

Macroeconomic Consequences

The future of trade is in services (esp. intermediate services)

Development will become increasingly service-led

Important distributional consequences across and within countries

Extensions

- Fantastic set of papers: lots of food for thought, extremely policy relevant

 - Add numbers to the conjecture (e.g. simulate impact of changes in labor intensity and reduction in trade costs in a multi-country, multi-sector trade model)
 - Pre-requisites for successful service-led development (Chapter 3, April 2018 IMF WEO)
 - Deepen discussion of the distributional and political economy consequences of the Globotics Transformation

What if?


- Continuous reduction in trade barriers for services is assumed, but ...

Trade restrictions imposed (number) ■ Goods ■ Investment ■ Service 2,500 2,000 1,500 1,000 500 2021 2013 2017


