








GOVERNMENT ANALYTICS FELLOWSHIP





KEY FEATURES

The **Government Analytics Fellowship** will position participants at the forefront of a global movement to reimagine government through the lens of data analytics.

The fellowship will extend over a period of 6 months and comprise a mix of in-person training and in-service support from senior experts at the World Bank and University College London to develop a pioneering Government Analytics project in their government.

The Fellowship offers the following key events:




Participation in the second edition of the Public Institutions for Development Conference: Supporting Firms and Workers.



Participation in the Government Analytics course in Washington, D.C., with hotel, travel and subsistence covered by the World Bank.

LEARNING PATH

The fellowship extends over a period of 6 months. **However, the core full-time commitment is focused on the 2 weeks** of in-person training in Washington, D.C. which includes the Government Analytics course.

REQUIREMENTS

To participate in the World Bank Government Analytics Fellowships Program, candidates must meet eligibility requirements. These are designed to ensure that all participants are well-positioned to fully benefit from and actively contribute to the program.

All participants should:

- Be nominated by their organizations (Up to 2 fellows per organization).
- Be working in central government organizations (including agencies).
- Be mid-level managers or senior analyst positions (or equivalent) with authority to develop a government analytics project.
- Be able to demonstrate prior tertiary-level coursework on statistics or related quantitative methods.
- Be available and able to travel to Washington DC between January 27 and February 6.
- Have working proficiency in English.

HOW TO APPLY

Call for applications close on September 28. Applicants are expected to submit all documents by the announced closing date, and no exceptions will be made. More detailed information regarding the application can be found in our website: http://bit.ly/3wQLF1Q.

All applicants must apply on the <u>website</u> and submit the following documents <u>in English</u>:

- An **endorsement letter** from their organization detailing its support for the fellow's efforts to enhance government analytics capabilities through a specific project.
- A comprehensive **CV (3 pages maximum)**, highlighting relevant experience and indicating prior tertiary-level coursework on statistics or related quantitative methods.
- A **150-word summary** of a government analytics project. Consult worldbank.org/governmentanalytics to understand the range of potential projects.
