Dear Wishart,

A propos ~~of~~ what you told me on Mr. Amoako-Atta's complaint to Mr. Woods that the British press never sought to speak to anyone who could give them the true facts, I thought you might be amused by the following note by my Director of Information here:

"The Ghana Information Services made an appointment for Mr. Lewis, the Times' leader writer, to call yesterday afternoon on the Principal Secretary at the Ministry of Finance, Mr. Gyasi-Twum.

While Lewis was talking to the Principal Secretary the Minister came into the office. Gyasi-Twum handed him Lewis's card and suggested that Amoako-Atta might wish to have a word with him. The Minister angrily threw the card on the table and said: "You ask questions after you have abused us", and stalked back into his office."

Roy Lewis is a senior member of the editorial staff of the Times and a highly responsible journalist.

It would be charitable perhaps to assume that the Minister thought the Sunday Times was the Sunday version of the Times.

SUBJECT: Mr. Woods' Visit to Dominion Securities Corp. in Toronto

1. Mr. Woods, as you know, is scheduled to visit Dominion Securities Corp. at 11:00 a.m. on November 9th. At the request of Mr. Graves I called Dominion Securities to find out details of the visit. These details, as outlined to me by Mr. Ward, Vice President of Dominion Securities, apparently differ sharply from your understanding of what is to take place.

2. Mr. Ward said that Mr. Woods was expected at the office of Mr. G.E. Phipps, President, on the 5th floor of the Bank of Montreal Building, King & Bay Streets, Toronto, at 11:00 a.m. Present will be Mr. Phipps and Mr. N.D. Young, Vice President and Director of Dominion Securities. Later in the day -- no time was specified -- after Mr. Woods' talk to the Canadian Club, a larger meeting would be held at Dominion Securities at which Edward Ely, Executive Vice President of Wood, Gundy & Co.; Bruce West, President of A.E. Ames & Co.; and other executives of Canadian dealer and investment houses would be present to meet Mr. Woods.

3. I expressed surprise at these plans, and Mr. Ward said he would get a letter off to me on this at once.

I understand this was proposed as a "cocktail" meeting.

Mr. Woods' Travel in Nigeria

I. Assuming that Mr. Woods would use only the scheduled airlines and taking into account the Nigerian Airways timetable known at the present time, it would appear possible to suggest a basic itinerary with two alternative routes.

A. Basic Itinerary

This itinerary would be as follows:

LONDON-LAGOS and surrounding areas - (with possible visit to IBADAN) KANO - KADUNA - KAINJI (Niger Dams) - KADUNA - KANO - LONDON. With this pattern Mr. Woods would leave LONDON on a Wednesday and would be back in LONDON on Friday evening the following week.

B. First Alternative Route

Mr. Woods would spend a weekend in the resort area of JOS. The itinerary would be the same as the preceding one except that Mr. Woods would go from KANO to JOS on Saturday morning and to KADUNA on Monday morning then following the above itinerary. In that case Mr. Woods would leave LONDON on Monday instead of Wednesday.

C. Second Alternative Route

Mr. Woods would visit the four Regional Capitals and could spend at least one day in each of them. Mr. Woods would leave LONDON on Monday. At the end of the week he would fly to BENIN CITY - ENUGU and back to LAGOS. Then the trip would be similar to the basic itinerary, i.e. LAGOS - KANO - KADUNA - KAINJI - KANO - LONDON.

II. All of these travels can be made within two weeks, but they imply the use of the Nigerian Airways commercial flights. Nigerian Airways are using on their domestic lines DC3 and Fokker 27 Friendship without first-class. In any case it is necessary to use a private plane to reach the Niger Dam site or to fly over it. Therefore, it is suggested to consider the possibility of using private planes to go to KAINJI from KANO or KADUNA and to ENUGU and BENIN CITY from LAGOS while using commercial lines between LAGOS and KANO where jet liners are in operation.

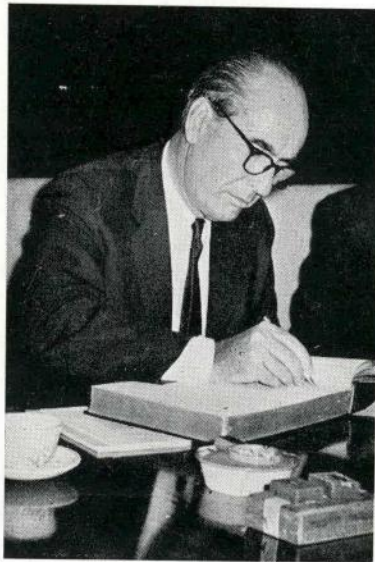

World Bank President Visits IIC's Office In New Delhi

August 25, 1964 was an important day for the Indian Investment Centre. It was on this day that Mr. George Woods, the world's foremost banker, paid a visit to the Centre's office in New Delhi. Mr. Woods was for two years a member of the IIC's Governing Body and was closely associated with its organisation at its very inception. Notwithstanding an extremely busy programme in Delhi, he readily agreed to visit the Centre's office when an invitation went out to him from IIC's Chairman, Mr. G. L. Mehta. Mr. Woods paid a similar visit to ICICI's office in Bombay on 26th August.

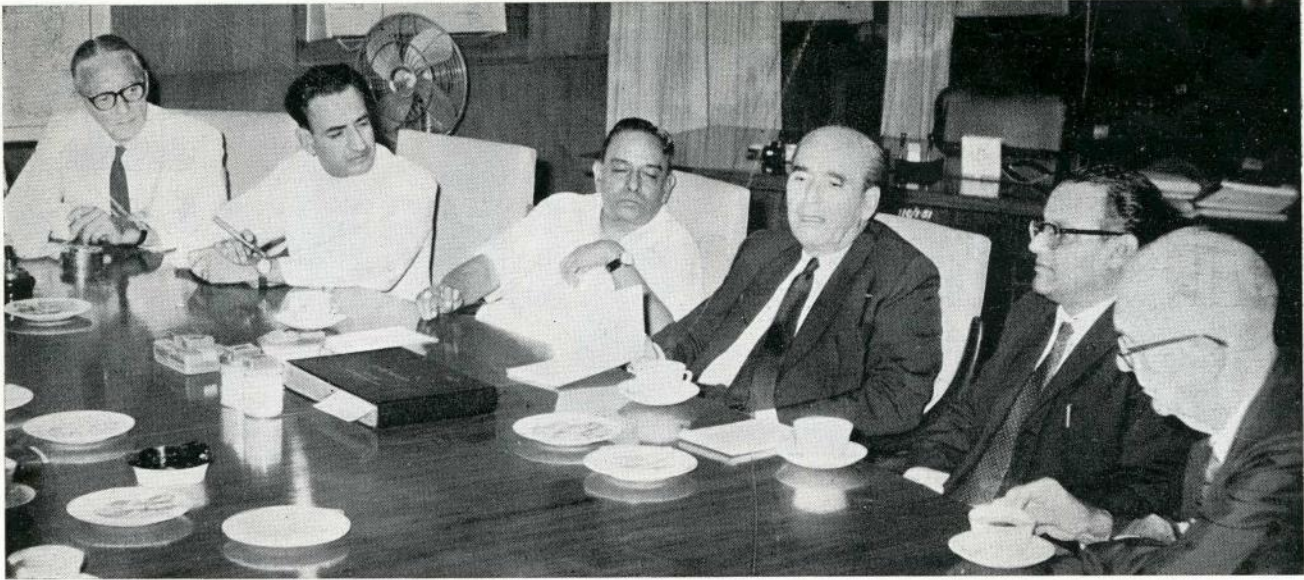

At the Centre's office in New Delhi, Mr. George Woods was received by Mr. S. Ranganathan and Mr. G. L. Bansal, two members of the Governing Body. Mr. C. Tyler Wood, Director, U.S. AID mission in India and Mr. John F. McComb, Chief, Technical

Assistance, AID were also present. Senior officers and advisers were introduced to him and after a brief account was given of the Centre's activities, an interesting discussion followed. Mr. George Woods recalled the days, more than three years ago, when he was associated with the organisation as a member of the Governing Body. Later, as a member of the Advisory Committee to the New York office, he had occasions to come into close contact with the working of the Centre. He stated that the Centre had done some fine piece of work during the past three years, and he was happy to note that 67 proposals in various fields had matured into joint ventures with its assistance. With wider publicity, the Centre would be able to guide more and more foreign entrepreneurs in investing in India. It should not only be able to promote joint ventures with Indian and foreign parties but also guide the foreign industrialists in choosing competent Indian partners with good financial background and reputation.

Asked about the prospects of increased World Bank financing, Mr. George Woods stated that at present World Bank loans could be given only for certain industrial projects for which guarantees of the concerned governments were necessary. There was a proposal to amend the articles of agreement of the Bank and I.F.C. (Washington) to make it possible for the Bank to lend to the I.F.C. for re-lending to private industries. If the proposal was approved at the Tokyo meeting, IFC would be empowered to borrow from the Bank in an increasing measure and use these re-

sources for financing the private sector to a much larger extent than its present resources permitted.

The question of evaluation of the Centre's work during the last three years came up during the discussions. Mr. C. Tyler Wood said that he had the opportunity of being associated with the working of the Centre right from the beginning and it appeared to him that the Centre had done very well during a period which was most difficult from the point of view of foreign investments. He was of the opinion that, compared to the situation five years ago, there was a growing understanding in the country about the need for speedy

disposal of investment proposals and better appreciation of the standpoint of foreign investors. The Centre had all these years done "quiet and careful work" and gained recognition.

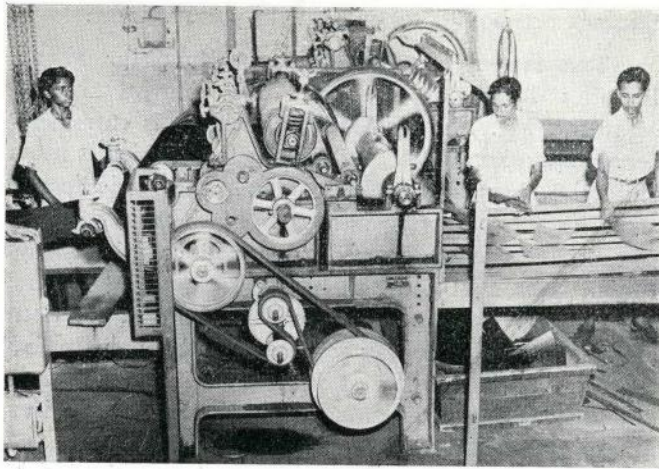
Welcoming Mr. George Woods, Mr. S. Ranganathan said that he was very happy that Mr. Woods was able to pay a visit to the Centre in spite of his busy programme. The real value of the Centre's activities, he added, did not lie merely in the number of joint ventures assisted, but in supplying useful information to educate Indian and foreign parties in making the right type of industrial efforts in the country.

R. S. Bhatt—Governing Body's New Member

Mr. R. S. Bhatt, Chairman, Unit Trust of India, has been nominated by the Government of India as a member of the Governing Body of the Indian Investment Centre. With his nomination, the Centre will continue to have the benefit of his guidance and rich experience in the working of the Centre.

Before joining the Unit Trust, Mr. Bhatt was the Centre's Executive Director right from its inception.

Carborundum Universal Ltd., Madras Forges Ahead



Section of the Bonded Abrasive Finishing Department

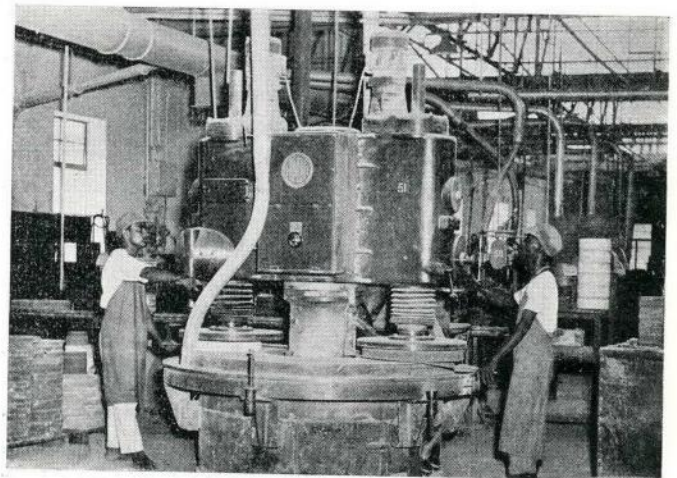
Carborundum Universal Limited, Madras, is a joint venture in which three companies—two of them foreign, have participated in the production of a wide range of bonded and coated abrasives, which play a vital part in industry. The Indian promoter is Murugappa & Sons, a notable business house of Madras. The foreign partners are: Carborundum Company, Niagara Falls, New York, U.S.A., one of the world's biggest abrasive manufacturers with 35 plants all over the world and Universal Grinding Wheel Company Limited, Stafford, England, one of the biggest grinding wheel manufacturers in the U.K.

Carborundum Company, Niagara Falls, New York and Universal Grinding Wheel Company, Stafford, were enjoying almost 80 per cent of the sales of bonded abrasives in the Indian market prior to the first world war and it was with these two companies that Murugappa & Sons started negotiations for a joint venture and finally succeeded in their efforts. Carborundum Universal Ltd. Madras was floated on 21st April 1954. Production started in September 1955 and the present output of the company is of the order of 1800 tons of bonded abrasives and 1,00,000 reams of coated abrasives per annum. It covers practically the entire range of bonded abrasives, both vitrified and resinoid. The coated operation similarly covers almost entirely the full range of coated products. At the Madras Works, the company is installing a Super Refractories project which will start with a manufacturing programme of 750 tons of Super Refractories per annum for which a very good demand exists in the country.

In both coated and bonded abrasives, the main material used is synthetic grains—either aluminium oxide (Al_2O_3) or Silicon carbide (SiC). Uptil now, these raw materials used to be entirely imported from Niagara Falls, but an interesting feature of the joint venture is that Carborundum Universal has planned to produce aluminium oxide in its own plants in India. An aluminium oxide plant is under construction at Edapally near Cochin. The raw material for aluminium oxide — a special grade of bauxite — will be mined by the company in Saurashtra and calcined will be produced in a plant under erection at Por. Okha. The company's production programme thus involves a gigantic feat of organisation extending from Madras to Port Okha and Cochin which, between them, cover a distance of 3,000 miles for a round journey.

The final production programme of the company will be fully diversified and cover the entire range of products from the first stage to the last, as will be evident from the following schedule:

- (1) Aluminium oxide at Cochin—7,000 tons per annum.
- (2) Calcined Bauxite at Port Okha—30,000 tons per annum to be raised eventually to 90,000 tons. A considerable part of the output will be exported.
- (3) Super Refractories: 750 tons per annum.
- (4) Bonded abrasives: Present output 1,800 tons per annum to be raised to 3,500 tons during the next three or four years.
- (5) Coated abrasives: Present output—1,00,000 reams to be increased to 1,50,000 reams shortly.

The company started with an authorised capital of Rs. 7 million, which has been fully paid-up. In addition, there is an accumulation of share premium of Rs. ½ million. Authorised capital is now proposed to be raised to Rs. 25 million out of which the paid-up portion will be Rs. 10 million in due course. This is being done with a view to financing the expansion programme. In the capital structure, Carborundum Company of New York holds 27 per cent of the stock while Universal Grinding Wheel Company, Stafford, England, holds another 22 per cent, leaving 51 per cent to the Indian Share-holders. The original foreign exchange component of the project was practically fully covered by the 49 per cent of capital held by the foreign partners. The Indian company's technical collaboration is, however, only with Carborundum Company of New York, for which a technical service fee of 3 per cent on turnover is paid. Besides, a sum of Rs. 0.2 million worth of free shares was issued to the New York company for trade marks and patents. The company has received a foreign exchange credit of Rs. 1.75 million from the Industrial Credit and Investment Corporation of India Limited to finance the import content of the bonded abrasives expansion project. A rupee loan of Rs. 3 million has been granted by the ICICI out of which Rs. 1.81 million has been repaid. For additional finance to meet the cost of expansion, the ICICI has sanctioned a further loan of Rs. 7.5 million (Rs. 6.5 million in rupees and Rs. 1 million in foreign currency).

The Company has a strong and high-powered Board of Directors with Sir A. Ramaswami Mudaliar, a leading industrialist of the country and a member of IIC's Governing Body, as Chairman. It has among others the Vice-President, International Operations of Carborundum Company, New York, as well as the Chairman of the Carborundum Company Limited, Manchester, as directors. Universal Grinding Wheel Company Limited, Stafford, England, is also represented on the Board by its Managing Directors.

The company's profitability is exceedingly good. While in the first year of production (1956) no dividend was declared, in each of the two subsequent years dividend declared was 3 per cent. This went up to 6 per cent in 1959 and 9 per cent in 1960, which figure continues to rule today. A large part of the Company's earnings are retained in a number of reserves which amounted to about Rs. 4 million at the end of August 1963. The company's line of production is such that the market grows with growing industrialisation. There are other companies producing grinding wheels, but Carborundum Universal will be the only one manufacturing synthetic grains. The company will meet

the whole of India's demand for aluminium oxide and synthetic grains. With technical knowhow assured from one of the leading foreign manufacturers, the earnings are bound to grow in the years to come.

The factory is situated at Thiruvottiur about 10 miles from Madras city. Its General Works Manager, Mr. Thomas William Jackson, is extremely capable and knows his job. The factory, which is neat and trim, has about 600 workers, who periodically enter into a three-year agreement with management. The technical department is manned completely by Indian personnel and all the Divisional Managers are Indians. Mr. Jackson considers the collaboration agreement as a three-way joint venture between India, the U.S.A. and the U.K., both from the point of view of financing, technical knowhow and training. Batches of trainees visit periodically plants in the U.S.A., the U.K. and Germany for ascertaining the latest advance in techniques on a continuing basis. About twenty Indian technicians have so far been trained in the U.S.A., the U.K. and Germany. The company is working to worldwide standards against which its products are tested. There is a laboratory designed for quality control, but the young scientists in the laboratory have also done a fair amount of development work. Originally, the highly specialised machineries for abrasive industry were imported from the U.K. and Germany; but some of them are now being locally fabricated with drawings supplied by collaborators.

The company's relations with the collaborators have been uniformly good. Mr. M. V. Arunachalam, one of the managing directors, told IIC that the company has been receiving allround cooperation from its collaborators who are also completely satisfied with the operational results. Mr. J. A. Williamson, Chairman of the Carborundum Company of U.K. and one of the directors of Carborundum Universal, paid a glowing tribute to the company on the occasion of the laying of the foundation stone of the aluminium oxide plant at Cochin. He said that ever since its inception in 1954-1955, Carborundum Universal had grown steadily and made its contribution to the industrial development of India. The successful operation of the Indian company, added Mr. Williamson, had enthused its Western associates to come forward and cooperate in establishing further manufacturing facilities for related products such as synthetic abrasive grain. He concluded by saying that the performance to date of Carborundum Universal was most encouraging and he was sure it would scale new heights.

Petro-chemicals Team from Japan visits India

A Japanese team of experts in the field of petro-chemicals reached Delhi on 10th September. This visit, which is of four weeks' duration has been jointly sponsored by the Japan Consulting Institute, the Indian Investment Centre and the Indian Refineries Ltd. The members of the team are:

Authorities in India are impressed with the striking advances in the technology of production and use of petro-chemicals achieved in Japan in recent times, whereby more than three dozen petroleum refineries and petro-chemical complexes of large capacities have been brought on stream in that country. As India is on the threshold of a rapid advance in petro-chemicals manufacture, the advice of the leading experts from Japan will be of immense value.

The members of the team held discussions with the Ministers and the officers of the Ministry of Petroleum and Chemicals as well as with the Indian Investment Centre and Indian Refineries Ltd. They will visit the existing and proposed petroleum refinery sites such as Koyali, Trombay, Cochin, Madras, Haldia and Barauni. The objective of the team is to assess facilities available at suitable locations for the establishment of naphtha cracking plants and for processing the chemicals obtained to turn out consumer products such as plastics, synthetic rubber, synthetic fibre etc. The possibility of technical and financial participation by Japanese producers in India's petro-chemical projects will also be explored.

After completing on-the-spot studies at the various locations, the members of the team will return to Delhi and participate in a final round of discussions. Based on these studies and discussions the Japanese experts are expected to provide a report laying down guidelines for organising the development of petro-chemicals industry in India.

26 Joint Ventures Approved in August

The Government of India have accorded approval to 26 foreign collaboration agreements during August 1964. Of these, 16 relate to financial participation with foreign capital flowing to 7 new ventures and 9 existing projects. The benefits of advanced technology would flow to the remaining ten.

The 16 projects involve a total investment of Rs. 183.8 million. The contribution of foreign investors would amount to Rs. 62.22 million i.e. about 34% of the total investment.

Investment in new ventures alone would aggregate Rs. 153.5 million, of which the foreign collaborators would provide Rs. 54.2 million. The U.K. with four agreements gains the lead and would invest Rs. 39.5 million. The share of West Germany with 2 agreements is estimated at Rs. 12.27 million and that of Switzerland Rs. 2.4 million. The chemical industry claims the largest amount of foreign investment at Rs. 45.4 million. Shell Petroleum Co. Ltd. of U.K. in collaboration with National Organic Chemical Industries Ltd., of Bombay would invest Rs. 33.4 million out of a total of Rs. 100 million for the manufacture of organic and inorganic chemicals. Similarly Farbwerke Hoechst A.G. of West Germany in collaboration with Polyolefins Industries Ltd. of Bombay would invest Rs. 12 million out of a total investment of Rs. 36 million for the manufacture of Polyethylene and Ziegler Catalysts. The other agreements cover important items of manufacture such as hard metal products, welding electrodes, stramit boards, bright bars, cigarette and tobacco making machines. Of the 7 new agreements, 3 took the form of majority equity participation by foreigners.

An investment of nearly Rs. 8 million from abroad would flow to the 9 existing projects which would invest an additional amount of Rs. 30.3 million. U.K. and West Germany are again the largest contributors with Rs. 3.4 and Rs. 3.28 million respectively. The other participants are U.S.A., Switzerland, and non-residents. The expansion schemes, will include among others the manufacture of forgings, hydraulic rubber brake hoses, engine valves, grinding wheels, steering gears and diesel vehicles, etc.

Technical know-how from 4 firms in the U.S.A., 2 each in West Germany and Japan and one each in Canada and the U.K. will assist in the manufacture of piston and piston rings, streptomycin, centreless grinders, cargo winches, cables, twist drills and armers.

Specific Investment Opportunity

FERTILISER INDUSTRY

"I ton of plant nutrients (N-P-K) can produce an average of 10 tons of basic food. Taking further into account that 1 metric ton of basic food provides approximately 5,000 calories per day for one year and the average world intake is 2,400 calories a day per person, then 1 metric ton of basic food provides enough calories for two people to live one year. . . Thus, the use of one additional ton of plant nutrients enables us to feed at least 20 more people."

Mr. Boudewijn, Chairman, Fertiliser Industry Advisory Panel U.N. Freedom From Hunger Campaign.

There are at present seven factories in India producing diverse types of fertilisers such as ammonium sulphate, urea, double salt (sulphate-nitrate) ammonium phosphate, ammonium chloride and calcium ammonium nitrate. Their combined annual production capacity is 3.7 lakh tons of fertiliser nitrogen (N). There are also over two dozen factories producing superphosphate fertiliser with an aggregate capacity of 1,10,000 tons of P_2O_5 .

During the past four years, India, on an average, imported 2,50,000 tons of N, 40,000 tons of P_2O_5 (exclud-

ing rock phosphate) and 30,000 tons of K_2O annually, to meet the growing domestic demand. The annual cost of the imported fertilisers was about U.S. \$50 million. It may be emphasised that owing to the paucity of foreign exchange, it has not been possible to import sufficient quantities of fertilisers to meet the existing demand in full. The aggregate supply of fertilisers comprising domestic production and imports is therefore not an accurate indicator of the current level of demand which is really much higher.

Projects under Construction

With a view to meeting the ever growing demand for fertiliser, 13 projects which include both expansion of existing nitrogen factories, and construction of new ones, are now at different stages of implementation. They are shown in the table below. Completion of the 13 projects together with the expansion of existing superphosphate factories will raise India's production capacity to one million tons of N, and 500,000 tons of P_2O_5 .

The Allied Chemicals and Andhra Sugars have formed a joint venture for the manufacture of ammonia and urea at Kothagudem. Another important joint venture between the International Minerals and Chemicals Company and E.I.D., Parry is implementing the fertiliser project at Visakhapatnam.

Hanumangarh, Kotah and Mangalore. Fertiliser projects are on the look-out for overseas collaboration.

Production Targets

The target of production capacity for nitrogen has been estimated at 2 million tons (N) and that for phosphatic at 1 million tons (P_2O_5), by the end of the Fourth Plan (1970-71). These are expected to increase to 4 million tons (N) and 2 million tons (P_2O_5) by the end of the Fifth Plan (1975-76). These targets are based on the large potential demand for fertilisers which in turn can be measured by considering a few facts about Indian agriculture. The consumption of nitrogen in U.S.A. amounts to about 4 million tons whereas in India it was 0.5 million tons last year. This is so in spite of the fact that the cropped area in India is 160 mnha which is roughly the same as the total cultivated area in the U.S.A. This is a measure of the potential demand for fertilisers in the country.

Pricing Policy

There is neither distribution control nor price fixation for ammonium phosphate, nitro phosphate, ammonium chloride and mixed fertilisers. Government, however, has set up the Central Fertiliser Pool for ammonium sulphate, ammonium sulphate nitrate, urea and calcium ammonium nitrate. The Fertiliser Pool is managed by the Department of Agriculture which purchases the entire domestic production of these fertilisers at fixed prices for distribution among the consumers at fixed prices. It may be stressed that the Government would like to discontinue the pool system as domestic supply catches up with the internal demand.

The Government of India have already given an assurance that a fertiliser factory in the private sector will be paid the same price which is offered to a public sector unit for the same type of fertiliser. In view of the more efficient processes of production and better management expected in the case of private sector units, the Government assurance would ensure attractive profit margins to fertiliser producers.

U.S. Consortium's Interest

The enormous scope for profitable investment in the fertiliser industry in India has been well appreciated by a group of important fertiliser producers in the United States. It is reported that the Bechtel Corporation of San Francisco has been invited by the Government of India to prepare a feasibility study. Bechtel and a consortium of U.S. companies have offered to establish 5 fertiliser factories in India with a total investment of about a quarter of a billion dollars.

Congress of International Chamber of Commerce to be held in New Delhi— February 1965

The 20th Congress of the International Chamber of Commerce will be held in New Delhi from 6th to 13th February, 1965. It is expected that about 1200 delegates representing ICC Members in about 60 countries, besides representatives of international organisations, will attend the Congress. Dr. Bharat Ram, President of the Indian National Committee of the International Chamber of Commerce will be the Chairman of the Congress. The Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry and the Indian National Committee of ICC will play host to the delegates. The meetings of the Congress will be held in Vigyan Bhawan during February 7 to February 12.

India's Prime Minister, Mr. Lal Bahadur Shastri will inaugurate the opening session.

The main theme for the 20th Congress would be: "World progress through Partnership." The subject has been divided into sub-themes for discussions in seven committees to be constituted. The topics chosen for detailed consideration deal with the relation between economically developed countries on the one hand and the under-developed countries on the other. They underline a search for prosperity through optimum operation of private enterprise.

The Congress will review the ICC's activities and draw up and adopt a Statement of Conclusions on the general theme.

After the Congress, foreign businessmen are expected to visit various industries in the country for seeking new opportunities for fruitful economic cooperation between India and other countries.

IIC OFFICIAL RECEIVES FELLOWSHIP FOR STUDIES IN U.S.A.

Mr P. H. Ramchandani, the Indian Investment Centre's Senior Officer (Legal), has been awarded the Central Government Lawyers' Fellowship for international legal studies at the University of Stanford, California, U.S.A. for the academic year, 1964-65.

He will be leaving India this month. One of the subjects he will take up for specialisation is "Americans doing business abroad."

Government Modifies Bonus Commission Award

The Bonus Commission in its report submitted to the Government of India in early 1964 had made certain recommendations which would generally be applicable to industrial establishments subject to the Factories Act. The Commission suggested that 60 per cent of the "available surplus" should be payable as bonus subject to a ceiling and a floor. For the purpose of computing the maximum and minimum amount of bonus the basis should be wages and dearness allowance taken together. The minimum amount of bonus should be equal to 4 per cent of the total annual wage bill or Rs.40 per worker whichever is higher. The maximum bonus should not exceed 20 per cent of the total basic wage plus dearness allowance. Another important recommendation was that only income-tax and super-tax plus rate of return on paid up capital at 7 per cent and that on reserves at 4 per cent should be treated as prior charges in arriving at the available surplus.

The Government of India have modified some of the recommendations of the Bonus Commission. The modifications are:—

- (1) All direct taxes including surtax and tax concessions such as development rebate will be deducted as prior charges in computing the "available surplus" from which bonus will be distributed. The Government decision, thus, reduces the balance of profits available for bonus determination.
- (2) The rate of return on paid-up capital will be raised from 7 per cent to 8.5 per cent and that on reserves, from 4 per cent to 6 per cent for the purpose of calculating the 'available surplus'. The rationale behind this decision of the Government is to allow a fair return to investors and also to enable an industrial enterprise to undertake expansion and modernisation with the help of internal finances to a reasonable extent.
- (3) The amount of bonus exceeding a certain maximum should be distributed in the form of securities and not in cash.

The bonus award will not be applicable to those enterprises which have already entered into bonus agreements with labour and which may renew them with mutually agreeable modifications. It is important to note that the public sector units whose sales turnover of not less than 20 per cent of the gross aggregate sales competes with the products and/or services

manufactured or sold by the private sector units, will also be subject to the bonus award.

The bonus formula, it may be emphasised, will also not be applicable to new concerns until they have recovered all early losses including all arrears of normal depreciation admissible under the Income-tax Act. The liability to pay bonus (including minimum bonus) will commence only (a) from the year in which there is for the first time an over-all net profit, i.e. sufficient profit after providing for the year's normal depreciation to wipe off all accumulation of previous losses and also arrears of depreciation; or (b) from the sixth year following the year in which the undertaking begins to sell its products and/or services *whichever may be earlier*. This exemption also applies to existing concerns in respect of new industrial units started by them either in the same or in a different industry.

The bonus formula provides for the computation of "available surplus" by deducting from the 'gross profit' the following:

- (a) Depreciation as per Income-tax Rules.
- (b) All direct taxes and tax concessions.
- (c) Return at the actual rate payable on preference share capital and 8.5 per cent on equity capital plus at 6 per cent on reserves.

The principle of "set off" and "set on" has been adopted. In case the amount allocable as bonus exceeds 20 per cent of the labour earnings as defined above, the excess upto a limit of a further 20 per cent is to be carried forward for being set off in the succeeding four years. Where there is no available surplus or the amount of the available surplus allocable as bonus is less than 4 per cent of the annual labour earnings, the whole of the quantum of 4 per cent or the amount necessary to make 4 per cent as the case may be is to be carried forward and set off in the succeeding years upto a maximum period of four years.

The incidence of the bonus formula on profitability will vary from one undertaking to another depending on several factors. It might, however, be stressed that one should take into account the *change* in the amount of bonus payable under the bonus formula rather than the total bonus payable in order to assess the additional incidence, if any, of the formula on profitability of an enterprise. This is necessary because companies making profits have so far adopted a policy of declaring bonus which may range from two to six months of basic wages paid to workers.

Finally, I write to tell you that the World Bank Governors' Meeting will be in Toyko this year, during the week beginning September 6, and I am planning to stop over in India enroute, probably during the week of August 24. I expect we will be in Calcutta and Bombay for a day or two and in Delhi for perhaps two or three, and if you and Ranu are going to be on the sub-continent at that time I trust it will be possible for us to see each other.

A team of over thirty top U.S. businessmen came out last week to India to survey the investment climate. I believe the visit was generally successful (for both sides); you would probably be hearing from some of them.

Mr. President, Distinguished Delegates:

The World Bank welcomes the opportunity to participate in the deliberations of this United Nations Conference on Trade and Development -- and we intend to participate actively and affirmatively. For world trade is not a subject of remote interest to the Bank; it is a matter of direct and immediate concern. Indeed, our Charter explicitly recognizes the intimate connection between international investment and international trade. And, as the agenda of this Conference clearly demonstrates, both investment and trade are basic to economic development, which is the essential preoccupation of the Bank.

Mr. President, I suggest that, in approaching its agenda, the aim of this Conference must not be merely to stimulate debate, to exchange views and to formulate issues. It must be nothing less than to make a real start in evolving international trade and development policies which are more adequate than those presently prevailing for stimulating economic growth throughout the developing world.

Fortunately, the Conference is meeting at a propitious moment. World trade is growing as fast today as at any time in the present century. The long decline in commodity prices has now been arrested and, in some degree, reversed. Nearly 20 years of development effort have brought many countries to a better position to undertake the decisive changes of production they must achieve for a better standard of living. And, not least important, there is in prospect a sustained rise in the prosperity of the industrial countries. The consequences of good that can flow from that are enormous -- a greatly increased demand for imports generally, including a continuation of the more buoyant demand for primary commodities; an increased ability on the part of the industrial countries to accommodate imports from the developing countries without causing severe hardship to their own producers; and,

perhaps most significant of all, an enhanced capacity to provide development assistance.

The scope for action on many fronts is greatly increased by the present state of the world economy. We can advance on our problems in a mood, not of caution and misgivings, but of confidence and high expectancy.

Not all of the questions which this Conference will consider lie within the reach of the Bank and its affiliated organizations; but we nevertheless are prepared to consider a wide range of actions in an effort to assist in reaching cooperative solutions to these questions. We are ready, for instance, to join actively in the search for answers to the vexing question of how to stabilize income from commodity exports. We want to assist in enhancing both the quantity and the quality of assistance to the developing countries, and in seeking ways of making the burden of international indebtedness more manageable. We want above all to increase our own contribution to the efforts of the developing countries themselves to diversify and strengthen their economies, for it is here that we think the most fundamental solutions lie.

* * * * *

Mr. President, the trade issues facing this Conference are many and complex. They are not going to be solved by any simple formula or master stroke. One guiding idea, however, can make our task easier: that what we can accomplish in the middle and long run will be worth more than it will cost us in the short run. In the short run, measures to change the existing patterns of trade in order to increase the export markets for the developing countries are likely to be painful. In the long run, however -- and it need not in fact be such a very long run -- such an expansion of trade necessarily brings advantages to both industrial and developing nations. It also requires action by both industrial and developing nations.

So far as the industrial countries are concerned, the required action is of many different kinds. These nations will have to move toward elimination of those elements of restriction that now exist on the importation of primary products. They will have to become considerably more receptive to imports of manufactured goods from the developing countries. And they will have to encourage regional groupings of the developing countries designed to stimulate trade in manufactured goods among themselves. Above all, the industrial countries must not let their own regional groupings freeze into closed systems, locking out exports in which particular developing countries can excel. For only if larger markets are available will the less developed nations be able to go beyond mere import substitution to develop really efficient industries based on economies of scale.

The industrial countries must, in addition, move to help liberate the underdeveloped countries from a difficulty particularly well known to many participants in this Conference. Some 30 countries, accounting for nearly half the trade of the developing world, are dependent on a single commodity

for more than half their export earnings; and many other countries are dependent on only two or three. Despite the over-all increase in world trade, the demand for primary commodities has grown only slowly, and prices have faltered. The value of the exports of the underdeveloped nations as a group has increased since the war at a rate only of some three to four percent a year. This is less than the growth in the volume of such exports and, more significantly, less than enough to support the level of developmental imports needed for a satisfactory growth of income. To use but one striking example, the Latin American countries increased the volume of their exports of primary commodities by 25 percent during the period from 1956 through 1962, but they actually earned less foreign exchange in the last year of the period than in the first.

The need to help the developing countries escape from their over-dependence on the export of primary goods appears to me incontrovertible. In the long run, as I have said, the only real solution is for those countries to produce economically for the home market more of the goods which they now import and to diversify their export production. This means both increased industrialization and increased productivity within the agricultural sector. These processes take time, however, and prompt consideration needs to be given to measures for moderating the adverse effects upon the orderly development of these countries which result from the wide swings in their export earnings. This Conference will be discussing over the weeks ahead whether the answer, or part of the answer, is to seek greater price stability through commodity agreements, or to try to mitigate the effects of price fluctuations through some new form of compensatory financing, or to try some new approach altogether. The important thing for present purposes is the increasing awareness on the part of the industrial nations that the problem is serious and that practicable solutions must be sought.

As I have already indicated, it seems likely that the World Bank's role will be primarily to help in the long-run process of diversification and modernization, rather than to finance mitigating measures. But we are quite prepared to join in exploring the issues involved; indeed, we are already deeply committed to studies of the coffee problem and of the market for extra-long-staple cotton. And I feel confident that such explorations will enable the Bank and the International Development Association (IDA) to formulate, within our means and within the authorization of our charters, increasingly effective measures to assist countries afflicted with difficult commodity problems.

* * * * *

Mr. President, let me turn now from the shorter-term trade issues to the longer-run and more fundamental problem of bringing about in the developing world more diversified and more efficient production. On this front, where we in the Bank can claim some expertise, I am convinced that there are promising opportunities for advance. During the 1950s, the developing countries as a whole achieved an average annual rate of growth of nearly 4-1/2 percent, despite the slackening of the rate in the later years of the period

and in the face of a rate of population growth that in many cases represented a heavy burden on already limited resources. Over this decade of accomplishment, there was an impressive accumulation of new assets in the form of basic supports to a productive economy -- roads and railroads, ports and power stations -- and a growing experience and wisdom in dealing with development. Many countries -- although, unfortunately, by no means all -- are now in a position to go forward into new kinds of production and into better balanced patterns of trade. Development assistance to them ought to be increased. Merely to hold that assistance level, or even, as at times appears to be a possibility, to let it decline, would be to waste foolishly all the hard-won gains of the postwar era.

Now also is the time to improve the quality of development assistance. This means, in particular, supporting those programs and projects which promise the greatest economic return to the developing countries and avoiding those which serve primarily the short-range political or commercial ends of the industrial nations. The quality of aid has recently benefited by the coordination efforts of the Development Assistance Committee of the OECD and the growing sophistication of the developing countries themselves. Consultative groups organized by the Bank for several countries are also helping, and we expect to expand this activity as we find appropriate opportunity to do so. But more progress needs to be made, and in particular there must be more concentration of effort upon those countries which show that they are able to utilize aid effectively.

Moreover, the terms of aid must continue to be improved, for the problem of debt service continues to be pressing. In the seven-year period, 1955 to 1962, the public indebtedness of the developing world appears to have increased two and a half times. Over the same period, debt service payments rose by almost four times, due largely to the high proportion of the debt represented by short and medium-term suppliers' credits. It is a striking fact, I believe, that the average life of the aggregate public debt outstanding at the end of 1962 was only about eight years. Because of the seriousness of the debt burden, some governments have moved to lighten the terms of their assistance, by foregoing interest for an initial period of years or otherwise reducing the amount of the interest burden, or by extending the length of their loans. Other governments, unfortunately, appear to be offering development assistance on harder rather than easier terms, a tendency which, in my view, can only be self-defeating in the end.

A few countries are now caught in an acute cash squeeze which may require special action by their creditors. Others may find themselves in the same position unless both they and their creditors use greater discretion in connection with offering and accepting future short-term credits. This kind of difficulty cannot be removed simply by a debt reorganization unless that reorganization is accompanied by appropriate and effective agreements:

On the part of the debtor country, to take all measures within its capacity to bring its balance of payments under control and to meet its obligations as they fall due;

On the part of the creditors, to provide the debtor with capital on long term to meet legitimate development needs; and,

On the part of both debtor and creditors, to avoid, in the future, the kind of short-term credit transactions which caused the trouble in the first place.

Let me add that, where all parties concerned are willing to agree to appropriate disciplines in connection with a debt adjustment, they will find the Bank ready to consider adapting its own financing to the necessities of the situation and to assist, when requested to do so, in working out the required new financial regime.

* * * * *

Mr. President, I have spoken up to now primarily of steps which the industrial nations can take to help those less developed. Much -- indeed most -- of what needs to be done, however, must be done by the developing countries themselves. The industrial countries can provide a favorable trade environment for building up production within the developing nations, and they can help in that process by supplying skills, equipment and finance. But the development process itself is essentially a matter of domestic effort, for which no amount of external help can be a substitute.

First and foremost, what is required of the developing countries is a set of policies and conditions conducive to productive investment. I have in mind not only such basic elements as political and financial stability; I have in mind equally the provision of incentives to productive investment through appropriate changes in land tenure systems and through the enactment and enforcement of proper tax regimes. I have in mind, too, the building of educational systems adapted to development needs. And I have in mind the formulation of public investment programs designed, not to advance the immediate political interests of the particular government in power or the business interests of particular economic groups or localities, but to make the maximum contribution to the long-term balanced economic growth of the entire country.

The determined and single-minded pursuit of such a set of policies could well arouse a spirit of confidence in the developing countries, with effects that would be dramatic. Not the least of these effects might be to recapture or unearth those large amounts of domestic capital which have fled many less developed countries for investment elsewhere, or which have simply disappeared into hoards for safekeeping. To bring this blood coursing back into the veins of the developing nations' economies would be an achievement of major importance. It would also help bring about another consequence of great moment, by attracting more foreign investment. Foreign investment in the developing countries is not merely desirable, it is indispensable. It not only adds to capital inflow and facilitates the introduction of new productive techniques; it is also likely to bring in international partners

whose knowledge of trade channels can provide the leading edge for the entry of home industry into world markets.

One other significant opportunity lies at the doorstep of the developing world. As the Secretary General's report points out, nearly 100 of the developing countries have populations of less than 15 million. Two-thirds have populations of less than five million, less, that is, than the population of any one of many of the world's leading cities -- of Chicago, for instance, or London, Los Angeles, Moscow, New York, Paris, or Tokyo. Few of these countries, standing alone, offer a sufficiently large base for the efficient use of productive resources. For these countries, the hope for satisfactory development lies largely in regional arrangements to eliminate trade barriers, enlarge markets and rationalize production among themselves. We in the Bank have for a long time sought to encourage regional groupings of this kind and will not only welcome but seek out similar opportunities in the future, since for many countries this is clearly the path to healthy growth.

* * * * *

Mr. President, any country or group of countries prepared to adopt economic development as a central objective of its policy will find the Bank, together with its affiliates, a willing and, I hope, a powerful ally. Our own developmental role has been constantly expanding and our operations have, over the years, proceeded at an ever faster tempo. Loans and investments made by the Bank group of institutions in support of projects to increase production in the less developed countries now aggregate more than 5-1/2 billion dollars. In the 1963 calendar year, the level of our financing reached the equivalent of a billion dollars and for the current fiscal year ending June 30 it may be above that figure, to stand at the highest level in our history.

Of this record and of the momentum it reflects we can justly be proud. We are proud, but we are not satisfied. The decade of the '60s confronts the Bank with problems different from those it faced in the '50s; the approaches and solutions which have served the Bank well in the past as it sought to meet the needs of its members are no longer fully adequate or appropriate. Among other things, we had only 56 members ten years ago; now we have 102, and 20 of these became members in the last year. Many of our most recent members are new not only to the Bank but to the international community. Inexperienced in development administration, they need different kinds of assistance, both financial and technical, from those appropriate for countries which have been longer on their own. If the Bank is to go on being a dynamic agent of economic progress, it must adapt itself to the changing development environment and respond to the changing needs of its membership. The Bank, no less than its members, must continue to grow.

And so, Mr. President, we have embarked on a program of critical self-analysis, to consider wherein and to what extent our policies and internal organization need to be modified and the direction or emphasis of our activities changed.

The first consequence of this re-examination has been a decision to expand the scope of our financing. Up to now, the Bank has been concerned chiefly with large-scale projects to develop better transportation and new sources of energy. We do not propose to abandon these fields, and indeed, they no doubt will continue to absorb the major portion of our funds.

Building infrastructure, however, is not an end in itself. We have concluded that we should now greatly increase our assistance to agricultural and industrial production which infrastructure is intended to support and promote.

We have in mind, for example, assisting comprehensive agricultural schemes to increase productivity on individual land holdings, and hope especially to help strengthen organizations which extend credit or technical help to farmers. And because the investment requirements of agricultural projects call primarily for local currency expenditures, I am recommending to the Executive Directors that the Bank evidence greater willingness to help finance such expenditures. Moreover, I am pleased to say, we have enlisted the cooperation of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) in our plan to intensify our support of agricultural development on this broader scale.

We are also seeking ways to vary and broaden the nature of our assistance to industry. One approach will be to provide long-term financing for programs to import individual pieces of equipment, components and spare parts in cases where existing industrial capacity is not fully used because there is a lack of foreign exchange with which to buy such equipment from abroad. Other approaches, designed particularly to enable us to be of greater help to private industrial enterprises, are being explored. Above all, we intend to continue to press forward with our support of private industrial development companies. Seventeen such institutions, in Asia, Africa and Latin America, have already been set up or strengthened by the Bank group under the leadership of the International Finance Corporation (IFC). This growing network of organizations, equipped to tap both international and domestic capital and to provide managerial and technical assistance for growing industries, is giving a new impetus to the economic development of many of our member countries.

The success of our efforts in the fields of agriculture and industry depends in large part, however, on how effectively the initiative, intelligence and skills of the people of the borrowing countries are mobilized for productive purposes. Efforts to enable human beings to realize their fullest potential must be of many different kinds, but somewhere near the root of the process must be education. IDA entered this field some time ago and the Bank expects shortly to make its first loan for education purposes. In our efforts to do more to help create the facilities for the spread of education we shall have the cooperation of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), with which we plan jointly to explore and support new projects. We hope that one important consequence of our decision to enter the field of education financing will be to encourage others to intensify their efforts in this sector.

So much, Mr. President, for an indication of the ways in which the Bank is determined to expand the horizons of its lending. A second result of our re-examination of our policies has been the adoption of some greater flexibility in the terms of our financing. We have already, in one significant case, given a borrowing country the unusually long grace period of eight years before requiring the first amortization payments on our loan, in order to take account of the borrower's difficult short-term financial situation. We have also begun to lend at somewhat longer term than was our practice in the past, where this is justified by the prospective life of the project and is desirable in light of the country's economic position. And we are examining the whole problem of local expenditure financing which I have already mentioned in connection with agricultural projects.

A third decision which has emerged from the review of our activities is that our technical assistance and training activities must be greatly enlarged. As most of you know, the Bank decided long ago that the effective discharge of its development responsibilities required it to supplement its lending operations with many types of technical assistance. We have been particularly concerned, up to now, with development planning. We have helped 25 countries to draw up programs of economic development; we maintain an Economic Development Institute as a senior staff college whose purpose is to improve both the formulation and execution of development programs; and we have established a Development Advisory Service whose members are now functioning as program advisers to 11 governments in the less developed world.

Without in any way reducing these efforts, we propose now to put greatly increased emphasis on assisting our members to identify and prepare projects. We have come to this decision because the flow of sound, economically viable projects coming forward from many developing countries today is not enough to enable these countries to realize the growth rate which it is within their capacity to attain. It is not that good investment opportunities are lacking; what is lacking is initiative and proper organization to enable those opportunities to be realized.

Assistance in project preparation is not a new departure for us. The Bank, and IFC as well, seldom finance a project without having made suggestions which will add to its practicability and increase its economic and financial return. In recent months, however, we have given increased attention to the project problem. We have added specialized courses in project evaluation to the curriculum of our Economic Development Institute. We have undertaken more and more pre-investment studies of possible projects and sector programs, both as Executing Agency for the United Nations Special Fund and on our own. For the future, we are giving serious consideration to increasing the number of our field representatives responsible for providing assistance in project planning on the spot. And the partnership arrangements with FAO and UNESCO which I have mentioned are designed, among other things, to expand the number and improve the quality of agricultural and education projects available for financing. But we are fully aware that these efforts, in relation to the need, are modest and we are anxious to explore suggestions for helping still further to accelerate the flow of good investment projects. For such a flow is a sine qua non for economic progress.

There is, of course, another sine qua non -- adequate resources with which to finance those projects. And that brings me to my last point: however much success we may have in reorienting Bank policies and in expanding the scope of Bank lending and technical assistance activities to meet the development needs of the '60s, the effectiveness of our efforts will, as a practical matter, be circumscribed by the adequacy of the funds available to us.

Certainly the minimum acceptable target for Bank/IDA activity over the next decade should be to make as large a net contribution to the needs of the developing countries as these institutions have made in the past; our aim must in fact be much higher if the goal of satisfactory economic progress is to be achieved. Since the Bank is entering upon a period in which it will be receiving very sizable repayments of the principal of loans made in earlier years, even the minimum goal will call for a correspondingly large increase in the gross level of financing by the Bank and IDA in the years ahead. The Bank, with access to private capital markets, should be able to find resources adequate to the demands of the proposed new dimensions of its lending. But a greatly increased proportion of development assistance must in future be made available on terms which impose a minimal burden of debt service upon the recipient countries. Insofar as multilateral development assistance is concerned, this calls for a greater role to be played by IDA. And IDA can play that greater role only if its own resources are considerably augmented.

The terms on which IDA makes its credits available preclude the possibility of raising funds through borrowing in the private market, as the Bank does. IDA must instead look primarily to governments for its resources. The relative speed with which IDA's initial funds have been committed or earmarked for sound and priority development projects, and the volume of applications for additional credits now under consideration or clearly visible in the offing, are evidence of the importance of adding substantially to the resources at IDA's disposition. Fortunately, the financial situation of the Bank itself is now such that it is in a position to make a contribution to this end. Because of the level which the Bank's reserves have reached, it no longer seems necessary to add to those reserves each year, as in the past, the full amount of the Bank's net earnings. It is accordingly my intention to recommend to the Bank's Executive Directors at the end of the current fiscal year that the Bank transfer to IDA a portion of the Bank's net earnings for the year which might prudently have been distributed as a dividend. This policy, if approved and continued by the Executive Directors, as I am confident that it will be, should over a period of time provide IDA with considerable supplemental strength.

But let me promptly add that, even with such transfers from the Bank, the needs which IDA was created to meet cannot be satisfied by governmental subscriptions at their present level. I earnestly urge, therefore, that the contributing governments participating in this Conference re-examine the amount of their pledges to IDA in the light of the pressing investment requirements of the developing countries as they may be revealed during the course of our deliberations here.

* * * * *

Mr. President, I should like to conclude on the same note which I struck at the outset of these remarks. The problems with which we will be grappling here, despite their urgency, are likely to prove insoluble if our vision is obstructed by the blinders of immediate self-interest. But if we cast those blinders aside, if we seek solutions within the framework of our common interest in long-term economic growth, the outlines of the path to progress will, I am confident, soon appear. And surely it must be our aim that, by the time this Conference adjourns, we shall have moved a measurable distance along that path, we shall have identified and isolated a number of specific programs worthy of further investigation, and we shall have agreed upon organizational and other arrangements to carry this work forward. It must in short be our unalterable resolve to press on with the deliberations here and now beginning until constructive solutions to our problems of trade and development are reached.



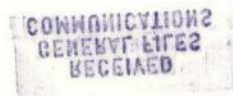

Debt reorganization, however necessary in itself, alleviates only the symptoms of the disease. It does not remove the basic cause. Unless the debtor countries agree that they will follow sound economic policies, and unless the creditor countries agree to provide credit to the debtors in amounts and upon terms which do not create an intolerable burden on the debtors, no permanent solution is possible. Unless something quite radical is done, the world will continue to be faced with over-borrowing, debt reorganizations, fresh borrowing, and, in due course, defaults, or near defaults, which make yet another debt reorganization necessary.

It will not be easy to get out of this vicious circle. To do so will require a degree of resolution which so far has been manifestly lacking among both debtor and creditor governments. It is, nevertheless, worth while to explore the possibility of reaching a series of agreements which will make it possible for the under-developed countries to obtain a steady stream of capital from the developed world and to use it in an orderly fashion. Agreements of the kind I have in mind involve for both parties responsibilities as well as benefits. That is the essence of a good agreement. The debtor country would undertake to discuss its economic situation and development plans at regular intervals with the countries and the international institutions who could provide the external capital. The discussions would cover such matters as the timing, scale, and character of the development

planned; the amount of short-term indebtedness incurred for what might be termed current purposes--for working capital; and the amount and terms of the long-term credits obtained for financing long-term capital investment. Creditor countries, for their part, would undertake to make credit available only within the framework of the plan agreed upon by both debtors and creditors and on agreed terms. I would not disguise the difficulty of reaching an agreement of this sort, and of living up to it when it has been reached. It involves an element of self-control, which even the most enlightened countries will find difficult to maintain. But, nothing less than this is going to provide a permanent solution.

I believe that the attempt is worth making. If there appeared to be a large measure of support for the proposal, both from debtor and creditor countries, the World Bank would be willing to take the lead in exploring it.

Dear George:

George Wishart passed along your inquiry about the Fund's publication, the International Financial News Survey. The story about it is that, like the other publications of the Fund, it was begun as a kind of technical assistance to member countries; its purpose was to bring information to the monetary authorities of the less developed countries that would be of specific interest to them in the discharge of their duties. Later on, it also began to publish items that were thought to be of interest to the Fund staff. In the circumstances, there was no discussion of the possibility of making the Survey a joint publication of the Fund and the Bank.

As you have noticed, the Survey consists entirely of items that already have been published elsewhere. Most of these items are gleaned by the staffs of the area departments of the Fund through their routine reading, and are passed on to the Editor for his consideration.

As you probably know, there is one joint publication of the Fund and the Bank: it is Direction of International Trade, in which the United Nations collaborates as well. On the chance that you may not have seen it, I am sending with this note a copy which you can chuck into the wastebasket when you are through with it. This publication was begun in 1950, and the contribution which each agency makes to it is explained in the introduction on page 3.

We have made the hotel reservation direct from here and it has been checked up on by Enrique Lopez-Herrarte. Enrique has also arranged for a car for Mr. and Mrs. Woods during their stay in Geneva. Enrique will be present for all the Geneva part of the trip and there will be no need for you or any other representative from the Paris Office to be there since this is primarily a matter of liaison business with the United Nations.


Mr. Woods plans to leave Geneva on Saturday, May 4 and fly to Lisbon for a short holiday visit. We have not as yet notified the Portuguese authorities and the intention is for the visit to be mainly holiday and "incognito". STATEMENT BY PRESIDENT REGARDING
VISIT TO EUROPE - MARCH 1963

Executive Directors' Meeting, April 25, 1963

1. I intended at the last meeting to make a brief and informal report on my recent visit to Europe which occurred the last two weeks of March, but time did not permit, and I would like briefly to make a report to you now.
2. The itinerary took me to Italy, the United Kingdom, Germany and France, and I was able to meet with the Governors of the Bank representing each of these countries. I also visited with the heads of the Central Banks. Through their representatives on this Board, I would like to thank these distinguished Governors and their colleagues for the courteous reception and the fine hospitality which I received everywhere.
3. My aim in paying these visits -- the first overseas visits I have made since taking this chair -- was to pay my respects to some of the largest European stockholders. No specific agenda were prepared for these meetings, and all the talks were of a general nature touching on matters of mutual interest regarding the operations of and the prospects for the Bank and IDA and IFC. The meetings were of real value to me, as they enabled me to obtain a firsthand knowledge of the attitudes and feelings of these large stockholders. I also felt it right that the Governors representing the large stockholders should have an opportunity of seeing me and learning a little about my own thinking as to our future activities and on some of our problems. I found in each country I visited wholehearted support for the work of the Bank and its affiliates and a very real desire to assist to the maximum extent possible in carrying out our objectives. Naturally this response gives me great encouragement.
4. Among the general matters I discussed was the question of the replenishment of the resources of IDA. The appropriate authorities in each country visited have this matter under close consideration, and all are unanimous that IDA must continue and must be provided with further resources. There remain differences on the apportionment of the next round of subscriptions among the major contributing countries, but I may say good progress has been made since the early part of this month on this question. I made my own viewpoint clear. I told the Governors that I appreciated the considerations which led to the making of loans and grants on a bilateral basis. I pointed out that the Bank

has built up over the years a competent and experienced staff. I stated that the Bank and IDA management and staff are ready and willing to administer such new funds as may be pledged to IDA.

5. I took advantage of my visits to explain to the Governors my own thinking regarding the use of the Bank's accumulating surplus. I reaffirmed my intention, after a reasonable time, of making proposals regarding the use of these surplus funds to further the purposes of the Bank. I expressed the hope that these surplus earnings could and would be constructively used by the Bank.

6. I would like to conclude by reiterating how useful I found these cordial exchanges of views. In due course I hope to visit in their own countries the Governors representing many other member countries. This may take me some time since an additional 79 countries are involved, but I shall be looking forward to doing so as opportunities can be arranged.

President's Visit to Member Countries (March 18 - March 30)

The purpose of Mr. Woods' visit to four of the member countries of the Bank was to meet with the Governors who represent the largest European stockholders in the Bank. Mr. Woods' intention was to pay his respects, on his appointment as President, to these stockholders; no specific agenda were prepared for meetings as it was intended to have a general talk only on matters of mutual interest regarding the operations of and prospects for the Bank and its affiliates. As the question of the replenishment of the resources of IDA is currently under consideration, this subject was discussed at most of the meetings.

Meeting with Governor Carli, Banca d'Italia

Mr. Woods met with Governor Carli on March 18. No specific problems or matters concerning the Bank or IDA came up for discussion. Mr. Woods thanked Governor Carli for the response from the Italian Government regarding its intention to contribute to the new resources required by IDA and said that he appreciated the attitude adopted by Italy. Thereafter, a general discussion took place on the prospects for the Italian economy.

United Kingdom - March 21 and 22

During the visit to London, Mr. Woods met with the Chancellor of the Exchequer (Mr. Maudling) and with the Governor of the Bank of England (Lord Cromer).

On March 22 Mr. Woods was present at a meeting in the Treasury, presided over by Sir Denis Rickett. Sir Denis Rickett explained the British point of view regarding the next round of subscriptions to IDA. The original subscriptions had been based on the first Bank stockholdings which had been fixed before the Bank came into being in 1946. The economic situation of Western European countries had changed considerably since then and it was the British contention that further subscriptions to IDA should be agreed on a more realistic basis; in particular, the British contended that the United Kingdom should not be asked to subscribe more than Germany and, if possible, the subscriptions from the United Kingdom, Germany and France should all be at the same level. Mr. Woods expressed sympathy with the United Kingdom's point of view, especially in regard to bringing up the German subscription in line with that to be furnished by the United Kingdom.

Mr. Woods then said he would like to make quite clear his personal position on the question of new resources for IDA. He appreciated the considerations which led certain countries to make loans and grants on a bilateral basis; he understood that these countries would also wish to support a certain amount of financing on the multilateral basis. In regard to the latter, the Bank and IDA had built up, over the years, a competent and experienced staff. If the member countries wished to continue their support to IDA, the Bank/IDA management and staff were ready and willing to administer these new funds.

However, it was entirely up to the member countries, and especially the larger of the Part I countries, to determine how much the total amount of the new resources would be and to make arrangements to provide these funds.

Mr. Woods referred to two other considerations. On the question of timing, it was desirable that a decision be reached on the amount of the new resources for IDA before the "pledging" meeting of the Pakistan Consortium which is due to be held at the end of April or first few days of May. Mr. Woods also explained his position in regard to the suggestions that the Bank might make a grant to IDA or pay a dividend on the understanding that the dividend proceeds should be subscribed by the recipients to IDA. Mr. Woods considered that it would damage the Bank's independent image if either of these courses were followed and he was strongly of the opinion that the question of new resources for IDA should be treated as a separate matter, quite independent of any thought of replenishing IDA from surplus held by the Bank. At the same time, he informed the United Kingdom representatives of his intention to come up with some proposals regarding a right and proper way of using the Bank's undistributed earnings to further the purposes of the Bank: perhaps these earnings could be used in some intermediate manner between ordinary Bank lending and the terms of an IDA credit.

In regard to the total amount of subscriptions which might be raised for IDA, Sir Denis Rickett felt that yearly subscriptions in aggregate \$250 million would be a maximum, and Mr. Milner Barry even queried whether that amount could be obtained.

Discussion then turned on the forthcoming meetings of the Pakistan and Indian Consortia on it being suggested that IDA participation in meeting the requirements for India and Pakistan would relieve the pressure on individual countries in contributing to the total amounts required. Sir Denis Rickett pointed out that it had already been agreed that no more than 40% of the resources of IDA could be used for India. Mr. Woods promised to enquire into this. Sir Denis Rickett also urged that the Bank should send a follow-up economic mission to India to review the progress being made under the Indian Development Plan. Mr. Woods said that he would like to discuss this with Mr. Escott Reid.

Germany - March 25 and 26

On March 25, Mr. Woods met with Dr. Karl Blessing. The discussion was general.

On March 26, Mr. Woods attended a meeting with Professor Dr. Ludwig Erhard, Minister for Economic Affairs. Dr. Erhard welcomed Mr. Woods and promised him the full cooperation of the German Government in the work of the Bank and its affiliates. Mr. Woods acquainted Dr. Erhard with his views on the respective roles of the Bank and IDA and, in particular, his intention to find an appropriate use for the Bank's surplus earnings. Dr. Erhard said that Germany was a loyal supporter of IDA and appreciated the need for IDA credits to countries which were no longer capable of taking on further loans on conventional terms. Dr. Erhard also stressed the need for a continuance of bilateral aid. Some countries have close ties with various less developed areas

and bilateral aid is necessary from a political standpoint. Germany supported various other lending agencies such as the European Investment Fund and was also encouraging private German investors to invest abroad.

Dr. Erhard said that Germany would certainly participate in providing increased resources for IDA for the next period. He agreed there should be no mixing of the roles of the Bank and IDA, although he did not think that a transfer of say, \$50-\$60 million a year from the Bank to IDA would affect the World Bank's standing. There was no need for a quick decision on this, but the possibility might still be kept in mind, especially as certain countries were now having difficulties in meeting all their commitments from budgetary sources. Mr. Woods said that he agreed that all methods and procedures should be looked at and reverted again to his intention to come up with definite proposals on how the Bank's earned surplus could best be utilized, possibly in an intermediate manner between Bank loans and IDA credits.

Dr. Erhard also referred to the desire of the major subscribing countries in IDA to play a more active part in determining the policies under which IDA credits are made. He distinguished between IDA and the Bank: in the case of the Bank, member countries or stockholders would leave it to the management to decide on the operations, to raise money in the markets, etc. IDA was different in that its funds can only be replenished by additional subscriptions from member countries. Accordingly, it would be right for these larger subscribing countries (the Part I countries) to participate to a larger extent in decisions as to how the aid is to be used. Mr. Woods said that he sympathized with this position and it was his intention to arrange a suitable method of consulting with those member countries which supplied IDA's disposable resources.

Dr. Erhard also referred to the need for some over-all review of the projects requiring financing in all developing countries and the various types of financial assistance which was being made available. He thought that some over-all review was necessary in order to assure that the aid being given would be as effective as possible. Mr. Woods said he agreed with this although it was difficult to find out the facts, especially as a great deal of financing was done through suppliers' credits and it was hard to get full details on this. Dr. Erhard thought that the Part I countries might enter into an arrangement to exchange this information among themselves and the Bank.

Mr. Westrick also referred to the question of the terms on which IDA credits are made and thought that there ought to be closer consultation and coordination in agreeing appropriate terms. He was not satisfied that the normal IDA credit terms are appropriate in all cases. Mr. Woods said that he understood the point and would give it consideration.

France - March 27

Mr. Woods met with the Minister of Finance, M. Giscard d'Estaing, and M. de Lattre on March 27. General subjects of interest were discussed, including the need for a replenishment of IDA resources. M. Giscard d'Estaing confirmed that it was the intention of France to make further contributions on an increased scale to the previous amount. France was involved in many important aid programs which obviously limited the amount that France would be

able to contribute to IDA, but it was its firm intention to support IDA and to indicate this support by an increased contribution. Mr. Woods thanked the Minister, appreciated the French viewpoint and explained to the Minister his views on the roles of the Bank and IDA. Mr. Woods also referred to his consideration on how best to use the Bank's surplus earnings. Mr. Woods' general views met with acceptance on the part of the Minister.

The Minister also referred to the intention of making further substantial repayments against the outstanding Bank loan to France. Mr. Woods made the suggestion that France should repay the loan in its entirety, on the anniversary (May 9) of the granting of the loan. This would be a spectacular demonstration of the strength of the French economy and would illustrate, in a clear manner, how the Bank had been able to assist countries and might suggest to these countries that when their economies had gotten to a satisfactory basis, they should plan to repay the Bank at the earliest practicable date. Mr. Woods further suggested that, as a next step, a moderate sized bond issue could be floated on the Paris Bourse. The Minister promised sympathetic consideration of this suggestion.

Mr. Woods also called on M. Brunet of the Banque de France.

Dear George:

Dick Demuth has sent me a copy of his letter to you about the draft of your speech for ECOSOC, and I am in full agreement with all that he says. It seems to me to be quite excellent.

But I do have one relatively small point. Towards the middle of page 11 there is a reference to IFC's "responsibility for financing and fostering industrial development corporations", and near the top of page 13 there is a reference to IFC "which has now assumed primary responsibility for our relations with industrial development corporations in our member countries". I wonder whether it is really necessary or wise to use the words quoted above and whether it would not be better to omit them. I am not disposed to argue, at any rate at present, on the division of responsibility in these matters between the Bank and IFC. But it is in fact the case that by far the larger amount of money is provided by the Bank and I would question whether the Bank can formally divest itself of responsibility for this. There is also a potential conflict of interest between the Bank as the provider of loan capital and the IFC as the provider of equity capital.

It is, of course, perfectly true that our expertise in these matters is now concentrated in IFC, but that seems to me to be rather different from saying that IFC has "assumed primary responsibility for our relations with"

I am not suggesting any change in the substance of the present arrangements - all I want to do is to omit words which might lead to an unnecessary argument either in the ECOSOC or, perhaps more likely, in the Bank Board.

Just a line, before I go off to Florida, about the ECOSOC speech. The draft which Harold sent you yesterday already reflects most of my suggestions and, in general, I think the presentation is now both sound in substance and lively in tone.


I do have a rather strong feeling, which I am conveying to Harold and John Croome, that the detailed discussion of two IFC operations -- namely, of the Fundadora underwriting on page 12 and of the Philippine Development Corporation financing on page 13 -- is out of keeping with the rest of the speech, the tone of which is properly very much more general in character. As you know, your audience at ECOSOC is primarily interested in general policies and trends, not in specific deals. I would suggest, therefore, that the whole discussion of Fundadora be eliminated on page 12. So far as development banks are concerned, I think we ought to mention the substantial progress of many of those we have financed in the past and stress (and identify) the large number that IFC has helped to organize or reorganize recently, but without spelling out the Philippine story.

What I have suggested has one other substantial advantage -- it would cut the statement somewhat. I think it would be desirable, if possible, to reduce the speech by about two pages. I am giving John Croome a number of additional minor suggestions designed to help toward that end.

I hope to have something for you on the use of our surplus earnings by the time you get back -- it isn't easy!

Dear George:

Here is John Croome's second draft of your ECOSOC speech, taking into account your comments and, in the first part, following the new line we spoke about before you left for Europe. In this form, the speech would probably take about 45 minutes to deliver, and one thing you may want to consider, among others, is whether the length is all right, or whether you want it shorter. Three-quarters of an hour is not long by ECOSOC standards, but it is five minutes or so longer than Gene ever spoke; and it may be longer than you care for. On the other hand, I think it is not a dull speech, even at this length.

You will find another copy of this draft when you arrive in Frankfurt. We are giving it general circulation to department heads in the Bank; and it may prove desirable, on the basis of their comments, to prepare a third and slightly retouched draft -- the more so if any of your comments have reached us in the meantime. If we do prepare a third version, it will be waiting for you at the hotel when you get back to Washington.

I'm also collecting notes from the area departments about operational matters that might possibly lead to unfavorable comment from the Council members, although the general feeling is that this is not something to be concerned about.

Your Press Dinner in London

This is to give you the names of the editors you will meet in London, together with a little information about them. The Bank's acquaintance with London editors is close and cordial; it dates from 1949, and became intensive in 1951, the date of our first sterling issue. In those early days, four of the editors you will meet -- Fry of The Guardian, Bird of The Economist, Bureau of The Statist and Gampell of Reuters -- were especially helpful with advice, encouragement and friendly reporting.

In all, we expect nine editors, as follows:

From The Times -- William Clarke, the Economic and Industrial Editor. He is in his early 40s, an attractive and capable younger man who has risen rapidly on The Times since he joined its staff as a junior some seven or eight years ago. He recently was promoted from City editor (that is, financial editor) to his present post, in which he directs the work of the City editor, among others. He occupies a position somewhat higher than Jack Forrest on The New York Times, with closer access to management and stronger influence on editorial policy. Clarke has known about the Bank since his apprentice days, and is well (although by no means perfectly) informed about the Bank. He has been in one of the several press tours of Bank projects we have organized in Europe, and has attended several of our Annual Meetings in recent years.

From The Daily Telegraph -- Francis Whitmore, the City editor. Francis is pushing 60, a John Bull type, ruddy and hearty. His paper, as you know, occupies a position in London somewhat analogous to that of The Herald Tribune in New York: it is the more or less acknowledged voice of conservatism, and especially financial conservatism, in the U. K. Whitmore's daily column is a very influential one and he, too, has a strong voice in the editorial policy of his paper. He is among the most prestigious, and probably is the best paid, of the City editors. He has been on one of our press tours.

From The Financial Times -- This paper, as you know, is widely considered to be the best financial daily in the world. Gordon Newton, the editor, unfortunately will not be in London while you are there, but we have a good substitute in the person of Gordon Tether. He is the author of a daily column signed, "Lombard," which is read with interest, although not always with approbation, throughout the City of London. He has been on two of our press tours; almost alone among financial writers, he has taken a special (and friendly) interest in IDA.

From The Guardian -- Richard Fry, the City Editor. He is in his 50s, of central European origin and therefore, by this time, more British than anybody. The Guardian is liberal in its politics and distinguished in its reporting; we presume that Richard himself was responsible for a spectacular recent scoop which resulted in The Guardian publishing, in advance, important sections of the long-awaited recommendations of the National Economic Development Office for enlivening the British economy. Fry has been one of our press tourists, was one of our original Four Horsemen and has regularly come to our Annual Meetings. He has a special interest in India, and has visited that country twice in recent years.

From The Economist -- Roland Bird, the Deputy Editor. In this post, Bird manages the second half of The Economist, which is published under the general title, "Business." He is just on the far side of 50, the most sophisticated of the editors and the finest literary craftsman among them. He is also the personal favorite of some of us: like Johnnie Miller, he is an opera buff; like me, he is a golf nut; and we have shared these pastimes with him on many occasions. He is one of the original Four Horsemen, a past press tourist, and regularly has come to our Annual Meetings. He, too, has first-hand acquaintance with India.

From Reuters -- Sidney Gampell, the commercial editor. He is sixtyish, and directs all of Reuters commercial and financial reporting around the world. He also writes most of a confidential letter from Reuters called X-Ray; like the little girl with the curl, when X-Ray is good, it is very good, but all too frequently it is merely horrid. Gampell has been a Bank press tourist and regularly comes to Annual Meetings. He is also one of the original Four Horsemen, and his publicity for the fact that the Bank's bonds in effect had a dollar guarantee was helpful to our first sterling issue. Quite unnecessarily, he has our Paris staff frightened to death; in fact, he is rather like a bear in manner and appearance: he is gruff of voice and, because of a permanently stiff neck caused by falling off the Isle of Aran years ago, carries his head tipped forward so that he peers out at you from under an overhang of formidable black eyebrows. His growl, nevertheless, is worse than his bite; and when he growls, the thing to do is to pay no attention at all.

From The Observer -- Samuel Brittan, the City editor. You probably know that none of the London dailies has a Sunday edition. Instead there are a few serious Sunday papers, of which the best established are The Observer and The Sunday Times. Both are notable for their foreign correspondence and their criticism of literature and the arts; but financial reporting is not their long suit. Brittan, of The Observer, is in his 30s, talks with a lisp, walks on his toes, and tends to write long and lumpily on topics about which he could be short and sweet.

From The Sunday Times -- William Rees-Mogg, the Economic editor. He is about the same age as Brittan, but a bit higher in the hierarchy, and is altogether better informed. He is very quiet, and easy to underestimate for that reason. He has been a press tourist and has attended Annual Meetings.

This will also be your first meeting with Viggo Christensen, the Bank's Director of Information for Europe. Although Viggo looks much younger, he is 56. He is Danish, but speaks excellent English; he was born in England and lived there until he was seven. He was financial and then foreign editor of a Copenhagen daily before he became director of the United Nations Information Centre in Copenhagen in 1949; he had been with the U. N. for eight years when we hired him.

* * *

Finally, let me make one suggestion about topics: the purpose of the occasion, of course, is to let the correspondents ask questions on things that interest them. To the extent that you are able to steer the course of talk, however, you might want to take pains to see that IFC gets its fair share of the discussion; IFC has long been regarded with scepticism in the United Kingdom, and the City journalists are not at all well informed about its current policies and operations.

In regard to the schedule of meetings, these seem fine and I have noted your additional information that we would meet with Mr. Blessing at 12:00 p.m. before the Bundesbank lunch on March 25th. Also that you have arranged for Guth to stay on after the lunch for a chat with Mr. Woods. I also note that Mattioli will leave a message for us in Rome.

Dear Johnnie:

As we are getting towards the end of the week, let me take this opportunity of summarizing where we stand on Mr. and Mrs. Woods' visit to Europe. We are very grateful to you for your quick answers on all the points and I think that we have now got the pattern of the tour fairly well established.

The bookings we are making here are as follows:

March 15, Friday

Leave New York by Alitalia Flight No. 611, at 6:40 p.m.,
for Rome.

March 16, Saturday, to March 19, Tuesday

In Rome. Staying at the Hotel Excelsior.

I have now got your cable No. 92, saying that you have fixed the appointment with Mr. Carli for Monday morning, March 18, and that you will be able to be with Mr. Woods when he makes that call. Mr. Woods will be very glad to have you with him, although he hopes it is not putting a strain on you to do this and then get on to Brussels that evening.

March 19, Tuesday

Rome to London, probably by Flight AF 611 to Paris and then on; we are checking further into this to find out what the change-over delay is in Paris.

March 19, Tuesday, to March 23, Saturday

In London (Claridges) and at Ditchley Park. (see below)

March 1, 1963

March 23, Saturday

To Paris by Air France, Flight 853, leaving at 1 p.m.

March 23, Saturday, to March 26, Tuesday

In Paris. Staying at the Bristol.

March 26, Tuesday

Leave Paris by Air France, Flight 760, at 6 p.m., for Dusseldorf and then by car to Bonn. Staying at Hotel Koenigshof.

March 28, Thursday - morning

By train or car to Frankfurt.

March 28, Thursday, to March 29, Friday

In Frankfurt. Staying at the Frankfurterhof.

The return trip is as yet undecided. As you know, the visit to Cannes for the Bilderberg meeting is out, but it is possible that Mr. Woods may want to pay a visit to Luxembourg to see a personal friend there. We are working out some suggested flights and I shall be in touch with you again about this.

The Travel Office here will arrange for a car in Rome and in London. May we take it that your office will arrange for the car for Paris and the German bit of the trip.

Thank you for your letter of February 27. Mr. Woods received yesterday an invitation from Sir Leslie Rowan to attend the Ditchley Park meeting, and he has decided to accept; it should be a very interesting meeting. I enclose a copy of a letter which I have written today to Sir Leslie, on Mr. Woods' behalf. Presumably, you will be arranging direct with Sir Leslie regarding your own attendance at the conference. Mr. Woods would, I am sure, be quite agreeable if you want to stay on there over the Sunday, as he does not expect to have any business engagements in Paris until the Monday.

You ask about the amount of luggage that Mr. Woods' party will have. I know that on their trips to the Philippines neither Mr. or Mrs. Woods have taken a lot of baggage, but of course they will need a little more in Europe on account of the weather conditions. I should think that one large car would do; if we need more, I can take a taxi with the remainder of the baggage.

Dear Johnnie:

Thank you for your letter of February 20th which has just been received. You will by now have got my letter of the 20th.

There are two developments here which I should mention. In the first place, we have learned today that the Bilderberg Meeting is to be held at Cannes and not in the Nice vicinity. Mr. Woods has not taken a final decision as yet on whether he will attend the meeting. I shall let you know his decision in due course. The evening flight from Frankfurt to the Nice Airport sounds rather a tiring one but we must leave it to you to suggest what is best in the event Mr. Woods decides to go to Cannes.

Secondly, Dr. Donner called this morning to say that Bonn has sent him preliminary word that Wednesday 27 should be alright for Mr. Erhard. However, Erhard himself has not yet been contacted personally and, accordingly, Donner would like to leave both dates March 27 and 28 open in case Erhard prefers March 28th. Incidentally, Donner is himself paying a visit to Bonn leaving here on Wednesday, February 27th.

The general program you propose of trying to see the Finance Ministries the first day and the Central Banks the second day is agreeable to Mr. Woods, if you can arrange it that way. Mr. Woods would like to leave some time free in Frankfurt for another appointment he is contemplating.

As I mentioned in my previous letter, it is probably best if we make all the bookings from here, at least as far as the travel goes. Perhaps you would like to have a word with the hotels in London, Paris and Bonn to see that they hold suitable accommodations. Then we can send confirmatory bookings in through American Express. As I mentioned in my last letter, I am scheduled to be on the trip and would want a single room in the various hotels.

Thank you for all your help in this matter. Will you send me a full program as soon as you have it worked out?

Dear Johnnie:

This will confirm our telephone talk this morning regarding Mr. Woods' plans. I am sure that we got them straight, but I summarize them here for the record.

Tuesday, March 19, New York to London.

March 20 - 22 in London at Claridge's.

Mr. Woods would like to leave Wednesday, March 20, free since he will take the opportunity of Burke Knapp being in London on that day to talk things over with him and get his up-to-date report on his visit to Germany etc.

On March 21 and 22, Mr. Woods would be available to see the British Treasury people, the Bank of England and Barings.

Mr. Woods agrees to the "off-the-record" small dinner with London press representatives if you can arrange it for either the Thursday or the Friday night.

March 23 cross over to Paris and stay at the Hotel Bristol.

March 23-26 in Paris.

Presumably you will make appointments for him with the Finance Ministry and Central Bank on March 25 and 26.

You suggested a small cocktail party for the Paris Office staff on one of these days.

March 27 and 28 Bonn and Frankfurt.

You said you would be working out the best method for Mr. Woods to meet the appropriate German contacts.

All the above dates are subject, of course, to the arrangements fitting in with the availability of the Chancellor of the Exchequer and the French and German Finance Ministers. Mr. Woods has given these dates to the appropriate Executive Directors here. Dr. Donner

telephoned back to say that it is not certain yet whether Mr. Erhard will be available at all at the end of March (he may be in Scandinavia) and at any rate he will need to have both March 27 and 28 left open to pick the one which would best suit Mr. Erhard. Donner said that he would deal with this and would let us know as soon as possible.

For the return trip, I mentioned that Mr. Woods might be attending the Bilderberg Conference near Nice on March 29 and 30. He has not yet had the official invitation. Assuming Mr. Woods does go to Nice, he should fly down either in the evening of March 28 or the morning of March 29. He would return from Nice to New York (possibly through Paris) on either Sunday, March 31, or April 1.

Mrs. Woods will be accompanying Mr. Woods. I am also scheduled to be on the trip.

I am asking our travel people here to sketch out an itinerary on the basis that we can get the various appointments suggested above. You will be letting us know in due course what you are able to arrange. I understand from the travel people here that it is best for us to take the tickets and to book the hotels although we would of course appreciate your advice on the flights etc.
