Leaders in Urban Transport Planning

Sub-Saharan Africa is the world's most rapidly urbanizing region with a current urban population approaching 500 million. This number is expected to double over the next 20 years. Rapid urbanization, coupled with rising income levels are contributing to even faster growth in motorization with its associated negative externalities (congestion, pollution and road accidents). In this context, sound transport planning and management is needed to sustain and improve the quality of urban life for the cities of the region in the future.

Urban transport planning and management are complex and multi-dimensional. Unfortunately, policy officials in many developing countries do not have access to urban transport planning knowledge, especially in various urban transport "soft" disciplines such as planning, policy, program and project development, finance, operations and management. It is with this in mind that the Leaders in Urban Transport Planning, LUTP program is presented. The objective is to address this knowledge gap and help city leaders' deal effectively with complex urban transport issues.

The "Leaders in Urban Transport Planning" (LUTP) program is focused on promoting sustainable transport and improving the efficiency, safety, equity and sustainability of African urban transport in all dimensions, from social and environmental to financial.

The specific objectives of the Program are to:

1. develop an understanding of the complexity of urban transport problems and give senior national and city transport decision makers the tools to identify, evaluate and implement context-sensitive solutions
2. learn from international experience and provide a framework for cities to develop sustainable solutions appropriate for their respective situations; and
3. develop a common platform for cities to learn from each other.
