

Background

The year 2023 marks the 10th Anniversary of the Korea Program for Operational Knowledge (KPOK), a successful partnership between the World Bank Group (WBG) and the Republic of Korea. Over the past decade, KPOK has provided development knowledge and learning to help low- and middle-income countries address complex development challenges. The Open Learning Campus (OLC) of the WBG has been at the center of KPOK implementation at the same time playing a leading role in establishing the global education ecosystem in development.

Sharing the objectives of providing actionable capacity building and knowledge sharing programs for WBG client countries to tackle development challenges, OLC and KPOK were able to mutually reinforce each other, building strong partnership with various layers of Korean partners across sectors who are willing to share Korean development experience with global development community. Even amidst the challenges posed by the recent COVID-10 pandemic, this partnership has grown stronger, adapting to diverse delivery models to reach a wider audience.

This half-day event is designed to bring together key Korean partners and World Bank counterparts to celebrate the 10 years of successful collaboration. Sheila Jagannathan

Head, Open Learning Campus World Bank Group

Sheila Jagannathan is a lifelong learner and Head of the Open Learning Campus at the World Bank in Washington DC. She serves as the organization's focal point on digital learning and issues at the intersection of technology use and capacity building in emerging countries. She is an internationally recognized thought leader, advisor, author and a forward-thinking senior education leader with over 35 years of experience in leading capacity building, knowledge management, data, social learning and transformation change across public and private organizations. She has been responsible for designing and implementing world-class solutions in challenging global environments, resulting in performance and productivity improvements. Sheila also provides policy advice and technical assistance to World Bank country-level capacity building programs (both government and training centers of excellence seeking to introduce technologies in their educational systems) in, East Asia, China, the Middle East and North Africa, Africa and South Asia. A recent MOOC designed under her leadership on Future of Work (WDR 2019) was nominated for the prestigious EDX prize for 2020. Her current areas of interest and activity include: Skilling and the Fourth Industrial Revolution, 60-year curricula, corporate talent management, diversity & inclusion, organizational development, MOOCs, experiential pedagogy, online/hybrid strategies, multimodal and social learning environments, immersive learning (AR/VR), use of artificial education in education, big data analytics, LXPs, LMS, and learning ecosystems.

Sheila has written articles for various peer-reviewed publications and journals learning publications in technology-based learning. Her seminal book, 'Reimagining Digital Learning for Sustainable Development: How Upskilling, Data Analytics, and Educational Technologies Close the Skills Gap', by Routledge, New York (2021) is recognized as a landmark in the field of digital capability building and sustainable development, a topic that has now become center stage in promoting alternative pathways for jobs and employment among millions of low income youths in different parts of the developing world. She is on the advisory board of major professional associations of learning such as the UN-SDG Learn, Canadian Foreign Service Institute, Global Distance Learning Network, Indian National Skills Development Council, George Mason University, E-learning Africa, (Annual International Conference for developing E-learning capacities in Africa), International Conference on e-learning (ICEL), and Skills Development Councils, IQPC's Chief Learning Officer (CLO Exchange). Sheila was invited to join 15 global leaders for an UN Executive Leadership Program for Sustainable Development, and is currently a UN Master Mind for providing leadership advice to the organization on sustainable development issues.

Sang Kyoo LEE is the Director of the International Financial Institutions Division. He assumed office in February 2022.

Prior to his tenure at KDI, Dr. Kang taught macroeconomics at the State University of New York (SUNY) at Binghamton and worked for the Financial Supervisory Service (FSS) of Korea. He also worked as an Economist for the Department of Economics at the OECD and served as a Consultant for the WB and the ADB. In his current role, Dr. Dongsoo Kang takes the lead in designing and implementing impactful knowledge-sharing programs. Leveraging exhibitions, seminars, and capacity-building initiatives, he collaborates closely with esteemed partners, such as Multilateral Development Banks, partner governments, and public institutions, to facilitate effective information exchange and foster strategic alliances. Dr. Kang holds a B.A. in Economics from Seoul National University and an M.A. and Ph.D. in Economics from the University of Chicago.


Junseok Hwang

Recent research areas also include smart city technology innovation, sustainability of technology management, appropriate technology for developing economy and community, fourth industrial revolution education, digital transformation.

Jason Allford

Special Representative (Country Manager), Korea Office World Bank Group



Mr. Jason Allford is the World Bank Group's Special Representative to Korea, a role he commenced in August 2021. Mr. Allford manages the World Bank's Korea Office, a global hub on innovation and technology for sustainable development. The office has a team of more than 30 staff and consultants from diverse backgrounds focused on bringing lessons from Korea's development experience – particularly in relation to innovation, technology, and green growth – and applying them to the World Bank's operational work in other World Bank member countries. It links Korean public and private sector partners with other parts of the World Bank Group and with counterparts in other countries. The office was established in Songdo, Korea in 2013. The Korean Government and the World Bank Group renewed their support for the office and its role in the World Bank's work program for the third time in July 2021.

Mr. Allford was educated in economics at the University of Tasmania and the London School of Economics and Political Science. He joined the Australian Government in 1994, starting a career focusing on macroeconomic analysis, forecasting and fiscal policy. He has also worked for governments in Papua New Guinea and Indonesia. He previously worked at the World Bank Group from 2014 to 2018, representing fifteen countries from Asia and the Pacific on the Bank's Board of Directors. He has also worked as an adviser on fiscal policy to governments in Africa, Eastern Europe and the Middle East.
