






Remittances are important for households, but not all households can send a migrant

a. Share of Bangladeshi households with an international migrant (left axis) and remittance share of income in households with at least one migrant (right axis), by consumption decile







Migration costs tend to be very high for South Asian migrant workers



Costs for select corridors, months of wages at destination




Costs for Bangladeshi migrants for select corridors, months of wages at destination




High costs and over-indebtedness



Borrowing to finance temporary economic migration






Inefficiencies in systems often contribute to these high costs



Migration cost breakdown for select corridors





Access to finance can be a binding constraint for migrant workers from South Asia




Migrant costs by source of financing, select corridors



Migrant workers often face a range of challenges that affect their employment status


Primary reason for returning earlier than planned among Bangladeshi

Wage expectations before departure vs actually earned overseas by temporary migrants from Bangladesh



- Among surveyed Bangladeshi returnees
 - 22% not satisfied with experience
 - 46% left before end of contract
 - 32% currently unemployed –
 43 percent left before the end of their contract

Returning migrants may need more time and support to reintegrate


