ICP Classification – History

Research took place to revise ICP 2005/11 classification

by a dedicated Task Force, established by the ICP Technical Advisory Group


- To reduce the number of BHs: combining BHs with comparable products.
- To improve the homogeneity of the BHs: splitting BHs found to be too heterogeneous.
- To be coherent with the expenditure classifications of regions with their own comparison programs (Eurostat-OECD, CIS: with more glandular classification).

The revised classification (ICP 2021 / 2017) largely remained the same – keeping the comparability between cycles, less burden to countries & regions.

ICP Classification — Tree version

At the **basic heading** level:

- Expenditures are defined and estimated.
- Products are selected for pricing.
- Prices are collected and validated.
- PPPs are first calculated then averaged.



ICP Classification — Interactive version

- 6 Main aggregates
- 28 expenditure categories
- 63 expenditure groups
- 126 expenditure classes
- 155 basic headings

COICOP – classification of individual consumption according to purpose

COPNI – classification of the purposes of non-profit institutions serving households

COFOG – classification of the functions of government

COICOP (Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose) 2018



COICOP

Objectives

- Provides a structured framework for classifying goods and services based on household consumption.
- A core component of the System of National Accounts (SNA) but extends beyond national accounting.

COICOP 2018


- The first revision since COICOP 1999.
- Significant changes from the previous version
 - Introduction of a detailed Subclass level (similar to ICP's basic heading level).
 - Updates to reflect evolving statistical and policy needs. (introducing modernized goods and services).
 - Systematic separation between goods and services.

COICOP

ICP and COICOP 2018

- COICOP 2018 updates will require major revisions to the ICP classification.
- Changes possibly affect
 - Classification structures across different levels.
 - Realigning products to new structures.
 - PPP methodologies and calculations.
- Adjustments need scenario testing to assess impact on PPP results.

ICP Classification & COICOP 2018 (2)

Products / Item lists

- COICOP 2018 provides valuable suggestions for each subclass level.
- For all ICP products on regional and global product list.
 - All existing products can be mapped (some requiring re-mapping).
 - Adding new products can be considered (due to new headings).
 - Deleting products can be considered (due to merging/deleting of headings).

National Accounts Expenditures

 Each classification change directly impacts GDP estimations at the corresponding level.

ICP Classification & COICOP 2018 (3)

ICP classification and 2018 COICOP classification

- A better alignment is possible mainly due to the new COICOP subclasses.
- Aligned CPI, NA and PPP classifications benefit data production, including CPI ICP item mapping, PPP weight estimation and PPP extrapolations.
- However, revising the ICP classification entails various operational steps and considerations that need careful assessments and planning.
 - Also, national timelines for adopting the COICOP 2018 for CPI purposes vary.

2025 SNA

ICP classification and 2018 COICOP classification

- The 2008 SNA is currently undergoing revision.
 - Addresses key global economic developments, including Globalization,
 Digitalization, Well-being & sustainability.
- Major Updates
 - Recognition of data as a produced asset.
 - Accounting for natural resource depletion as a production cost.
 - Refinement of central banks' output measurement.
- The impact on the ICP classification appears minimal, but further investigation is required.

Summary of previous discussions



Previous discussions (1)

- Previous discussions with ICP Technical Advisory Group (TAG) and Inter-Agency Coordination Group (IACG)
 - The ICP Global Office outlined key COICOP changes and their impact on the ICP classification. (IACG Oct 2023, TAG Nov 2023, IACG Nov 2024)
 - Participants agreed for the need of ICP classification update
 - The update would ensure comparability and alignment with COICOP 2018.
 - Many economies and regional agencies have adopted or plan to adopt COICOP 2018 in near future.
 - SNA 2025 updates further emphasize the need for revision.

Previous discussions (2)

Expected Impacts

- Changes will affect price data surveys and national accounts data.
- Some adjustments will be straightforward, while others require further analysis.
- Enhanced alignment with CPI, national accounts, and PPP classifications.
- Reduction in burden on economies and regional agencies.

Proposed Action

- Establishment of an ICP Task Force.
 - Inclusion of international, regional, and national experts.

Goal

Address updates and ensure a smooth transition.

Task Force on ICP classification



Scope of work

- Assess the impact of the COICOP 2018 and 2025 SNA updates on the ICP classification.
- Draft an updated ICP classification.
- Draft an interim approach to link the current ICP classification with the new Eurostat-OECD PPP classification
- Analyze possible scenarios and conduct simulations to assess the impact on PPPs.
- **Explore the feasibility** of revising previous ICP cycle results to be aligned to the new classification and review the implications **on PPP time series data**.
- Recommend an appropriate timeline and implementation strategy for the new ICP classification.
- Develop guidelines and recommendations for adopting the updated classification.
- Prepare other documentation as needed, including needed revisions to ICP operational materials and solutions.

Membership

- The Task Force on ICP classification will be formed of experts and/or practitioners in the field of index numbers, PPPs, price statistics, national accounts, and international statistical classification. These may include:
 - Representative(s) of the ICP Technical Advisory Group
 - Representatives of the ICP Regional Implementing Agencies
 - Representatives of the ICP National Implementation Agencies from each ICP region
 - Representatives of the ICP Global Implementing Agency.
 - Independent experts/consultants.

Tenure and Work Modality

- The Task Force on ICP classification will have a fixed tenure of two years upon its establishment.
- The Task Force will meet both virtually and in person, as needed.
- Members may participate in Inter-Agency Coordination Group meetings to discuss the operational implications and feasibility of their proposals.
- They may join ICP Technical Advisory Group (TAG) meetings to present their findings and recommendations for TAG's consideration.
- The ICP Global Implementing Agency will serve as the secretariat for the Task Force on ICP classification.

Expected Deliverables

- Develop an updated and interim ICP classification.
- Present its proposed approach to the TAG.
- Draft an interim report for discussion.
- Refine its methodology through further research and computations as needed.
- Prepare a final report with recommendations.
- If a methodological changes, stemming from the update, are proposed, the Task Force should conduct and document an assessment of its impact on the results.











COICOP 18. 01.1.1.1. Cereals

- Dried grains of cereals, whether or not broken or precooked (steamed), but not further prepared.

Includes: wheat; rice, including parboiled rice; sorghum; barley; millet; maize (corn); quinoa; teff. Includes also: bulgur; rye; oats; triticale; buckwheat; canary seed; quihuicha or Inca wheat; canagua or coaihua; adlay or Job's tears; mixed cereal grains, in the form of dried grains, also including other ingredients (provided that these are not the main ingredient) but not further processed.
