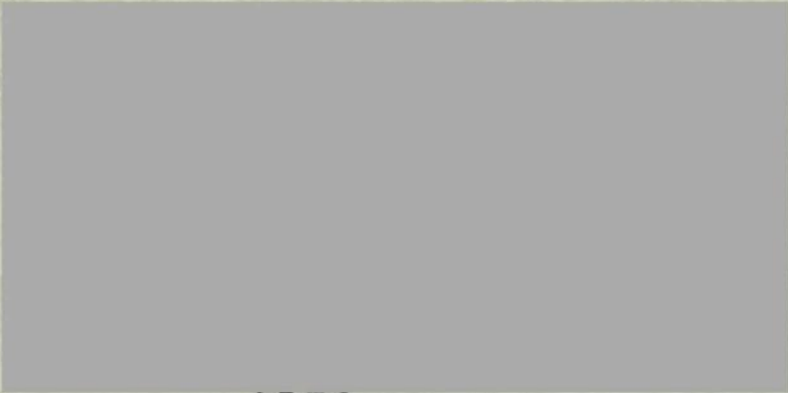



Dear George:

Please find enclosed to you a confirmation copy of my cable to you dated today. Also enclosed are copies of the statements which I have prepared for the Paris meeting. We have had a pretty hectic time getting organized for this meeting, but I think now that everything is reasonably well in hand as far as we are concerned. From all I hear, however, we are going to be confronted with sharply divergent views among the different Part I countries on almost every issue. Perhaps I will have a better idea where we are headed at the end of next week when I hope to be talking to you on the telephone in Rome.

As I said in my cable, business has been proceeding here normally. I enclose the Agenda for this week's and next week's Board Meetings. We also expect to schedule meetings on May 16 and May 18 (when I will be back here). Aside from the regular flow of business, we have scheduled the International Insurance proposals for May 16, and we will try to pursue the subject of interest rates during that week.

Yesterday (May 4) we spent a couple of hours on interest rates. The feature of the meeting was a sweeping review of the affairs of the Bank and IDA by Mejia. I would urge you to read the transcript of this speech. Anyway, one of his main points was that the Bank should stop providing money to IDA, and that the retention of these amounts in the Bank would permit the Bank to maintain its present interest rate. I might add that Malaplate and Skjerdal also spoke against any increase in interest rates at this time.

I am afraid it is too late in the day to give you any further extensive rundown on developments here, but there really have been no serious problems in the area of Bank or IDA operations. The usual slippage is going on and as you will see from the latest Forecast of Bank Loans and IDA Credits (attached), it now looks as if Bank loans for the fiscal year will be only about \$1 billion including the loan to IFC.



I should say that I finally received here in Washington a visit from Younis and the UAR Ambassador. We are taking steps as soon as possible to send Collier back to Cairo to update our economic appraisal, and at the same time to get people out to start work on the preparation of agriculture and transportation (railways) projects.

Finally, I should say that at the Board Meeting on May 2 I read the statement which you had prepared but which you did not have time to deliver on the subject of "Sales of Loans Out of Portfolio." This provoked an extensive discussion in which a great many questions and doubts were raised. At the end of the discussion I said that we had in fact suspended sales from portfolio (except to borrowers and to the UNDP), but that I would report to you the discussion that had taken place. I think you will have to resume this discussion with the Executive Directors after your return.

Indian Press

As I mentioned to you, it is the Press Information Bureau of the Government of India which provides press officers to the ministries of the Government. We understand that Mr. Desai has a press secretary in his capacity as Finance Minister, rather than as Deputy Prime Minister; and if so, his press secretary may be T. Sanathanan. We do not know Sanathanan.

This press attache, whoever he may be, would make any arrangements that might be needed for meeting the press. It would also be helpful to refer to him any inquiries directed to Mr. Woods during his stay, on the grounds that these questions should be pointed to Mr. Desai rather than to Mr. Woods, who is simply Mr. Desai's guest.

Five English-language newspapers of consequence are represented in New Delhi, along with two nation-wide news agencies. The names of editors and correspondents who have visited the Bank in Washington are shown with an asterisk:

The only locally-based daily newspaper is The Hindustan Times, which is a property of the Birlas. The Editor, Ajit Battacharjea *, was until recently the Washington correspondent of this newspaper. The News Editor, who also specializes in economics and finance, is S. Subramaniam *. (Another Birla publishing property is The Eastern Economist and its Editor is V. Balusubramaniam.)

The Statesman is at home in Calcutta, but an edition also is published in New Delhi. It is the property of a number of industrial groups in India, including Tatas. The Editor in New Delhi is K. Rangachari *. The News Editor, and the one most likely to take an interest in Mr. Woods, is Inder Malhotra *.

The Times of India is at home in Bombay, but has a New Delhi edition also. It also is the property of industrialists (the Jain family), but because of litigation against the owners is for the time being operating under a caretaker board of directors strongly influenced by the Government. The special correspondent likely to be interested in the Bank party is K. S. Rangaswami *. (The Times has an affiliate, The Economic Times, which is a daily financial paper. Its Delhi correspondent, D. K. Rangnekar, was a particular pet of Mr. Krishnamachari, and presumably is still quite hostile to the Bank.)

The Indian Express also is at home in Bombay, but has editions published in Delhi and elsewhere. The Resident Editor in Delhi is Nandan Kagal. (The Express also has an affiliated financial daily, The Financial Express. Its correspondent, S. Santhanam, is not particularly friendly to the Bank, although this seems to be more from lack of information than from lack of objectivity.)

The Hindu, published in Madras, while it does not have as large a circulation as some of the other newspapers, ranks near the top for being objective and well informed. Its New Delhi representative is H. Venkatasubbiah *, who has taken a special interest in the U. N. and the specialized agencies.

The Indian equivalent of the DPA or the Associated Press is the Press Trust of India. The Chief of its New Delhi bureau is K. Subramaniam. The other nation-wide news agency is the United News of India; it is relatively new and is less well established than PTI. UNI's Delhi Chief is V. P. Ramachandran.

Issues in India

Here are some of the issues that might be brought forward if you were to have a press conference in India:

Devaluation

This is still an issue. Most of the English-language press originally took either a neutral or a favorable view toward devaluation, saying either that it would be necessary to wait and see what developed before forming a judgment, or saying that devaluation was long overdue. Economists and the press watch the export figures, however, and there has been recurrent press comment that the fall of Indian exports following devaluation proved that the anti-devaluationists were right. The relation between devaluation and imports, and between devaluation and decontrol, has not been well understood or widely commented on.

Mr. Desai, as you know, originally was an opponent of devaluation. A recent statement by him, Mr. Cargill tells me, represents a sensible and adroit handling of the subject. You might also be interested in the attached comment by the Minister of Commerce.

The Consortium

An issue related to devaluation is the belief, still very widespread, that the consortium really is an instrument to coerce the Indian Government. This view was sedulously promoted by Mr. Krishnamachari, and has persisted following his departure from the Government. Press comment probably reached its height last autumn, when suggestions were widely made that India would do better to pursue its own interests on a completely bilateral basis. It is certainly not understood that in India the consortium has been a powerful influence in India's favor, especially with regard to the form and terms of aid.

The Bank and the U. S.

Related to the consortium issue is the question of the relation between the Bank and the United States. American news agency reports and Indian special correspondence from Washington both made much of the fact that the United States would rely on the Bank's judgment in deciding whether to resume aid to India. In India, this circumstance was interpreted by the press to mean that the Bank would become a kind of stalking horse for American interests, and that the Bank, in fact, was not being true to its own character as an international institution. It was not

understood that the U. S. position, in fact, did not inhibit the Bank from making its own professional and expert judgment on the policies at issue; and it was not particularly noted that the American and Bank positions were not synonymous: i. e., that during the lapse in American aid, the Bank Group continued to make new commitments in India. In any case, from the Indian point of view, the U. S. position is now much improved.

Defense Expenditures and Indo-Pakistan Joint Projects

Since The Hindu newspaper (March 29 and 31) has carried a summary of the most recent Bell Mission's findings, including the "two pet bugs" -- defense expenditure and Indo-Pakistan joint projects -- questions on this subject are likely to be raised.

Fertilizer

The technical basis underlying the fertilizer issue has not been made clear in India. The press generally has assumed that there is plenty of raw material in India, and that the Bank's emphasis on the necessity of importing materials -- and capital, technology and management -- is contrary to India's own best interests and does not sufficiently recognize India's own capabilities. Some sections of the press have dealt more realistically with the question; and recently, Mr. Rosen gave an interview to an Indian journalist (copy attached) which touched on the point.

Among other questions you might be asked about fertilizer are two: (1) is the idea of organizing a consortium of fertilizer companies under consideration; and (2) since private companies seem to be reluctant to come into India to manufacture and distribute fertilizer, is the Bank willing to support this kind of activity in the public sector.

Local Procurement

The Group's procedures on international bidding recently have started to become a fairly general issue: it is thought that Indian companies can handle more of the business under Group financing and should be given more of a chance to do so; and it is not generally understood that international competition does not exclude bids from Indian suppliers. This issue originally arose in the case of the discussions of the Haldia Port financing. It was reported that these discussions broke down entirely on the issue of local vs international procurement. No other version of this episode, so far as I know, was given to the press or published in India.

IDA Replenishment

You may have questions on the prospects for IDA replenishment. At least one report has appeared in the Indian press concerning the wish of the United States to make its contribution in a form that will somewhat protect its balance of payments position, and you may have questions about this also.

SUBJECT: Press Matters -- India

1. It might help you to deal with any press that you may encounter on your arrival in New Delhi if Rainer had copies of a brief statement to hand to the press. This might expedite your progress through the airport and deter press from attempting to ask questions. A draft of such a statement is attached. Mr. Cargill has a copy.

2. Mr. Desai very probably will be eager for you to have a press conference sometime during your stay. Because of the complexity and controversiality of some aspects of the Bank's relations with India, a press conference would present formidable difficulties; and it would be better simply to issue some kind of statement or communique.

3. But if a press conference cannot be avoided, it might be useful for you to have some kind of mock-up of the kinds of questions that might be asked. I will give you and Cargill such a list tomorrow morning.

Mr. George D. Woods, President of the World Bank and of its affiliates, the International Development Association (IDA) and the International Finance Corporation, made the following statement on his arrival at Palam Airport on April 30:

"I have come to India at the friendly urging of my good friend, Mr. Morarji Desai. It is three years since my last visit, and these years have witnessed momentous developments. India, the largest democracy in the world, has successfully conducted a general election. She has initiated changes of policy intended to accelerate her economic growth; and toward the same objective, the Indian consortium has just indicated a target of \$1,300 million in assistance to India during the fiscal year.

"I do not bring any agenda with me, but have simply, and very willingly, put myself at Mr. Desai's disposal. I am looking forward to free and informal discussions with him of matters of mutual concern, and fully expect that our talks will be most helpful in the Bank's continuous and cooperative effort to play a constructive role in the economic development of India."

It is expected that Mr. Woods will be in India for approximately one week. He is accompanied by Mrs. Woods, by Mr. I.P.M. Cargill, the Director of the Asia Department of the World Bank and IDA, by Mr. Gregory Votaw, a member of the staff of the Asia Department, and by Mr. Rainer Steckhan, who is Mr. Woods's personal assistant.

Visit to Portugal and Spain May 1966

I have taken note of your arrival at Lisbon with TWA Flight No. 900 departing from New York at 9:45 PM Tuesday, May 17, and arriving in Lisbon at 9:10 AM local time on Wednesday the 18th. In Lisbon, instructions will be given to the airport police and customs of your arrival and you will have assistance, if needed.

As you know, the present Minister of Finance of Portugal is Mr. Ulises Cruz de Aguiar Cortés, who is still recovering from a heart attack suffered in November 1965. Mr. Ulises Cortés has also been Minister for Economics and, recently, President of the Caixa Geral de Depositos which is a Government savings institution and has a great importance. Mr. Ulises Cortés was by the end of March spending only a few hours a day in his office. He used to arrive by noon and remain for an hour or two. The major part of the work is done by Mr. Ricardo Faria Blanc, a young -33- and brilliant economist who is the Under Secretary of the Treasury in the Ministry. He is a very competent official and has the relations with International Organizations under his responsibility. I recommend getting in touch with him not only because of his present position but also because of his growing importance in Portugal's administrative and political life.

The Governor for Portugal in this World Bank is Mr. Antonio M. Pinto Barbosa, Minister of Finance until May 1965. He is a Professor for Economics at the University of Lisbon and enjoys the full confidence of the President of the Government, Mr. Oliveira Salazar. His recent appointment as Governor of the Bank of Portugal, after many years of vacancy, proves the importance and political future of Mr. Pinto Barbosa who is about 50 and has served for more than 13 years as Minister of Finance with noted success.

In the case you would meet in social events or similar occasions, Mr. Daniel Barbosa, Chairman of the Banco do Fomento -investment bank with Government participation- I wish to stress his independent personality based on a brilliant political record -he has been Minister for Economics- and has personal wealth which makes him very appropriate for a sound management of Banco do Fomento. Banco do Fomento is now getting into close cooperation with IFC in financial activities in the private sector of Portugal.

Spain

As far as I know, the way you will arrive in Sotogrande, near Algeciras in the South of Spain, has not been decided yet. I would


appreciate, consequently, to have as early as possible your information on whether you are flying by a regular airline or by private plane in order to inform the corresponding authorities.

For your arrival in Madrid on the 22nd of May, I have already informed the Spanish authorities to keep in touch with you in Sotogrande in order to know the time of your arrival in Madrid. There will be an official waiting for you and the customs, police, and others will be informed.

As we mentioned during our conversation of yesterday, besides the visit to the Minister of Finance in the afternoon or early evening of Tuesday the 24th and the visit to Mr. Navarro Rubio, your friend and former Minister of Finance, who is organizing the meeting of the American Banker's Association, I would like to give you some additional information about personalities who could be of interest to you, if you should meet them in some social occasion, particularly at the formal dinner offered by the Minister of Finance on the 24th of May. They are:

✓ Laureano López Rodó, Minister Without Portfolio and Commissioner for the Development Program. In his middle 40's López Rodó is a Professor of the University for Administrative Law and a very influential member of the Government. His office is doing outstanding efforts to improve the bureaucracy and to coordinate the Government's activities, principally on the economic development area. He is closely connected with the most important members of the Government - the Minister of Finance, Mr. Espinosa, the Minister of Industry, Mr. Gregorio López Bravo, the Minister of Commerce, Mr. Faustino García Moncá, and the Minister of Public Works, Mr. Federico Silva Muñoz.

Other personalities of outstanding relevance in Spain's political life are: the Minister of Industry, Mr. Gregorio López Bravo, 42, married, naval engineer, who has previously been Director General of Foreign Trade and of the Agency for Foreign Currency (Instituto Español de Moneda Extranjera). His strong personality has been reflected in several occasions and seems to have a bright political future.

 The Minister of Commerce, Mr. Faustino García Moncá, in his late 40's, has been for many years in the banking business. Before joining the Government, he was President of the important Banco de Bilbao after a short period as Under Secretary of Commerce.

✓ In the private sector, besides the well-known banker Marqués de Deleitosa, Chairman of the Banco Español de Crédito, and others, I should remind you of the importance of Mr. Carlos Mendoza, President of RENFE (Spanish Railways) who is well-known in this World Bank for his great capability and business mind. He is, at the same time, member of several Executive Boards of important banks in Spain, particularly of the important Banco de Vizcaya and INDUBAN (Investment Bank of Bilbao).

I think that these informations could be of some help to you during your stay in Portugal and Spain and I wish you a very pleasant trip to both of my constituents.

When I saw Mr. Woods in Frankfurt yesterday we discussed his visit to Madrid at the time of the American Bankers' meeting there at the end of May. He asked me to get in collusion with you on a programme for him.

My feeling is that, as this is his first visit to Spain, we have a big programme there and our relations with the Spanish government are so much better than we ever expected, that he should be prepared to go (at least some of the way) to town.

When Burke and I paid our first visit after they joined we saw four Ministers - Finance, Foreign Affairs, Industry and Commerce - and the Central Bank and INI. (Later, during the Armand-Dorsch period I saw Public Works.) The call on the Minister of Foreign Affairs was a protocol one to a new member and need not be repeated.

As Navarro Rubio is now Governor of the Banco de Espana he will presumably spend the week at the ABA and there may not be need for another meeting. But I think Mr. Woods should certainly call on the Ministers of Finance, Public Works and presumably (in view of our present activities) Agriculture and probably also those of Commerce (who is Governor of the Fund and comes to the AGM) and Industry. And then there is Lopez Rodo and RENFE.

The ABA meeting begins formally on Tuesday May 24 but there is a reception the night before and Mr. Woods will only arrive in time for that.
