## Hotels, Venue, Luggage

Rome is remarkably busy in May and our venue and hotels are located outside the city center. As a result, we will use three hotels to have enough rooms for all participants. We are grateful for your flexibility as we work together under this arrangement!

**Hotel:** You will stay in one of three hotels from May 19-23. They are about 25km outside of Rome city center. The hotels have already been booked and paid for.

Your assigned hotel will be communicated in a separate email from [spjcorecourses@worldbank.org](mailto:spjcorecourses@worldbank.org). Room allocations were made to accommodate early arrivals and where possible to keep regions together. The hotels/rooms are all different from each other.

For those unable to book flights home on May 23, you may need to transfer hotels just for that evening. Our team will take care of you to ensure this happens.

For anyone staying overnight May 24<sup>th</sup> onward, you are responsible for arranging your own hotel and transport to the airport.

**Venue:** May 20-22, training will take place at [Casale Doria Pamphilj](#), about 25km outside Rome city center. Buses will take you from/to your hotel and venue. On May 23<sup>rd</sup>, training will take place at Bank of Italy Headquarters ([map](#)) in Rome city center. Buses will take you from your hotel to the venue, and then either to Fiumicino airport or back to one of the hotels.

**Luggage:** On May 23 we may need to transfer your luggage between hotels or to hold it until you depart for the airport. The organizing team will ensure this happens and communicate further with you at the conference on all details.

**UPDATE** Welcome Reception at **Borgho di Tragliata**, evening of May 19th :

Starting at 7:00pm, please enjoy the great food and drinks and meet your fellow participants! We will also conduct early registration, provide name badges, etc.

For those staying at Hotel Corsi or Casale Doria Pamphilj, a bus will pick you up at 6:20pm to take you to **Borgho di Tragliata**.

## Course Travel

You and are responsible for booking all flights into and out of Fiumicino airport in Italy, as well as completing the visa application process appropriate to your country. If a visa appointment is not secured by May 10<sup>th</sup>, 2024, the organizing team may need to re-allocate your 'seat' to someone able to attend. We encourage all participants to obtain travel medical insurance, which may also be a requirement for visas. The World Bank is not responsible for medical assistance during the Core Course.

In Italy, all transport will be provided for you by bus from your arrival May 19<sup>th</sup> through the morning of May 24<sup>th</sup>. This includes travel from/to airport at arrival and at departure. A schedule will be shared as the event approaches.

For anyone staying overnight on May 24<sup>th</sup> for personal reasons, you are responsible to arrange your own travel to the airport for departure as well as hotel.

**Arrival:** Buses will leave regularly from Fiumicino airport on May 19<sup>th</sup> to go to your hotel. Please communicate your arrival time if not already done so.

**Departure:** Buses will take you to Fiumicino airport on May 23<sup>rd</sup> after final Course session, or on May 24<sup>th</sup> in the morning. Please communicate your departure time if not already done so.

***In special cases,** additional travel arrangements such as from/to the airport have been made due to your itinerary (e.g. early in morning, late at night), and this has been communicated separately. Please follow that guidance if so.*

**Bus Schedules:** We have booked shared minivans and buses for you, for transport to/from airport and to/from venue. If you choose to take taxis at any time that will be at your expense.

### Transport from Airport to Hotel:

- Proceed through customs at Fiumicino airport, after baggage pickup.
- Look for a person holding a sign with the **World Bank logo (below)** and follow him/her to the van. You may need to wait if they are currently dropping other participants.
  - *You may have been contacted separately for hotel transport due to your flight itinerary. If so, please follow those procedures.*

### Transport from Hotel to Venue:

- For those staying at hotels off-site, there will be buses provided at 8:30am each morning to bring you to the conference venue.
- For the evening of the 19<sup>th</sup>, a bus at 6:30pm will bring you to the venue for a welcome reception. *(Those staying at the venue do not need to take a bus)*

### Meals

All meals in Italy are provided and paid for. This begins with lunch and dinner on May 19th and goes through breakfast on May 24th. We have adjusted the menu to fit different diets (vegetarian, halal, etc.). Please see email sent May 17<sup>th</sup> for additional information.

### About Italy / Rome

Rome is a popular destination in May! The temperature is generally around 75F / 56F | 23C / 18C and on average it rains 5 days in the month.

**Electricity:** Italy standard voltage is 230V. Type F and Type L plugs are used. You may need a plug adapter depending on your country of origin. You are responsible for bringing these items.

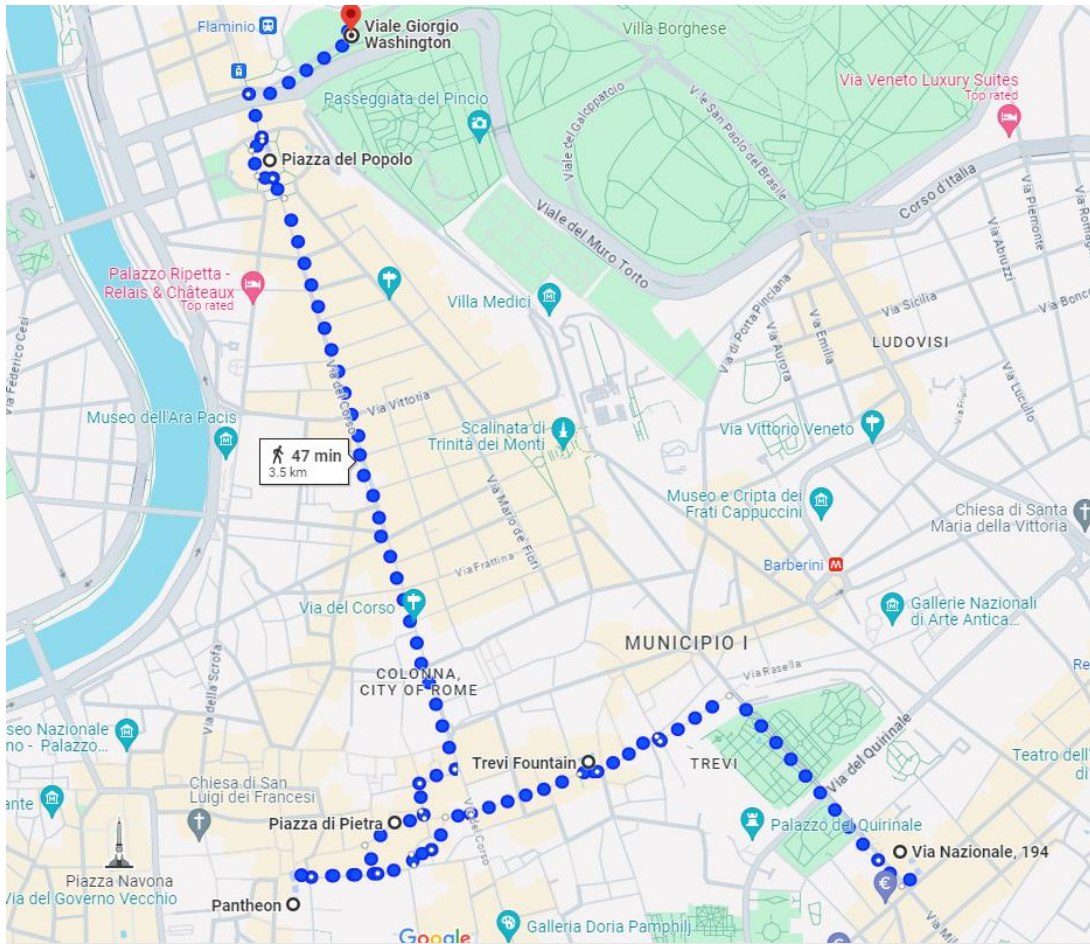

## ANNEX – Walking Itinerary, Thursday afternoon



This map shows “Itinerary 2” below.

### Itinerary 1: (MAP)

3:00 PM - Start at Palazzo Esposizioni (lunch), Address: Via Nazionale, 194

- 1) [Trevi Fountain](#)



- Walk (approx. 15 minutes) to the Trevi Fountain.
- Spend 20 minutes here to admire the fountain and toss a coin for good luck.
- 2) Walk to the [Spanish Steps](#).
  - Spend 10 minutes enjoying the view and the Barcaccia Fountain.
- 3) Walk to the [Pantheon](#).
  - Spend 20 minutes exploring the interior and the Piazza della Rotonda (there might be line to enter).
- 4) Walk to [Piazza di Pietra](#).
  - Spend 10 minutes exploring the piazza and its ancient Roman temple ruins.
- 5) 5:00 PM - 5:45 PM - St. Peter's Square
  - Take a taxi (approx. 15 minutes) to St. Peter's Square.
  - Spend 30-45 minutes exploring the square and the exterior of St. Peter's Basilica.
- 6) 6:00 PM - 6:30 PM - Walk to Viale Giorgio Washington for pick-up.

#### **Itinerary 2 :**

- 1) 1-4 as above
- 5) Follow Via del Corso until you arrive to [Piazza del Popolo](#).
  - a. Option to enter to “[Basilica di Santa Maria del Popolo](#)” to see Caravaggio’s masterpieces.
- 6) Then walk to pickup point close by.

#### **Itinerary 3:**

- 1) 1-4 as above
- 5) Go to [San Luigi dei Francesi](#) to see Caravaggio masterpieces.
- 6) Follow Via del Corso until you arrive to [Piazza del Popolo](#).
  - a. Option to enter to “[Basilica di Santa Maria del Popolo](#)” to see Caravaggio’s masterpieces.
- 7) Then walk to pickup point close by.

#### **Itinerary 4 (different!)**

3:00 PM - Start at Palazzo Esposizioni (lunch), Address: Via Nazionale, 194

- 1) Walk (approx. 20 minutes) to the Colosseum following via dei Serpenti
  - a. Spend 20 minutes exploring the exterior and taking photos.
- 2) Walk (approx. 20 minutes) to Piazza Venezia following the ancient road “Via dei Fori Imperiali” with archeological sites on the way.

- 3) Walk (approx. 10 minutes) to the Pantheon.
  - a. Spend 20 minutes exploring the interior and the Piazza della Rotonda (there might be line to enter).
- 4) Go back to Via del Corso until you arrive to Piazza del Popolo.
  - a. Option to enter to “Basilica di Santa Maria del Popolo” to see Caravaggio’s masterpieces. Then walk to Pickup point closeby.
- 5) Then walk to pickup point close by.

(Alternative: take a taxi to the pick up point from Piazza Venezia)

Gracchi (Ice Cream): Near Pantheon (Via dei Gracchi, 272)

Rinascente (Shopping): Near Trevi Fountain (Via del Tritone, 61)
