3. Country-wide



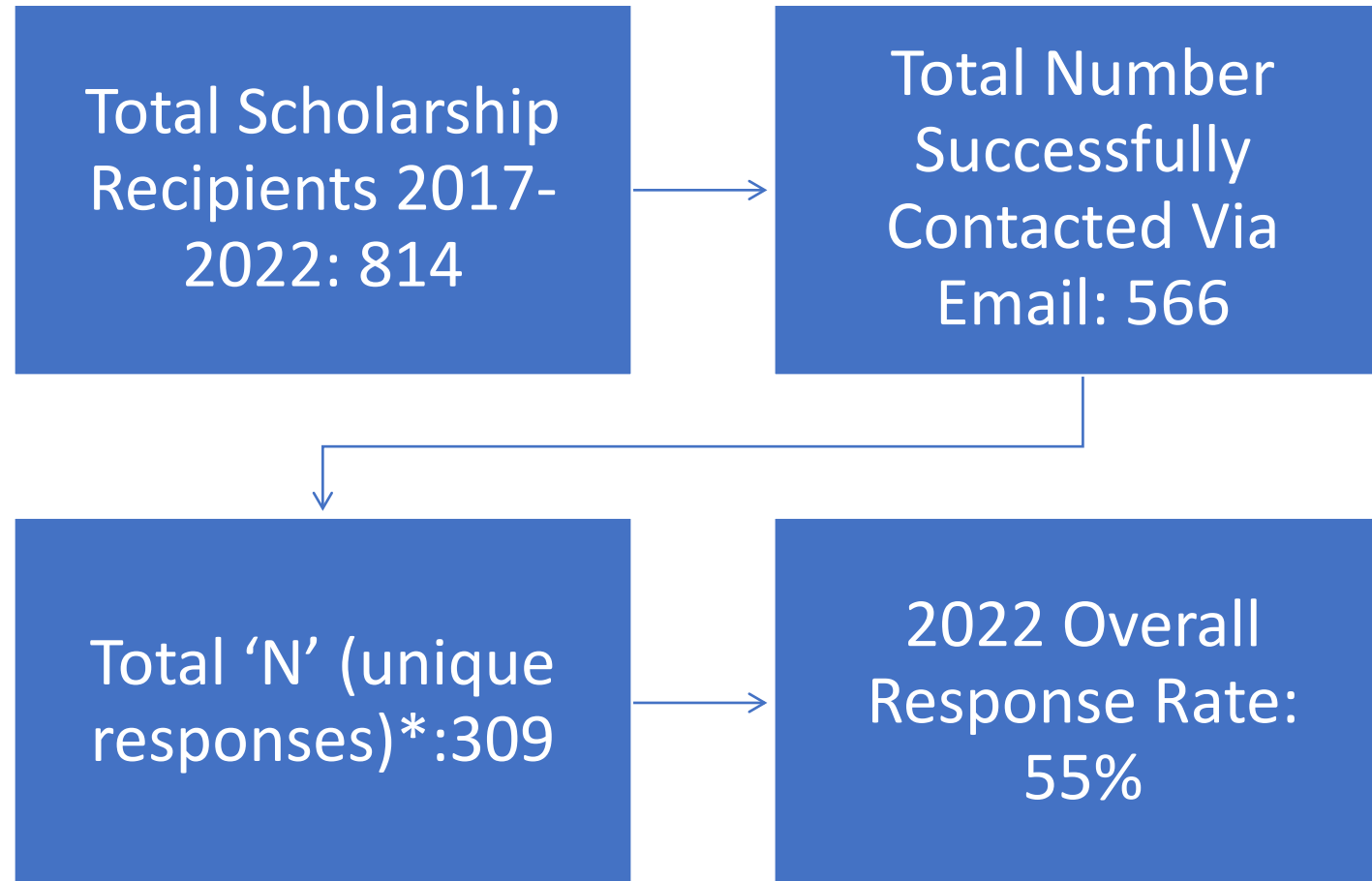
For each of the three levels, several indicators of results were created and questions were designed to measure each indicator

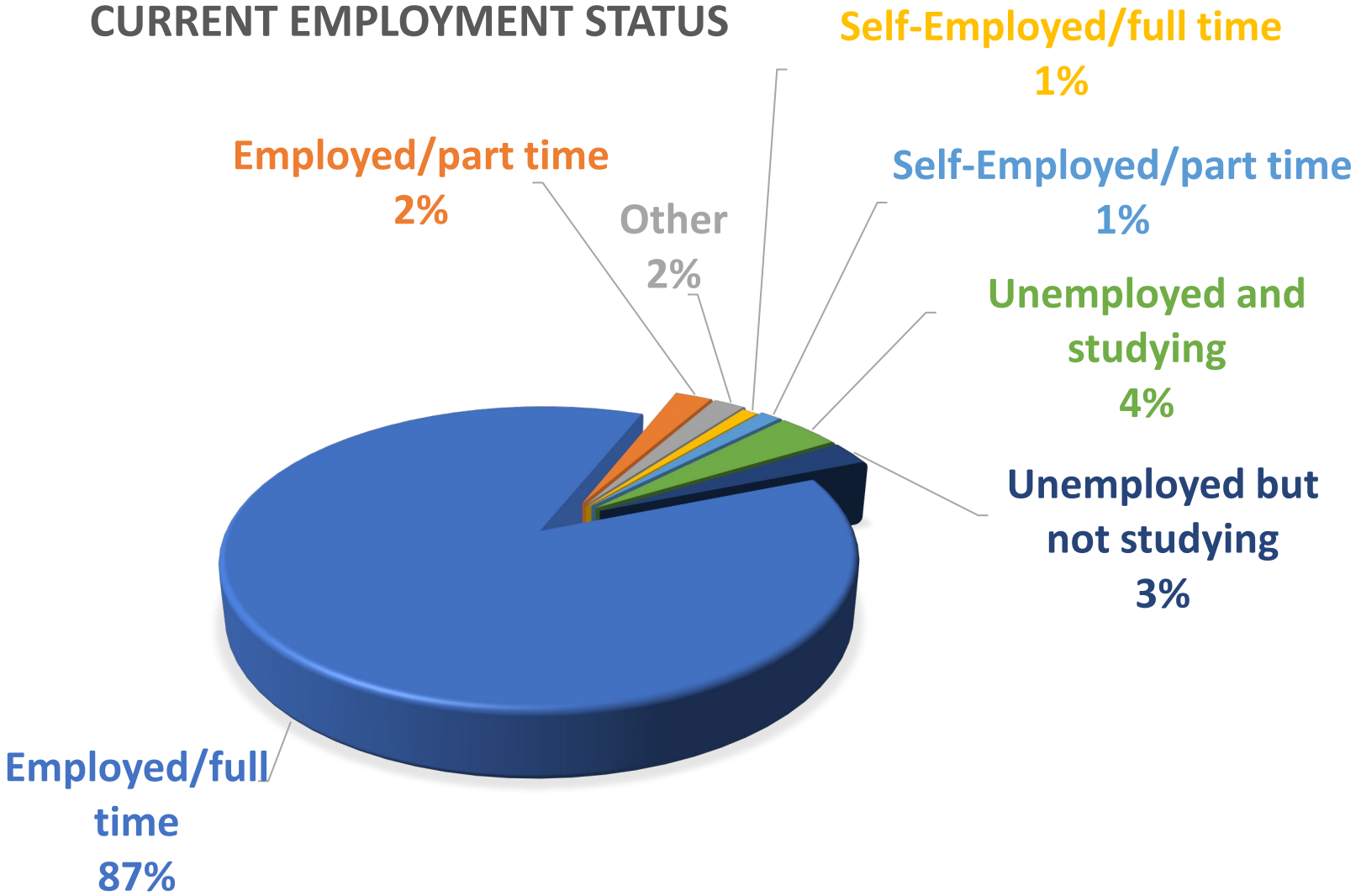




Individual Level- Current Employment Status

What is your current employment status?

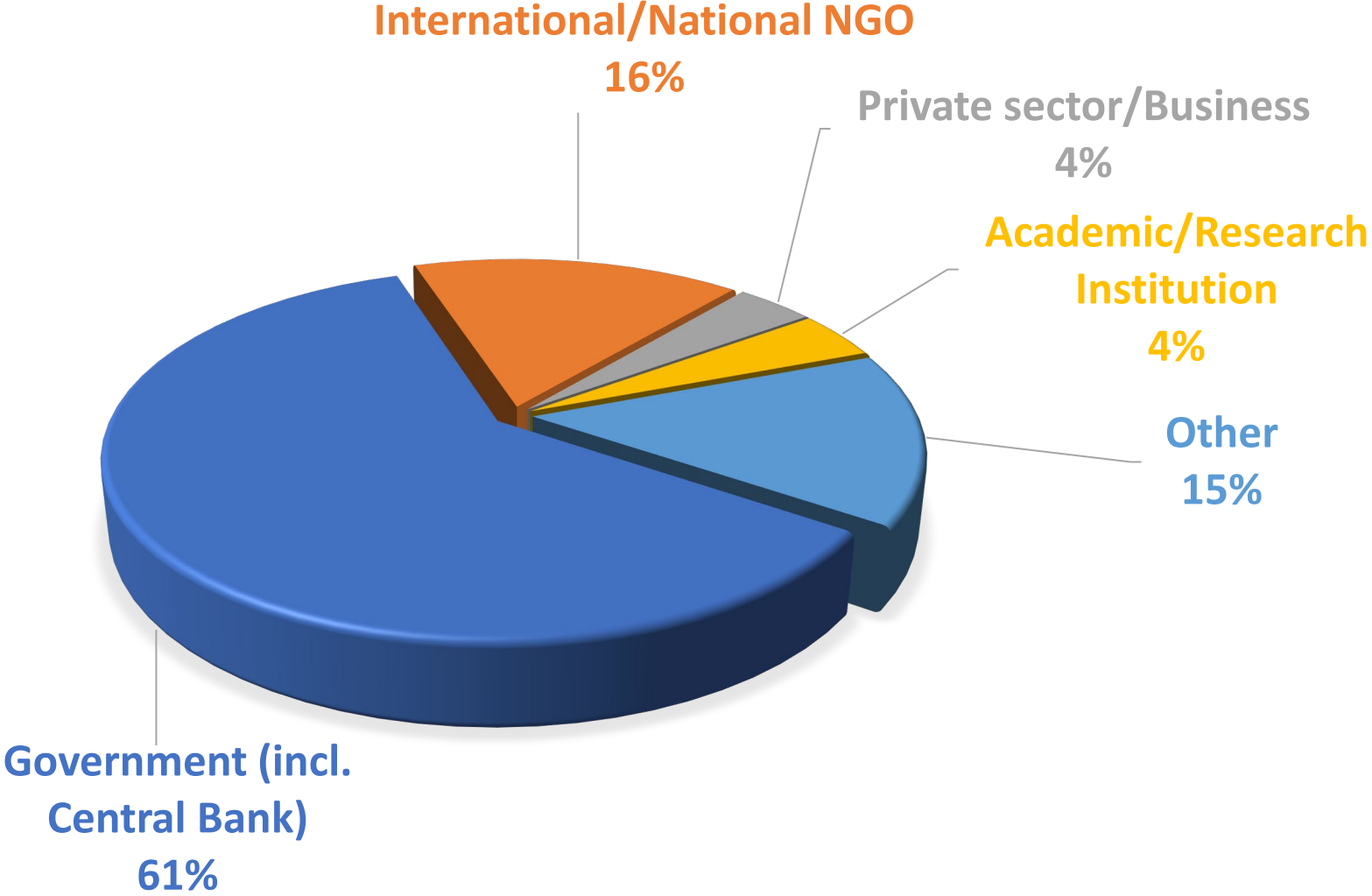
CURRENT EMPLOYMENT STATUS





Individual Level-Type of Organization

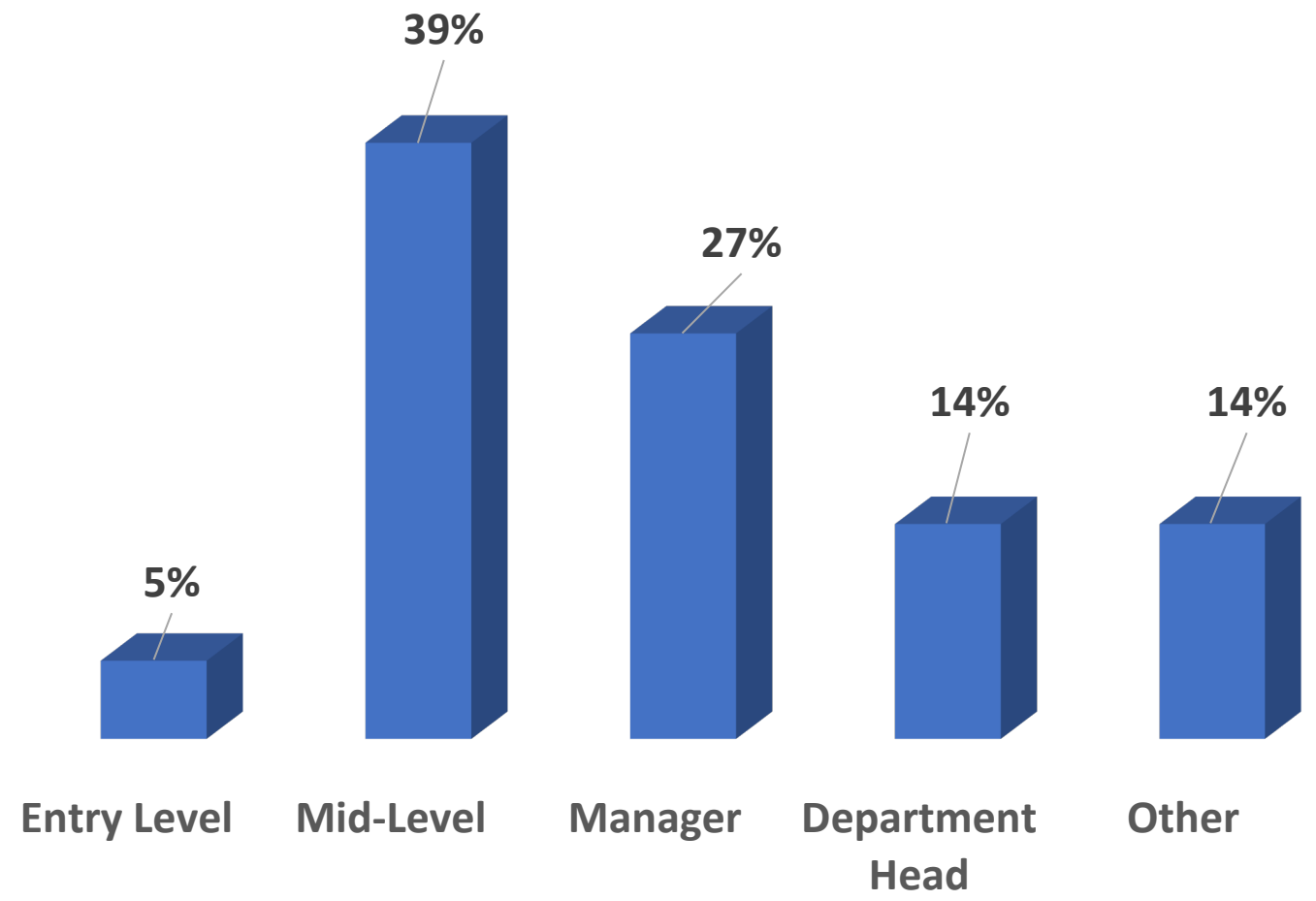
Type of organization you work for?

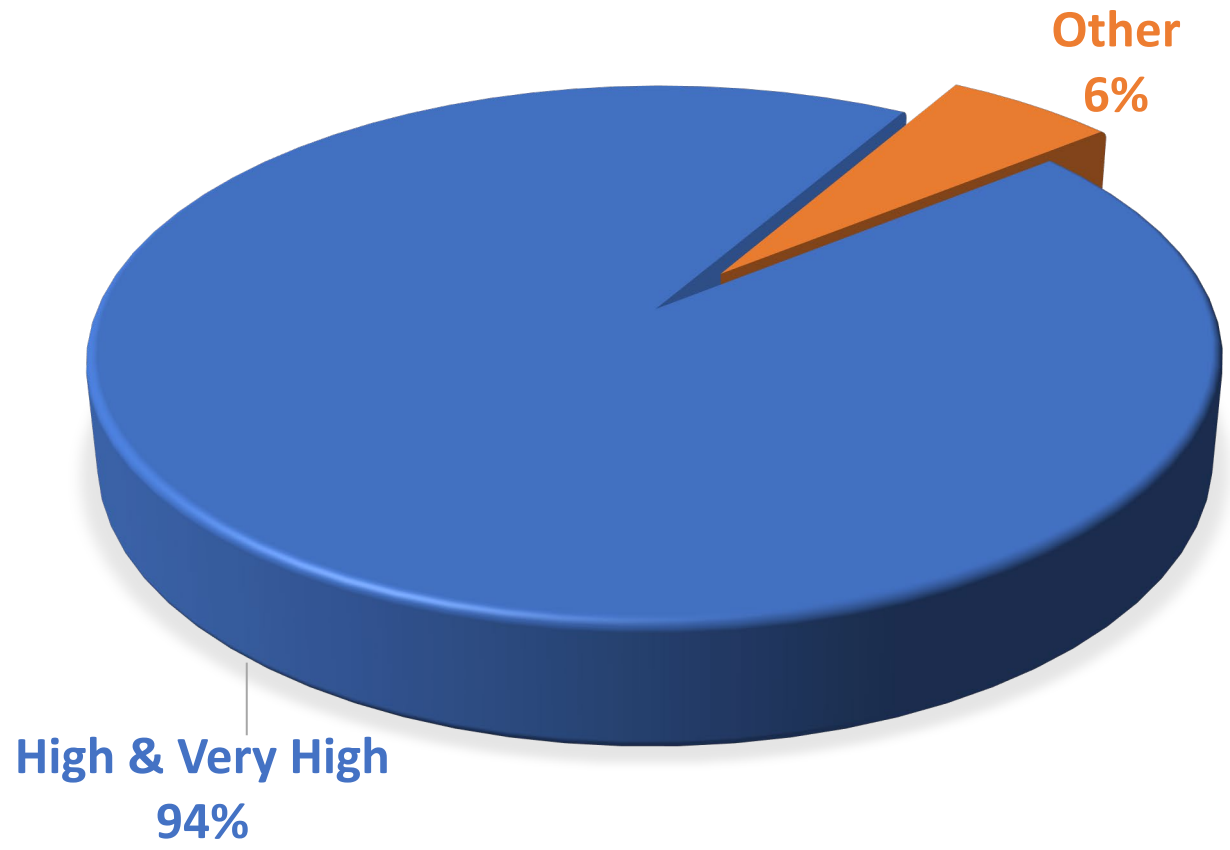
Current level of position.





Individual Level: New Skills Acquired

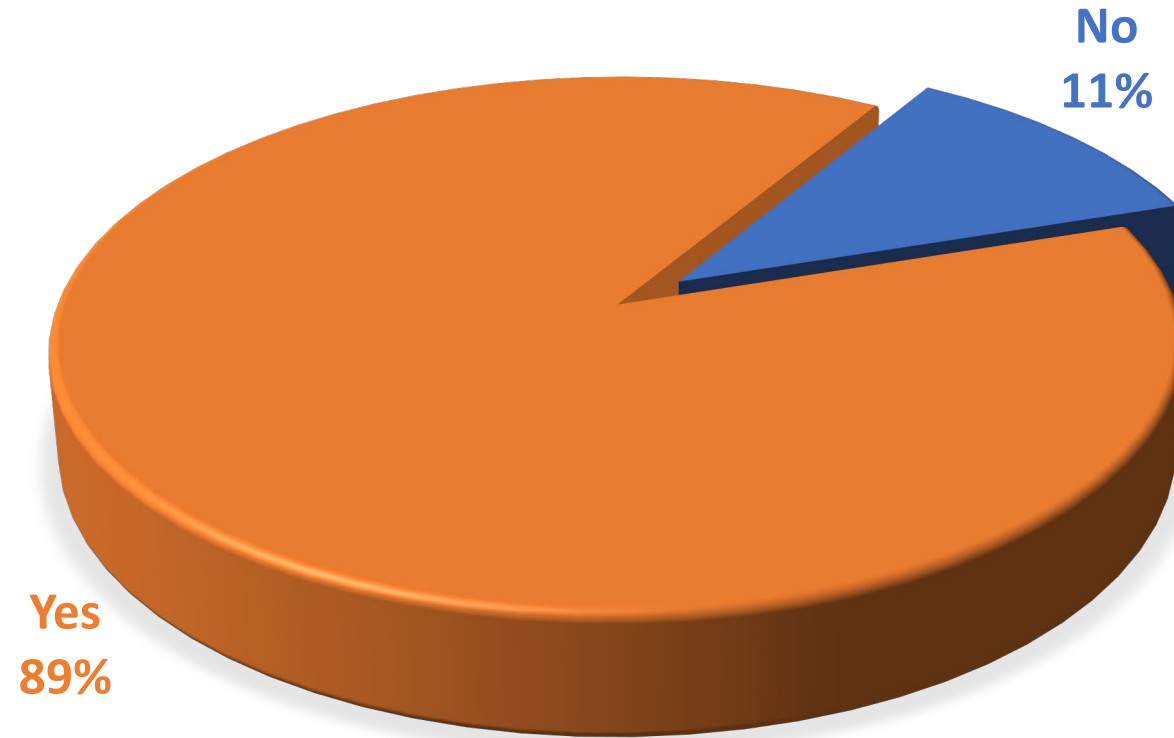
How would you grade the professional skills you gained through JJWBGSP-funded studies?





Individual Level: Expanded Role & Responsibilities

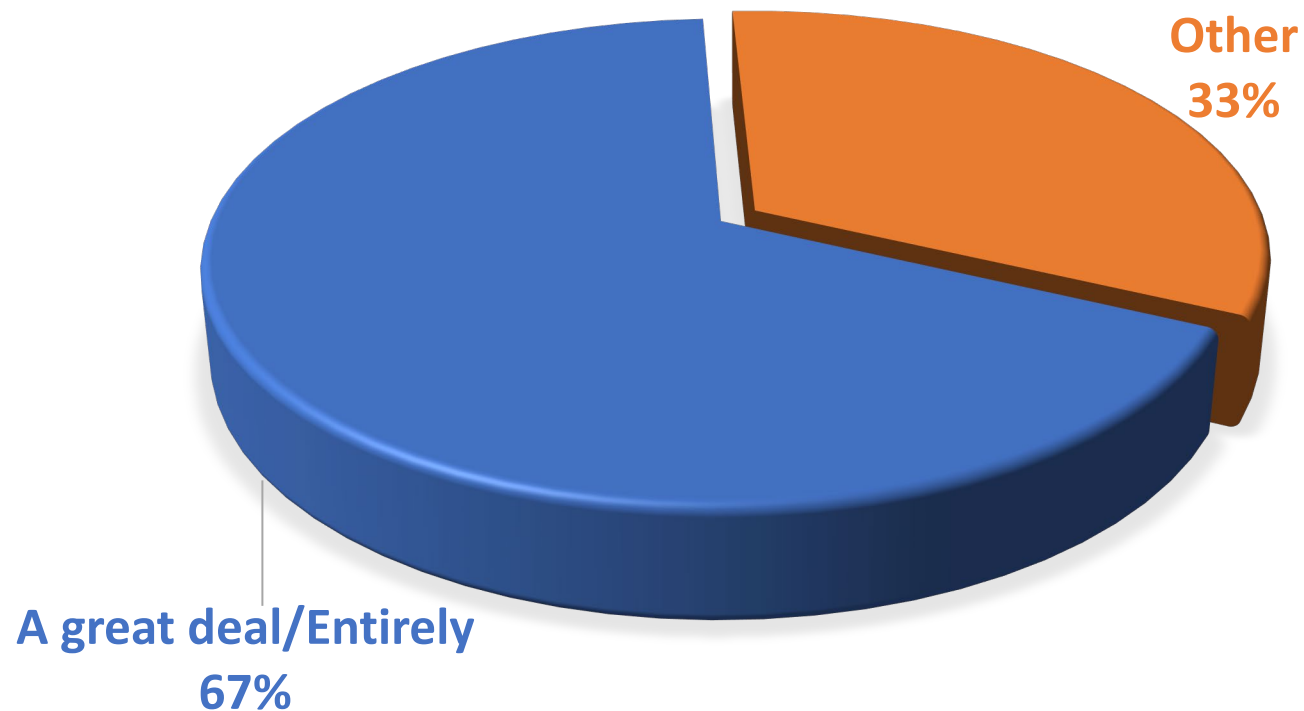
Over the course of your career since completion of JJ/WBGSP, has your role/responsibilities expanded?





Expansion of your role/ responsibilities

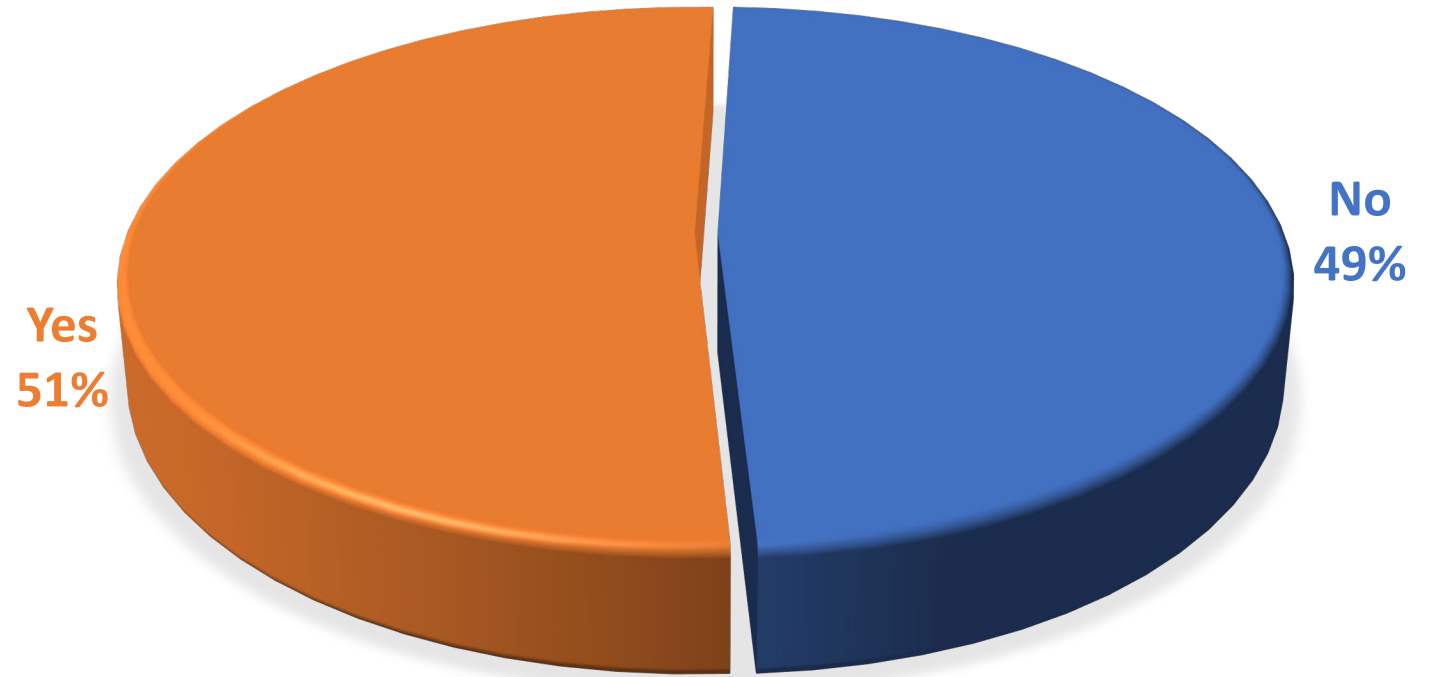
To what extent do you attribute the expansion of your role/responsibilities to JJWBGSP?





Individual Level: Career Advancement

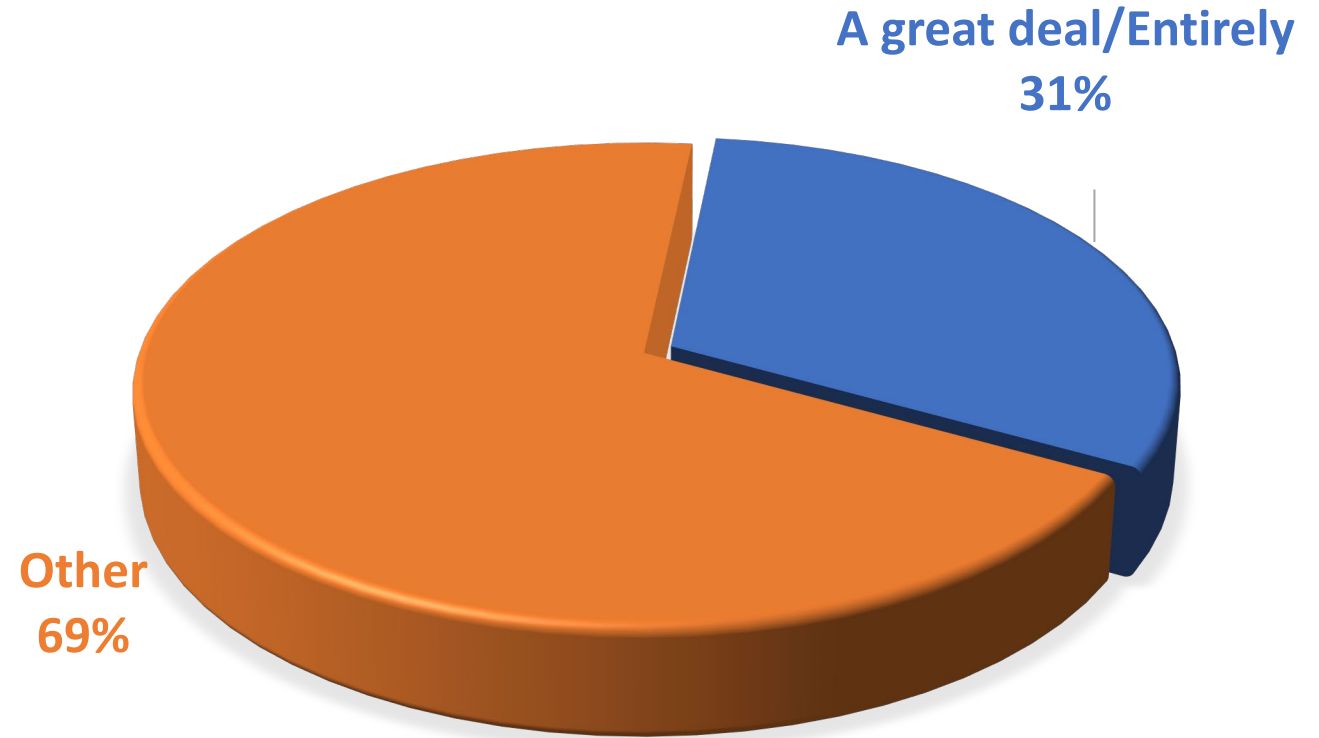
At any time since the completion of JJWBGSP, have you been promoted?

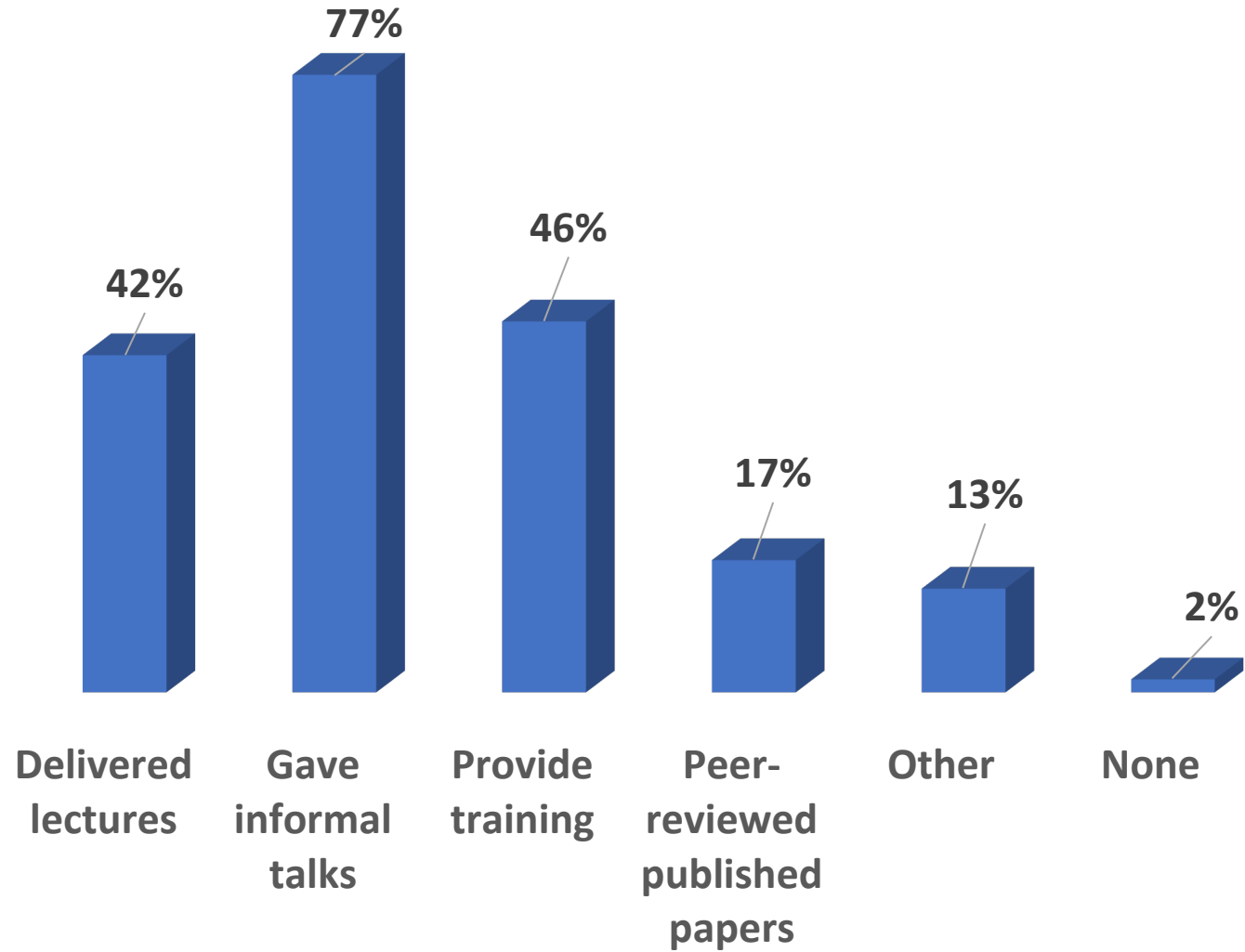
To what extent do you attribute the promotion increase to JJWBGSP?

In what ways have you shared the experiences and knowledge you gained through your JJ/WBGSP studies with others in your home country/region?

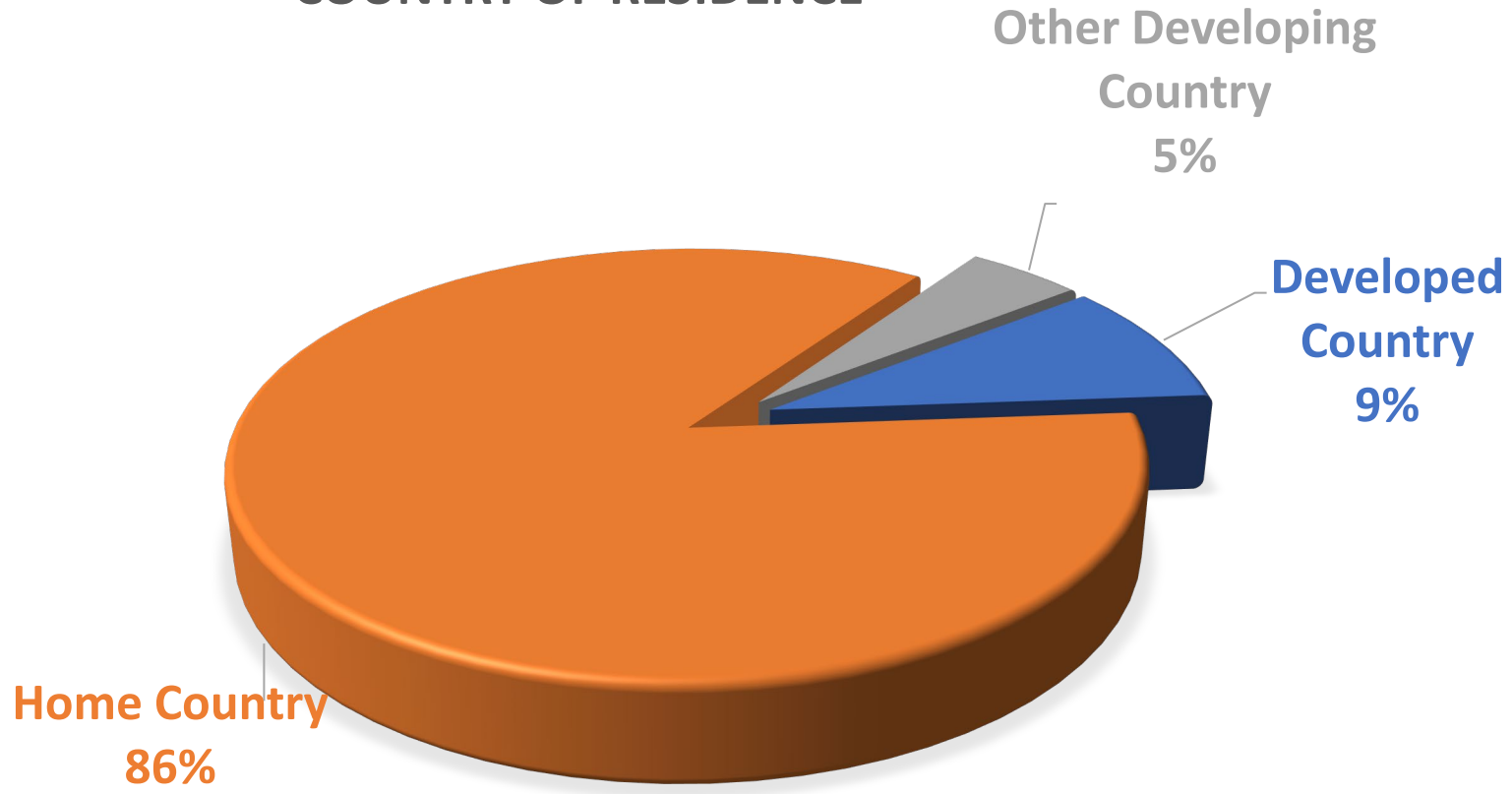

COUNTRY OF RESIDENCE

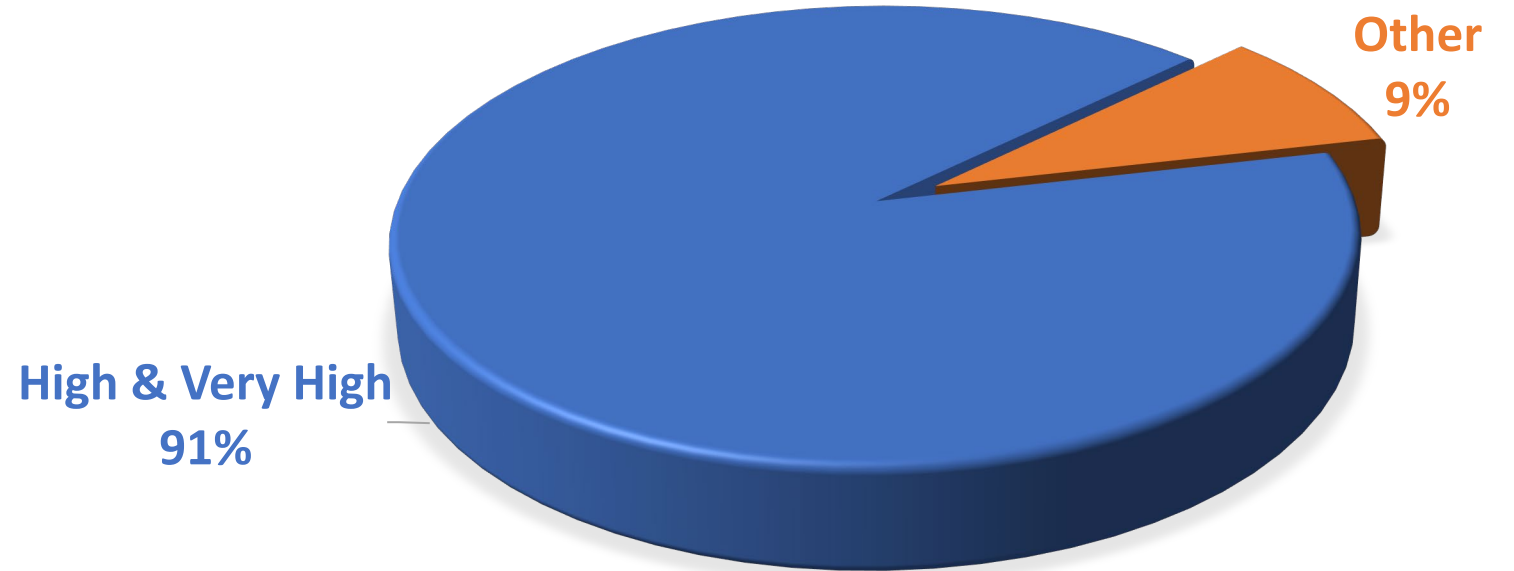

RELEVANCE OF JJWBGSP TO CURRENT WORK

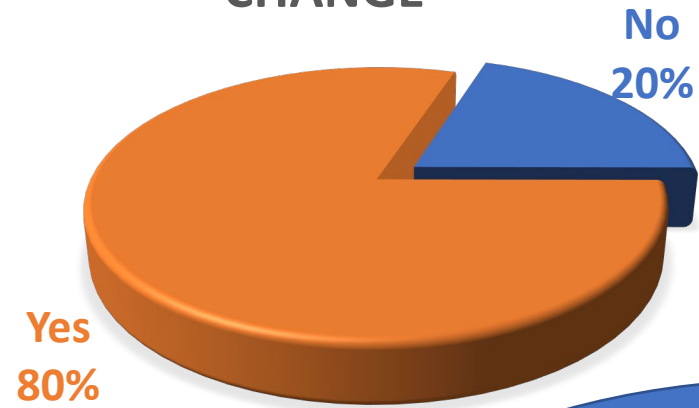




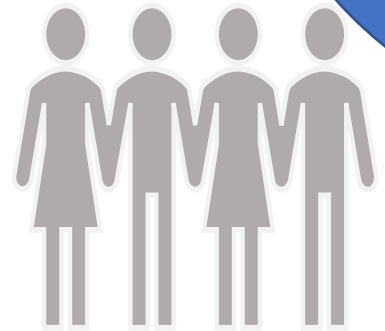

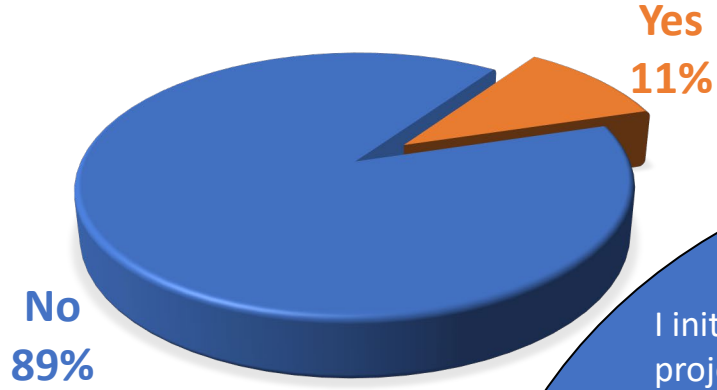

I initiated and led the implementation of the project that aims to utilize agrowaste like maize cobs, groundnut shells, and rice husks to produce high-quality cooking briquettes for smallholder farmers' households. Over 15 groups of farmers have been trained and recent feedback shows that over 10 small-scale briquettes businesses have been started by mostly women. This project makes me proud because, in addition to the positive benefits for the communities like improved household income and increased awareness about the dangers of cutting down trees for firewood, I was invited to share this initiative at the recent UN Summer Academy 2022.
