its views on the need for any changes in the basic objectives or orientation of the Centre's programme elements, and on means of improving the efficiency of operations, and will make proposals for overcoming any constraints identified under item (vii). While the Mission should feel free to make any observations or recommendations it wishes, it mus be clearly understood that the Mission cannot commit the sponsoring organization, viz., the CGIAR/TAC.

Dear Mr. Mahler,

As in the past, it has again come to my attention that this time the terms of reference for the quinquennial review mission to CIAT were not circulated for comment by members of the CGIAR. I received the draft terms of reference under the cover of a memorandum issued by you on 3 March as one of the documents which were tabled in open session "at the fifteenth meeting of TAC" and "could not be distributed in advance of the sessions".

I would like to repeat once again that the quinquennial review missions cannot be considered as being esoteric exercises but were designed by the CGIAR to serve as a review to guide the Centres and the donors in their work and decisions. That being the case, I fail to see why the TAC, which is the technical advisory arm of the CGIAR, cannot circulate terms of reference in respect of these missions, the timing of which is known well ahead of their being fielded, to the member donors of the CGIAR for their comments. As I pointed out previously, individual donors may use the quinquennial review as a means of having the mission look into certain substantive aspects of the work of a Centre which may not be covered by the rather broad and general terms of reference. To some, including us, the quinquennial review mission serves as a means of establishing accountability for our involvement with them. I would therefore appreciate it if in future a formal note be addressed to all donors along the lines I have set out above, well ahead of the time of the fielding of review missions. I hope you will not take this letter as a rebuke or anything of the kind, but merely as a reminder that we consider the quinquennial review missions to be an important tool in assessing the work we are financing and for that reason would like to have a chance to ask questions. I am sure that this matter can easily and without undue burdens be dealt with in future.

EEC

- 1. I visited Brussels on January 17, and reviewed the arrangements for the EEC contribution to ICRISAT, using the IBRD Trust Account.
- 2. The EEC will deposit half of its 1977 contribution (or \$1.25 million) into the IBRD Account as soon as ICRISAT and the EEC have agreed on a "cost estimate." The Director General of ICRISAT would then request the Bank to transfer the funds to the ICRISAT account. Two other installments would be made on submission by ICRISAT to the EEC of quarterly statements of expenditure.
- 3. On the basis of my discussion, I prepared a note for Dr. Cummings on preparation of the cost estimate (Annex I). I also prepared a note indicating the approach which ICRISAT might use with the EEC to ensure maximum flexibility (Annex II).
- 4. Eggers of EEC indicated that they were planning on an allocation of three million units of account for 1978 (\$3.75 million). They hoped to provide contributions to the Latin Centers. In fact, the EEC would be prepared to consider any center except those located in Africa. The EEC may want to play a residual donor role; they would work out their contributions after the CG pledging session.

Belgium

- 5. I called on the Belgians also on January 17. Mme. Vervaleke was away. I spoke with Messrs, de Langhe, Ramboux and de Smet. The essential items agreed were as follows:
 - (a) ICIPE - Belgium is prepared to consider some short-term financing for the ICIPE-IITA cooperative program. I promised to send them ICIPE materials as soon as possible;
 - (b) Belgium is prepared to consider an additional contribution to CARIS in 1977. We should write formally asking for consideration of an additional pledge of about \$50,000. (I informed Mahler in Rome);
 - (c) The contributions to CIAT and CIMMYT for 1976 had finally been deposited in the IBRD Account with the National Bank of Belgium; the CIP contribution was to be deposited momentarily. I suggested this mechanism should not be used agais. It was confirmed that it had been done in 1976 as

Thank you for your letter of January 3. I would agree with you that although Camus is sometimes apologetic about his command of English, he is, in fact, quite fluent in the language. His considerable experience on the TAC, his very broad experience as the director of a large research complex, his knowledge of the tropics and his sound judgment, make him the best candidate for Vice Chairman from among the members from developed countries.

I think the members of TAC should themselves choose the Vice Chairman. In doing so, however, I would hope they would recognize that the membership of TAC itself is carefully balanced between those from the developed countries and those from the LDCs, and I would hope they would see the merit, other things being equal, of maintaining that balance as between the Chairman and the Vice Chairman.

Both Blumenschein and Hussein Idris look like good candidates from developing countries. Both have had considerable experience in research management and both appear to be fair-minded and have sound judgment. A point in favor of Blumenschein is that he is still active in research management, whereas Hussein Idris, as a Minister, is involved at the political level. As between them, I too would lean towards Blumenschein.



I have now been able to go over your letter of December 28, with enclosures, on which you invited my comments. I will address my comments to several of the points covered in your letter of December 23 to Philippe Mahler.

With reference to ICIPE, I found the memorandum of December 17, which was distributed to the Consultative Group members and Center Directors a very useful presentation of the background and one which posed some of the essential questions. I shall be interested in learning of the responses and shall look forward to conferring further as you suggest, as the strategy paper is under preparation.

With reference to items 7 to 13, it seems to me that you have outlined a logical program for preparation of the commentaries on center programs and budgets and for preparation of the integrative paper. I hope there won't be too much slippage in actually carrying this out. It seems to me that you have provided in a logical way for joint participation of the two secretariats and for consultation with the center directors and the TAC. I don't have any better suggestions at the moment. I shall be discussing this with the TAC secretariat at the time of the 15th TAC meeting in Rome late this month. If I have any further suggestions as I get more deeply into TAC affairs, I'll forward them. I expect to be free of my responsibilities as Director of ICRISAT in early March and will then have more time available for TAC. I shall wish to keep in as close touch as possible with both Secretariats.

1. Thank you for your letter of 23 December which we discussed on the telephone on Wednesday. I would now like to confirm and expand on a few points stemming from our discussion.

Joint Visits

- 2. Mr. Webster will visit ICIPE, IITA and WARDA along with Dr. Coulter and Mr. Hayman during the second and third weeks of February. They could leave Rome on either Monday evening, 7 February, or Tuesday 8 February, as I would like Mr. Webster to be available on the 7th to review with me the outcome of the 15th TAC meeting.
- 3. I am ready to attend the meeting of the Programme Committee of ICARDA on 22-23 January, and, along with Mr. Ritchie, the Executive Committee of ICARDA on 24-25 January. I understand you will suggest to the ICARDA Board that an invitation be sent to me to this effect.
- 4. I have noted that Mr. Griffiths will be visiting Mr. Pichel around 4 February. It is our understanding and that of Mr. Pichel that this visit will essentially deal with the format and the presentation of the IBPGR Budget in line with established standards. Mr. Pichel may, however, wish to take advantage of Dr. Coulter's presence in Rome on 7 February to give him some advance information on the substance of the draft programme of IBPGR for 1978.
- 5. We have agreed that there is no need for a joint visit to ICRISAT at this stage since the purpose of the forthcoming travel of Mr. Ritchie to Hyderabad is confined to the construction programme of the Centre.

6. I would suggest that Dr. Coulter stop-over in Rome on his way back from ICIPE, IITA and WARDA to finalize with Mr. Webster the draft comments on the IITA and WARDA programmes, and the draft strategy paper on ICIPE. At this time Dr. Coulter might also review with us the IBPGR programme of work and budget for 1978 which should by then have been reviewed and approved by the Board.

Documentation Preparation Schedule

- 7. The delays involved in correspondence from and to the Centres make it very unlikely that all the Programmes of Work and Budget papers will have reached us in Rome by April 1. As I shall be away myself during the second half of that month for the CIAT Quinquennial Review, I do not think it possible to have all the draft 'programme' sections of the Commentaries ready by April 29 for comments by the Centres. Those which will be ready by that time will be sent to the Centres concerned and to TAC members along with the documents for the 16th TAC meeting. The others will be made available at the meeting in Cali, which as you know will be attended by the Centre Directors. The Directors will have an opportunity to review these draft comments before they make their presentation to TAC.
- 8. We agreed that the draft programme sections of the Commentaries will not be submitted to TAC for a formal clearance and therefore, as was pointed out to you by Sir John Crawford I understand, TAC and its Chairman in particular will not feel bound by these Commentaries which will remain a responsibility of our Secretariats. I consider it my duty, however, to ensure that the TAC Secretariat contributions to these Commentaries, in their final form, will fully reflect the views of TAC as expressed at the 16th meeting of the Committee. It is also my understanding that prior to this meeting the TAC Secretariat will take the initiative of identifying the programme issues and of commenting on these as a preparation for seeking the views of TAC.

Format

- 9. Your proposed format for the Commentaries includes a number of items of a purely descriptive nature on the mandate, programme, and progress of the Centres which are likely to duplicate the introductory statement requested in the Programme and Budget submissions. I feel that the Commentaries should be confined to actual comments and observations and that substantive information on the programmes and budgets of the Centres should be included only when of direct relevance to the Commentaries. Should you find it essential to have general factual information included in the Commentaries, this could best be prepared by the Centres themselves, although this may further duplicate their written and verbal presentations to TAC and to the CG.
- 10. TAC and its Secretariat will certainly have an interest in commenting on the section 'Institutional Relationships' which is of direct relevance to the programme aspects. As to the section on 'Issues', obviously its outline will vary with the Centre concerned. It must, of course, include issues related to new programmes, new special projects, programme shifts and the implementation of recommendations of Quinquennial Reviews.

11. It is clear that we shall have to be flexible on both the procedures and the format for these Commentaries. Of most importance at this stage is to have reached this mutual understanding on our cooperation and to continue to remain in close and frequent contact so as to adjust our schedules and our contributions as we proceed. You can rest assured that the small reservations which I have made above are in no way an attempt to limit our cooperation but rather a constructive effort to ensure that we embark on a realistic and feasible programme with attainable objectives for our respective Secretariats.

SUBJECT: Collaboration with TAC Secretariat

1. Mr. Mahler telephoned Tuesday, January 11, in response to our letter of December 23 which he had just received.

- 2. On Joint Visits he confirmed that Webster would be available for visits to West Africa and Nairobi. Webster would get in touch with Mr. Coulter about the timing of his departure for Nairobi. Mahler suggested that Coulter and Hayman return to Washington via Rome so that they could join with the TAC Secretariat in a discussion with the Genes Board Secretariat about its 1978 program. The Genes Board Executive Committee would have met by that time. With respect to ICARDA, Mahler is eager to attend the Program Committee meeting on January 22 and 23. I said we would immediately seek to get him an invitation.
- 3. Mahler asked whether John Griffith's visit to Pichel on February 4 would be just to discuss budgetary procedures or would also be for discussing program. I said I thought it was the former.
- On the Document Preparation Schedule Mahler said that he felt that it was not possible for the TAC Secretariat to produce draft program sections of the commentaries for circulation in advance of the TAC meeting. He proposed that they be "tabled" at the TAC meeting and hence available for the center directors on their arrival in Cali. I did not have in front of me at the time I was talking to him the attachment to our letter of December 23, and now that I look at it, I am not quite clear whether Mahler was saying that it would not be possible to get action number 7 accomplished by May 13 (or whatever is the date sufficiently in advance of the TAC meeting to ensure receipt of the TAC member ahead of time) or whether he was in effect saying that it would not be possible to get out the draft program sections to the centers and the CG Secretariat by April 29 (action number 4). If the former, this may not be a serious problem, but if the latter, it means that neither the center directors nor the CG Secretariat will have had anything from the TAC Secretariat before the Cali meeting. This would be very unsatisfactory. (Since dictating the above, I have received a copy of the TAC Secretariat work program. It is ambiguous on this point, but seems to tip toward the second interpretation.)
- 5. Mahler did say, however, that for some of the centers, he saw no problem meeting the timetable. The ones he mentioned were IITA, WARDA and ICARDA. These presumably came to his mind because they are mentioned for joint visits in the first part of the letter.

_ - 2 -January 13, 1977 Files The implication seems to be -- but this needs checking -- that Mahler is dubious about being able to do any work on the program sections during April because of other commitments, of which the Quinquennial Review of CIAT is the principal one (See TAC work program). Mahler next commented on the relationship between the TAC Secretariat's part of the commentary and the input from TAC itself. He did not refer to an earlier idea he had had -- namely, that the summary minutes of the TAC meeting with respect to the centers' programs could serve both as TAC's official minutes and as the program sections of the commentaries. However, his remarks on the necessity of consistency between TAC's views and the Secretariat's comments suggested that he saw a more formal relationship between these two than I did (and, I think, than did the Review Committee and the Group). As we discussed this question, I agreed that the TAC Secretariat's comments had to take account of the views of TAC, and I think I understood him to say that this did not in any way imply that the content of the program sections of the commentaries had to be "cleared" with TAC. I emphasized to him, as had been done in the letter, that the Group expected these commentaries to be the work of the two Secretariats and not of the CG Secretariat on the one hand and TAC on the other. I think he now understands this, but I am not sure how he proposes to proceed. This is a matter to be discussed further. On the Draft Commentaries Outline paper Mahler's only comment was that Item 1 under Section II, "General description of strategy and programs; new programs for 1978, beyond 1978," should be prepared by the centers themselves. In fact, he may have been referring to all Items I through 8. I told him that I thought the task would become impossible if we sought to have the centers themselves write part of the commentaries. There would be inconsistencies in presentation both as between commentaries and internally within each commentary. Moreover, to leave an important part of the task such as this to twelve centers and programs would make it impossible to keep up to time. I felt strongly that the production of these commentaries was the responsibility of the Secretariats and they would have to do the work themselves, drawing, of course, from the information supplied by the centers and, if necessary, putting questions to them. I am not sure he was convinced. Mahler said that he would put his comments in a letter. Obviously, however, we will not receive this before Dan Ritchie departs and probably not before John Coulter leaves. Therefore, even before getting his letter, we should clarify our position on the various issues so that they may be discussed by Ritchie and Coulter in Rome. dunny cc: Messrs. ON THAT OCCASION AFTER CONSULTATION BETWEEN CG CHAIRMAN AND TAC CHAIRMAN QUESTION OF TAC VICE CHAIRMAN WAS DISCUSSED IN EXECUTIVE SESSION OF TAC WHICH DEALT WITH SEVERAL MATTERS AFFECTING SERVICE OF TAC MEMBERS. IN SUBSEQUENT OPEN SESSION VICE CHAIRMAN WAS ELECTED BY TAC MEMBERS THEMSELVES. - 1. With reference to Cummings's inquiry about the procedure of appointing a Vice Chairman of TAC, I have checked with Oram and Demuth. It is clear that in practice what happened was that Crawford and Demuth agreed between them, ahead of the initial meeting of TAC, that Swaminathan was the obvious candidate. The question was presumably discussed in an executive session of TAC, which, among other things, discussed the staggered terms of the initial TAC members. We have no minutes of this executive session, and neither Oram nor Demuth can remember whether they were present or what transpired. The record shows, however, that immediately after the executive session, Swaminathan was unanimously elected Vice Chairman in open session.
- 2. I think it is highly desirable that election of a TAC Vice Chairman be left to TAC itself. Certainly we do not wish to get involved in a procedure which requires the Co-Sponsors, or a special selection committee of the CG, to make a recommendation to the CG as a whole which would then make the appointment. This would be much too heavy-handed and fraught with potential problems. Neither do I think it should be a personal prerogative of either the Chairman of TAC or the Chairman of the Group to appoint the TAC Vice Chairman. Nevertheless, I think the views of both of them should be given due weight.
- The attached reply to Cummings tells him what happened last time and makes suggestions for the future. It leaves open, for the time being, any definitive suggestion on your part. There is an issue here. Normally I think it would be wise to choose as Vice Chairman one of the TAC members from a developing country. It is a useful way to demonstrate the wish to have the client countries participate in the management of the System. John Coulter makes two points, however, which you should consider. First, the two best candidates from the developing countries are Idris and Blumenschein. Both hold responsible jobs in their own countries, but both have had only one year on TAC; it would be useful to give them another year and a chance for Cummings to size them up before electing one. Moreover, there is likely to be pressure to have the next Chairman (who might possibly take over when Cummings completes his three years) from a developing country and an incumbent vice chairman would be a strong candidate, even if his term had to be extended beyond four years for the purpose. Therefore, we should be very sure of the quality of the Vice Chairman incumbent at the time. Second, Cummings is new and it might be well to have, at least for the first year, a seasoned TAC member as vice chairman. This would suggest Camus.

- 4. Because of these considerations, the cable does not come down clearly on the issue of whether the next vice chairman should come from a developing country.
- I think Coulter's views are well worth considering, though my own view is that the vice chairman over the next year is likely to be symbolic rather than operational, and while a Frenchman would be a useful choice (because of Pagot, etc.) a Sudanese or a Brazilian would fit the overall situation better. But a decision on this issue can await Cummings's consultation with you, and hence the cable leaves the issue open. If you want to close it, we can change the cable.

Thank you for your letter of December 8 and your comments on the selection of members of TAC.

Every member of TAC serves in his individual capacity and, as you say, is selected for his individual competence. The Secretariat, on behalf of the Co-Sponsors and the Group in general, maintains a roster of possible candidates. For the most part this roster is built up from the suggestions made by members of the Group who, from time to time, are specifically asked to make suggestions. While the roster is fairly long, it would be disingenuous to say that it is exhaustive or comprehensive and sometimes we find that the number of potential candidates with competence in a particular discipline is small. Water management is an example.

In making their recommendations to the Group, the Co-Sponsors are at pains to ensure that the membership of TAC includes experts in the various fields and with experience of the various regions with which the system of research supported by the Group is concerned. Moreover, it was agreed by the Group at the beginning that half the members of TAC would be drawn from the developed countries and half from the developing countries, and that among the latter some would, if practicable, be drawn from each of the major regions of the developing world.

You can be assured, however, that while attention is given to this balance between members from the developed and the developing countries, members of TAC are selected for their individual competence in the fields of interest to the Group. Nationality and political considerations play no more part than is implicit in the policies I have described.

I should add that in considering each candidate, the Co-Sponsors, with the help of the Secretariat, check his qualifications, experience and suitability with persons who know him. Furthermore, initial appointment is for two years. It is intended that TAC members who do not meet the standards of the Group will not have their appointments renewed for a second term. I would be glad to answer any further questions on this or any other aspect of the CGIAR you may have. When I am next in London, I hope very much to see you and if you come to Washington meantime, please come to see us.

It is essential that ICIPE produce an appropriate Program and Budget paper for 1978 and I feel a joint visit would be very useful. Dr. Odhiambo would welcome a visit about February 7.
- 3. Regarding ICARDA, Dan Ritchie is tentatively planning to attend the ICARDA Executive Committee meeting in London January 24-25. There is a Program Committee meeting also on January 22-23. I know that falls just before the TAC meeting, but if you feel that you or Brian would find it useful to attend, we would certainly suggest to the ICARDA Board that they invite you. I'm not sure what other time would be available to review ICARDA jointly.
- 4. As for the Genes Board, John Griffith (on loan to us from the Bank's Programming and Budgeting Department) will be visiting Pichel about February 4 for a couple of days to discuss the 1978 Budget. We may have to rely on the TAC Secretariat for any further review with the IBPGR Board.

ICIPE

5. I am enclosing for your information a preliminary paper on ICIPE which we have circulated to the members of the CGIAR and to Center Directors. You will see it is only a fore-runner of the ICIPE strategy paper, giving the background of the situation and mainly dealing with the question of interim (1977) financing of ICIPE. The strategy paper itself, which I agree should be seen and commented on by you and Sir John and Ralph Cummings before issue, will go out later. In fact, it could be drafted jointly following the visit to ICIPE.

1977 Center Presentation Days/Board Meetings

6. We have asked all centers for their 1977 calendar of events, but do not expect to have all the replies before January 10. We will send the calendar as soon as it has been compiled.

Center Program and Budget Submissions

7. Also enclosed are two papers circulated to Center Directors regarding the implementation of the CGIAR Review Committee recommendations. As you will see from the paper on the 1978 Program and Budget Papers, we have asked the Centers to include the introductory program material which you have suggested, and additional information on special projects.

Document Preparation Schedule

- There are two questions here I think we need to clarify a bit. The first relates to the process of preparing the program sections of the commentaries. I have the impression from your letter that you believe the program sections will essentially present the views of TAC, and that it would be TAC's responsibility to identify the issues and action dealing with them. The concept is, I think, a little different. The Bell Subcommittee (which established the procedure) saw it as a function of the Secretariat to comment on each center's Program and Budget Paper and to present an integrative report on the system as a whole, taking into account whatever views it felt were relevant and useful. The only change recommended by the Review Committee was that these commentaries and the integrative report be improved and made more comprehensive by taking program as well as budget questions fully into account in an integrated way. As a means of doing this it was recommended that the two Secretariats collaborate on the commentaries and the integrative report. Obviously we can profit from the views of the TAC members and should take them into account, but as both a formal and a practical matter the commentaries and the integrative report are products of the Secretariats.
- 9. There is also a further practical consideration. If we are to get our task done in the very little time available we shall, between us, have to take the initiative to identify the issues both program and budget issues. We can ask others (including TAC members) to express their views on the issues as we see them, but in order to get the job done efficiently I am sure we are going to have to do the formulation of the issues and our comment on them rather than look to others to do it. The implication is, I believe, that the commentaries in their entirety will need to be in first draft before the TAC meeting so that TAC members will have something to react to.
- 10. This brings me to the second point of clarification. Customarily, we have tried to resolve budget issues with the Centers before the commentaries are finalized. I believe the Center Directors would

Mr. P. J. Mahler December 23, 1976 Page three

appreciate seeing our draft sections on both budget and program before the TAC meeting, so that they know what the issues are and can prepare a response, if required. This suggests that we should submit our draft sections to the Center Directors well before the TAC meeting to permit time for a response. There would probably not be time to revise the drafts before they are given to TAC members, but the responses from the Centers could be circulated at the TAC meeting, and taken into account in the discussion.

- 11. Since the budget sections would presumably not need to be given to TAC in advance of the meeting (and would be made available to TAC members at the meeting only if they felt it would be useful), we would use most of May to revise the draft budget sections and have revisions ready by the end of the month.
- 12. The mechanics of producing the commentaries would therefore be as follows:
 - (a) Each commentary would be divided into sections.
 - (b) The initial drafting of each section would be allocated to one or the other Secretariat.
 - (c) As soon as each section is drafted, it would be sent for comment to (i) the other Secretariat and (ii) the Center concerned.
 - (d) The Secretariats would exchange comments on each other's drafts.
 - (e) Center comments (whether on budget or program) would be sent to both Secretariats.
 - (f) Prior to the TAC meeting, TAC members would be given whatever is the latest draft of the program sections available at the time, and at the TAC meeting they would be given a later draft, if there is one, plus the Center's comments.
 - (g) With the TAC members' views and the Centers' comments in mind, the two Secretariats would then produce a final complete draft.

To simplify matters, I attach a brief outline schedule which identifies the major steps, timing and responsibility. I believe it is a workable plan and I would appreciate your comments on it.

13. Enclosed also is a suggested format for the 1977 Secretariat

Commentaries. I would appreciate your thoughts and suggestions. We have also done a first draft on the format and coverage of the Integrative Report. We will be doing a second draft shortly, and will be sending it along in early January.

Payment for Quinquennial Reviews

14. Finally, regarding payment for the costs of the Quinquennial Reviews (your cable of December 15), I believe the simplest solution would be for the TAC Secretariat to submit an invoice directly to the center for the actual costs incurred by TAC. The center could charge to its own budget any costs which it has incurred.



Appointment of New TAC Members

- 1. We circularized the CG membership sometime ago with the Co-Sponsors' recommendations of new members for TAC. The deadline for comments was about this time. As soon as the deadline has passed, and providing there are no objections or comments which give rise to problems, we should promptly get official appointment letters out to the new members.
- 2. I expect that the form of letter we used last year can be used again, but can you please specifically check this? As I remember, last year we also sent new members a cable at the same time as dispatching the appointment letter so as to give them a little advance notice. We should do the same again this year, particularly in the light of the short time remaining before the January TAC meeting.
- 3. As soon as appointment cables and letters have gone out, the TAC Secretariat will have to write to each new member giving him the terms and conditions of service, etc. and advising him of the upcoming TAC meeting, if they have not already done so. In a recent letter from me to Philippe Mahler I laid out the procedure in some detail including reminding him that the TAC Chairman (Crawford? Cummings?) will also probably wish to send a welcoming letter to the new members.
- 4. To clew up these new appointments, there are quite a lot of things to be done, but they are all pretty routine. Could you please set it all in motion? The specific actions required are:
 - a. Checking whether we have arrived at the deadline for comments from CG members, and whether the comments received give rise to any problem. (In this connection you will find a letter from Whitelegg of the United Kingdom which is a bit stuffy about the appointment of Abou Khaled. Would you please read it and consider whether it warrants a reply. If it does, could you please draft one for my signature?)
 - Preparation of appointment letters for Warren Baum's signature.
 - c. Preparation of a cable to each appointee for my signature advising him that an appointment letter is on the way.
 - d. Preparation of cable for Mahler saying no objections have been received, appointment letters and cables have been dispatched, and reminding him about welcoming letters from the TAC Chairman.

We have been taking the necessary steps to clear away the new TAC appointments. You will already have received a copy of the memorandum which has been sent to all CGIAR members. For your information I enclose another as well as a copy of a telex which has been sent to the more distant members so as to alert them and copies of letters I have sent to the candidates.

We have a standard procedure for the appointment of TAC members which is laid out in a letter I wrote to Peter Oram on January 9, 1975. In the past, Sir John Crawford has at that point send a personal welcoming letter to each new member. I am not sure whether he drafted these himself or whether these were done for him by the TAC Secretariat. You may wish to look into this and to consider whether welcoming letters this time should go out from Dr. Cummings.

Immediately after the appointment letters are sent the TAC Secretariat issues a standard information letter on terms and conditions, etc. to each new member, of which you send us a copy. From there on the TAC members are entirely in your hands until the end of their term of service, at which time the Chairman of the Group sends them a brief letter of thanks. This will be done again this year for those whose terms are expiring, and we shall send you copies.

It all seems a bit complicated, but it is routine and I expect it to go entirely smoothly. If you foresee any hitch or problem, please let me know.

Appointment of Members to the Technical Advisory Committee

- 1. On August 5, 1976, we circulated a memorandum on the election of Technical Advisory Committee members and invited members of the Consultative Group to suggest candidates to fill five vacancies on TAC arising at the end of 1976.
- 2. The Co-Sponsors have reviewed all the suggestions and information put forward in response to the August 5th memorandum as well as that already on hand from submissions made last year. With so many vacancies arising and considering that TAC will have a new Chairman beginning in January, they believe it wise to ensure some continuity in filling the five vacancies. This is reflected in their recommendations.

Under a procedure foreseen in the August 5th memorandum, Dr. Ruttan's present two-year term would be extended for one year to December 31, 1977. The others would be appointed to two-year terms ending December 31, 1978. Biographies of Dr. Abou Khaled, Dr. Ishikura and Dr. Hopper are attached, and one of Dr. Joshi, Director of the Indian Agricultural Research Institute, will follow shortly.

4. Members are asked for their early agreement to these recommendations so the nominees may be appointed in good time to attend the next TAC meeting at the end of January 1977 to be held in Rome. Any comments on these nominations should reach the Secretariat by December 20, 1976. In the absence of objection, we plan to notify the candidates of their appointment by December 31, 1976.

Dear Mike,

Yesterday I sent a cable in reply to your request for my comments on the draft minutes of the last cosponsors' meeting made at the end of your letter of 16 November, 1976, as I thought you may want to finalize these as soon as possible. I wish now to cover the other points raised in your letter regarding our cooperation in 1977.

Joint Visits

I agree in general with your proposals for joint visits to the IARCs, and with the schedule which reflects my earlier discussions with John Coulter and Dan Ritchie. IITA, WARDA, and possibly some aspects of the work done by ICRISAT and CIMMYT in West Africa could be covered by Mr Webster in February, after the 15th TAC Meeting. Discussions with the IBPGR Secretariat could then be held in Rome after the visits to IITA and WARDA, and in conjunction with the meeting of the IBPGR Board. As far as ICARDA is concerned, I feel that, besides the consultation with IDRC, a joint visit to meet with the Acting Director and the Chairman of the Board may be necessary.

I shall leave it to your Secretariat to make the necessary arrangements with the centres concerned for these visits and for their timing, and would like to receive confirmation from you as soon as possible. I would also appreciate receiving a copy of the schedule of IARC Presentation Days and Board Meetings for 1977 which I understand has been compiled by your Secretariat.

As far as ICIPE is concerned, during his visit to Rome last week Dr Cummings raised the question as to whether this could actually be considered as finished business for TAC. I would recommend that, prior to issuing a paper on ICIPE for distribution to CGIAR members, you give Sir John Crawford, Dr Cummings, and myself an opportunity to comment.

Centre Commentaries and Integrative Report

I look forward to receiving your suggestions regarding the format and coverage of the Centre Commentaries and Integrative Report. As you know, my approach would be to try to frame the discussions of TAC and its report at the May meeting in Cali in such a way that extracts of the report can be directly incorporated into the commentaries.

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Centre Programme and Budget Submissions

The preparation of the commentaries and the related contributions from TAC would be greatly facilitated if the centres could agree on the broad lines of a common format for the presentation of their programmes. In line with the recent discussions at the CGIAR meeting last October, I would strongly recommend that the programme and budget documents include an introductory statement on:-


- (i) the interpretation of the mandate of the centre;
- (ii) its present and future strategies;
- (iii) major achievements in the course of the past year;
- (iv) proposed new activities;
 - (v) main qualitative and quantitative changes in ongoing activities.

Where appropriate, these introductory statements should include reference to action taken as a consequence of the recommendations of the quinquennial reviews and of TAC comments on the programmes and budgets of the preceding year. I would consider this statement as an essential condition to enable our Secretariats to identify issues in time for the preparation of commentaries and the centre programmes, as you suggest. I agree that the CIAT and ILRAD submissions for 1977 could serve as models, providing that the above introductory statement is also included. Moreover, I think we should insist on having the costs of the main programme activities clearly identified, especially those which are new or subject to change, and those of the special projects. If you agree with these requirements, I would appreciate it if you could ask the centres to modify the programme sections of their documents accordingly. I feel that this introductory statement would not involve much extra work for the centres since they prepare an introduction for oral presentation to their Boards, TAC and Centres' Week.

I also agree with you that it is the TAC Secretariat's task to analyze these programme documents and identify the issues. It is, however, my understanding that the final commentaries on these issues will be those of TAC, as set out in the TAC report.

Document Preparation Schedule

I agree in general with your proposed schedule, although it may prove unrealistic to attempt to identify issues and make comments before receipt of the centres' submissions, even in respect of those centres on which we are best informed! Of course, the issues which were raised by the quinquennial reviews, or by TAC, on the preceding submissions can serve as a starting point. With regard to the distribution of draft commentaries, I think they should not only go to the centre directors but also to TAC members before the end of the May meeting. Then, I would expect that the TAC Secretariat's contributions to the commentaries after the TAC meeting would be rather limited if, as I hope, relevant excerpts from the TAC report can be used for this purpose. You can rest assured that, in any case, we stand ready to assist you as best we can with these commentaries as well as with the sintegrative report for which we may also use some of the general observations made by TAC and the CG Review Committee during their last meetings.



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Centre Forward Planning, Programme Balance and Optimum Size

I agree with your cautious approach in this respect. At the same time, I think we should already have, this year, an outline on the overall strategy of the centres for the next five years and a five-year plan for all centres in their submissions in early 1978. CIP has already been requested to outline its five-year programme for the quinquennial review and, as you know, CIAT made an attempt in this direction last year.

We have certainly got a busy year ahead of us, and you can count on our cooperation in this respect. I think that, if the submissions from the centres and the draft comments for TAC consideration are properly framed, we can avoid considerable duplication of effort in the preparation of documents for TAC and for the CGIAR.

I am sending copies of your letter and of my reply to Sir John Crawford and Dr Cummings, and I would recommend that you take no action prior to having received their reactions to the proposed arrangements. Perhaps you have already sent copies of your letter to them. It would be helpful if, in future, you would indicate that you do so on the original of your correspondence to me.

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

Dear Philippe:

We have now begun to address ourselves to the "fallout" from the Consultative Group meeting, and I wanted to follow up with you on several matters regarding our prospective joint activities.

To be able to produce joint Center Commentaries and the 1977 Integrative Report, I believe we must agree promptly on a coordinated schedule of work. This includes joint visits to selected centers and an agreement on the format, coverage, and mutual responsibilities for the material to be produced. Let me cover these matters separately.

Joint Visits

I believe you have talked briefly with John Coulter and Dan Ritchie about the schedule of visits to several international centers. For joint visits, I believe we should concentrate on CIP, CIAT, ILCA, IITA and WARDA for 1977. I enclose some comments which explain the zeasons for focusing on these centers. Joint visits to CIP and CIAT will take place in the course of the Quinquennial Reviews; we will also be together for the ILCA Program Committee and Board meetings. For IITA and WARDA I believe we should schedule a joint visit, possibly just after the Rome TAC meeting. Several donors have expressed concern over IITA's diffuse program and high costs, and I woulk like to suggest a joint visit in about mid-February.

Center Commentaries and Integrative Report

We will be sending you before Christmas our suggestions regarding the format and coverage of the Center Commentaries and Integrative Report. I believe the 1977 Commentaries can be somewhat similar to the 1976 ones, with a condensed financial section and an enlarged program issues section. We are developing ideas on the Integrative Report as well, and will try to prepare an outline and some draft sections for discussion before the February TAC meeting.

Center Program and Budget Submissions

I hope that the TAC Secretariat will be able to produce program analyses of all the centers, not only those for which a visit is scheduled. To ensure you have the kind of information required, I would appreciate your reviewing this year's program and budget proposals from the centers and advise us of any changes or additions in the program content in each document which you feel would be helpful. I believe the CIAT and ILRAD budget papers, for example, are relatively thorough in their program descriptions, and you may feel no changes are quired if all centers could follow the pattern of these two centers. Please let us know as soon as possible if you would wish us to ask any center to modify the program sections of their P&B submissions. We should notify the centers involved by the end of the year.

Document Preparation Schedule

As you know, we are scheduled to receive the draft P&B submissions on April 1. We must aim, I think, at having the financial and program sections of the Secretariat commentaries drafted (separately) by early May at the latest, in time to have them combined and sent to the centers for comment before the May/June TAC meeting. To meet a schedule as tight as this, I think it essential to begin drafting the program sections even before the P&B submissions are received for those centers on whose programs we are best informed. This would ease the pressure during April, and enable us to send combined commentaries to the Center Directors well before the TAC meeting. Perhaps you could also visit Washington briefly en route from CIAT, to discuss how to proceed with completion of the commentaries.

Following the TAC meeting in June, I also feel the two Secretariats' staff should work together, probably in Washington, for two weeks to complete the Center Commentaries and the Integrative Report. To do all this in two weeks will mean that the Integrative Report (except for the final figures for 1978) should also be drafted well in advance. It should be done before April 1 if possible.

I am attaching an ottline work cycle which I believe would enable us to prepare our integrated documents in good time.

Center Forward Planning, Program Balance and Optimum Size

Another matter on which we must advise the Center Directors relates to the recommendations of the Review Committee regarding the forward planning of research, the balance between research, training, etc., and the somewhat controversial optimum size question. Mr. P. J. Mahler November 16, 1976 Page we three

I think the CG meeting agreed that these matters cannot be considered by the Genters overnight. It requires a good deal of thought, discussion and consideration.

We think an appropriate approach to this question might be through the mechanism of the Quinquennial Reviews. Perhaps the Centers scheduled for a Quinquennial Review could be asked to prepare a paper outlining their longer term objectives, program plans, appropriate balance in their program and other aspects suggested by the Review Committee. This is, of course, also the recommendation of the CIMMYT Review Panel regarding future Quinquennial Reviews. We look forward to hearing from you regarding your instructions to CIAT on this question, and would appreciate discussing this whole matter with you further before the CIAT Quinquennial Review mission planning is too advanced.

Other Matters

I believe you had a couple of suggestions on the draft minutes of the Co-Sponsors' meeting of October 26. Please let us have them at your earliest convenience. We want to issue these minutes as soon as possible.

Regarding TAC membership, as soon as we hear from Joshi, we will be circulating to the Consultative Group the Co-Sponsors' proposals for the appointment of Abou Khaled, Hopper, Ishikura and Joshi, and the extension of Ruttan.

We have a lot to do together between now and the end of July. All of us here are looking forward to working closely with you, Brian and Dr. Arledge.

REVIEW WITH CENTERS OF 1978 PROGRAM AND BUDGET

ILCA. Sir John Crawford and his TAC mission with Philippe Mahler will attend the Board meeting at end of March. Dan Ritchie will also be there. If there are any visits of CG Programming and Budgeting staff to be made to ILCA for the coming year, it would be preferable to have John Griffith or Jane Feldstein visit before this meeting. It is essential next year to avoid the major revisions of ILCA's budget which were necessary this year and last.

ILRAD. This Center was visited recently, and has no particular problems. A visit is probably unnecessary for the time being.

CIAT. There will be a TAC Quinquennial Review in April 1977. Philippe Mahler.will be Secretary and John Coulter hopes to attend. CIAT's budgeting process is in good hands.

CIP. There will be a TAC Quinquennial Review in December 1976. Brian Webster will be Secretary and John Coulter plans to attend. We should decide what additional P&B input would be desirable later.

CIMMYT. The TAC Quinquennial Review has been completed, so that there should be no need for a program review visit. There are still some budgeting problems, and John Griffith may visit.

IITA. This will have a Quinquennial Review late in 1977. There are problems with the capital budget and some donors are uneasy with the expansion of the research program. A 'holding' operation may be appropriate for 1978, and the TAC Quinquennial Review would serve as a basis for planning the 1979 program and budget.

WARDA. It is time to review their program, although Dr. Chandler has been closely involved with it and there are believed to be no major problems.

There could be a joint TAC/CG Secretariat visit to IITA and WARDA. IITA has appointed a new Director of Research and it would be useful to discuss future programs with him.

ICRISAT. The main problem here is the capital program. There is expected to be a delay in the implementation of this and various problems are looming. Dr. Cummings promised the CG Secretariat a revised capital budget for 1977 and 1978 to be ready in time for the 1977 September meeting. John Griffith plans to visit ICRISAT sometime next year. Both the TAC Secretariat and John Coulter visited recently, so there should be no need for another visit.

IRRI. This Center has recently had a Quinquennial Review. No program visit should be necessary. The budgeting process is now in good shape.

IPBGR. This is one Center where we should insist that they give us a proper five-year forward plan, both for the Board's activities and for the activities which they propose to sponsor at the Centers. One donor at least is unhappy that the Board has expanded its functions beyond

what was originally intended. There is also a management problem and the Board should have a plan for solving it. We have talked to Dick Demuth about both of these problems (which are interrelated) and he will be alerting the Executive Committee of the Board to the need for action at its next meeting. The two Secretariats need to consider together how to proceed.

ICARDA. This Center also has a management problem. Responsibility is still dispersed among the Board, the Executing Agency, the Sub-Committee and an 'Acting Director' who, under his present terms of reference, has limited responsibility. Harold Graves and Dan Ritchie (Chairman and Secretary of the Sub-Committee respectively) are visiting IDRC (the Executing Agency) to endeavor to get the Board to arrange for more effective administration during that interim period before the new Director General takes up his duties. The two Secretariats need to consider how to proceed in the light of the actions of the Board.

ICIPE. The CG Secretariat will prepare a paper for distribution to CGIAR members. Meanwhile, we should encourage bilateral donors to collaborate on funding some of the ICIPE/center projects.

Cotton Production Research Centers - Estimated Construction Costs

- 1. As Mr. Ramanujam has requested, I have prepared estimates of the cost of developing two cotton production research centers. These costs are based on the experience of the CGIAR with the establishment of ICRISAT, ILCA and ILRAD.
- 2. You will see from the attached table that the costs of the two stations are estimated as follows:

- 3. The total cost of about \$9\$ million compares with the original Working group estimate of \$20\$ million and the revised estimate of \$12\$ million. John Coulter and I believe \$8-9\$ million should be ample.
- 4. If the two centers are associated with centers such as ICRISAT or the Sudan national cotton research institute, the construction costs of the library, conference and training facilities, housing and site development could be reduced substantially, by perhaps \$2 million.
- 5. Regarding operating costs, the CGIAR centers have an average annual operating cost per senior staff member of \$150,000 to \$230,000. On the basis of 17 senior staff at each cotton research center, the annual operating cost estimated by the Working Group of \$3.28 million appears realistic.

WATER BUFFALO RESEARCH CENTER OF TOWN TO SUMPLY Wood To beep of the CA To beep of the Water And Why FAO

It was recalled that two countries of Asia initially proposed to the survey had confirmed the needs and interests of the survey had confirmed the survey region in this field and proposed an international cooperative buffalo inplin FAO research programme. TAC then called an expert consultation on the subject.

The report of the consultation recommended that an international effort be made to strengthen water buffalo research through the establishment of a cooperative network of national programme. Within this network, some participating national institutions with relatively advanced expertise would be assigned regional responsibilities for leading the common research effort in specific programme areas. The network would be guided by international board or steering committee including representatives of the national and international institutions involved. A coordinating unit and a documentation center would service the network. Their proposed location had been agreed upon by the network e.g. the coordinating unit in Bangkok, Thailand and the documentation center in SEARCA. 1

The consultation recommended that the project be executed through FAO. The consultation further suggested that FAO consider making full use of the mechanisms provided under its Regional Animal Production and health commission of Asia, Far East and South West Pacific in the implementation of the project. It was feel that through this mechanism and that of the international board of the network, the participating national institutions could ensure that the international network programme would respond to their needs for buffalo research and development.

While confirming the need for an international effort for water buffalo research, TAC made a number of comments on the proposal:

- (1) Concern was expressed about the possible risk of disfersion of activities in a cooperative network involving several national institutions. The proposed scheme would however have the advantage of maintaining close links between research and national development programme, providing that development plans of the countries concerned, especially their objectives, were further examined during the elaboration of the cooperative programme.
- (2) A close coordination should be ensured both within the network and outside, in particular with several international centers and programmes such as the Agricultural Information Bank of Asia operated by SEARCA in Liaison with the ABRIS Programme of FAO.

In both cases one country did not concurr with the proposal and reviewed its offer to host these facilities.

- (3) The type of research carried out through the network should be production-oriented and take due account of the actual capabilities and development needs of the national institutions involved.
- (4) The scope of the international effort could be viewed either as that of a docentralized institute or that of an international secretariat servicing national programs. For the time being, TAC recommended a step-by-step approach starting with a preparatory phase while donors may, in a second phase, provide part of the larger support needed directly to the national programmes.

As far as the execution of the project is concerned, TAC

INTERNATIONAL COOPERATIVE BUFFALO RESEARCH PROJECT

The domestic water buffalo population of the world, which numbers about 150 million, constitutes a major source of farm power, milk and meat; that in spite of its great importance to the overall economy of many Asian, Far East and Near East countries, no major effort has been made to increase farm level output from the buffalo through programmes of improved feeding, management and the conservation and use of selected superior germ plasm. It considered that many of the biological and socioeconomic problems limiting the efficiency of production and utilization of the buffalo require careful and intensive research.

This project proposal is a possible alternative to the original proposal for establishing an international buffalo research and training centre to achieve the same purpose. As such, although the magnitude of the investment requirements may be about the same, this proposal would have the advantage of moving the programme at a faster rate and at the same time build the necessary infrastructure for institutionalizing buffalo development schemes by strengthening basic national buffalo research capabilities and maximizing advances in the use of the technology that may be developed.

Objectives of the Project

Long-term objectives

The long-term objectives of the project are to assist the governments of the developing countries in which buffaloes have a potentially important role in agriculture, to strengthen their national buffalo research and development programmes and to establish cooperative arrangements between research institutions and organizations in the different countries, so as to improve their efficiency in the utilization of scarce research resources and in the implementation of research results.

In particular, the project will:

- 1. Build the necessary infrastructure for an international buffalo research and development programme by strengthening the basic national capabilities and maximizing advances in technology developed on an international level.
- 2. Establish a linkage mechanism that would meaningfully weld the national research programmes together in an international network for buffalo development; and thereby
- 3. Improve buffalo production and utilization so that large numbers of the farming population of the developing countries in Asia and the Near East could benefit through improvement of agro-livestock production, increased income and better nutrition.

Immediate objectives

- 1. To catalyze effectively the establishment and strengthening of national buffalo research and development programmes.
- To stimulate new/continuing in-depth assessment of the national buffalo development programmes in the countries concerned, including the identification of benchmark information, developmental constraints, and evolving/updating relevant strategies for national buffalo research and development.
- 3. To utilize the existing resources and capabilities in some of the countries involved and utilize them for research and research training activities which would have implications in several of the countries included in the project, for example, along the following lines:

Egypt - nutrition studies (meat type)

India - dairy production

germ plasm conservation and resource development (dairy buffaloes)

reproductive physiology and artificial insemination (dairy buffeloes)

Pakistan - nutrition (dairy buffaloes)

Philippines - meat production technology

Thailand - reproductive physiology and artificial insemination (meat-type buffaloes)

germ plasm resource conservation and
development (meat-type buffaloes)

Sri Lanka - buffalo diseases, including reproductive disease

- 4. To establish a sustained national documentation programme on the buffalo in each of the countries involved and feed the information into an international buffalo documentation centre which will be established as a repository of information on the buffalo and which would be responsible for dissemination of such information to all interested countries.
- 5. To develop an effective mechanism for interaction between research institutions at the country and international levels; this would

involve <u>inter alia</u> the establishment of research cooperation between institutions active in research on specific subjects with a view to tackling related problems in a concerted manner, by organizing the exchange of information on recent research findings, exchanging staff and consultants, and organizing workshops and seminars on topics of common interest to participating institutions.

6. To establish an international coordinating unit for the project which would develop and implement an effective mechanism for coordinating an international buffalo research development programme.

Institutional Framework

The project shall operate under the basic concept of injecting self-reliance in the various country development schemes. Thus, the project shall operate through the appropriate Ministry of the countries concerned. In so doing, the Government of each participating country shall establish a national buffalo research and development centre, or simply identify an existing institution to serve as such and designate a national research coordinator to liaise with the project.

Buffalo research capabilities are not equally developed in all countries. A few countries, such as Egypt, India, Philippines, Pakistan, Thailand and Sri-Lanka, which have developed some relatively advanced capabilities in certain key areas of buffalo production, will be asked to take on added responsibility in the initial stages, for intercountry cooperation in research and research training.

The project shall be organized through a flexible framework of cooperating national institutions and with a small coordinating unit.

There would be a national buffalo research coordinator in each cooperating country, who would be the national focal point for international cooperation. The project would be headed by a small coordinating unit and an international board, which should include the national coordinators; one representative from the two FAO Commissions concerned (the Regional Animal Production and Health Commission for Asia, the Far East and South-West Pacific; and the Near East Animal Production and Health Commission), and one from FAO Headquarters together with the nominees of the Consultative Group on International Agricultural Research. At board meetings the activities of the project during the coming year would be decided, particularly in relation to equipment, fellowships, consultants, training, workshops and other meetings.

It was considered that the proposed machinery would permit of a high degree of autonomy in the research organization without alienating it from development, and bearing in mind that national research programmes should serve national development. It was agreed that activities and funding should be in accordance with capabilities, and all activities should be thoroughly reviewed by an international board each year.

Considering that the project would involve the channeling of funds to research programmes in a number of different countries, the arranging of workshops and seminars with participants from several national institutes, the use of consultants, and the services of a project director to guide the effective utilization of international inputs into the national buffalo research programmes, and being aware of the fact that the necessary agreements already exist between FAO and the governments concerned for executing projects of this nature, the Expert Consultation recommended that the project should be executed through FAO.

The consultation recommended that the project be executed through FAO. The consultation further suggested that FAO consider making full use of the mechanism provided by the RPHCAP in the implementation of the project. It was felt that through this mechanism and that of the international board of the project, the participating national institutions could exert the necessary control and supervision of the project so as to insure that the project will respond to their needs for buffalo research and development.

The consultation discussed tentative arrangements and an interantional cooperative buffalo research project proposed here could initially involve seven countries (Egypt, India, Indonesia, Pakistan, Philippines, Sri Lanka and Thailand) which collectively have some 70 percent of the world's buffalo population. However, as the project develops additional countries may be brought into the programme of cooperation. For research training the project would be open from the beginning to selected participants also from other countries with sizeable buffalo population.

It is proposed that the support to the International Cooperative Buffalo Research Project (ICBRP) be phased as follows: a preparatory phase in year 1, and an establishment phase in years 2 and 3. It should be stressed that the proposed budget for the establishment phase are purely indicative and would be fleshed out during the initial meetings of the ICBRP international board. In year 3, a review mission will be mounted to take stock of the progress made and to develop concrete plans of action on a longer term basis.

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

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


