







Background

- For over 2 decades MOHWEA has embarked on Health Sector Reform aimed at improving responsiveness of the health system
- Performance-based Financing (PBF) Pilot January 2023
 - A portion of WB-supported HSSP funds have been designated to support PBF Pilot
 - The PBF Pilot focuses on DM and HTN in the primary care setting - considering the burden of NCDs in the country
 - PHC facilities in 4 regions will participate, with 2 in each PR during the pre-pilot (1st 6 months), to be scaled from the initial 8 to 17 facilities (half of all PHCs)

RMI 4: Treatment for diabetes






Strengthening the Health Information System



St. Lucia Health Information System (SLUHIS)

- Web-based electronic medical record
- Capturing clinical data at each encounter
 - clinical notes, meds, physical measures (e.g. BP, weight), health behaviors, lab values
- Additional analytic capabilities needed for quality improvement








Quality of Care, Patient Recall Process



- A regularly updated list of all patients who are due for:
 - screening (if not diagnosed)
 - a follow-up visit (if diagnosed)
- Person(s) designated to track down these individuals
- A clear process for tracking people down
 - Phone call, text message, email, letters
 - Consider home visits
- QI training will be provided to supervisors & selected staff







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


PBF pilot lessons to inform UHC expansion





- Output-based financing (capitation + incentive)
- QIP
- Facility autonomy
- Demand side incentives (free lab test)
- PBF Pilot lessons (from impact and operational evaluation) to inform
 - Scale-up of the PBF scheme
 - UHC expansion and implementation
- Use of technology has been key to strengthen system resilience
 - "to maintain core functions in terms of access and quality of care when managing a shocks"









KWPF grant to propel UHC expansion


