Urban transport practitioners in rapidly urbanizing and developing cities in Africa are grappling with the challenge of providing more inclusive access to opportunities, while reducing the impact of travel on human welfare and the environment. Addressing complex challenges including congestion, road traffic fatalities and injuries, air pollution, and the consumption of scarce resources like land and fuel requires holistic approaches to urban transport planning, governance, management, and operations implemented by strong and cooperative institutions empowered with human capital with a wide range of skills.

We welcome participants from cities in Ghana and Sierra Leone to participate in an interactive workshop on urban transport institutions, management, and public transport reform. Facilitated problem-solving and hands-on learning will empower participants to think creatively and holistically and learn from one another on how to assess the travel needs and challenges facing their cities; balance different perspectives of transport system regulators, operators, and users; and develop solutions that are ‘best fit’ to local circumstances.

The Leaders in Urban Transport Planning (LUTP) program empowers policymakers and practitioners with the knowledge and skills needed to diagnose urban mobility challenges and craft effective strategies to promote more livable, more sustainable cities.
