# 1. The Challenge

#### The Challenge

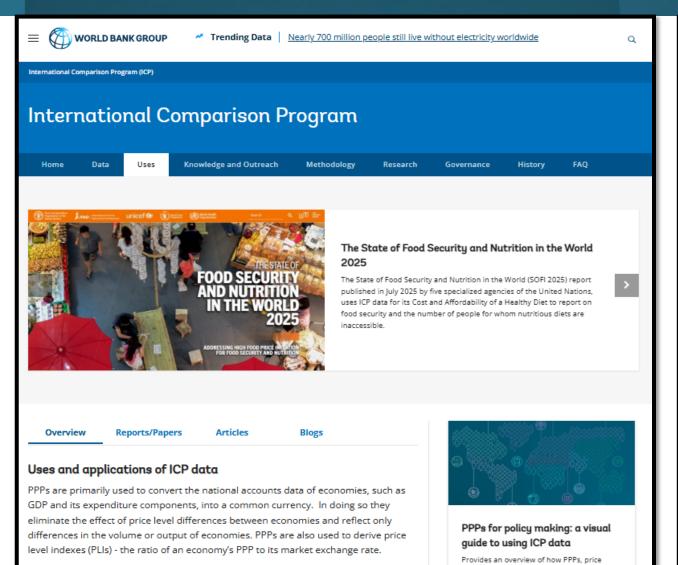
- **Fact**: ICP data (esp. PPPs) is used worldwide at any given time.
- Wide Uses: Thematic (economy → energy, human development),
   Global (all regions), Multi-sector (gov't, International Organizations, media, academia, private research)
- Always: Continuous demand; spikes with new ICP or IOs data/report releases
- Goal: Track, archive, and categorize use cases to:
  - 1. Quantify how many and by whom
  - 2. Educate users on correct usage
  - 3. Communicate importance to donors and stakeholders

#### Specific Tasks:

- 1. Compile a comprehensive list of uses
- Categorize for snapshot summaries (theme, language, date, outlet type, topic)
- Curate examples to feature on website, presentations, newsletters, and outreach
- Issue: Current process is manual, incomplete, English-heavy, timeconsuming, and misses many cases





#### The Solution

#### Introducing the PPP Citation Tracker (work in progress):

- Monitor online publications.
- Extract and classify citation metadata automatically.
- Sync results to Google Sheets and email digest.
- Save users hours while improving accuracy.

#### What It Will Do Automatically

- Every week (or day/month), the system will:
  - 1. Search scholarly databases.
  - 2. Detect keywords like 'purchasing power parity', 'ICP 2021'.
  - 3. Extract publication details.
  - 4. Validate data.
  - 5. Remove duplicates.
  - 6. Update Google Sheet and send summary email.

### **Example Output**

- Structured Fields Captured:
- Title | Author(s) | Source | Date | Summary |
   Topics | Insights | PPP Usage

• Each entry will become a fully verifiable citation with live links and metadata.

# The Connected Google / Sharepoint Sheet

- Centralized live database:
- Tabs: Citations, New since last run, 7-day history.
- Color-coded for ICP cycles.
- ➤ Real-time updates no manual refresh required.

## Email Digest Summary

- Every morning/week/month you receive:
- Number of new PPP/ICP papers.
- Topics and regions.
- Key quantitative findings.
- Attached CSV for new entries.
- Synced automatically with Google/Sharepoint Sheet.

# Behind the Scenes (Simplified)

- Workflow:
- 1. Search (Deep Thinking/Deep Research)
- 2. Extract (13 metadata fields)
- 3. Validate
- 4. Classify
- 5. Sync
- 6. Report


 Operates like an AI research assistant trained on PPP and ICP data.


