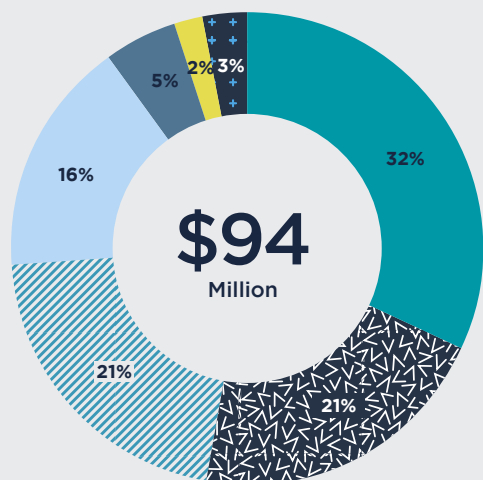


Kiribati

Through the [Pacific Islands Regional Oceanscape Program](#), the World Bank is helping the Government of Kiribati to improve the sustainable management of their tuna and coastal fisheries to ensure the benefits are maximized for the country's future growth and development.

Transport



Since its launch in 2016, the [Kiribati Road Rehabilitation Project \(KRRP\)](#) improved the [only main road through South Tarawa](#), which is used by the island's entire population of 50,000 people. The [Outer Islands Transport Infrastructure Investment Project](#) aims to improve the safety and climate resilience of transport infrastructure on selected outer islands, and focuses on the maritime and road sectors.
