- ☐ Review the design of impact evaluations studies, focused on assessing the effectiveness of scaling up Economic Inclusion programs through government systems.
- □ Can these impact evaluations help us find robust answers on the impact and cost-effectiveness of Economic Inclusion (EI) programming at Scale and implemented by Governments for a range of outcomes?




Broader Framing Questions

- □ **Critical knowledge gaps:** Promising evidence base, but largely restricted to small scale NGO programs. Is the evidence from NGO programs enough to make the case for the scale up of Government-led El programs?
- What do we mean by scale: Is 10% of the extreme poor "at scale", is a program with 100,000 beneficiaries at scale? SEI 2021 report highlights that most EI programs cover less than 5% of population living below extreme poverty line.
- □ Differences across population groups and Regions: As we move to scale, heterogeneity of impacts, both across target groups and rural/urban regions has implications for program adaptation and customization
- □ **Political Economy** Just as important a driver as evidence. Adoption of scale hinges on politics, fiscal realities.
