

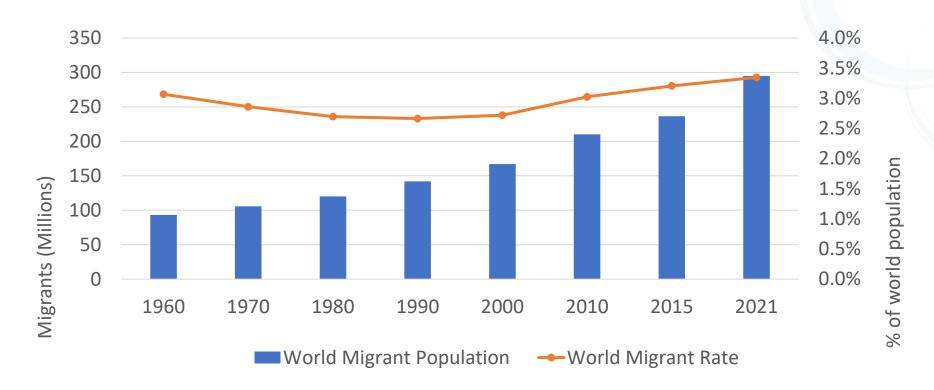

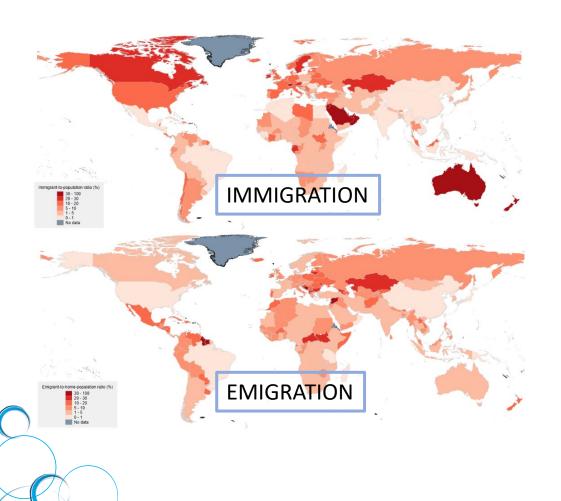


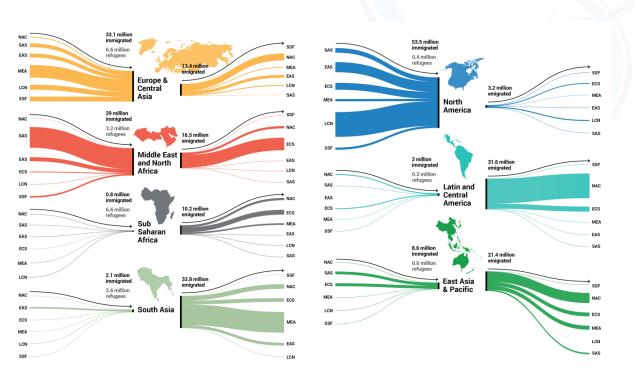
Immigrants compose ~3% of World Population



- In 2020, ~270m migrants, 35m forcibly displaced
- World Bank-OECD Joint work, Funded by KCP for the last decade

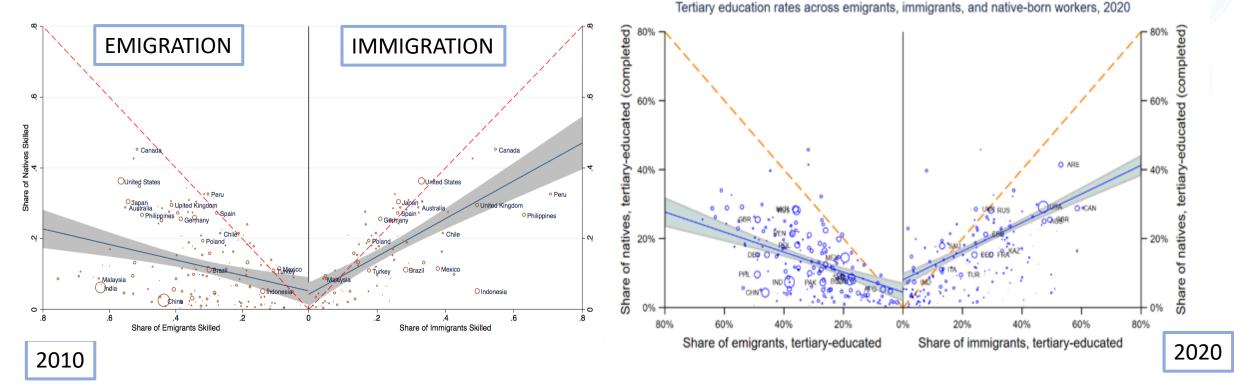
World Bank-OECD Joint work, Global Bilateral Database





- Bilateral 192 *192 countries, Gender, education disaggregated
- Based on censuses, population registers, estimation of missing data
- Funded by KCP for the last decade

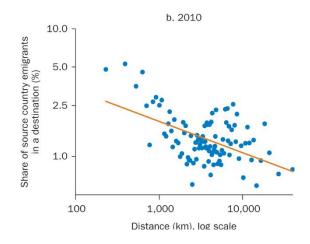
Education Categories – Assess "Brain Drain"

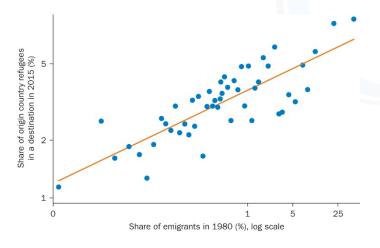


- Captures share of tertiary educated in each corridor

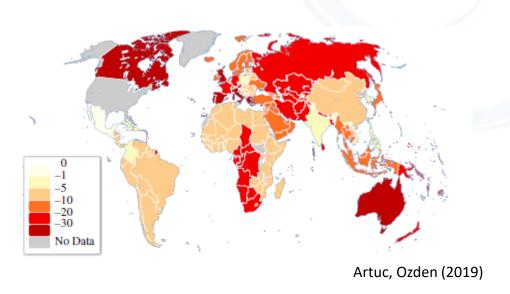
Wage impacts of Emigration

- OECD countries also suffer from brain drain
- Emigration matters more than immigration!

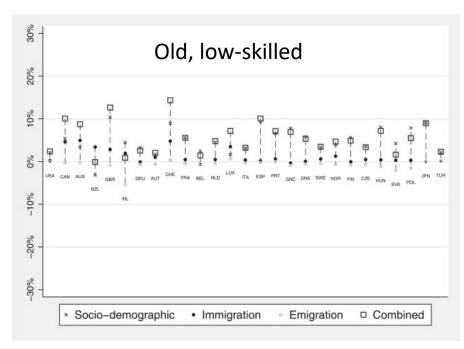
Transit Migration

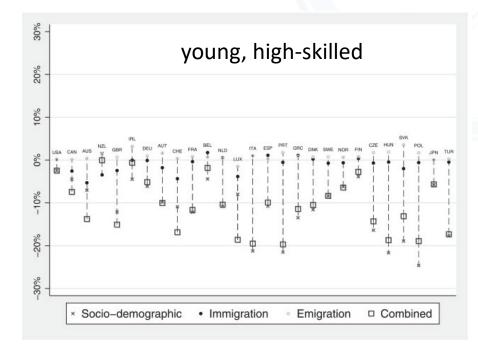


- Transit Migrants compose 9% of all migrants to the US (14% of tertiary educated migrants)
- Policies in one country impacts transit or permanent migration to other countries

Wage impacts of ageing, education change and immigration

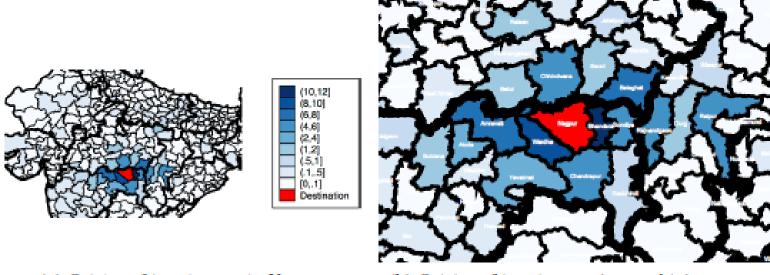




Docquier, Mattoo, Ozden (2019, EER)

- OECD countries going through ageing, increased education and immigration <u>simultaneously</u>
- Ageing and increased education matter more than immigration
- Immigration benefits the old and the low-skilled in destination countries the msot

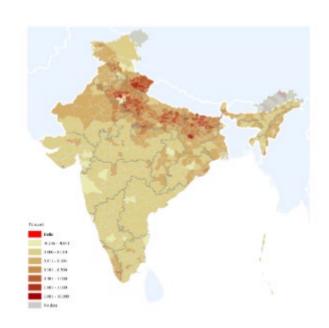


- (a) Origins of in-migrants in Nagpur
- (b) Origins of in-migrants (zoomed in)

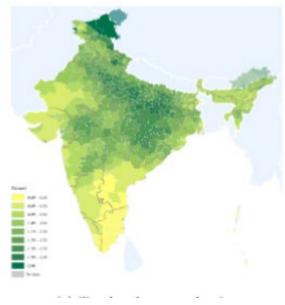
Kone et al (2020, J Econ Geog.)

- Internal borders matter: migration higher in districts within the same state –
 for both high and the low-education people
 - State level entitlement programs
 - Preference for own residents in tertiary education

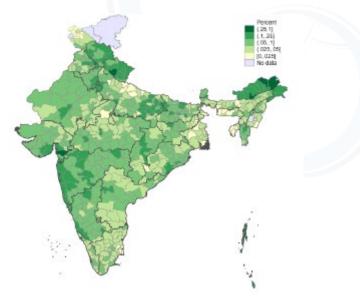

Due to Expected Temperature Rise



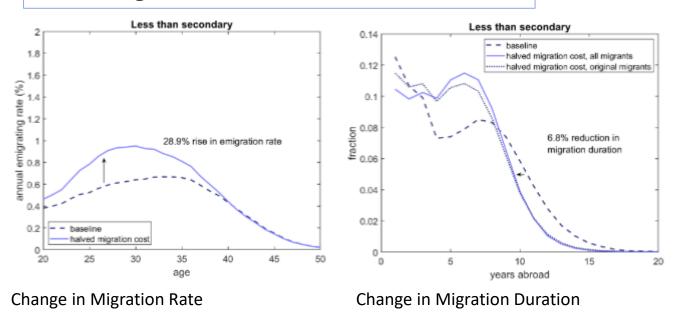

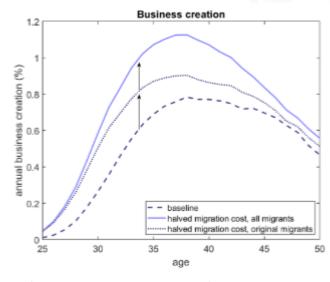

- How wages spill over across a country? Via internal migration
 - Depends on the patterns (barriers) bilaterally estimated
 - Explore impacts of location specific productivity shocks, global warming or transportation infrastructure

When migration costs decline 50% ...





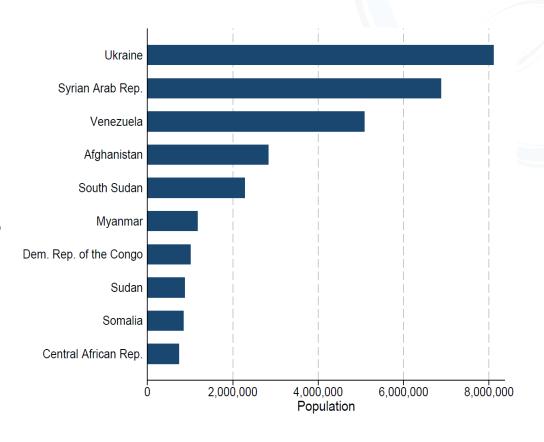
Change in Entrepreneurship

- International Migration occurs due to financial market constraints
 - Entrepreneurs cannot borrow to invest, but they can borrow to migrate.
 - Thus migration policy impacts savings/investments and vice versa

Forced Displacement is a Global Challenge

 More than doubled in the last decade: 32m refugees

83% hosted in developing countries

Show case: Colombia's PEP Program



- No impacts on host's:
 - labor markets
 - local crime
 - political behaviors
- Large impacts on migrant's welfare





Profound Policy Impacts of this work

Approval of larger amnesty in Colombia in 2021

 Motivated the governments of Ecuador, Dominican Republic, Peru, and Chile to approve similar integration measures

• Streamline large operational work from the WB and IDB to support the economic integration of Venezuelan refugees in Latin America

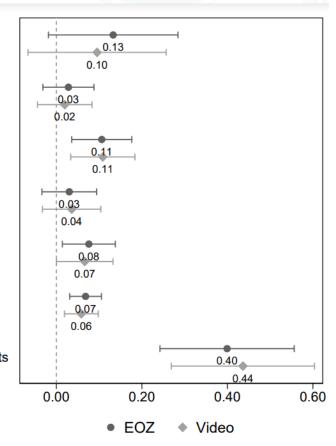

3. How to create jobs and facilitate integration

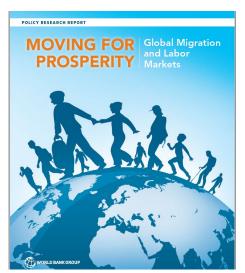


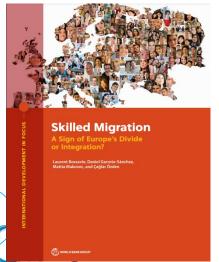
Scope for future work other international mobility

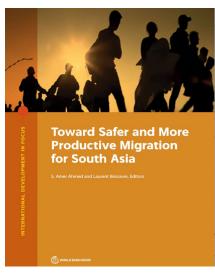
- 1. How to shape **E**migration policies in origin countries:

 - Reducing undocumented migration, role for temporary migration programs

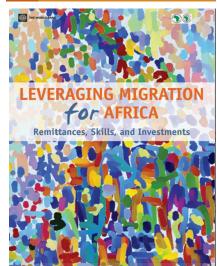
- 3. Expanded/Alternative data sources
