Our staff are expected to treat everyone with respect, dignity, and compassion at all times, at work and at home. Staff who perpetrate domestic abuse may face disciplinary consequences, including termination of employment.

The Domestic Abuse Prevention Program (DAPP) provides free and confidential support to staff, spouses, partners, and dependents above 18 years old. Support is provided to victims/survivors of domestic abuse. Services include crisis management, advocacy, short term counseling, legal consultations, and referrals to internal and external resources, educational services, and other support when appropriate. These services are also available for those seeking help who are concerned they may be using abuse in their relationships.
